Bemidji State University welcomes 800 new freshmen with Orientation and Welcome Week activities

Bemidji State University's class of new students for the 2017-18 academic year, which includes a freshman class expected to number around 800 students, will get its first taste of college at the university's Orientation weekend, Aug. 18-20.

Orientation welcomes all students who are new to the university, including both first-time college students and students transferring to BSU from other institutions.

The schedule of activities begins with the BSU residence halls' annual Move-In Day on Aug. 18 and continues with a series of activities for new students and their families throughout the weekend. BSU's traditional Convocation ceremony will take place on Friday night at 5 p.m.

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The Asham Stompers, a high-energy jig and square dance group from Manitoba, will perform Aug. 26 and 27 at the Chautauqua and French-Canadian/Metis Festival at Old Crossing and Treaty Park.

Asham Stompers returning to Chautauqua and French-Canadian/Metis Festival

The Asham Stompers are returning to the Chautauqua and French-Canadian/Metis Festival. The jig and square dance group performed in 2013 and 2015 and received standing ovations at every performance.

The dance group from Manitoba will perform Saturday and Sunday, Aug. 26 and 27, at Old Crossing and Treaty Park near Huot, MN. All the performances are free and always bring joy to audiences.

The Stompers help re-capture and preserve the history of the Métis people through the traditional dancing. They have fun and enjoy the richness of the Métis tradition through the Red River Jig, which has been done in First Nations communities for so many years.

The group, which is half Metis and half First nations, combines the Red River Jig with square dancing, adding some new steps to the traditional dance of the Canadian Metis.

"There is no language in dance. Everyone understands dance," said Arnold Ashman, founder and leader of the group.

The high energy group, formed in 2002, has traveled from Mexico to China. They did six performances at the 2010 Winter Olympics in Vancouver, British Columbia, and more recently toured Mexico and Cape Breton Island, Nova Scotia.

"It's our way of reaching people, instilling pride and we know we can help bring about change," Asham said.

The Stompers perform to music by fiddler Shawn Mousseau of Lake Manitoba First Nations. He takes off his shoes and chords with his toes while playing the fiddle.

A newcomer to the festival, Tom Brosseau, an internationally known folksinger/songwriter based in Los Angeles, Calif., will share songs and stories of his native North Dakota. He will be on stage Aug. 26.

Also on August 26, which has been designated as Voyageur Day, Double the Trouble 13-year-old twins from Winnipeg will perform traditional Metis songs along with original and contemporary music.

The Confused Brothers Band, a five-man folk-funk group from Minneapolis, will follow Brosseau.

Saturday will close out with Mass at 5 p.m., an AFRAN supper (\$10 donation requested) and a dance at TNJ's in Red Lake Falls at 9 p.m.

August 27, First Nation Day, will feature Corey Medina and The Brothers of Bemidji. They combine storytelling with blues, rock and folk music.

Hip-hop artist "Thomas X" Barrett and Brendan Strong will lead a program featuring poetry, Ojibwe hand-drum and flute playing, singing and youth dancers from Red Lake.

The festival begins Aug. 25 with a potluck picnic and a hayride at 6:30 p.m. and a bonfire, songs and storytelling at 8:30 p.m.

Throughout the weekend, there will be programs, demonstrations by artists and artisans, arts and crafts displays and activities for children.

Food, including French Festival specialties such as Tourtiere (meat pie) and bread baked in the earth oven will be available.

Admission is free and the public is welcome to all events in the park.

The Old Crossing and Treaty Park is on Red Lake Co. Road 3 and seven miles northeast of Gentilly on County Road 11 or 10 miles southwest of Red Lake Falls.

The festival, presented by AFRAN (Association of the French of the North), emphasizes the French heritage and celebrates the multi-cultural heritage of the Red River Valley.

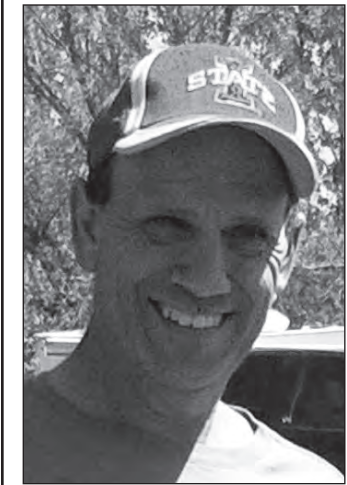
