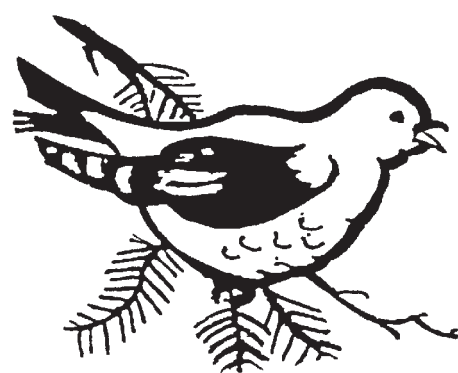

Summerfest Pageant to be held once again in Red Lake Falls

The Little Miss and Junior Miss Summerfest Pageants will return to Red Lake Falls Friday, July 24 at 7 p.m. at Community Hall.

The Little Miss division, which is open to girls ages 4 through 8, will be up first, followed by the Junior Miss division, which is open to girls ages 9 through 12. Both pageants are open to girls from all over the area, there are no geographical restrictions.

Entry fees are required for both pageants. The fees are used for costs associated with running the pageant and to purchase consolation prizes, which every contestant will receive.

In each division, one girl will be chosen as Little Miss or Junior Miss Summerfest. The girl chosen for this honor will be crowned and will receive the grand cash prize. Also in each division, a runner up will be chosen. They will receive a smaller cash prize.

The competition will consist of an introduction, answering an on-stage question and dressing in pageant attire.

Girls in the Junior Miss division will be required to perform a talent. Talents can be in any form and may include any of the following: singing, dancing, playing an instrument, skit, jokes, juggling, magic, readings or anything else the contestant desires. Talents should be limited to five minutes or less.

A changing area will be designated for girls who would like to wear a different outfit for their talent, though it is not required that they change. Any props or music that is needed for the talent must be provided by the contestant.

Contestants in both pageants will be rated by a panel of judges based on their poise, personality, appearance, speech and pageant attire. Girls in the Junior Miss division will also be rated on their talent. The highest overall score determines the winner.

The deadline to register a contestant in either division is Monday, July 13. There is a maximum of eight contestants allowed in each division, so early registration is recommended.

All contestants will be required to attend a rehearsal Thursday, July 23 starting at 7 p.m. at the Community Hall in Red Lake Falls. An ice cream social will follow. At this event, contestants will get the chance to meet each other and last year's winners, as well as enjoy free root beer floats.

Woman plead guilty on meth charges

Tambra Laws, 56, plead guilt to one count of third-degree possession of methamphetamine and Gabrielle Poitra, 42, plead guilt to one count of storing meth paraphernalia in the presence of a child or vulnerable adult. Both women face multiple charges with sentencing to be held August 5, 2015.

Drug charges are from a methamphetamine bust in April at a Bagley resident along with Darrin Forsberg, 44, who pleaded guilty June 17 to aiding and abetting possessin of methamphetamine with intent to manufacture. Another man, Andrew Chevalier, 53, of Bagley was also arrested and faces felony drug charges.

The Nerd

Opens July 20

The third show of the Thief River Falls Area Community Theater opens on Monday, July 20 and runs through Thursday, July 23. The Nerd, written by Larry Shue and directed by Barb Geer, is a zany comedy that will entertain audiences of all ages.

One of the funniest plays ever written, The Nerd is an extraordinarily inventive, side-splitting comedy first presented by the Milwaukee Repertory Theatre, then produced in Great Britain, then went on to Broadway. The action centers on the hilarious dilemma of a young architect who is visited by a man he's never met but who saved his life in Vietnam—the visitor turning out to be an incredibly inept, hopelessly stupid "nerd" who outstays his welcome with a vengeance. Shue delivers a neatly crafted package that uses some classic comic forms to bring the audience to its knees laughing.

The cast of The Nerd includes Matthew Linder as Rick Steadman ("The Nerd"), Jonathon Mansk, Lauren Rogalla, Stephen Moeller, Al Rogalla, Leah Wattenphul, and Ian Peterson. The production team for The Nerd includes Barb Geer, di-

rector; Teresa Rankin McGriff, stage manager and props manager; Philip Hoks, set design and construction; Max Anderson, lights, and Paul Tandberg, sound. Jean Larson will serve as the box office and house manager for this production.

Theology in the Trenches

Dear Denise

I received your letter today. Thank you for your candid words. I read them several times. It was a puzzle to me at how puzzled I was in my lack of knowing how to respond or if I need respond at all. You convicted me on several levels. Today,



have failed to reflect His mercy, grace, and Love...I want to ask you to forgive me for it is not mine alone...but yours as well. The second thing I felt was hope. Your words gave way a treasure buried deep within and if I have not told you before what I see in you, I will do so now. I see that His grace is sufficient. I see His compassion alight within you. I see a person who is made in the image of Christ as you reflect Him to the world. I see His love calling you, and as you listen to His still small voice, be assured He is awakening your soul to draw nigh.

As you expressed your most inward desire to give to others in your semi-retirement years and be part of a mission minded organization, I could relate. Purpose driven lives, in my estimation, are deeply gratifying as we connect with others for reasons well beyond ourselves. You mentioned that you need a reason to get out of bed in the morning, and that you long for a work environment which looks out for the betterment of others.

Your longing for a sense of community was among the many things you were craving. But then came the words...your words to which I was ashamed to say...I had no words. They read, "I am craving a sense of community, often supplied through a faith based relationship, not available to my atheist soul."

From the depths of those words rose within me two things, sadness and hope. The sadness wasn't for you, but for me. Your Firearms Questions Answered

This month's question is, "I know my rifle is accurate, but I have trouble getting decent groups from a bench, my friend says I flinch. How can I get rid of a flinch?"

The flinch is very common with any firearm having noticeable recoil or muzzle blast. It is not unusual to see flinching with shotguns, high powered rifles, larger handguns and the small pocket handguns. Usually it is due to anticipating uncomfortable recoil or noise. Some of the hardest flinching to cure happens with the compact light weight polymer framed pistols. While the calibers of these handguns are typically smaller and considered to be low recoil, the felt recoil is sharp and causes people to anticipate the muzzle flip and pull the muzzle slightly down at the moment the trigger is pressed. All the shots then go low. I've have seen shooters with such consistent flinching that the groups are very tight but always six inches below the point of aim with the sights already adjusted to the end of the movement. If a shooter without the flinch tries the same gun the groups will be four or five inches high.

The first step to conquering the flinch is to prove to yourself that you do indeed have a flinch. Another person watching you shoot may see it, but with all the recoil and noise, you may not believe you are flinching. The best way to do this is have a friend load your firearm for you. Your friend will either load a live round or a fired empty, but you don't know which. Pistols could have a few dummy rounds placed in the magazine randomly. When you fire, there is a good chance the round will be live, so you will be expecting recoil and blast. If the round is an empty, there will be no recoil and the flinch will be easily seen by observers and felt by the shooter. Try this several times. The most common flinch I see is dropping the muzzle at the moment the trigger is pressed to overcome muzzle flip. This causes the shots to go low. The second is jerking the trigger to the get the shot over-with. This is common in high powered rifles and handguns and usually causes shots to string out in the direction of the strong hand. A third type is a tensing of the

upper body at the moment of firing in anticipation of painful recoil. This typically happens with heavy recoiling firearms or people with a smaller body size shooting a poorly fitted firearm. Of course, there are many variations and combinations of flinching in addition to those three.

Once the shooter acknowledges that there is a flinch, we can work on eliminating it. Make sure the rifle is being held properly and tightly to the shoulder. A poor hold or poor stock fit can make recoil painful. This is exaggerated if the shooter is smaller or the rifle is lightweight. A heavier rifle can make recoil almost disappear. Anyone who has experience with the M1 Garand will probably tell you that 30-06's don't kick. Those rifles were gas operated, which absorbs some energy from recoil, and weight almost ten pounds! Try a 30-06 in a light weight six pound bolt action rifle and you will notice the recoil. The recoil is manageable, but many people will start to flinch after a box of shells through the light weight rifle. Just a proper hold will make the recoil more comfortable. Next, be sure they have adequate hearing protection. Plugs and muffs if necessary. Without hearing protection, the noise will make almost anyone flinch and will destroy your hearing over time. After that, I like to remind the shooter that the rifle is designed to safely transfer recoil to the body and that while it will push and shove and make a lot of noise, the rifle will not hurt you if you have the proper position. You know there will be noise and recoil, so just concentrate on trigger control and let the rifle buck. If the shooter can get in this mind-set the flinch will often go away and the groups will tighten up considerably. Just be sure to test yourself occasionally, because the flinch will try to come back. Until next time, keep both eyes open.

Clean Car, Polluted River

Did you know that by washing your car at home, you could be polluting a nearby waterbody such as a river, stream or lake? For some, washing your vehicle is a right of passage when we are transitioning from winter to spring. But did you know that all that grime on your vehicle has been noted as a serious contributor to water pollution. Dirty water containing soap, detergents, residue, gasoline, heavy metals from rust, and motor oils can flow directly to storm drainages and into the nearest river, stream or lake. This in turn harms water quality and wildlife species and habitat.

Phosphates from soap can cause excess algae grow which smells bad, looks bad and overall is bad for water quality. As algae decays, this process uses up oxygen in the water that fish need to thrive and survive.

The Environmental Protection Agency offers some best management practices when washing your car:

- Using a commercial car wash. Commercial car washes are designed to catch the water off of vehicles to recycle or treat.
- Washing cars on gravel, grass, or other permeable surfaces.
- Blocking off the storm drain during charity carwash events or using an insert to catch wash water.
- Pumping soapy water from car washes into a sanitary sewer drain.
- If pumping into a drain is not feasible, pumping car wash water onto grass or landscaping to provide filtration.
- Using hoses with nozzles that automatically turn off when left unattended.
- Using only biodegradable soaps.

If you are still wishing for that extra shine and clean, Rodale's Organic Life website offers some tips on how to make your own protectant.

Interior: Mix 1 part fresh lemon juice with two parts olive oil in a small bowl. Dab a small amount on a soft cloth and rub it over plastic and vinyl surfaces. (Do not rub on surfaces that shouldn't be glossy or slippery)

Exterior: Mix up your own batch of green car wax using linseed oil, pure carnauba wax, beeswax, apple cider vinegar (for detailed instructions on green car wax visit www.rodaleorganiclife.com/home/organic-way-wash-your-car).

By using these few best management practices and organic protectants, you too can make your mark on improving water quality in the Red River Basin. Washing one car may not seem to be a problem, but by spreading the word and educating others on environmentally friendly car washing tips, together we can make measurable improvements in water quality.

Ask a Trooper

Question: I was wondering if it is illegal to have the ball hitch in the receiver of my truck if I am not pulling any trailers at that time? Also is it illegal to have more than one ball on my bumper?



Answer: No, it is not illegal to have a ball hitch in the receiver of a truck when not pulling a trailer at that time. It is not illegal to have more than one ball hitch on the bumper. But with that being said, you need to be aware that multiple ball hitches on the bumper could obstruct the rear license plate. According to Minnesota State Statute 169.79 Subd. 7 "All plates must be (1) securely fastened so as to prevent them from swinging, (2) displayed horizontally with the identifying numbers and letters facing outward from the vehicle, and (3) mounted in the upright position. The person driving the motor vehicle shall keep the plate legible and unobstructed and free from grease, dust, or other blurring material so that the lettering is plainly visible at all times. It is unlawful to cover any assigned letters and numbers or the name of the state of origin of a license plate with any material whatever, including any clear or colorless material that affects

the plate's visibility or reflectivity."

The ball hitch needs to be a device approved by the commissioner of public safety. The ball hitch must be of sufficient strength to control a trailer. A ball hitch attached to the receiver can have the receiver detached and removed when not

in use, especially if it is causing an obstruction.

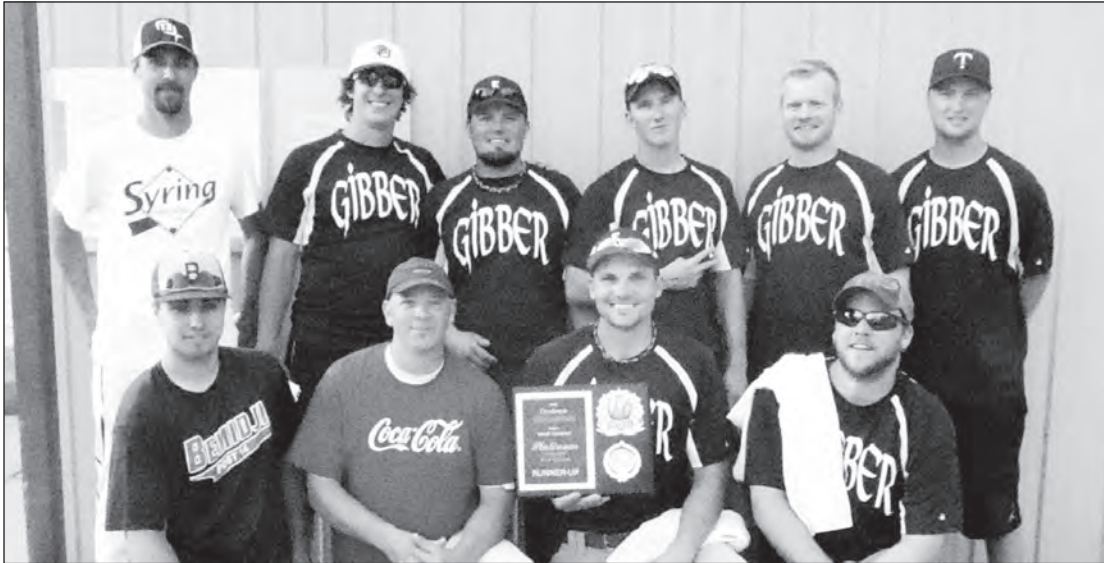

Wildlife Drive opening July 18 at Roseau River Wildlife Management Area

The 27-mile "Wildlife Drive" through the Roseau River Wildlife Management Area (WMA), 20 miles northwest of Roseau, will be open to vehicular travel July 18-26 and the following weekends through Aug. 16. The drive traverses wetland, woodland, brushland and farmland habitats, providing visitors ample opportunity to see wildlife.

Roseau River WMA is one of the viewing stops along the Pine to Prairie Birding Trail, which consists of 45 sites spanning a 223-mile corridor from pine to prairie in the northwestern part of the state. These sites offer some of the most spectacular birding in the state, along with scenic beauty and friendly communities.

The viewing route also cuts through the northern reaches of the Juneberry 3 wildfire, which burned an area in excess of 30,000 acres in October 2011. The fire opened up stands of woody vegetation, creating new foraging sites for birds and mammals and improving nesting cover for a wide array of birds for years to come.

Approximately 149 bird species breed within the Roseau

River WMA. Yellow rails, horned grebes and Western grebes are a few of the rare breeding species found within the area's vast wetlands. Along the drive you may also encounter trumpeter swans, loons, white pelicans, sandhill cranes, great blue herons, eagles, a variety of ducks and other water birds, sedge wrens, yellow warblers, Nelson's sharp-tailed sparrows, black bears, deer, beaver, otter, muskrat, red fox, gray wolf and the occasional moose.

Aside from excellent wildlife viewing opportunities, the WMA "pools" offer spectacular year-round northern pike fishing opportunities. Visitors typically fish along the dike roads or near the water control structures. When the dike roads are closed to motorists, visitors can bike to Pool 1 West or Pool 2 from the parking areas. During the waterfowl hunting season only, motorboats of 10 horsepower or less may be used on the Roseau River WMA.

The Wildlife Drive can be easily accessed at the main dike road, located one and three-quarter miles south of the WMA headquarters on Roseau County

Road 3. Only motor vehicles licensed for use on public highways are legally permitted to operate on this road. Motorists are urged to use caution due to narrow roads, soft shoulders, deep ditches and two-way traffic. The speed limit on all WMA roads is 20 mph. Note that the wildlife drive may be closed due to inclement weather or road construction.
