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Rose Odegard celebrates 100 years

100 years ago on May 8, 1917, Rose was born to Albert and Ida Johnson of Gonvick. On Saturday, May 6, 2017 her family had a 100th birthday party at the Samhold Lutheran Church in Gonvick. Many friends, neighbors and family came from New York, Florida and points in between to help her celebrate. Family is one of the most important things to Rosie and she was able to see all of her family at once.

Rose's father Albert came from Sweden when he was eighteen years old. He lived in Wisconsin with an uncle before moving to Gonvick. That is where he met his future wife Ida. She was the daughter of Andrew and Mathilda Nelson of Gonvick.

Albert had several jobs including building the railroad lines, being a mechanic and working for the Clearwater County Highway Department. He and David Allen owned a garage which was one of the first business places formed in Gonvick after the named was changed from Wildwood. The building originally owned by Steffen Winden was sold on November 25, 1919 to David and Albert for the purchase price of \$200.00.

When he came home covered in grease or dirt from work he would give all of his children big hugs. Ida would scold him as then their clothing would be as bad as his.

The first light plant generator was built by David Allen and Albert Johnson in 1917 for electricity in Gonvick. Albert and his brother Charley Johnson worked on clearing the land for the Soo Line railroad to come through.

In his free time Albert enjoyed carving wood. He made many sleighs with people and horses attached. Rose's mother Ida stayed at home taking care of their four children and milking the cow twice a day. She cooked and cleaned for the family.

Rose had a sister Evelyn who died at an early age when she was 11 and Rose was 12 in 1927. She also had two brothers Benny and Arnie. They enjoyed living in town as they would play all sorts of games. The Lost River was just north of their house and they would go down there to fish and swim. In the winter they would skate on the ice.

Rose Johnson graduated from Gonvick High School in 1936. She was a basketball player along with her other friends. After she finished high school Rose went to beauty school in Fargo. She started a beauty shop but after her marriage is was difficult for her to keep the shop.

Rose was united in marriage to Verner Odegard who was of Norwegian ancestry as opposed to her Swedish ancestry. To this union four children were born; JoAnn, Arvin, Dennis and Debbie. They purchased a home next to her parents in Gonvick.

Rose would help her mother with inside and outside work. They would cook, bake and garden. Those are three things Rosie has enjoyed doing all her life. She is an excellent cook and loved to garden when she was living in her home in Gonvick. She made soups, roasts, and desserts of all kinds. She enjoyed playing cards and putting puzzles together. Her mother passed away when she was 91 and she did a lot for her father. She made goodies for him as he lived next door until he passed away when he was 105.

You could not get away after stopping to visit without some of her goodies and coffee.

She enjoyed listening to music and had a lot of Daniel O'Donnell's songs. She was fortunate to be able to attend a few of his concerts and have her picture taken with the Irish singer.

She is now a resident of the Essentia Health Living Center in Fosston. Her eye sight is failing but her spirit and memory are the best.

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Marshall County Sheriff's Office K9 Eva to get body armor

The Marshall County Sheriff's Office received K-9 Eva in October 2016 and has been in service since December 2016 with her handler Deputy Cody Gillund. She has been deployed 30 times to assist Law Enforcement with narcotic cases, man tracking and search warrants.

Marshall County Sheriff's Office K9 Eva will receive a bullet and stab protective vest thanks to a charitable donation from non-profit organization Vested Interest in K9s, Inc. K9 Eva's vest is sponsored by an Anonymous Donor and will be embroidered with the sentiment "Born to Love - Trained to Serve - Loyal Always". Delivery is expected within eight to ten weeks.

Vested Interest in K9s, Inc. is a 501c (3) charity located in East Taunton, MA whose mission is to provide bullet and stab protective vests and other assistance to dogs of law enforcement and related agencies throughout the United States. The non-profit was established in 2009 to assist law enforcement agencies with this potentially lifesaving body armor for their four-legged K9 officers. Since its inception, Vested Interest in K9s, Inc. provided over 2,400 protective vests, in 50 states, through private and corporate donations, at a cost of over 2.1 million dollars.

The program is open to dogs actively employed in the U.S.

with law enforcement or related agencies who are certified and at least 20 months of age. New K9 graduates, as well as K9s with expired vests, are eligible to participate.

The donation to provide one protective vest for a law enforcement K9 is \$1,050.00. Each vest has a value between \$1,795 – \$2,234 and a five-year warranty, and an average weight of 4-5 lbs. 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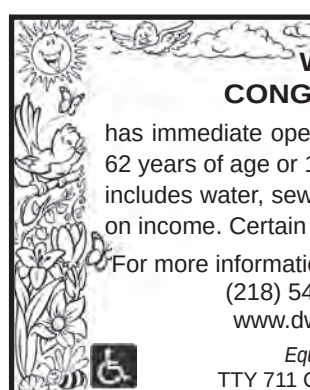

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Ask a Trooper

Question: I want to install a lift kit and put bigger tires on my pickup. I want to comply with all the state laws. What is a bumper height law and the law about tires that extend out past the fenders?

Answer: Adding a lift kit and installing bigger tires and rims are very popular on pickup trucks. Anytime you make any type of modification or alterations to a vehicle's stock suspension and tires/rims, it can change how that vehicle handles and preforms. It can also change the way the vehicle handles, steers, brakes and could affect its overall performance.

Below are a list of equipment violations and safety issues that I have seen over the years with modified trucks:

Bumper height violations- With a raised suspension, bumper height comes to mind. The law in Minnesota says bumper height must be within six inches of the factory bumper height. The maximum bumper height for 4x4s is 25 inches. Bumpers must be at least four and a half inches tall and must extend 10 inches outside of each frame rail. The height of the bumper shall be determined by measuring from the bottom of the bumper, excluding any vertical bumper attachments, to the ground. A vehicle which has an original bumper which does not exceed a height of 30 inches may be modified by attaching a full width bumper to the regular bumper to meet the height requirement.

Tires exceeding past the fenders- Installing wider wheels on a vehicle that extend past the fenders, required some type of fender flare added on. The flaps or protectors must be at least as wide as the tires they are protecting and have a ground clearance of not more than nine inches from the ground when the vehicle is empty.

Speeding due to larger tires/rims- The speedometer is reading how many revolutions the tires are making, not how fast they are spinning. With larger



tires the circumference of the tires are larger, meaning the distance around the tire is longer, so each revolution you are traveling further than before. Now, the actual speed of the vehicle is higher than the speedometer reads. It will be lower if smaller tires/rims are installed. I recommend stopping at a local auto/tire shop and they can advise on how much your speedometer would be off.

Higher risk for a rollover crash- By increasing the vehicle's height, it will increase the vehicle's center of gravity, making it less steady. This could be a problem when taking sharp turns, as a higher center of gravity gives the vehicle a tendency to lean more, increasing the chances of rolling over or losing control. Additional modifications may be needed to correct this. Make sure to read the lift kit manufacturer's instructions when installing it yourself or have it professionally installed.

Braking, steering issues, reduced blind spots and overall safety of your vehicle. By adding bigger tires and rims, the stock brake system may need to be upgraded. The front suspension may need bigger and stronger parts. Taller vehicles may increase your blind spots, as smaller vehicles may be less visible. Adding larger mirrors, relocating the current mirrors or adding a blind spot mirror to help see vehicles in blind spots might be necessary.

It is highly recommended to consult with a professional mechanic before modifying a vehicle to assure its safety and it complies with all state laws.

Having the opportunity to visit the "First Wonder of the World," a child's heart, was worth the travel time as we embarked not only into the neighborhood, but into the world of discovery.

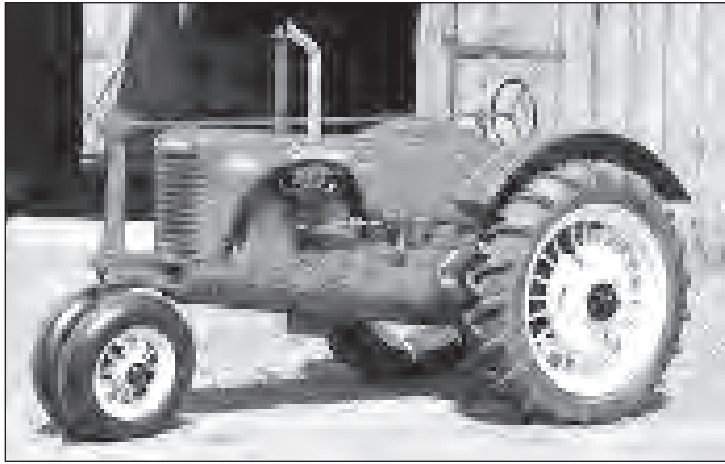
Matthew 6:21 puts it plain. "For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also."

Massey Harris

The Massey Company began in 1847. Starting with well-made farm implements the Canadian Company acquired other companies and had a pretty successful beginning, but entering the tractor market had to take a couple of tries before they found a tractor manufactured by the J.I. Case Plow Works. Massey Harris bought out the J.I. Case Plow Works in 1927 and now had a tractor and a factory.

Massey Harris began selling the 12-20 Wallis tractor in about 1929. Massey was able to sell the Wallis line through much of the United States and Canada. Massey was one of the first and definitely a leader in selling their tractors all around the world. The new Massey Harris 25 appeared in 1933 still sporting the Wallis type design.

did not catch on.

Massey's following tractors shared the same engine. The standard version was called the Pacemaker, and the row crop version was called the Challenger. Let's talk a little more about the Challenger. It had the same boiler plate frame and engine design as the earlier Wallis tractors. This row crop tractor proved successful and helped Massey make a step forward in there quest to be a leader in the tractor market. I have never driven a Challenger although I have seen a couple at tractor shows. I don't suppose I will ever have one of my own, but just take a look if you see one because it is another great example of the engineering of our early tractor designs.

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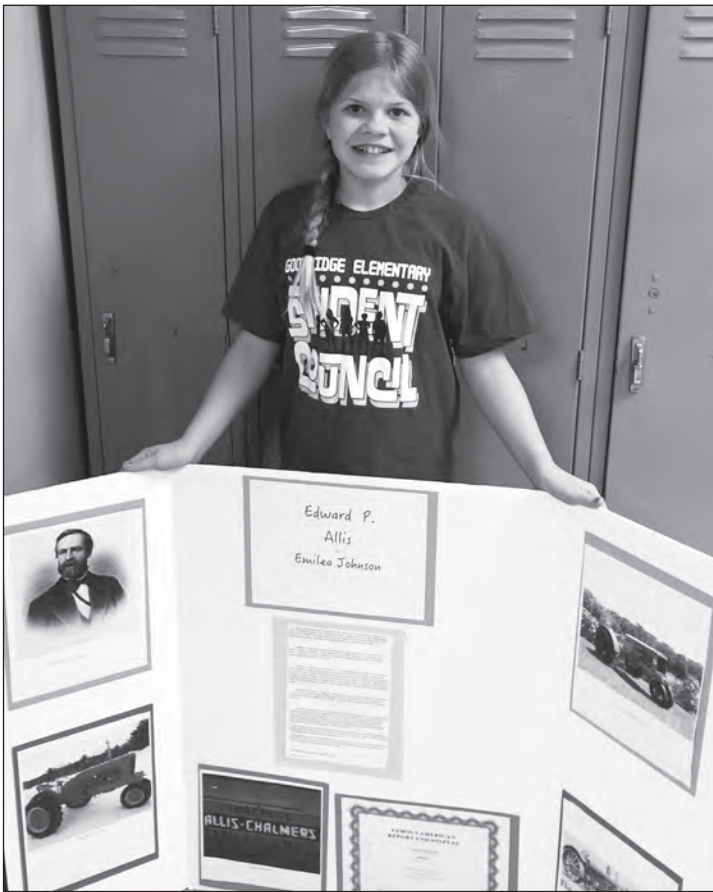
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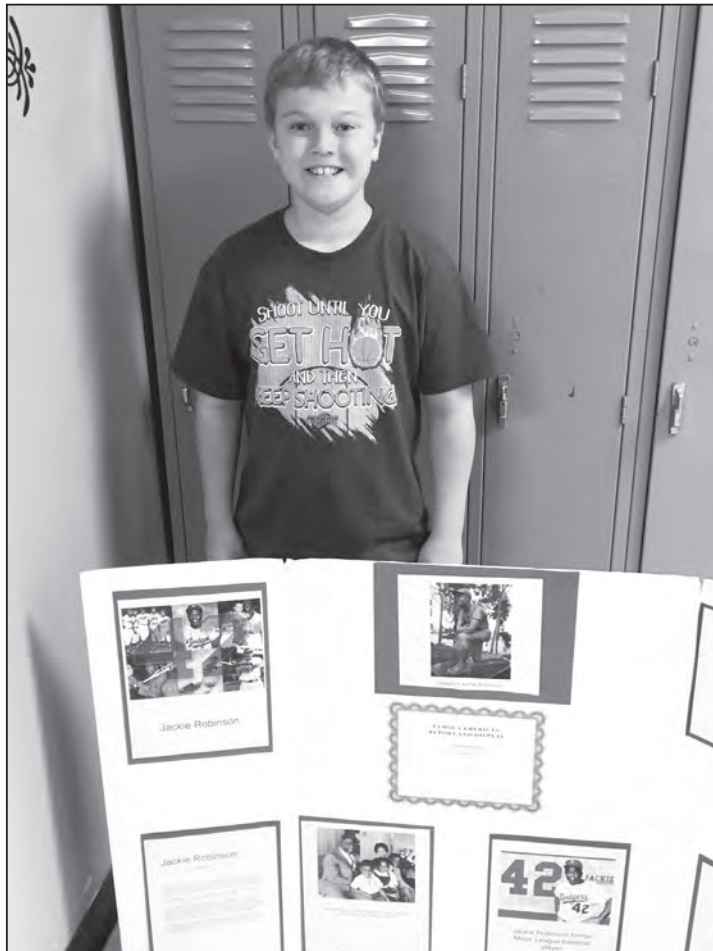

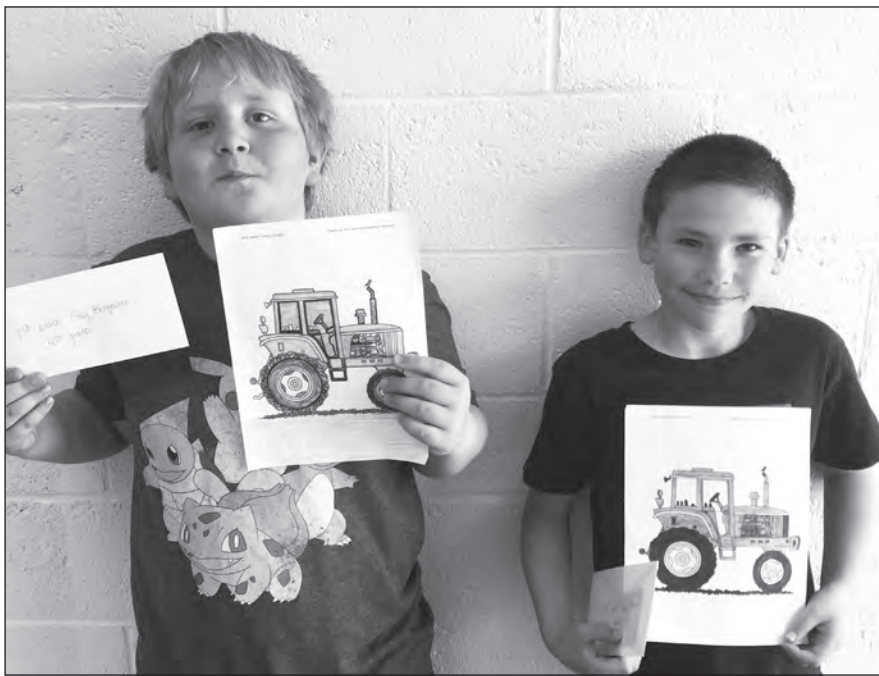

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Apply to hunt elk in Minnesota

Northwest elk research continues

Hunters have through Friday, June 16, to apply for one of 13 elk licenses offered this year by the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources.

"We have native elk herds and managing them involves balancing the benefit they provide to all Minnesotans with the damage these large animals do to fences and crops," said Adam Murkowski, DNR big game program leader. "Our elk management plan provides background and guidance on our elk management and research."

Licenses will be available for two concurrent elk seasons in Kittson County's central (zone 20) and northeast (zone 30) zones. The Grygla area elk zone will not be open to hunting in 2017 because that area's elk population is below the population goal level outlined in the elk management plan.

The first 2017 elk season runs from Saturday, Sept. 9, to Sunday, Sept. 17, in both open elk hunt zones. Three bulls-only licenses and one antlerless-only elk license will be available in the Kittson County central zone (zone 20) and two bulls-only licenses will be available in the Kittson County northeast zone (zone 30).

The second 2017 elk season runs from Saturday, Oct. 7, to Sunday, Oct. 15. Three bulls-only licenses and one antlerless-only elk license will be available in the Kittson County central zone (zone 20) and three bulls-only licenses will be available in the Kittson County northeast

zone (zone 30) for the second season.

Hunters may apply individually or in parties of two at any DNR license agent, the DNR License Center at 500 Lafayette Road in St. Paul, mndnr.gov/buylicense or by telephone at 888-665-4236. There is a non-refundable application fee of \$4 per hunter. The license fee is \$287. Hunters will have to select a zone and season when applying. Hunting information including maps of the elk hunting zones is at mndnr.gov/hunting/elk.

In addition to managing elk populations through hunting, the DNR continues to track 19 adult cow elk that were outfitted with GPS tracking collars in early 2016 for a research project that will enhance knowledge of elk and help inform elk management in the future. Applicants should be mindful that if successful in the antlerless lottery, they will be asked to not shoot radio-collared cows because the study is ongoing.
