Gonvick Native, Steven Richards, concludes his military career

The Navy Retirement Ceremony is a long-standing tradition meant to celebrate the conclusion of a successful military career, to bid farewell to a shipmate as he departs from active service to rejoin the civilian community.

Steven M. Richards joined that group in June of this year with a ceremony before 190

people at the officers club on Whidbey Island Naval Air Station in the state of Washington.

The arrival of the official party, the parade of colors, the National Anthem before the invocation was led by Pastor Debra Benson, Steve's pastor at Anacortes Lutheran Church.

Guest speakers included CDR James Rankin and Cap-

tain Geoff Moore Commanding Officer at NAS Whidbey Island.

Commander Richards was born and raised in Minnesota and graduated from Gonvick-Trail High School in 1987. He was commissioned from the University of Minnesota NROTC unit with a Bachelor of Mechanical Engineering. He met his wife, Jeni Holland, in one of their engineering classes at the University and were married in June of 1990.

Steve earned designation as a Naval Aviator on December 17, 1993 after flight training in NAS Whiting Field, Florida and NAS Corpus Christi, Texas. The same town that their first son Conner was born in November 1993.

He was with Patrol Squadron EIGHT stationed at NAS Brunswick, Maine with two Sigonella deployments and one Keflavik/Panama/Puerto Rico tri-site deployment in 1995. Leaving his family for over 6 months each time and his second son Daniel who was born in Maine in April 1995.

In 1999 he was with Patrol Squadron THIRTY at NAS Jacksonville, Florida as a flight instructor.

His next assignment was Patrol Squadron Special Projects Unit TWO stationed at MCBH Kaneohe Bay, Hawaii in February 2001 where he was a World Traveler to parts unknown to the family.

October 2003 saw the family moving again to Patrol Squadron FORTY-SIX at NAS Whidbey Island, Washington where he was deployed twice with VP-46 to the SEVENTH Fleet AOR.

He joined US STRATCOM at Offutt AFB, Nebraska in November 2006 where he served in the Plans and Policy Division.

His next assignment was a desk job and not as a pilot as the Executive Officer for the Navy Recruiting District in Seattle in 2009 and then the command in 2010. He was responsible for all Navy recruiting efforts within Alaska, Montana, the northern Idaho panhandle and the majority of Washington State.

The Navy found out that he had been in the Navy over 20 years and he had only been a pilot and at a desk and needed to be on a ship. In May of 2012 he reported to Carrier Strike

NAS Whidbey Island is the home of all Navy tactical electronic attack squadrons flying the EA-6B Prowler and EA-18G Growler.

Group ELEVEN as Anti-Terrorism Force Protection Officer and as the fleet Admiral's Liaison Officer. He embarked on the USS Nimitz and was deployed until November 2014. It was during that time that the Nimitz sailed through the Suez Canal, which was the first time

a west coast based carrier had been in the Mediterranean Sea.

His last assignment was as the base Executive Officer at Whidbey Island Naval Air Station

His personal awards include the Defense Meritorious Service

Medal, two Meritorious Service Medals, two Strike Flight Air Medals, five Navy Commendation Medals, (one with Combat Distinguishing device), and three Navy Achievement medals as well as other unit and service awards.

Gonvick residents heading to Washington D.C. to advocate for Duchenne muscular dystrophy treatment

Gonvick residents Cheri and John Gunvalson and their son Jacob will travel to Washington, D.C. to attend a Federal Drug Administration, FDA public forum on September 28th that will help decide if a treatment their son is on will be approved in the U.S. Their son was diagnosed with Duchenne muscular dystrophy (DMD) and is currently enrolled in a clinical trial for a drug called Translarna.

A FDA advisory committee will listen to and review advice and insights from outside experts including doctors and patients who have had experience with Translarna. The committee's end vote could be used as a deciding guideline when the FDA decides the drug's

fate on October 24th. Without treatment and an approval, the family fears Jacob's condition may worsen and lead to death.

Translarna received marketing authorization for patients with nmDMD in the European Union in August 2014 and is now available in over 25 countries.

What the Gunvalsons will be giving is testimony for getting the drug approved in the United States. Jacob has been on the test drug for the past 8 years. There is no question that the benefits of this drug far outweigh the risks. Every 90 days for the past eight years Jacob has gone to the University of Minnesota for treatment. He's currently enrolled in a clinical trial for ataluren, which he takes three times a day.

"Independence is my life; without independence, I'm not living my life," said Jacob.

He has had many successes in his life. He graduated from the University of North Dakota as a licensed social worker. He has interned and worked at the Minnesota Governor's office, the State Senate and at the institute for mental health.

Jacob went into social work as his true passion is to help others. He does not want his disease to limit his happiness. His goals are to work, make money and live a life as independent as possible. He will be 26 on his birthday October 5. He will celebrate his birthday by going to a Viking game which he hopes they will win.

DMD is a rare form of muscular dystrophy that causes muscle weakness. Patients eventually lose the ability to care for themselves. The typical life expectancy for someone with DMD is mid-20s. Jacob lost the ability to walk around 2007 and is now permanently in an electric wheelchair.

Although Jacob is wheelchair bound, he doesn't take for granted performing tasks such as using his cell phone, something his peers with the disease are not able to do.

Congressman Peterson's speech to the FDA public forum

Thank you for the opportunity to speak on behalf of Minnesota's 7th District regarding ataluren's application for approval. The timely delivery of this treatment is of the utmost importance to the Duchenne community.

One of my constituents, Jacob Gunvalson, is in the audience with us today to share his experience with Duchenne. Jacob was not expected to live past his teenage years, but access to ataluren has allowed him to live and thrive well into his

20s with no side effects. Jacob recently completed a successful internship in Governor Dayton's office in Minnesota and enjoyed a trip to Europe with some of his friends.

During my time in Congress, I have consistently supported several measures to ensure that my constituents can benefit from life-saving therapies the way that Jacob has.

The 2012 Food and Drug Administration Safety and Innovation Act (FDASIA) enhanced the FDA's ability to speed patient access to safe and effective products. In particular, the legislation helped develop and implement accelerated approval programs to provide therapies to patients with rare, debilitating, and 100% fatal diseases. Under FDASIA, treatments that benefit Duchenne patients warrant consideration for accelerated approval.

More recently, Congress passed the 21st Century Cures Act which recognized the essential role that patient advocates play in the development of drugs and medical devices. It is my hope that, in keeping with this legislation, the FDA will enhance its efforts to incorporate patient experience into its regulatory evaluations and decision-making.

As there are no alternative therapies for this particular

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Ask a Trooper

Question: It is my understanding that a number of antique vehicles from the 1930's and 1940's were constructed with serial numbers (now known as Vehicle Identification Numbers (VINs)) pressed into the frame. However, it is my further understanding that these vehicles were not constructed with "public" serial numbers (or VIN's). Can such antique vehicles be sold without

a public serial number/VIN?
Answer: A vehicle does not need a new style public VIN in order to be sold. It can be sold with its original serial number. A vehicle must have its original identification from when it was manufactured. If it is missing, it must receive an assigned VIN (blue VIN) from the state of Minnesota for it to be registered and titled. 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Helping Each Other Out!

Over the years farmers have been pretty famous for helping each other out. If one neighbor got a new "baler", maybe his neighbor would help him mow and rake, but he would come and help bale with his new "baler". You can go way back to the threshing days where the threshing crew would come into the neighborhood and everyone for miles around would gather to help cut, shock, haul, and thresh the grain. And of course when there was a tragedy neighbors would rally to help their friend. Luckily farmers are still good at helping each other out. But, farming has changed. We may still bring our tractor or combine over and help someone out, but there is probably less of that "blood, sweat, and tears" and manual labor of years gone by.

That reminds me of a story. When I was growing up on our dairy farm we occasionally grew some corn to chop. Dad bought a one row IHC corn chopper and two wooden silage wagons at the Bob Johnson Sale, south of Clearbrook. You had to fill the wooden wagon, which had a "false front". It had an end gate like a gravel dump truck that was attached at the top. Under the load you would run a cable, when the wagon was brought to where you wanted to unload you would attach another tractor or whatever to the cable and pull the "false front" back until the si-

lage slid out through the wooden tailgate. Then you would slide the "false front" back to the front of the wagon and fill it again!! I am getting tired just thinking of all the hooking and unhooking of wagons, and the cable, and sliding thinks back in place!!

Well one year we had trouble with our chopper and had corn to chop and did not know what to do. We decided to call some close family friends from Red Lake Falls, the Bud and Gladys Huot family. They had a big dairy farm northwest of RLF, and did a lot of corn chopping. Gladys and my mom were high school friends and neighbors when they were young and luckily for me they had stayed friends over the years and I got to know their kids. Danny, Darla, Denise, Darin, Deann, Denette, Dwight, Delray, Doreen, and Darcy I am glad to say are friends of mine! One fall day Bud made the 33

One River, Many Voices

Three states and a province. Two countries. One Red River Basin and many voices. It is no wonder that water management in the Red River Basin can sometimes be a balancing act.

The Red River Basin (RRB) is an international, multi-jurisdictional area, approximately 45,000 square miles (28 million acres of land and water) in size, and includes the Devil's Lake Basin (3,180 square miles). The Assiniboine River joins the Red River in downtown Winnipeg.

Nearly 40,000 square miles of the RRB (103,600 square kilometers) are in North Dakota and Minnesota in the United States; the remaining 5,000 square miles (13,000 square kilometers) are in Manitoba, Canada. Only 1 percent of the RRB is located in the extreme northeast corner of South Dakota.

The RRB is a complex hydrologic system with extremes being normal. Spring and summer floods are common, as well as times when the Red River and its tributaries have little or no flow. Understanding all of the natural and human forces that impact the shared resources can



make water management very challenging!

Decisions on how best to manage the shared Red River is made by numerous individuals, boards, agencies and commissions. Using what we need with as little impact as possible will make us all good neighbors. Finding balances between multiple interest groups and promoting cooperation across boundaries and between groups is necessary in order to make decisions that will have the greatest benefit for those who live here.

Your opinion on how we manage our shared resources is important. Take the time to attend public water meetings and hearings when they are scheduled in your area. Attend a local water board meeting. The Red River Basin Commission (RRBC) welcomes public participation at their meetings and annual conference in January. 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High Blood Alcohol Content and Dangerous Incidents Highlight Extra DWI Enforcement

Risking the lives of children, driving into oncoming traffic, not learning from past mistakes and asking others who were drunk to drive highlight some of the dangerous incidents during the summer extra DWI enforcement period.

Results

- Officers, deputies and troopers arrested 1,370 drivers for DWI, compared with 1,351 arrests during last year's campaign.
- There were also 1,530 seat belt citations, compared with 1,690 in 2016.
- During extra move over enforcement on the anniversary of the death of Minnesota State Trooper Cpl. Ted Foss (Aug. 31), 367 citations were written compared with 486 last year.
- More than 300 law enforcement agencies participated in the extra enforcement campaign around Minnesota from Aug 18 – Sept. 3, according to the Minnesota Department of Public Safety Office of Traffic Safety (DPS-OTS).

Drunk Driving Arrests

- In Fillmore County, the sheriff's office was called after a motorist witnessed a SUV pulling a boat driving into oncoming traffic, nearly causing a crash. A short time later police found the vehicle pulled over on the shoulder of Highway 52 with the driver passed out in the driver's seat along with several open rum containers. The driver, who told the officer he was too drunk to drive, blew a .38 blood alcohol content (BAC).
- In Ely, a woman was arrested for a .24 BAC. Her boyfriend stated he was too drunk to drive so he asked his girlfriend to drive home. Booking could not be completed until the next day because she was too drunk.
- Several people driving with their children in the vehicle were arrested for DWI including:
 - o A mother in Cass County traveling with her 2, 3 and 4-year-old children was arrested after blowing a .30 BAC.
 - o A father in Prior Lake who was involved in a crash and had his 7 year old in the vehicle without a booster seat.
 - o A motorcyclist suffered serious injuries in Rice County when he was thrown off his bike after crashing into a ditch and hitting a sign. He was charged with 3rd degree DWI after blowing a .29 BAC.
 - o A man in Rice County who led police on a six-mile pursuit was arrested for his 10th DWI.
 - o A driver hit a Lino Lakes squad car around 12:30 p.m. The driver recorded a .26 BAC and had an open bottle of alcohol.
- In Minneapolis, a suspect was arrested for a second DWI offense in two years by the same officer.
- Several arrests were made for drivers under the influence of drugs, including a person in Jordan who was stopped after a hit-and-run and had 50 doses of LSD in the vehicle.

Coordinated Effort

The enhanced enforcement and education efforts are coordinated through the Minnesota Department of Public Safety Office of Traffic Safety (DPS-OTS) with overtime paid with federal funds received from the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA).

DWI Consequences

- Loss of license for up to a year, thousands of dollars in costs and possible jail time.
- Repeat DWI offenders, as well as first-time offenders arrested at 0.16 and above alcohol-concentration level, must use ignition interlock in order to regain legal driving privileges or face at least one year without a driver's license.
- Offenders with three or more offenses are required to use interlock for three to six years, or they will never regain driving privileges.

Prevent Drunk Driving

- Plan for a safe ride – designate a sober driver, use a cab/public transportation or stay at the location of the celebration.
- Speak Up – Offer to be a designated driver, or be available to pick up a loved one anytime, anywhere.
- Buckle up – the best defense against a drunk driver.
- Report drunk driving – call 911 when witnessing impaired driving behavior. Be prepared to provide location, license plate number and observed dangerous behavior

Treatment for Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy

SOUTH PLAINFIELD, N.J., PTC Therapeutics, Inc. (NASDAQ: PTCT) announced that the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has acknowledged the filing over protest of PTC's New Drug Application (NDA) for Translarna (ataluren), an oral, first-in-class, protein restoration therapy for the treatment of nonsense mutation Duchenne muscular dystrophy (nmDMD). 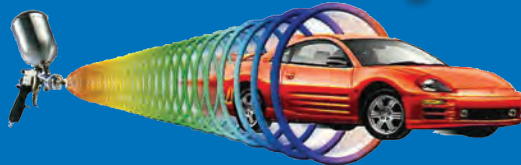
Primarily affecting males, Duchenne muscular dystrophy is a progressive muscle disorder caused by the lack of functional dystrophin protein. Dystrophin is critical to the structural stability of skeletal, diaphragm, and heart muscles. Patients with DMD lose the ability to walk in their early teens and experience life-threatening lung and heart complications in their late teens and twenties. It is estimated that nonsense mutations account for approximately 13% of DMD cases.
