Hunters should note errors in printed hunting regulations handbook and map

Hunters should be aware of several errors in printed copies of the 2017 Minnesota Hunting and Trapping Regulations Handbook and in the fold-out deer season map that accompanies the regulations booklet.

In the fold-out map, correct information is as follows:

- In central and northwestern Minnesota, deer permit areas (DPA) have 500 permits to harvest antlerless deer for DPA 197; 300 for DPA 262; 150 for DPA 269; 25 for DPA 270; 350 for DPA 271; 200 for DPA 272; and 100 for DPA 297.
- In 300 series permit areas, DPA 344 is designated as Hunters Choice; DPAs 341, 342, 343 and 347 are Managed; and DPA 346 is Intensive.
- The list of affected permit areas related to the section titled "Deer Permit Area Boundary Changes Along the Moose Range" should include DPAs 178 and 181.
- Permit area 340 under the Hunters Choice deer area heading doesn't exist and should be deleted.

In the printed booklet, correct information is as follows:

- The special youth deer hunt schedule on page 36 should include information on a hunt at Blue Mounds State Park. Mention of the hunt on page

87 should be deleted. The hunt is being held Nov. 18 and 19. There are 10 permits available.

- The closing date for a proposed late season deer hunt on page 62 is Jan. 14.
- The list of permit areas for which the landowner licenses is valid on page 67 should include DPA 218.

- The bag limit is three for the special archery deer hunt in the city of New Ulm on page 93.
- The special firearms deer hunts list that begins on page 85 should include a special hunt at Zumbro Falls Scientific and Natural Area (SNA) in Wabasha County from Nov. 18-26. It is hunt number 923.

- Dates for the special firearms deer hunt at Vermillion Highlands Research, Recreation and WMA on page 86 should be Nov. 4-17.
- Firearms deer licenses for the A and B season are valid for the Carver Park Reserve special hunt on page 87.

- The Itasca State Park special hunt on page 85 has a bag limit of 3.

"We apologize for these errors and will take steps to ensure that we can avoid these errors in the future," said Paul Telander, DNR Wildlife Section chief. "We're working with license vendors and stakeholder

organizations to ease any confusion by directing hunters to correct information posted online and encouraging hunters with questions to call the DNR information center at 888-646-6367."

Correct information for all of these errors is available at www.mndnr.gov/regulations/ hunting in the online versions of the 2017 Hunting and Trapping Regulations Handbook and fold-out deer map.

Firearms and muzzleloader hunters who want to harvest antlerless deer in a permit area designated as lottery this hunting season are reminded they must purchase their license by Thursday, Sept. 7. Hunters who purchase their license before this date are automatically entered into the lottery for the deer permit area or special hunt area they declare.

Letter to Mark Dayton, Governor

Dear Governor Dayton and Commissioner Rothman,

The proposed Line 3 Replacement Project (L3R) is a vital energy infrastructure project for Minnesota and the region. We write to express our ongoing concern about the many delays in the regulatory process for this project. We ask that you instruct your agencies to expeditiously move the project forward with no further delays, and for the Department of Commerce to encourage the Public Utilities Commission to do the same.

This \$3 billion investment in basic American infrastructure is important to our nation's economy. It will create thousands of good-paying construction jobs and provide millions in much-needed tax revenue to local governments across northern Minnesota.

There is simply no disputing the fact L3R will improve safety and environmental protection by replacing the current aging pipeline infrastructure. Delay would offer no environmental benefit.

Instead it would do the opposite by keeping crude oil transportation in aging pipeline infrastructure that has been identified as in need of replacement for integrity reasons. Economic security and environmental safety should not be held hostage by a proxy war against petroleum use, which is not directly relevant to this project. LR3 in no way hinders the use or development of alternative fuels. It simply facilitates safe transportation of the petroleum our economy currently requires.

Enbridge has been responsibly operating existing pipelines in Minnesota for decades. The company provides living-wage jobs and pays significant taxes across the state, along with transporting the energy we need. This is a fact often taken for granted.

There have been remarkable delays on this project. Enbridge applied for the Line 3 Replacement project in April 2015. To date, an unprecedented amount of public outreach, research and hearings has been conducted:

- Since April 2015, the Department of Commerce has held 49 public meetings (15 in August 2015, 12 in April/May 2016, and 22 in June 2017).
- There have been numerous public comment periods for the public to weigh in.

In September and October of 2017, the Administrative

Law Judge will open another public comment period and hold 18 additional meetings, bringing the total of public meetings to 69.

Throughout the process, the Public Utilities Commission has regularly added time to the schedule, far exceeding statutory timelines, for more public input.

Enbridge has also been proactive in meeting with community members, holding open houses and answering questions about the project. Since 2013, Enbridge has held more than 1,200 open houses and Q&A sessions along the project's preferred route, the existing right-of-way, the alternative routes and in the Twin Cities metro area.

The project's Draft Environmental Impact Statement (DEIS) more than adequately complies with both the language and the spirit of the Minnesota Environmental Policy Act (MEPA). MEPA requires agencies to take a "hard look" at potential environmental impacts. It does not dictate endless review, nor is it intended to stop important energy infrastructure projects from happening at all. The DEIS addresses the full scope of potential project impacts, and including but not limited to:

• Alternatives. The DEIS includes an analysis of a wide scope of alternatives, ranging from "no action" to minor route deviations to entirely different routes.

• Natural Resources. Impacts of construction on natural resources, including water resources, plants, and wildlife, are comprehensively identified and discussed.

• Tribal Resources. This process included more extensive tribal outreach than the State of Minnesota has ever before conducted for energy infrastructure projects, and a discussion of that outreach and its results are provided in the DEIS.

• Disposition of Existing Line 3. The DEIS includes a thorough analysis of pipeline abandonment (i.e., in-trench deactivation) and removal, including an identification of the significant human and environmental risks of pipeline removal.

• Crude Oil Releases. The DEIS includes discussion and analysis of the potential for and impacts of an accidental release, including the incorporation of analysis prepared by subject matter experts at the direction of the Department.

Greenhouse Gas Emissions. The DEIS includes an analysis of greenhouse gas emissions. On this point, it is important to remember that L3R is a replacement project – the existing Line 3 pipeline is already operating and transporting crude oil.

Although L3R will restore the existing line's historical operating capabilities, it is not expected to expand production or consumption of crude oil.

The most recent delay announced by Governor Dayton August 9 is yet another example of the agencies' serial inability to meet deadlines. The Department of Commerce consistently exceeds statutory and regulatory time frames, as does the Public Utilities Commission, which has added yet another layer of review to the project. While the DOC may be issuing the Final EIS this week, the project has a number of steps to go. We ask that you instruct your agencies to increase coordination between themselves, under close supervision of your office, to ensure progress and accountability. Regulatory fairness and predictability, along with robust government review and oversight, are critical to attracting and keeping economic development in Minnesota. You have indicated this is a top priority for you, and it is for us as well.

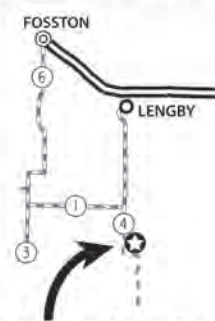

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High school students from Crookston, Warren, Sacred Heart, Fosston and Stephen-Argyle recently participated in RiverView Health's Scrubs Camp.

Area Students participate in RiverView Health's Scrubs Camp

Could it be the future individual to cure cancer was among the students at RiverView Health's Scrubs Camp last week? It could be. Anything is possible in health care. That's what area high school students found out at the camp held in Crookston Aug. 8th-10th.

Twenty-one students from Crookston, Warren, Sacred Heart, Fosston and Stephen-Argyle took part in the free camp put on by RiverView Health. Students attended sessions lead by RiverView staff in the categories of nursing, Rehab Services, Laboratory, Diagnostic Imaging, CPR/AED, casting in Orthopaedics, dietetics,

anesthesia and medical social work. The students also did a variety of hands-on activities in several service lines; including laparoscopy, sterilization and spent time in RiverView's learning lab.

The camp gave students the opportunity to hear of the challenges, opportunities and rewards of a variety of health careers, and get acquainted with RiverView should any of them choose a career that would lead them back to RiverView.

Studies show that there will be a shortage of about 90,000 physicians in the year 2020 and an even greater gap of about 130,000 in 2025. RiverView is

working to pique the interest of area students in an effort to stave off those trends.

Part of the camp also included trips to the University of North Dakota Medical School, Grand Forks, and Northland Community and Technical College, East Grand Forks, for tours and further information on the education and training involved in a variety of health-related professions.

One student credited RiverView Chief Nursing Operator April Grunhoyd with helping her realize that "...you can go pretty much anywhere as an RN (registered nurse)". Another

student stated that she enjoyed "being able to talk personally to health professionals...and see physicians in their work environments." Overwhelmingly, the students suggested the next camp be expanded to include even more time for learning the ins and outs of healthcare.

"This opportunity was absolutely amazing and I am so thankful for it...The whole camp outdid all of my expectations," concluded one student.

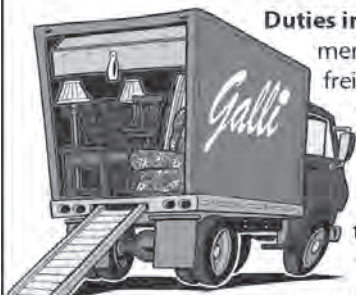

Tractors, Tractors, Tractors!! I love them all, but of course the special ones are the ones that have stayed in the family. Another story often shared by tractor lovers or collectors is when a family tractor was sold or traded off and with some luck they have been located and purchased and brought back to the family. We are lucky to have two of my grandfather's tractors, an A and B John Deere, still in the family. We also have several tractors my dad purchased and used on the farm.

Usually on the weekend I have a chance to do a little tractor "research"! I love to go to a show or a sale or somewhere that I can check out a few tractors. Unfortunately this weekend was too busy for that. I sure hope some of you had a chance to go to McIntosh and enjoy their tractor day. It is a GREAT parade and I enjoy the tractor pull. Sadly I had to be gone so I was not able to enjoy this awesome day. Another event was the Grygla Fall Festival/Grygla Centennial Celebration. I imagine there were a few tractors in that parade too. Once again they were at the same time and I was gone. If you hadn't gathered by now I was very sad to miss these events!

Fortunately through today's social media I saw a picture that made me smile. It was a picture of a former student and friend of mine, Adam Sjulestad, from Star Township, driving his grandfather's R Minneapolis Moline in the Grygla Centennial Parade. Like I said earlier, man I love to see a tractor that is still in the family. Besides that I am a sucker for Minneapolis Moline tractors.

In 1887 the Minneapolis Threshing Machine Company (MTM Co.) was formed. They started with threshing machines and eventually manufactured steam powered tractors. In 1902 the Minneapolis Steel and Machinery Company (MS&M Co.) was also founded. Their engineers developed a light weight tractor line using the name Twin City. Due to a depressed farm economy the MTM Co, MS&M Co., and the Moline Implement Co. of Moline, Illinois, merged on March 30, 1929. They formed the Minneapolis Moline Power Company. They manufactured tractors under the Twin City name until 1938. After that the name of the tractors was changed to Minneapolis Moline. The also then took on the pretty yellow and red paint scheme. The first of these "Visionlined" models was the model "Z". The models "U", "G", and "R" followed in the companies letter series of tractors. Many models were produced under the Minneapolis Moline name until Minneapolis Moline, Oliver, and White merged into the White Motor Company. By 1974 the Minneapolis Moline name was dropped and all tractors were manufactured under the WHITE name.

I am so glad that Adam shared his picture so I could reminisce about family tractors and Minneapolis Moline. Someday when you are not busy I'm going drive up to Star Township and take the R Minneapolis Moline for a drive!!

Ask a Trooper
by Sgt. Jesse Grabow Minnesota State Patrol

Question: I have discovered that the stop light in my town does not recognize a bicycle. Just wondering how to make a left turn legally? Any suggestions? Is the traffic signal sensitivity adjustable?

Answer: A person operating a bicycle or motorcycle may enter or cross an intersection controlled by a traffic-control signal against a red light in the following conditions:

Safety is Key: Recreation on the Red River

The warm spring, summer and early fall months bring people near rivers and streams to enjoy the serene nature landscape that rivers and streams offer. It is important to understand water safety in and around these areas. These rivers and streams far too often look incredibly peaceful, warm and refreshing but can prove to be deceptively cold and easily overwhelm even the strongest swimmers and recreators.

Each year, unexpected victims, whether specifically recreating or accidentally falling in the water will find themselves in a rescue type situation. Recreation.gov offers some key things to consider when the spring snow melts and rivers and streams are on the rise but also in late summer/early fall when waters appear to be warm or slow moving.

- Water Temperature: Air temperatures may feel hot and the water may feel or appear warm, but temperatures can be extremely cold below the surface. Hypothermia can quickly set in and overwhelm even the strongest of swimmers, becoming too weak to escape.
- Currents: In as little as six inches, water that may look

calm on the surface and slow-moving can have enough force to knock you off your feet and sweep you downstream. Even a slow current can take you where you don't want to go, towards hazards, and leave strong swimmers unable to reach the shore.

- Water Hazards: A slippery and uneven river bottom combined with the stream's current can suddenly sweep you off your feet. Debris and underwater features such as trees, branches and logs, and even narrow gaps between rocks can trap you under water, causing hypothermia or even death.

Recreation.gov also suggests that in the event you fall in, use the defensive position: on your back, feet pointing downstream and on the surface (can you see your toes?). Never go in the water after someone in trouble. Rescue from shore and get help.

Riverkeepers.org also offers some suggested times in which you should limit or avoid recreation on rivers and streams. They suggest limiting water sports after a significant rainfall of a half inch or more. Rainfall in these amounts can cause a significant increase in flow of stormwater to our streams and rivers. These increased flows may carry bacteria from numerous sources. Riverkeepers.org suggests that during this time, limit exposure risks by refraining from activities that submerge the head and face. Also, the Department of Health discourages water contact within 200 feet a running storm drain as these waters may contain high levels of harmful bacteria which may cause illness.

If on your next outing you plan to head to the river, plan ahead and remember to keep safety your top priority. Do your homework and do not go alone

but most importantly enjoy this precious resource we have in our backyards. And you may just be amazed at the beautiful scenery you can experience down by the river.

- the bicycle or motorcycle has been brought to a complete stop;

- the traffic-control signal continues to show a red light for an unreasonable time;
- the traffic-control signal is apparently malfunctioning or, if engineered to change to a green light only after detecting the approach of a motor vehicle, the signal has apparently failed to detect the arrival of the bicycle or motorcycle; and

- no motor vehicle or person is approaching the street or highway to be crossed or entered or is so far away from the intersection that it's not an immediate hazard.

The affirmative defense in this subdivision applies only to a violation for entering or crossing an intersection controlled by a traffic-control signal against a red light and does not provide a defense to any other civil or criminal action.
