Peterson Seeking Entries to Congressional Art Competition

WASHINGTON – Congressman Collin C. Peterson is inviting Seventh District high school students to submit artwork for the 2019 Congressional Art Competition.

The Congressional Art Competition is open to all high school students and the winning pieces are featured for one year in the Cannon Tunnel, which connects the House Office Buildings to the U.S. Capitol.

"One of my favorite things about the art competition is that I get to see how talented young artists in the district are," said Peterson. "This is a great opportunity for young folks to enter in a chance to have their work

displayed in the Capitol."

The Congressional Art Competition began in 1982 as an opportunity for Members of Congress to recognize and encourage the artistic talent of their young constituents. Since then, more than 650,000 high-school students have participated in the nation-wide contest.

Submitted artwork may be up to 26 inches x 26 inches x 4 inches (including the frame) and weigh no more than 15 pounds. Accepted mediums include:

- Paintings – including oil, acrylics and watercolor
- Drawings – including pastels, colored pencil, pencil, charcoal, ink and markers

- Collage (two-dimensional)
- Prints – including lithographs, silkscreen and block prints
- Mixed Media
- Computer Generated Art
- Photography

All entries must be original in concept, design and execution. Artwork that is a reproduction of another artist's work, including photographs, does not qualify for this competition.

HOW TO APPLY:

To best ensure accessibility for all students, Peterson's office will be accepting all Congressional Art Competition submissions online. Selection of the

winning piece, made in early May, will be determined based upon the photograph submitted with the application.

Mpls. mayor marks new partnership with Red Lake Nation on trip to reservation

If you are a member of a Native American tribe, it's more likely that you live in a city than on a reservation. Despite that, it's rare for city governments to partner directly with tribes, who typically work with the federal government.

That's changing — at least between the city of Minneapolis and the Red Lake Nation. This week, the mayor of Minneapolis drove 4 1/2 hours north to visit the Red Lake Tribal Council.

"I believe this is the first time a mayor from the Twin Cities has come visit the tribal council," said Red Lake Tribal Chair Darrell Seki Sr. "It's unique, and it's a good relationship."

Red Lake and the city of Minneapolis began working together last summer to respond to the largest homeless encampment in Minnesota in recent history. At one point, around 200 people were camped along Franklin and Hiawatha avenues. Most were Native Americans, and many were enrolled members of the Red Lake Band.

Red Lake is facing its own homelessness problem on the reservation, but it took unprecedented action in the city. It contracted with health care providers to treat people in the encampment, and social workers to get people into housing and treatment for chemical dependency. And it did so for everyone living there — not just its own tribal members.

The Red Lake Nation also offered the city of Minneapolis land it owns near the site of the former encampment to build an emergency shelter called a "navigation center."

"Red Lake stepped up in a big way with the navigation center. The city and the Red Lake Nation have been tremendous partners and friends, and the very least I could do was to come up here and see their way of life, their land, and to say 'Miigwech,' thank you," Minneapolis Mayor Jacob Frey said.

Minneapolis and Red Lake hope to transition the nearly 150 people currently living at

the navigation center to other housing by the end of May.

This fall, Red Lake aims to break ground on the navigation center site for a 110-unit affordable housing complex, which will have a health center and a Red Lake embassy on the first floor. Sam Strong, the tribal secretary for the Red Lake Nation, said having a good relationship with city leaders is crucial for both governments.

"We have thousands of band members who live in Minneapolis, and sadly, a lot of our band members are faced with a lot of social ill. So, it's important that the local leaders understand their constituents and have relationships with people who can come to the table with solutions," Strong said.

Native Americans began moving to cities in large numbers in the 1950s and '60s to seek greater economic oppor-

tunities. This migration was spurred, in part, by a federal program aimed at assimilating Native Americans into white, mainstream society by providing some assistance to relocate from reservations to cities across the country. Today, nearly 7 out of every 10 Native Americans live in or near cities.

Still, it's unusual for tribal and city governments to work directly together, according to David Beck, a professor at the University of Montana who focuses on urban American Indian history.

"For the most part, the relationship between reservation communities and cities has been pretty minimal in terms of the official city governments," Beck said.

Before Mayor Frey left, he received a model teepee and a T-shirt from the revered girls' high school basketball team, which plays in the state tournament in Minneapolis this week. He says he'll wear it with pride.

Red River Basin Watershed Districts Focusing on Water Storage as 2019 Spring Thaw Approaches

The National Weather Service in Grand Forks issued its 2019 Flood Outlook Forecast for the Red River Basin (RRB) last Thursday. With additional snowfall over the weekend and more precipitation likely into this week, the message is that some flooding is likely in the RRB. Despite this prediction, watershed districts in the Minnesota portion of the RRB have continued to focus on water storage projects and efforts.

The Red River Watershed Management Board (RRWMB) in the RRB of Minnesota has helped fund 45 flood damage reduction projects since being formed by the Minnesota Legislature in 1976. These projects are constructed, managed, and operated by the RRWMBs member watershed districts. Close to 200,000 acre-feet of water storage has been created by the construction of these projects. These projects have a total drainage area of 1,669 square miles. The RRWMB has allocated close to \$22 million for these 45 projects while local watershed districts have contributed \$9.6 million. The State of Minnesota and other funding sources have contributed \$51 million for these projects. These investments protect millions of dollars of public and private infrastructure in the RRB.

The RRWMB and its member watershed districts also

have 11 additional flood damage reduction projects in various stages of survey, design, engineering, permitting, and funding. The RRWMB has committed approximately \$23.568 million towards these projects that include urban protection and levees and rural flood impoundments. The RRWMB and its members leverage funds primarily from state sources to develop and construct projects. These projects can and do incorporate natural resource enhancements, which provide:

- Better water quality by reducing nitrogen, phosphorous, and erosion.
- Potential to reduce sediment loading and algae blooms.
- Protection and enhancement of naturally occurring fen wetlands.
- Large habitat blocks for wildlife.
- Nesting, resting, feeding, brooding, and rearing habitat areas for migrating waterfowl.
- Shorebird and upland game habitat.
- Low flow augmentation for fish habitat.
- Storage via restored wetlands to hold and retain water on the landscape for longer periods of time while providing agricultural drainage benefits.
- Protection and enhancement of habitat for rare, threatened, and endangered species.

A little more than 120 years after the Minnesota State Band was started, they will play a concert in Park Rapids at 7 p.m. Friday, March 22. The band was started by members of the Fraternal Order of Elks in St. Paul. They played as the Elks Band before changing the name to the Minnesota State Band in April 1898. Band members were all professional musicians, performers and educators, who donated their services on many occasions, but most of the time were paid to play. In 1963, the band was reformed as a state employee band with an all-volunteer membership, playing for fun at official State of Minnesota events and in the community.

Minnesota State Band will play in Park Rapids on March 22

The Minnesota State Band will perform in concert, under the direction of Keith Liuzzi, at 7 p.m. Friday, March 22 at the Park Rapids Area High School auditorium.

The concert will feature two band members as soloists: Tom Wells on tuba (Park Rapids) and Fred Larson on clarinet (Wadena). The band also will perform its most recent commissioned work, One Fair Summer Eve by David Evan Thomas. This four-movement suite (Pronto, Carousel, Princess Kay of the Milky Way, On Machinery Hill) depicts different aspects of the Minnesota State Fair.

"We premiered the work last November and now are happy to bring to more Minnesota audiences on our tours around the state," Liuzzi said.

The Minnesota State Band is the official band of the State of Minnesota. Founded in 1898,

the 60-piece concert band is the only remaining State Band in the nation and has represented the State of Minnesota on six International Goodwill Tours since 1986. While international travel is important, the band sees its primary mission as providing high quality music to the residents of Minnesota. The band's goal is to contribute positively to the development of music in the state and to affirm and continue the strong Minnesota band heritage in quality music.

The Park Rapids Lakes Area Arts Council and Park Rapids Community Education are sponsoring the event which will include an afternoon program for Century Middle School and Area High School band students.

The band's concerts are always free, but anyone can join

the ranks of their esteemed Associate Band Members by donating any amount. A very reasonable amount will procure one of their collectable stuffed animals. A free will donation also will be taken to offset local expenses.

The band's spring concert tour is funded in part by the Minnesota Arts and Cultural Heritage Fund as appropriated by the Minnesota State Legislature with money from the vote of the people of Minnesota on Nov. 4, 2008.

The Minnesota State Band also will perform at 2 p.m. Saturday, March 23 at the Memorial Auditorium in Wadena, located at 216 Dayton Ave. SW.

Seasonal Load Limit Notification

POSTING UPDATE

The **ENDING DATE** for Winter Load Increases in the **NORTH-CENTRAL** and **NORTH FROST ZONES** will be Tuesday, March 19, 2019 at 12:01 AM.

The **STARTING DATE** for Spring Load Restrictions in the **CENTRAL, NORTH-CENTRAL** and **NORTH FROST ZONES** will be Tuesday, March 19, 2019 at 12:01 AM.

Winter Load Increases in the **SOUTH, SOUTHEAST, METRO** and **CENTRAL FROST ZONES** have already ended. Spring Load Restrictions in the **SOUTH, SOUTHEAST** and **METRO FROST ZONES** have already been scheduled to begin on Friday, March 15.

Road Restriction maps indicating the locations of weight restricted routes are on the MnDOT Seasonal Load Limits website at www.mndot.gov/loadlimits.

OVERWEIGHT PERMITS

Permits for over 80,000 lb Gross Vehicle Weight will continue and new permits will be issued if all axle and group weights are legal.

Up to full-summer overweight permits can be issued during the Spring Load Restriction period only on interstate through movements.

Middle-range overweight permits become available within each frost zone when Spring Load Restrictions are lifted.

Full-summer overweight permits become available within each frost zone starting two to three weeks after Spring Load Restrictions are lifted.

Load limit dates are based on how weather is affecting roadway strength. These dates are established by monitoring roadway strength as weather conditions change. Therefore, these dates are variable. The end of Winter Load Increases and start of Spring Load Restrictions are separate events which may not occur on the same date.

As soon as a date is set, MnDOT will report this date on its 24-hour automated message center at 1 800 723 6543 for the USA and Canada, and locally at 651 366 5400 for the Minneapolis/St Paul area. This information is also published on the MnDOT Seasonal Load Limits website: www.mndot.gov/loadlimits

All changes are made with a minimum three calendar-day notice.

Do You Remember Your Teachers?

Do you remember your teachers? I remember mine.

Miss Miller was my K teacher. One of her shoes had a much bigger platform than the other. Dad said it was because she tripped over a toy in someone's yard. Truth-be-told, that was not the case in her case, but the illustration did serve its purpose. Between her bunny puppet and the show and tell circle, life was good. Ask a Trooper

Question: What is the law about pickup trucks with the flashing amber lights? I noticed some of them traveling down the road when they are not actively plowing. Also, is there a law against plowing or blowing snow onto a public road?

Answer: With the recent amount of record snowfall that we received, it can be a challenge for all of us to remove snow safely.

Minnesota state law says that a service vehicle shall not display a lighted lamp when traveling on the highway or at any other time except at the scene of a disabled vehicle or while conducting snow removal or road maintenance.

Any service vehicle may be equipped with a flashing amber lamp of a type approved by the commissioner of public safety. Remember that other traffic on the main roadway will have the right of way, so be sure to pay attention and use due care.

As far as moving snow onto a public roadway, it is violation to obstruct any highway with snow or ice. Activities such as



plowing, blowing or shoveling snow on to public roads is prohibited. This includes the ditch and right-of-way area along the roads.

Civil penalties can also apply if the placement of snow creates a hazard, such as a slippery area, frozen rut or bump that contributes to a motor vehicle or pedestrian crash. The civil liability can extend to both the property owner and the person who placed the snow.

Please remember to also help out local fire departments by making a path and clearing snow around a fire hydrant when it is on or close to your property.

Stihl Tractors

Andreas Stihl was born in Zurich, Switzerland, in 1896. He was quite an engineer and inventor. He moved to Germany. One of his first inventions was a portable saw that could be taken into the woods instead of hauling the logs out of the woods to the saw. In the 1930's his company began exporting saws. During WWII his factory was destroyed by bombs.

With sales of saws down Andreas decided to try the tractor market. The post-war boom for tractors and trying to restore agriculture in post-war Europe led to his development of light weight tractor in 1948. By 1949 the 12hp Model 140 was introduced with a one cylinder diesel engine. Starting in the tractor business was costly so staying in business was difficult. Luckily being an inventor Andreas Stihl also developed a light-weight, one man, chainsaw. Eventually his family convinced him to put all his efforts into the chainsaw business. Tractor production was ceased in 1963, ten years before his death. In 1974 the Stihl company began manufacturing saws in the United States under the name Stihl American. Now it is simply known as Stihl Inc.

We have all probably seen or heard of the Stihl Chainsaw, but I knew nothing of the tractor. It was painted a light "Oliver" kind of green. They give the appearance of a lot of the smaller, compact, European tractors. I sure would like to see one run! Sounds like more for to me than heading to the woods with my chainsaw!!
