## Delegation from Turkmenistan Government Visit Sanford Bagley

BAGLEY, Minn— Sanford Bagley hosted delegates from the Turkmenistan government on Friday, May 19. These IT professionals met with hospital staff to discuss the use of Sanford's Electronic Health Record (EHR) and other technologies at the medical center and clinics. The delegates took notes regarding ways to implement technology at hospitals in Turkmenistan. Turkmenistan is in

a transition period of moving away from paper-based medical records into electronic storage.

"To keep up with the rest of the world, we have switched to electronic management of documentation and records," Merdan Abdullayevich Hudaykulov, a member of delegation, said through an interpreter.

The switch from paper archives began about two years

ago. Another delegate, Rovshen Atayevich Myatiyev, said the fingerprint scanners at the hospital's pharmacy and a voice recognition system called "Dragon" at Sanford was particularly interesting.

The trip was organized by the Open World Leadership Center. Open World is an exchange program between the US and post-Soviet era coun-

tries. The exchange program allows for current political and civic leaders to travel to the United States and interact with our government leaders and professional counterparts.

"We don't know what exactly and where we're going to use, but we've taken several notes to be discussed with (government) leadership upon return," Hudaykulov said.

## Let the chainsaws rip and the sawdust fly

Hear the hammers clink against steel and the roar of the forge

The Ruffed Grouse Roadhouse of Lengby, Minnesota is proud to present, the first annual Roadhouse Rustic Art Festival on Saturday, June 24, 2017 from noon to 5 pm.

Bring a lawn chair, sit back and watch in awe as these demonstrating artists share the what, why and how of their craft. The seemingly effortless skill that these artisans display is breathtaking. The artists will also offer for sale their one of a kind pieces.

For centuries, the blacksmith was regarded as the most important man in the rural community. Here in this area, it would have been the blacksmith who made and serviced the vast range of iron implements, tools and utensils used on the farm, in the workshop and in the home. In the days before the tractor, when farmers relied upon the horse, the blacksmith also spent much of his time engaged in shoeing and other farrier tasks. Today blacksmiths create both ornamental and functional objects by applying traditional and modern specialist techniques to form, shape and join metals such as steel, iron, brass, copper and bronze.

**Jeff Olson** of Olson Iron Works hails from his home town of Fosston, MN. He is a metal artist who uses a forge, anvil and traditional blacksmithing tools to create ornamental sculpture and jewelry. Jeff has been creating contemporary works of art since he returned to Fosston in 2009 from working as a civilian contractor in Iraq. Jeff has created custom jewelry for New York fashion designer Mathew Sabatino as well as medieval costume pieces for the video game giant Blizzard Entertainment. Jeff has also worked as a primitive technology consultant for the Discovery Channels survival show "Dude You're Screwed." Jeff insists that his clients have the best ideas, he just forges them into reality.

**Tony Roed** is a local knife maker and metal artist from Stony's Custom Designs. Self-described as a blacksmith with a modern twist. Tony creates custom works of functional metal art for his local community and makes custom knives for a client list that stretches across the country. Tony enjoys making gas forges of his own design for other blacksmiths and collaborating with other artists for community projects. He is also instrumental in teaching blacksmith classes to the young and old with the Northern Minnesota Metalsmith's organization based out of Itasca.

While **Jerry Hobbs** from New York Mills is relatively new to the craft, his metalwork is absolutely stunning. A very talented craftsman from J.H blacksmithing. While Jerry does do work as a traditional blacksmith forging Rams Head fire pokers and fireplace sets, he specializes in making his traditional hunter/outdoorsman style of blades."

**Chainsaw Art** by **Joe Wavra**, of Klondike Carving of Red Lake Falls and his wife Chris live in a log home they built themselves in a beautiful area of Red Lake Falls, MN known as the Klondike. The land between the Clearwater and Red Lake Rivers that they call home has been a special place for centuries. Home of Native American settlements and a prominent trading post in the age of the Voyageurs, this place has a spiritual presence. Carving has become a part of Joe's life as he tries to capture some of the history of this unique place he calls home. Trappers, Voyageurs, Native American's, and the animals that they hunted are some of his specialties. Inspiration comes from long canoe rides where they come across some of the driftwood that become carvings of spirits from a bygone age. Joe and Chris are crafty people who can make most anything they put their minds.

**Mike Hoekstra** of Spike Air Studios of Grand Forks, North Dakota is armed with the philosophy "If it sits still, I'll paint

it," and a perfectionist's eye for detail, Mike Hoekstra is a multi-media artist with a wide interest in varying art forms and inspired by fellow artists. His primary artistic medium is airbrushing, but is also experienced in the use of watercolor, acrylics, oil painting, pencil & ink, and enamels.

Born and raised in Northwood, ND, he moved to Grand Forks, ND when he was 12 and where he still lives and has his studio. Mike has been artistic since his youth. As a self-taught artist, he took art classes throughout junior high and high school. He began airbrushing at age 14 while still working in traditional art mediums and drawing a lot of Kustom Kulture (also called Low Brow) Ed Roth style hot rod art. ## Grand Opening Held for New Redby Community Center

Maadaabiimong Maawanjii'idiwigamig Redby Community Center, Grand Opening

The new Redby Community on the Red Lake Indian Reservation recently held a ribbon-cutting ceremony for a much needed new Community Center, the old one falling into disrepair. The highly anticipated event was held on Tuesday, May 23, 2017 at 11:00 am.

Redby Representative to the Red Lake Tribal Council, Allen Pemberton, was interviewing with Lakeland News when the call came to move outside the building where several members of the Redby Community Board had set up a long and thick red ribbon. At the appropriate time Red Lake Chairman Darrell G. Seki, Sr. and Shakopee Mdewakanton Sioux Chairman Charles Vig shared cutting the ribbon with a giant scissors, the ribbon held in place by Redby Representatives Allen Pemberton and Julius "Toady" Thunder.

Chairman Vig was invited to represent the Shakopee Mdewakanton Sioux Community who provided funds for the large gym where current and future Ogichidaag will practice assuring further trips to state basketball tournaments.

Inside were four rows of tables and chairs donned with white table cloths beneath a half dozen basketball hoops. To the left food for the feast was being prepared. To the right and dominating the west wall where the speakers tables were set up, was a near life-size, full-color, high-resolution photo of the well-known Red Lake Chief, May-Dway-Gwa-No-Nind. (He Who Is Spoken

To) May-Dway-Gwa-No-Nind played a significant role in the 1889 Land Agreement that set the boundaries of Red Lake Nation and that resisted allotment.

The Chief insisted that the following words be part of the agreement, words that still echo down to the people to this day, the banning of liquor on the Red Lake Indian Reservation. May-Dway-Gwa-No-Nind, insisted: "That no liquor shall come upon this reservation. It would be the ruin of all these persons that you see here should that misfortune come to them." ~Chief May-Dway-Gwa-No-Nind during the Seventh Open Council to discuss the Land Agreement of 1889.

Spiritual Leader and Hereditary Chief Greeting Spears provided an invocation a spirit dish having been prepared. Spears also blessed the community center saying a prayer for all those present.

Red Lake Tribal Chairman Darrell G. Seki, Sr., then addressed the community in Ojibwemowin before switching to his second language, English. "This is for your kids to play basketball, a place for the kids to come after school. Your meetings can now be held in your beautiful building." He then thanked all those present and the drum, "Makoons Dewe'igan," Little Bear Singers.

Chairman Seki then introduced Chairman Vig. Vig thanked Seki and all those present. He said he was pleased to be a part of the building of the community center and other Red Lake building projects. He

then introduced three other Shakopee members traveling with him, including two young people.

Pemberton, the next of the speechmakers, spoke proudly of the community's Center. "We are grateful for the new community center and all those who came together to make this happen, including the Tribal Council, Sam Strong and Red Lake Economic Development, USDA, and the Shakopee Mdewakanton Sioux Community."

Next, Pemberton passed the mic to his Redby seat-mate Representative Julius "Toady" Thunder. "I am pleased at how the community center came together. Functional designs and space needs were part of the plan, including a full service, first-class kitchen including

a dishwasher all of which the community can be proud."

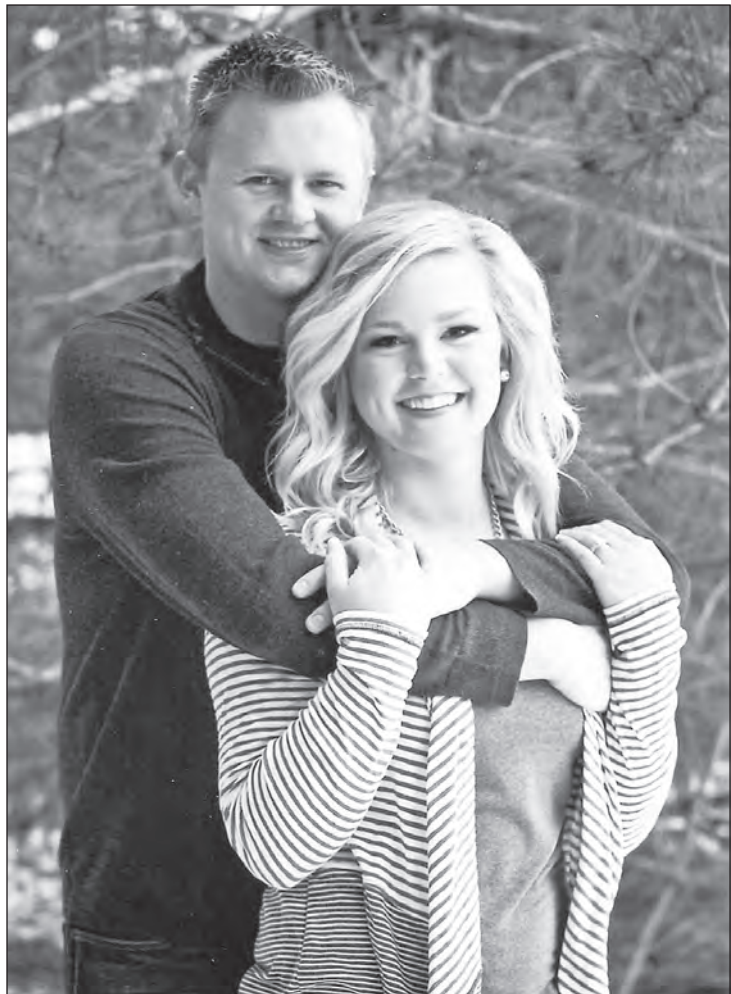

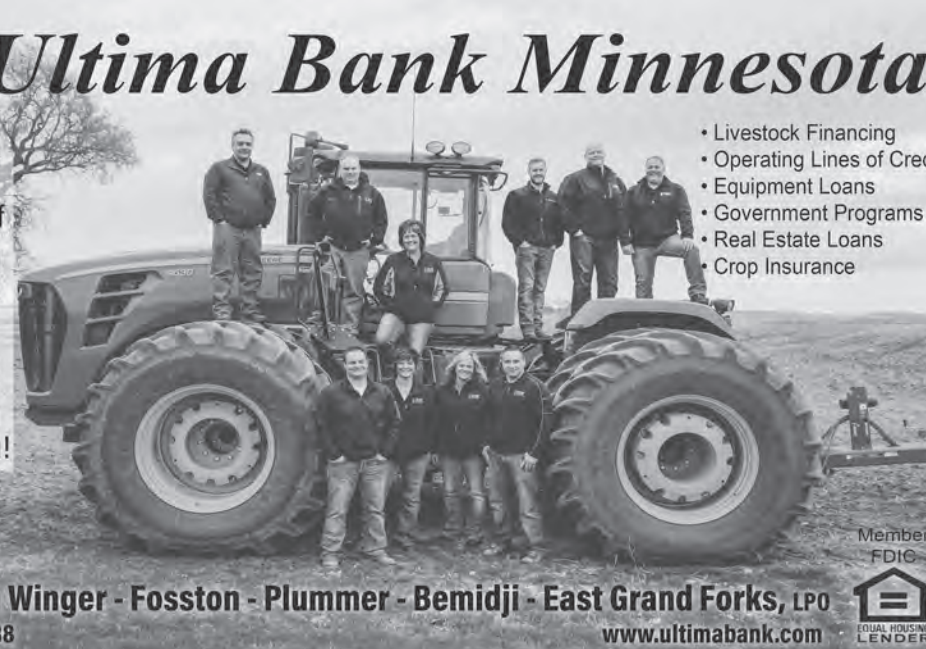

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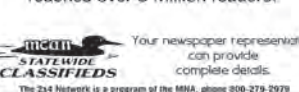

## The Farmall F-20

by Eric Mickelson

The Farmall Regular came into production in the 1920's. The new tricycle design proved popular and Farmall sales boomed through the late twenties and through the stock market crash of 1929. 1928-1930 average production was about 34,000 tractors per year. By 1933 barely 1000 were built, affects of the Depression had taken hold.

The F-20 had replaced the Regular in 1931 for production year 1932. It's improved engine gained approximately 10% more horsepower, about 20 on the drawbar and 27 on the PTO. The F-20's tricycle design continued to be popular with row crop farmers. The F-20 easily handled a 22 in. threshing machine and most equipment of the day.

When my dad moved to the farm a steel wheeled F-20 came with the farm they purchased. Being somewhat new to the farm he wanted his dad to start the tractor, but his dad was content to do the chores with the horses. But one dad talked grandpa to starting the F-20. They pulled it with the horses and dad got to drive it. The steel lugs and the frozen ground were not a good match, maybe the horses weren't so bad after all.

But dad developed a love of tractors and something that

has stuck with me all my life. I love talking tractors! So don't be surprised if you and I get into a conversation, eventually I will turn the subject to tractors!!

## Ask a Trooper

**Q u e s - t i o n :** I see vehicles go by with extended carted riers attached to their hitch with several full gas cans. We discuss what could happen if a driver was not paying attention and ran into one such vehicle. How safe can this be? Is there any laws in place that makes this unlawful?

**A n s w e r :** There is no law against having fuel containers on an extended carrier for non-commercial type vehicles. With that being said, I agree with you that it could be a very dangerous situation if a crash would occur.

I've investigated and witnessed vehicle fires and they tend to burn very fast when ignited by an outside source, electrical problem or engine fire. I have seen rear-end collisions where the fuel tank was ruptured and gasoline was dispersed at the scene, making it a very dangerous situation.

Newer vehicles are designed to keep the fuel from leaking out of the gas tank in the event of a crash by placing the tank in the safest location possible on the vehicle.

When it comes to gas cans/tanks that are placed on a cargo type carrier on the rear of a vehicle, it offers little to no protection if they are struck by another vehicle. If this occurs, fuel will most likely spill out of the tanks and potentially cause a fire to both vehicles.

There are laws that pertain to an extended carrier:

- The carrier and cargo must not block the rear view of the taillights and license plate
- The external cargo carrier must not extend four feet or more beyond the bed or body of the vehicle. If it does, the load/ carrier must have an additional rear light(s) when lights are required and when lights are not required, it must have a red, yellow or orange flag or cloth not less than 16 inches square.

I would also like to mention that there is a law for anything that is sticking over the sides of the vehicle that extends beyond the line of the fenders on the driver's side and extends more than six inches beyond the line of the fenders on the passenger's side.

Please place items like gas cans in an area where they have some protection if a crash would occur.
