Red Lake Minneapolis Housing Project Awarded \$2,718,591 from City

Mino-bimaadiziwin (The Good Life) Housing Project at former Amble Warehouse Site

Mino-bimaadiziwin was awarded \$2,718,591 from City of Minneapolis on Friday, one of largest Affordable Housing Trust Funds awards ever approved.

The Red Lake Band of Chippewa Indians are proposing to develop a 109-unit mixed use development adjacent to the Franklin Avenue Metro Blue line LRT station at 2105 Cedar Avenue South, the former Amble Warehouse site. Mino-bimaadiziwin (an Ojibwe phrase meaning "the good life") will offer efficiencies, one, two and three bedroom units in a six story building with ample green space, shared underground parking, and a complete amenity package. The Red Lake Band will co-locate their Wellness Center and Red Lake Nation Embassy on the building's first floor. Mino-bimaadiziwin provides mixed-use, mixed-income, workforce housing for families on a distressed site along a transit-oriented commercial corridor.

This development is important and ground breaking for multiple reasons:

- It addresses the lack of affordable rental housing which disproportionately affects Native Americans;
- Mino-bimaadiziwin is one of first Tribal inspired, sponsored, and developed housing developments off Trust land;
- Culturally appropriate services are co-located with affordable housing;
- The location allows for a TOD development with access to jobs, education, entertainment and services; and
- The addition of 109 housing units, an Embassy, and Wellness Center will completely transform a blighted site adjacent to an LRT station.

The Red Lake Band of Chippewa Indians wants to permanently move the dial on the Native American experience by developing a mixed use development that combines housing with a Wellness Center and Red Lake Nation Embassy at the gateway of the American Indian Cultural Corridor. RLBC thoughtfully selected this site for its first development off the Red Lake Reservation because this is where many of their members live. Housing for Native Americans in the urban core has been developed, but not by a Tribe. The location on the Cultural Corridor along Franklin Avenue represents an opportunity for Native Americans to create a community destination and source of pride. Mino-bimaadiziwin augments the Cultural Corridor through creating a comprehensive, holistic living environment that blends housing and traditional healing practices with contemporary therapies.

Mino-bimaadiziwin is also a mixed-income development, recognizing the need to holistically provide housing that serves LTH households alongside households with incomes at the 50% and 60% Area Median Income levels. Efficiencies and 1-bedroom units are offered to encourage community elders to live in community with young families.

In addition to the Red Lake Band of Chippewa Indians, the Mino-bimaadiziwin development team includes Cunningham Group Architects; Loeffler Construction (MBE/WBE); Plumer Law Office (MBE); Woodstone Builders, Inc.; Westwood Professional Services; and Landon Group (WBE).

The Heartland Museum in Clarion, Iowa

Last week on our little vacation to Iowa I got to stop at a museum I have been by many times, but had never had the "time" to stop. I have seen The Heartland Museum many times before when we were visiting and had seen episodes on RFD-TV showing off some of the collection there. Finally we had planned a visit without any deadlines...what a relaxing mini-vacation.

The Heartland Museum features many interesting artifacts of Wright County Iowa along with many pieces of Larry Maasdam's tractor collection. There is a 1930's street, a 1950's street a salute to veterans, and Alvina Sellers, Iowa's Hat Lady, has 302 of her 6000 hats on display. You can also watch a video of her on the David Letterman Show! I have never been to a more well kept museum!! But, now the fun starts.....

My favorite part of the Heartland Museum was the tractors. Many of the tractors belong to Clarion resident, Larry Maasdam. These tractors are immaculately restored and many of them are unusual and rare. First we were taken to a huge steel building a 1/2 block down the street from the main museum. Inside was the Big Bud 16-747! I have seen this on TV before although I was not prepared for the actual size.... it was huge! The wheels were 40 inches wide and about 8 feet tall. It was quite a site to see!!

The rest of the shed was filled with mostly Hi-crop tractors that had been collected from

California and various southern states where Hi-crop models were used. I have seen a few Hi-crops in my life, mostly John Deere and International/Farmall. This building included many Hi-crops. Oliver, Case, and even a Minneapolis Moline were represented here.

Next we went into the main museum. One of the most interesting pieces in there to me was an "iceless" icebox. This device had round shelves and a crank on top. When you were done using it you simply turned the crank which lowered the contents of your icebox down into the cellar or a hole in the ground to keep your food items cool! After a bit we got to the Agricultural Hall which contained the tractors and many many other ag-items. Have you ever heard the saying....like a kid in a candy shop? Well, that was me! We walked up one aisle and down the other with the advantage of an excellent tour guide. On top the tractors every town in the county had a room to decorate how they wanted. This was an excellent idea and superbly done. Larry's wife, Melanie, also has a huge and beautiful collection of buggies and other horse drawn equipment.

While we were there, there was a group from Germany and

Farmers Do This

Earth trodden soil layered in animal waste finds footing for the farmer. Knee high boots are rubber stamped with the proof of ...as there is no time like the present to work the current of cattle coming through the gate.

Windy the day is, overcast and drizzly as the scent of the natural drifts across yard. The breeze sends chills as I watch from second floor window cracked wide. Sights and sounds dance upward as the clamor below hits notes that beat out the rhythm, the heartbeat of farm life.

In low tones, the farmer speaks. "Go on...go on..." and into the chute the cattle lunge one by one.

The farmer isn't a high-roller. He merely rolls with a solid foundation doing basics well. His steps are planned. Methodical and intentional they are. That is how he succeeds at what he does, and that is how he helps others succeed.

On his day off, the farmer takes no time off. The lawn must be mowed, a customer needs product, the cattle need feed, a fence needs mending, and a meeting where wise men pray to lay a solid foundation gather. And so, the farmer gath-

ers. He gathers himself up and he goes, or works, or prays.

There's a ruckus outside the window. The cattle being worked are not happy to be contained in the container. They are suspicious. They do not understand, and they resist. It would be easier if they would cooperate. Their master wants good things for them, but they do not trust. The farmer sees the big picture, the cattle do not.

The master knows their needs, and there is a system that works. He is the gatekeeper. In a blink of an eye they are in and out of the chute if they cooperate. If they do not, it's a long and much more painful process.

As the final group of eight is rounded up, the farmer climbs up, over, in and through the pen to make sure the cattle are se-

cure. Literally, his life is on the line. That is what it looks like from where I watch as he tends his cattle with due diligence.

Like a shepherd caring for his flock, he watches over. He takes his rod into the herd to guide them safely through the process. He coaxes once more. "Come on...come on."

It is noted that some listen, and some do not. And, so it goes. Those who listen are quickly released and able to run in the freedom of green pastures that await.

The farmer is weary. The farmer's wife can see. It is sacred to watch off duty.

"Your rod and Your staff they comfort me" (Psalm 23:4). As does the rod of the farmer...it guides...it protects...it is a loving rod directing that which he is called to direct. Amen.

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Ask a Trooper

Question: I was told that the speeding fine in a construction zone had gone up recently. Could you also explain the Zipper Merge for merging into construction zones in Minnesota?

Answer: With a recent area work zone crash that left two people injured, this is a great time to talk about work zone safety.

During the spring and summer months, construction season is in full swing in Minnesota and motorists risk their lives and the lives of others by not slowing down and paying attention.

- In the past five years (2011 - 2015), 39 people have died and more than 3,700 people injured in work zone traffic crashes.
- In 2015, 10 people died in work zone traffic crashes, the most since 2010 (12).

Safety Tips:

- When driving in a construction zone, slow down. Work zone fines for speeding are more than \$300.
- Put the distractions away.
- Distracted driving is a leading factor in crashes in Minnesota and a driver needs to focus 100 percent of their attention on the road.
- Move over for construction workers and their vehicles, as it will provide safety for not only the workers but the motorists as well.
- Never drive impaired.
- Wear your seatbelt as it can save your life.
- Check out 511mn.org for road closures, detours and traffic incidents.

Zipper Merge

The Minnesota Department of Transportation urges motorists to use both lanes of traffic in a construction zone. Traffic

should not merge together until reaching the designated merge area. At that time, vehicles should alternate in a "zipper" fashion into the open lane.

Some drivers slow too quickly and move over to the lane that will continue through the construction area. This driving behavior can lead to unexpected and dangerous lane switching, serious crashes and road rage.

Some motorists will intentionally drive slow or block the lane that is closing because they believe drivers trying to "beat" the traffic are rude. This is not only dangerous and can lead to a crash or road rage but it's also illegal. Remember, the driver using the open lane is following the proper way to merge.

Studies show that the "zipper merge" works the best to keep traffic flowing, especially when there is a lot of traffic, by:

- Reducing differences in speeds between two lanes.
- Reducing the overall length of traffic backup by as much as 40 percent.
- Reducing congestion on freeway interchanges.
- Creating a sense of fairness and equity that all lanes are moving at the same rate.
