The Rodeo is coming to the Fair

115th Red Lake County Fair - June 23, 24, & 25

Red Lake County Fair is coming to Oklee June 23-24-25. This year marks the first time the Red Lake County Fair has offered a Rodeo as part of the events. The two day Rodeo will be a fun and exciting event to go to this year. Advance Tickets will be sold for the Rodeo and Baja Race until the 22th of June. The Advanced Tickets are available at Brooks and Oklee Cenex, Plummer Creamery, Carol Cozy, Wrights Consignment in Red Lake Falls, and Oklee Lumber. Tickets will be available at the gate the days of the rodeo.

The Red Lake County Fair's Rodeo is coming with two days of rodeo events. It is the 1st year that the Fair Board has hosted the rodeo. The rodeo events start at 6:30 p.m. on Friday, June 23 and Saturday, June 24. This rodeo has been dubbed "the best little rodeo around" and provides up close and personal views of rodeo livestock and dangerous bulls from the WoJo Rodeo Company. There are bucking broncos, trick riders, rodeo clowns, barrel racers, steer wrestlers, calf ropers, and bull riders to keep you entertained throughout the show. Many of these riders are competing for monetary prizes, and some local riders are trying to vie for prize money for their very first time. There are nine full events for both evenings, and there will be a rodeo activity for the little buckaroos during intermission both evenings.

There are going to be several different vendors such as jewelry and apparel vendors, many food vendors, a coffee wagon, and Watkins. At the fair there will also be several service organization such as ICCC and GVTEL with valuable information.

Red Lake County will kick off fair week with an opening ceremony on Friday, June 23, at 8:30 a.m. in front of the Red Lake County Central School. After the ceremony there will be donuts and coffee for the public. Starting at 9:00 a.m. the public is welcome to enter their projects in the Open Class entry. The Fair is looking forward to many new exhibitors for the Open Class. This is where you can shine with your project or gardening skills can be entered and win premiums.

At 1:00 p.m. Senior Citizens are invited to attend the Senior Citizen event at the Oklee Community Hall where an Outstanding Senior Citizen Award will be given out. Play BINGO to win prizes.

Grab a friend and meet at the East side of the RLCC High School for a scavenger hunt at 4:00 p.m. At 5:00 p.m. is a 4-H horse show.

The Friday night WoJo Rodeo starts at 6:30 p.m. After the Rodeo, come on down to the Dance at the Barn. The band playing on Friday night is "Gravel Highway". There will be food and beverage vendors at the Barn.

On Saturday, June 24 at 8:15 a.m. 5K registration begins on the South side of the RLCC High School. If you are interested in taking part in the 5K, contact Jessie at Jessie.hamrum@gmail.com.

From 10:30 a.m. to 12 noon, there will be kids and adults games at the school. A Bounce House will be set up and open at 11:00 a.m.

Many demo demonstration will be going on from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. Bobbie Olson will be doing Sign Making classes with a cost of \$25.00. There will be Rosemaling with Connie Nelson. Pat Asselin will have a demonstration on Daisy Pop Bottle Flowers. Thief River Falls Model Railroad Organization will have Model Train Demonstrations. There will be a demonstration on T-shirt Bags with Shirley Dessellier. The t-shirt will be provided which means no cost. During this demonstration you will be able to learn how to sew a straight seam. The Otter Tail Power Company will have a class on high wire electrical safety. There will be Peg Loom Weaving and Carding Machine with Aleza Olson and Nancy Vraa.

More than 320 persons, including 255 registered members, were in attendance at the 112th annual membership meeting of Garden Valley Telephone Company held at the Win-E-Mac School auditorium near Erskine on Tuesday, June 6, 2017.

As members registered and received their attendance gift, entertainment was provided by "The WoodPicks," a northern Minnesota band specializing in Gospel, Bluegrass, Country and Americana music. Members and guests were also treated to coffee and donuts prior to calling the business meeting to order.

A resolution to amend Article III, Section 1 of the By-Laws was voted on by ballot and passed. The business meeting included reports from President Jerry Freitag, Treasurer Jim Ferden and CEO/General Manager Tim Brinkman. Corporate Counsel Chuck Fitzgerald reviewed By-Laws information relating to director qualification and voting; and the election of directors for Districts 2, 5 and 8 was held. Human Remains located along the Red River in Polk County

On 6/10/2017 at approximately 2:42pm the Polk County Sheriff's Office received a 911 call from a boater on the Red River reporting what appeared to be human remains on the east bank of the Red River. Polk County Sheriff's Office deputies responded to section 29 of Higdem Township, to the riverbank and recovered human remains which have been transported to the Medical Examiner's Office located in Grand Forks, ND.

Update: 6/12/2017
This case continues to be under investigation. The Sheriff's Office is working with the UND Medical Examiner's Office and other Law Enforcement agencies in an effort to secure records and any information which may aid in identifying the human remains. As this matter is under investigation, no other information will be released at this time.

Answer: When we receive a call that a vehicle is traveling the wrong way, we treat this as an emergency and respond to the area as quickly as possible. Our goal is to get the vehicle stopped before a crash occurs. I have investigated far too many head-on crashes where occupants have lost their lives or were seriously injured due to a vehicle going the wrong way.

Drivers end up going the wrong way on a road for many reasons: Driving under the influence, confused, fatigued, not knowing the area or are

unfamiliar with the road or they may be suicidal.

If you ever encounter a wrong-way vehicle coming at you:

- Slow down and move to the right as far as you can.
- Stop on the right if you have time.
- Be aware of vehicles behind you if you need to break hard.
- Try not to swerve off the road or into other lanes at high speeds.
- If you have time, honk your horn, flash your headlights and activate your hazard lights.
- If stopped, call 911 and report your location and a description of the vehicle.
- Never turn around and follow or chase a wrong-way driver, as it will put yourself and others in danger.
- Get in the habit of driving

in the right lane if you are on a two-lane same direction road, because wrong-way drivers tend to be in your left lane.

This is one example of why we encourage people to wear seatbelts, avoid distractions while driving, never drive while impaired and obey all traffic laws, as it could save your life if you ever encounter a wrong-way driver.

Charles City, Iowa-Oliver Fun!!

It is that time of year, haying season!! So my wife said hey let's go on a little trip to visit my relatives in Iowa, before you have to start haying. Sounds good! But, I did have a little idea.... they don't live far from Charles City, Iowa.....home of Hart-Parr and Oliver. I thought they must have a museum there! Time for a little research. Yes, the Floyd County Museum. In 1999, the museum opened it's climate controlled exhibit area featuring farm tractors, tools, and implements. Sounds good to me!

So after stopping in Winona, MN, to do some visiting with family and friends we were off to Charles City. The handy iPhone took us right to 500 Gilbert Street where we were welcomed by a friendly and helpful staff. After getting the lowdown and a map of the museum we were off to explore. The first thing we walked into was a Minneapolis Moline Model R on display, along with some other MM items from the Minneapolis Moline Collectors organization. Right next door was the Tractor Edition featuring Hart-Parr, Oliver, and White equipment. This room had many items and artifacts from the Hart Parr, Oliver, and White plant that operated in Charles City from 1901-1993.

When I walked down into the “tractor” room it was like a movie when the treasure hunters finally lay their eyes on that treasure.....TA-DAH!!! What a nice collection of Oliver tractor history. One of the most interesting pieces of history was an experimental Oliver tractor. The Model XO-121 was built in 1953. It is painted opposite the usual Oliver them with the tractor being red and the wheels green. Oliver was experimenting with high compression engines. This tractor had a 4 cylinder engine generating a 12:1 compression ratio(hence the name XO-121). The tractor was never put into production, although some features were used in the Oliver “Super” series of tractors. Yet another interesting display showed something I had never seen, an Oliver out-board motor. These were made in the Battle Creek, Michigan, plant in the 50's and 60's. And don't forget the Oliverettes. This was a group of women who drove specially equipped Oliver tractors to do a “dance” routine. They apparently stole the show at the Iowa State Fair in 1959.

We left the tractors and toured Legel's Drug Store. What a huge complete collection and reconstruction of John Legel's Drug Store! Then the Log cabin featuring sounds of the fire and wildlife. I could go on and on. What I am saying if you are ever in the vicinity, I would highly recommend a stop at the Floyd County Historical Museum.

I know if I'm back in town I will stop again!

Lakeland Public Television will not be televising BSU home Men's hockey games this season

Lakeland Public TV's (LPTV's) CEO Bill Sanford announced that LPTV will not be televising BSU men's Beaver hockey home games for the 2017/18 season.

Over the past few months, LPTV had several meetings with BSU's Athletic Director Tracy Dill. In addition, Dill has been meeting with BSU staff including BSU President Dr. Faith Hensrud on the topic. In recent meetings, Dill notified LPTV that BSU wishes to significantly change the terms of the agreement that had been in place since LPTV began broad-

casting men's Beaver hockey home games back in 2010.

The proposed terms would now require a substantial rights fee payment to BSU. BSU's reasoning for the new rights fee was strictly a financial one. Dill cited concerns that LPTV broadcasts may have caused significant reductions in ticket revenue and attendance. Due to BSU's newly proposed requirement of a substantial rights fee, there just isn't enough revenue to support the added expense.

"While I'm certainly disappointed, I respect BSU's decision and wish them the best going

forward." said LPTV CEO Bill Sanford. "If we look at all of our costs including depreciation, last year we were close to breaking even. If we add in a new substantial rights fee payment to BSU, the budget just doesn't work. While we're thankful for the generous support we received from our sponsors over the years, there just aren't enough business sponsors or individual contributors to support the cost of televising the games with substantial new expenses."
