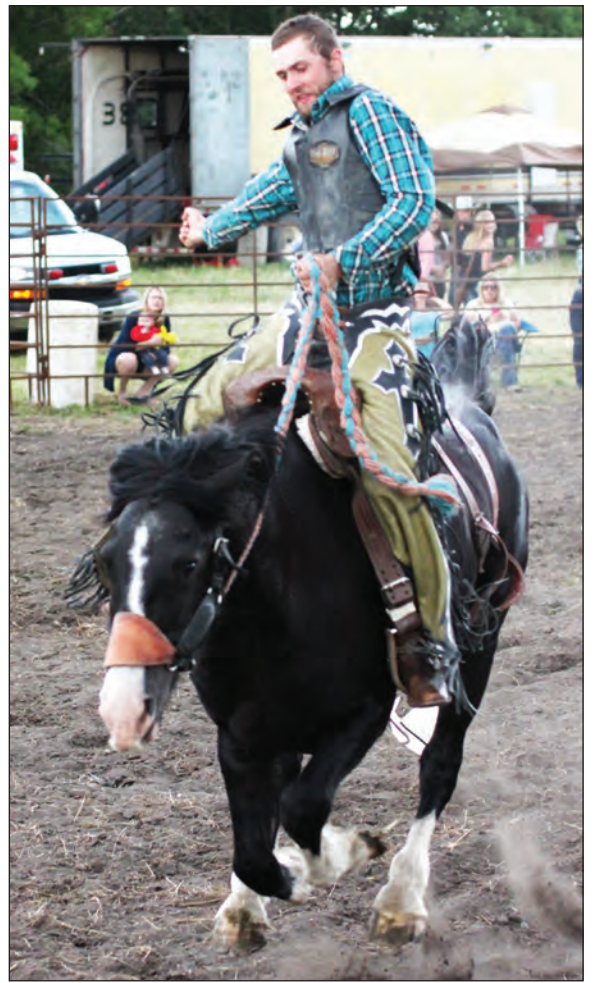

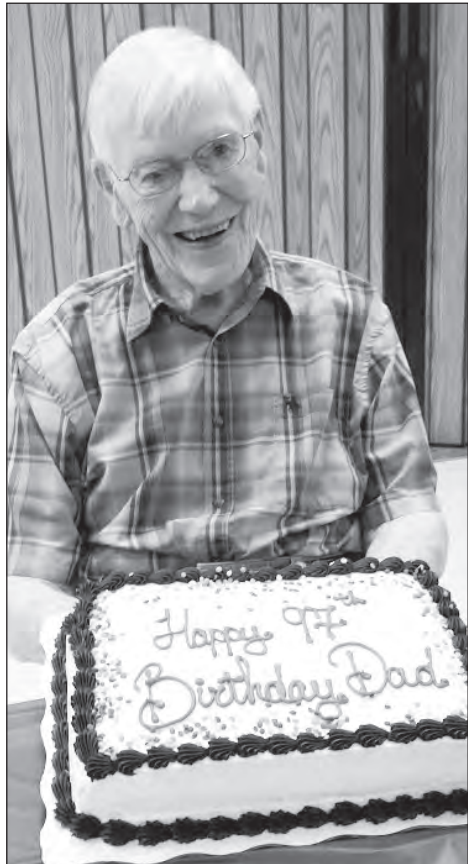
Gonvick Lion's Rodeo, held Friday and Saturday, was a hit for kids and adults

J.I. Case

J.I. Case was born in New York, in 1819. His father Caleb was a farmer. His mother, Deborah Jackson(Case), belonged to the same family tree as President Andrew Jackson. J. I. became interested in farm equipment at a young age. He and his father attended a demonstration for the Groundhog thresher. Both J.I. and his father were impressed. His father purchased a thresher and J.I. worked for him doing custom threshing. At this time in history many "easterners" were moving to the "midwest." J.I. purchased 6 Groundhog threshers. When he arrived in Chicago(after traveling the Great Lakes), J.I. demonstrated the threshers to well off farmers in the region. He ended up in Racine, Wisconsin, in 1843.

J.I. had an idea for his own threshing machine. By 1847 Case was the largest employer in Racine, WI. In 1869 in addition to threshing machines Case added the steam engine to his product line. After the Civil War Case adopted the Eagle as its trademark. The original design showed the eagle on a branch, but eventually evolved into an eagle perched atop the globe.

During the Independence Day celebration in Plummer we had a great example of a 1943 SC Case. It is owned by Brock Tvedt, a young member of the Tri River Pioneers.

The SC was tested at about 27 hp on the drawbar and

just over 31 hp on the belt. Production began in 1941 and continued for over a decade. The Case SC and DC versions were famous for the long steering arm that was out in front. Some say they were good for

hooking the fence row if you were not careful. Regardless of your favorite brand or color those orange Cases have always been appealing to me. Maybe if I talk nice to Brock he'll let me take it for a spin!!!

In that appreciation for Brun and his family, in May 2003, the council established the Gerald F. "Butch" Brun Memorial Scholarship Fund. The fund would award a \$3000 scholarship each year to a Red Lake member, who is a college student, in good standing, and studying in a human services field.

The resolution also stated that the scholarship would be determined by a committee of the family's choosing

and be announced each July at the monthly meeting of the Red Lake Tribal Council each year. An essay submitted by candidates was part of the application.

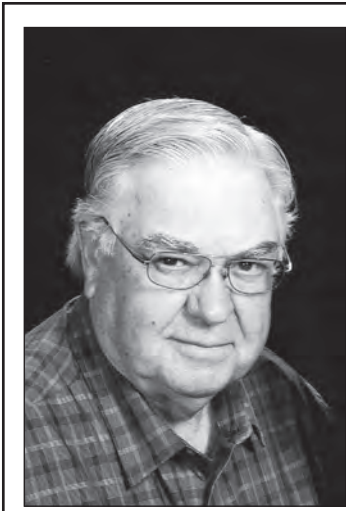

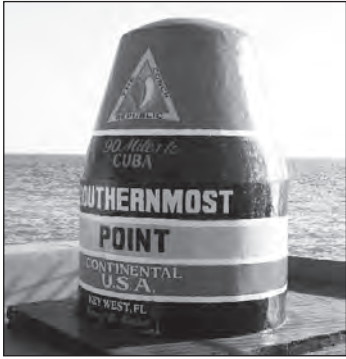
Northernmost Point Buoy Created at the NW Angle of Lake of the Woods

Angle Inlet, MN - It's the northernmost point of the continental U.S. It is where the 14,552 islands begin. It's an area that people actually have to drive through Canada to get to unless they go via water or ice. It's where many people come to get away from life and experience world class fishing, resort life, beauty, nature and some cheap psychology. It's Minnesota's NW Angle.

For some time, there has been the idea of having an icon or buoy marking the northernmost point of the continental U.S., much like Key West, FL has the southernmost point buoy. The idea has come to fruition and is ready.

The northernmost marker is located at Young's Bay Resort in the community of Angle Inlet, MN. Young's Bay was chosen as it is where the main marina is located for visitors and residents who are staying on one of the island resorts or cabins amongst the islands of the NW Angle. It is also adjacent to the bar and restaurant of the Angle called Jerry's is located where folks will stop in for their favorite beverage or a good burger.

Fishing is the main draw up at the Angle. Over a dozen resorts cater to visitors and provide a variety of accommodations from simply a cabin all the way up to a full service resort that provides bar, restaurant, satellite TV, Wi-Fi and guided fishing. Some anglers fish amongst the islands of MN.



Others fish the Ontario side of the lake which is literally a long stone's throw off the dock of many of our resorts. The Ontario side of the lake offers another 40 miles of world class fishing, delicious shore lunches, islands and beauty.

There is so much more to experience at the Angle than fishing however. The NW Angle has approximately 110 permanent residents. Some live on the mainland called Angle Inlet. Others live on islands. There is the only one room school in the state of MN that has grades K - 6. There is history in Ft. St. Charles, pictographs on rock walls and Massacre Island. There is nature, with deer, bears and wolves calling this area home as well as a wide variety of birds and other wildlife on display daily.

If you haven't experienced the NW Angle, it's hard to explain the feeling one gets at the Angle. It is a good feeling, one that reaches deep into your soul. It feels like it is a place where true relaxation can really take place.

DNR to modernize its electronic system for hunting and fishing licenses

Hunters, anglers and everyone who has a role in selling licenses for the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources can anticipate a new electronic license system that will enhance customer service starting in the spring of 2020.

“Over the next two years, we

will be modernizing the electronic license system to create a better and more efficient experience for customers – changes that will save the agency as much as \$1.5 million,” said Steve Michaels, DNR licensing program director. “Customers will find it easier to purchase

licenses and tags online and record their harvests from a mobile device or computer 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.”

The DNR sells licenses through a vendor that administers the electronic license system that allows customers to buy licenses in-person at nearly 1,500 locations around Minnesota, online and by telephone. The contract with the current vendor expires in 2020.

The first step in modernizing the license system happened in late May when the DNR issued a request for proposals for contractors to bid on a project to develop a new system.

“The new system won’t go into effect for more than two years but we have to begin work now to allow enough time to choose a vendor, design and implement the system, and communicate with customers and license sales agents,” Michaels said. “Across the spectrum of retail, customers are demanding the convenience of modern technology as part of their purchasing experiences, whether it is movie theaters, airlines, or retail stores.”

The DNR sells about 1.5 million fishing licenses and 580,000 hunting and trapping licenses.

Use of the current system continues through March of 2020, and the DNR plans to provide regular updates through the development of the new system.

Buy fishing and hunting licenses at any DNR license agent, online with a mobile or desktop device at mndnr.gov/buyalicense, or by phone at 888-665-4236. Mobile buyers receive a text or email that serves as proof of a valid fish or game license to state conservation officers.

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
