Major Delvin L. Schmunk retires from the United States Air Force

RED LAKE - At a ceremony held at the Red Lake Nation College on Saturday, August 19, 2017, Red Lake Band member Major Delvin L. Schmunk, retired from the United States Air Force after serving 20 years.

Schmunk is the son of LaVonne “Mickey” Schmunk. He is a 1988 graduate of Gonvick-Trail High School.

He also thanked his wife Miki, son Kentaro and daughter Mariko for their support over the years and with the many moves across the country during his tour of duty.

Major Delvin “Chief” Schmunk is an Airpower Strategist assigned to the Headquarters Air Force Directorate of Strategy, Concepts and Assignments, Deputy Chief of Staff, Strategic Plans Programs and Requirements, Pentagon, Washington, DC. This selectively manned position provides strategy expertise in the Air Staff's operational think tank advocating the proper role of air power. In this role he assesses threats, ascertains implications to join force and creates innovative solutions to future operational challenges. He integrates diverse conceptual work into the AF strategic planning framework from war games and experimentation and connects concept developers in and outside of the Air Force.

Major Schmunk entered the Air Force in 1992 through Basic Military Training School at Lackland AFB, Texas. After a four-year active duty enlisted career, he completed his Bachelor's degree and reenlisted in the Air Force Reserves before receiving his commission through Officer Training School at Maxwell AFB, Alabama in 2001. He has served as a Special Duty Postal Specialist, Intelligence Apprentice, and as a Space and Missile Operations Officer. He also has instructor and curriculum developer experience in Space and Missile Operations, as well as joint staff experience as a Security Countermeasures Officer.

During his most recent assignment with the Squadron Officer College at the Air University, Maxwell AFB, Alabama, he was the Division Chief of Distance Learning. He led a 16 member team of active duty reservists, civilians and contractors in planning and execution of professional development education for 3K+ students annually.

Area fire departments to receive grain bin rescue units from AgCountry Farm Credit Services

Six fire departments in the Red River Valley area will receive grain bin rescue units this fall courtesy of AgCountry Farm Credit Services. AgCountry started its Grain Bin Rescue Program in 2017 to help support rural communities and promote farm safety, and through the program donates a number of grain bin rescue units to area fire departments. Included in the rescue equipment is a 10-panel system, slide hammer and other accessories designed by rescuers specifically for grain bin entrapments.

Applications were accepted through July 31, and over 40 applications were received from departments throughout eastern North Dakota and western Minnesota. The departments chosen to receive the units are:

- Cavalier Fire Department
- Fordville Fire Protection District
- Fosston Fire Department
- Hawley Area Fire Department
- LaMoure Fire Department
- Lisbon Fire Department

Selection was based on current department resources, geographic area served and proximity to other grain bin rescue units in the area. The winning departments will receive their units and undergo training on them in September and October.

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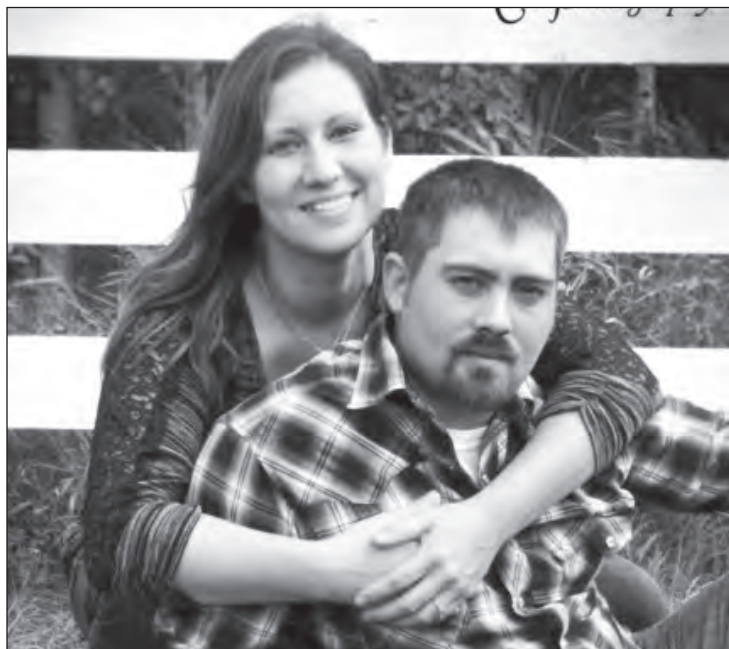

Polk County Sheriff

On 9/5/2017 at 1736 hours the Polk County Sheriff's Office assisted Grand Forks and East Grand Forks Police Departments with a pursuit. The pursuit began in the city of Grand Forks, continued through East Grand Forks and into the county where Polk County deputies took over. Stop sticks were deployed and the vehicle was eventually stopped using a PIT Maneuver in rural Fisher near the intersection of Polk County Roads 9 and 223.

26 year old Kyle Martin Heintz of Grand Forks was taken into custody and is being held at the Northwest Regional Corrections Center in Crookston. He is charged with fleeing in a motor vehicle, DWI, possession of a controlled substance, and possession of drug paraphernalia. Heintz also had outstanding warrants in both Minnesota and North Dakota at the time of the pursuit.

No injuries were reported as a result of the pursuit.

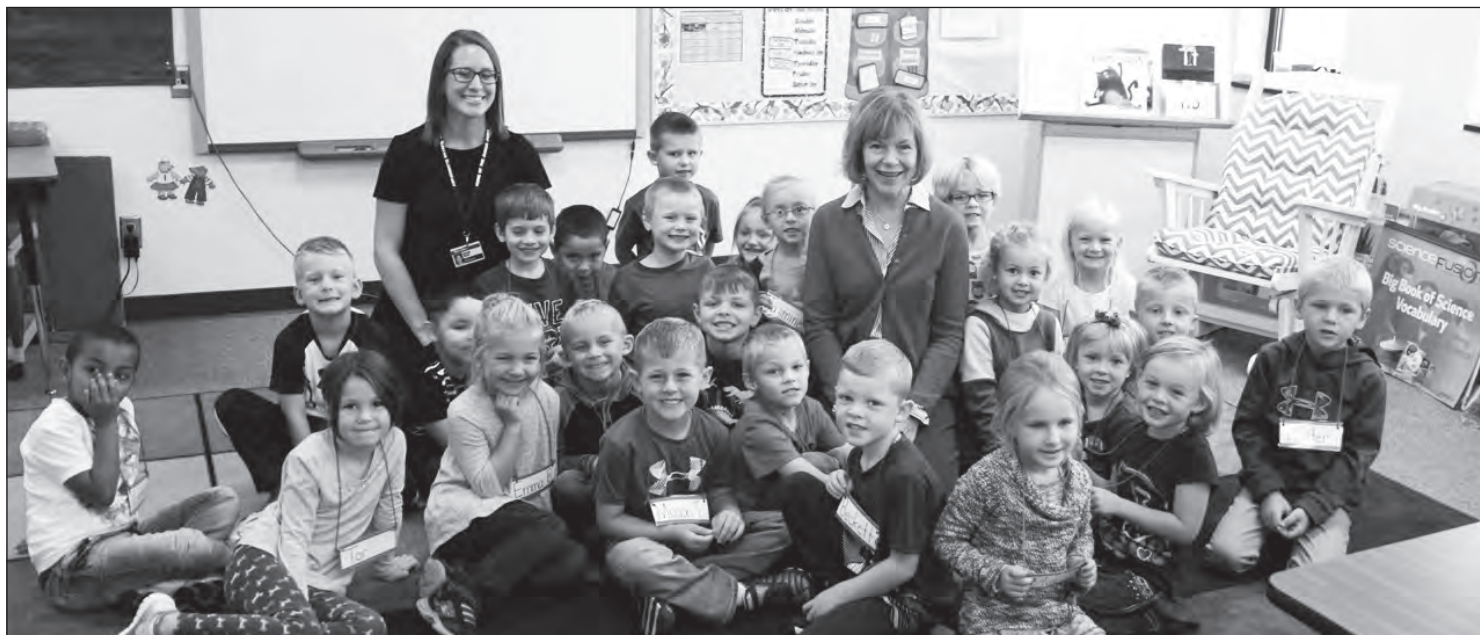

Lt. Governor Smith Visits Paul Bunyan Elementary School in Bemidji and Lowell Elementary School in Duluth

Since taking office, Governor Dayton has secured \$2 billion in new funding for voluntary preKindergarten, all-day Kindergarten, and essential E-12 student funding

Despite significant progress, thousands of young learners across Minnesota will still lack access to affordable early learning opportunities, compounding persistent achievement gaps

ST. PAUL, MN - With more than 860,000 students returning to class across the state this week, Lt. Governor Tina Smith today visited Paul Bunyan El-

ementary School in Bemidji and Lowell Elementary School in Duluth. This year, thanks to investments secured by Governor Dayton and Lt. Governor Smith, Bemidji Public Schools received \$208,000 and Duluth Public Schools received \$100,000 to expand their preKindergarten programs. Overall, the Governor and Lt. Governor have invested an additional \$2 billion in E-12 education since 2011. This new funding has made it possible for 22,500 kids to attend preschool this fall, along with more than 57,400 kids now attending all-day Kindergarten across the

state.

"Kids walking into school today are finding better classrooms, textbooks, and opportunities than they had just a few years ago," said Lt. Governor Tina Smith. "I am proud that Governor Dayton has invested \$2 billion in new funding for our schoolkids, to increase access to early education, ensure classrooms have the best teachers and materials possible, and promote greater opportunities for Minnesota families."

During the visits, Lt. Governor Smith reiterated her and Governor Dayton's continued

commitment to expanding access to preKindergarten for all Minnesota four-year-olds, noting that additional investments in the state's youngest learners are necessary to prevent achievement gaps and increase opportunities for all Minnesota kids.

The \$2 billion in new education funding invested since Governor Dayton took office in 2011 includes \$257 million to help young learners across Minnesota attend early learning programs, along with \$1.73 billion in new investments for all K-12 student.

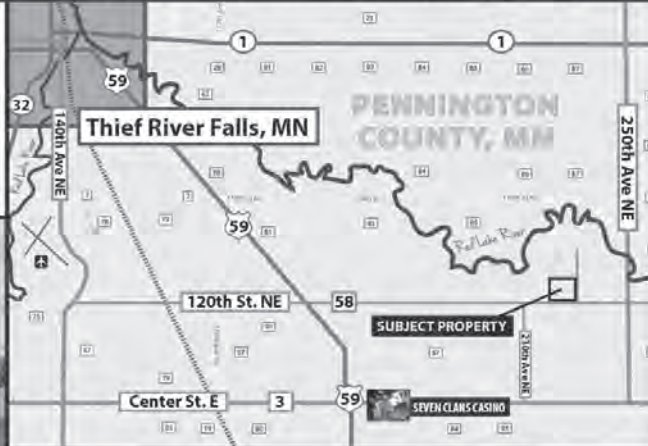

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Ask a Trooper

Question: Recently you talked about the stop arm on a school bus. My question is, if a school bus is stopped on an undivided highway, with the red lights flashing but no stop arm extended, may I proceed around the bus after I stop and it is safe to do so? (I would guess the bus driver is waiting for kids to come out of the house to get on the bus but are running late).

Answer: Even with the red

lights flashing and no stop arm displayed, you must stop and stay stopped until the red lights are turned off.

- Motorists must stop at least 20 feet from a school bus that is displaying red flashing lights and/or its stop arm is extended when approaching from the rear and from the opposite direction on undivided roads.

- Red flashing lights on buses indicate students are either entering or exiting the bus.

- Motorists are not required to stop for a bus if the bus is on the opposite side of a separated

roadway (median, etc.) — but they should remain alert for children.

Skirting around playground, kids, trees, and cement walkways, soon, the mango truck finds respite as it skids to a halt. Engine off now, it rests.

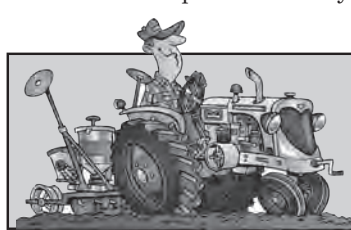

Northland Threshing Bee E-4 Coop

In the early 1800's the United States began to attract European immigrants. Some came for freedoms promised in America. Some came to escape crop failures and poverty. Some came for land which was much more prevalent than in many smaller crowded countries in Europe. One such immigrant was James Cockshutt. He and his family came to Canada, in 1827, with hopes of migrating further to Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. Upon arriving in Montreal he entered into a partnership starting a general store in Toronto. The business was successful and in the 1830's his son, Ignatius, opened a branch of his father's store in an area nearby known as "Brant's Ford." Eventually the Toronto store was closed and business was focused in Brantford, Ontario.

As the industrial revolution swept across North America it was now 3rd generation businessman James G. Cockshutt (Ignatius's son) that saw the need for farm implements to farm the prairies of Ontario. He opened the Brantford Plow Works in 1877. The name was later changed to the Cockshutt Plow Company.

After a while the company wanted a tractor. At first they marketed and Allis Chalmers tractor with the Cockshutt name on the gas tank. When that deal fell through they began marketing green Oliver Tractors, but they were painted red and had the Cockshutt name on them. During WWII the Cockshutt factory went into war production like many factories of the time. Cockshutt then decided to work on their own tractor! They released the Cockshutt 30 in 1946. It was painted red and sold in Canada. To expand their market the same tractor was painted orange and renamed the E-3 Coop. They were sold at various farmers cooperatives in the United States.

A bigger brother to the Cockshutt 30 came out in 1949. It was the Cockshutt 40! The 40 was tested with about 43 horsepower on the belt. Last week end I was at the Northland Threshing Bee near Strathcona. On display there was the Coop version of the Cockshutt 40, and E-4 Coop. It had been restored by the Badger Tractor Club. They were selling ticket to win the E-4.....so of course I had to buy a couple tickets. Now I just have to clean out the shed so when I win the tractor I have a place to keep it!! I happen to know the shop teacher, Mike Colton who works with the tractor club. He has fixed up some nice tractors over the years, which I have so far been unable to win!

Now that is a shop class I would like to be in! If I could turn back time and make myself a high school student again, I might transfer to Badger so I can be in the tractor club!

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4-H Youth Exhibit Their Best at 2017 Minnesota State Fair

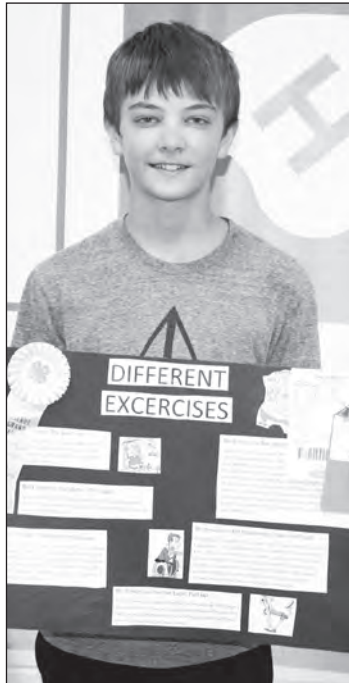
Red Lake County 4-H Members Experience the Minnesota State Fair
