College of St. Benedict's and St. John's U. Students Visit Red Lake

Will do Film on the Ojibwe Culture - Significance of Water

On Wednesday afternoon, October 4, 2017, students from the College of St. Benedict and St. John's University introduced themselves to elders and others at Red Lake Nation. The filmmakers were making contacts for future interviews on the cultural and spiritual significance of water. They visited first with Red Lake DNR Director and Tribal Councilman Al Pemberton. Next they visited with both elders and young teacher/messengers of culture and language at the Ojibwemowin Immersion Program.

Lastly the group would travel the road to Ponemah for a visit with Vickey Fineday and Wesley Cloud at Obaashiing University. Later all would travel to Windy Point living up to its name but just in time to see the sun set on Lower Red Lake, then turn to leave and see the Harvest Moon rising over Upper Red Lake. Students described it as an unforgettable experience. It was a good day.

About the Students and their film

The students visiting were bright, respectful, and professional. Five of the 20 involved came to visit, they included: Grace Lindquist and Brennan Lafeber who are Co-Directors for Extending the Link. They were joined by Danica Simonet, Alexis Solheid and Padra Xiong.

"Because Water is one of the four elements - the first round of Creation - we are focusing very tightly on water," said co-director Grace Lindquist, "we want to show everyone why the problems surrounding pipelines and water access/ownership is much more than an issue of resource distribution, and we must respect our water as it is a source of spiritual life as well."

Extending the Link (ETL) is a non-profit structured organization at the College of Saint Benedict and Saint John's University in St. Joseph and Collegeville, MN. Their mission is to foster awareness surrounding social justice issues through the creation of annual documentaries.

"Our team is made of 20 passionate students who strive to educate the community about under-represented social justice issues through the creation of annual films," said co-director

Brennan Lafeber. "We are all dedicated to telling stories important to the global community. Each year, we focus on a different topic, and cover the story both locally and abroad."

ETL's motto is "Think Globally, Act Locally," and therefore each film focuses on an issue at an international and domestic level with the goal of tying the story back into how it affects our local community in Minnesota.

"We typically research our topic during the summer and fall, and travel to film the international elements of our film in late December and early January," noted team member Danica Simonet. "we then return to campus and compile our footage to create a documentary to be shown to our campus, and broader community. You can check out examples of our past work on our YouTube page and our website, just Google "Extending the Link."

This year, for their 11th film, they are focusing on the cultural significance, spiritual importance, and value of water. They say their inspiration came from the recent issues of water rights and pipeline projects in the headlines, and the idea is to highlight the deeper significance of water to Native Americans in Minnesota.

"For our international aspect, we plan to parallel this story to the cultural significance of water to the Hindu population in Kolkata and Varanasi, India," said well-traveled team member Alexis Solheid. "Our overall goal is to be a voice for this issue and help them tell their story."

Students said they selected the topic for the film last May and conducted research throughout the summer. They interview for the domestic aspect of the film in October through December while simultaneously fundraising for international travel.

"We then travel to the country of interest for approximately three weeks over winter break to document the international side, said ETL member Padra Xiong. "When we return in January, we immediately begin editing footage and piecing our story together. At the same time we begin organizing our 'act local' initiative, which is a project we sponsor to create sustainable change relating to the issue in our community."

By April the group will have its final product and premiere the film on campus and be added to their website and YouTube free of charge to all. In May the process begins again with a new topic.

"Again, this year we will be telling the story of the spiritual and cultural value of water, said Lindquist. "While the issue of water pollution and access is widely covered, the idea that water is more than a resource for human exploitation and represents life and spirit to many cultures is largely overlooked."

"We will be paralleling the stories of the Hindu religion in Varanasi, India to those of Native American tribes in Minnesota, specifically The Red Lake

Band of Chippewa Indians. Our team would love to visit, hear your stories, and learn from your tribe," concluded Lindquist.

If possible, the filmmakers would also like to film interviews with some members to feature in our film, hence the introductory visit. The goal is to be an outlet and resource for the tribe and to tell the story of how water is important to the Red Lake Ojibwe culture.

"The Amazon" with Jesse MacArthur

October 18 Nell Program Jesse MacArthur left the United States for the first time when he was eighteen, traveling all the way to Ecuador where he quickly fell in love with the people and the culture as well as the exotic lifestyle, with the beach, Andes mountains and the Amazon all being within hours of each other. This is where he spent the next nine years developing a double life between South America and his life in the US.

The Amazon always intrigued Jesse, having made visits from time to time for missionary work or vacation. It is a wild place full of mystery, with butterflies bigger than ones hands and trees thicker than the width of a bus. While there, Jesse primarily worked with the documentation of some of the communities current projects through both photography and videography, which took him to the depths of the jungle where he lived and worked among the indigenous communities.

Jesse experienced both the true beauty of the jungle and its inhabitants, as well as saw things that he never knew previously existed before going there- including the severity of the destruction that is currently taking place and how badly it is impacting all who live there.

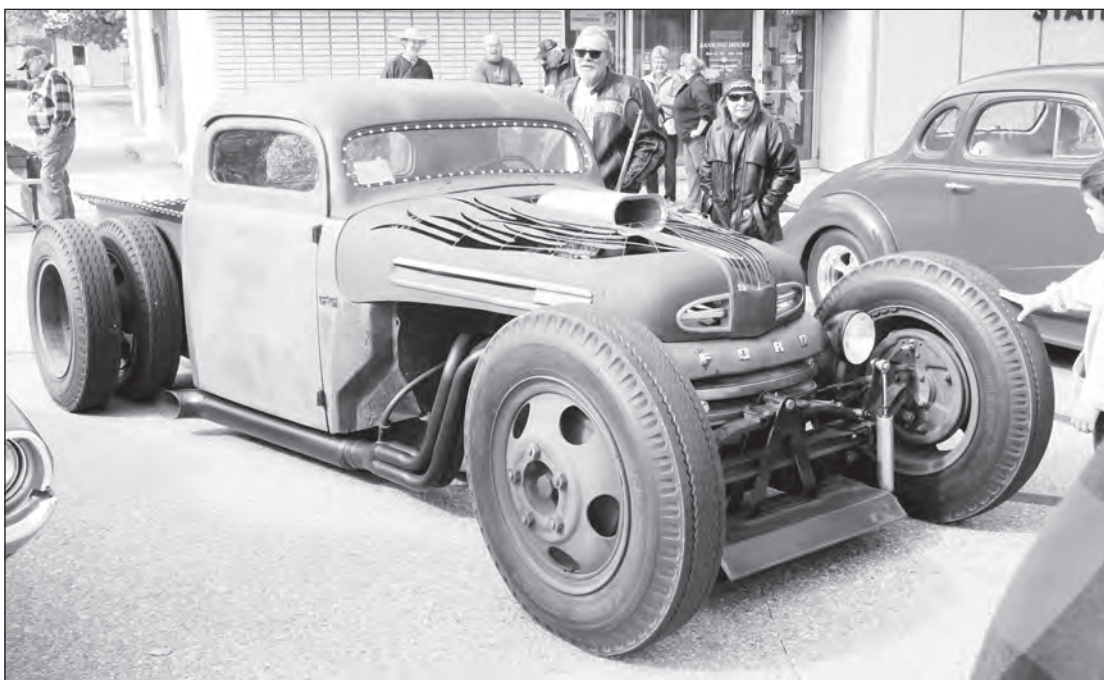

Polk County Sheriff

Vehicle Pursuit

On 10/07/2017, The Polk County Sheriff's Office attempted to conduct a traffic stop of a vehicle on CO 9 and 300th Ave SW in Lowell Township. When the Deputy pulled behind the vehicle at the intersection of CO 9 and 300th Ave SW the vehicle took off. The Deputy initiated a pursuit of the vehicle. The pursuit headed east on CO 9 toward the city of Crookston. When the vehicle came to the intersection of CO 9 and HWY 75 a MN State Trooper was able to use spike strips on the vehicle. Ask a Trooper

Question: Are drivers required to use turn signals when entering or exiting a roundabout? With a newly constructed roundabout very recently opened in town, I have not once observed a turn signal used. What is the law?

Answer: This is a great question as we are seeing more roundabouts in the state of Minnesota.

Minnesota state law says that a signal of intention to turn right or left shall be given continuously during not less than the last 100 feet traveled by the vehicle before turning. A person whose vehicle is exiting a roundabout is exempt from this

subdivision. So per state law a signal is not required once in a roundabout.

I would say that entering a roundabout could or would require a signal, depending on how it is constructed.

My recommendation would be to use your signal anytime you change lanes or direction, to alert others of your intention.

The Minnesota Department of Transportation says that roundabouts are safer and produce better traffic flow. Roundabouts show an 89 percent decrease in fatal crashes, a 74 percent decrease in life-altering injury crashes, and a 39 percent decrease in all crashes. They also handle high levels of traffic with less delay than most

stop signs or signals. The entry curves slow traffic so entering and exiting are easier and more efficient.

This past weekend I had the opportunity to travel to the Twin Cities and take in a great concert. Mom, Dad, Patty, and I headed for St. Paul Friday morning so we could attend a concert of the Wild Colonial Bhoys, at The Celtic Junction. Now, I'm not an expert on Irish music, but I have a reason to learn. My brother Cole plays lead guitar for the group. They have traveled abroad to put on a couple of concerts for our troops in Qatar. They have gone to Vegas, and the east coast as well as performing around the midwest. It was quite a treat. If was the first time I had heard them perform.

The "Irish Jams" were pretty catchy and I especially liked the great guitar work!! If you not busy next St. Patricks day and would like to attend Wild Colonial Bhoys Concert, they will be playing in Ireland!! Check them out on the web and get the details!

They had no tractors on stage but, my new connection with Ireland led me to another Irishman, Harry Ferguson. Harry is often referred to as the man who invented the 3-pt hitch system. Although this is not totally true, he did perfect the 3-pt hitch! He worked on a system driven off the belt pulley, and an electrical system, but using a mechanical hydraulic pump proved to be the answer. Now if he just had a tractor to put it on!

The Ferguson type A tractor was introduced in 1936 with Harry's hitch on it. The type A tractor was actually a David Brown tractor. Of course, next came the hand shake agreement with Henry Ford. Now the famous for "N" series carried with them the Ferguson hitch system. This probably helped immensely with the success of the Ford 9N, 2N, and 8N tractors. After the agreement with Ford fell through Ferguson began his own tractor line.

Ferguson hoped to show up Ford with his TE-20 model. They proved very successful in the United States and in Europe. One of the most interesting stories I have read in a long time is the use of the Ferguson TE-20s in the first land crossing of Antarctica. The Fergusons were equipped with full tracks and painted red to be seen in the snowy landscape. A heavy duty battery was used for starting in the frigid climate. Three of these Fergusons completed the 1200 mile journey helping to transport goods for the expedition.

I hope I don't have a 1200 mile Arctic journey to complete,

Elder Care: 20 IMPORTANT Things to Locate and Keep

Many years ago, I started down the path of elder care. My parents were in need of someone to help them. I'm that person. I wish I knew then what I know now, especially about organizing their important information. It would have made my elder care road easier.

My parents aren't organized people. This led to many frustrations for me. I would find bills and legal documents in the most unusual places, such as their life policy in a stack of newspapers, their power bill under their place mat at the table, etc. When they started having services cut off, I decided I needed to step in.

First of all, we bought them a safe to keep their important documents in. I organized it with file folders labeled for their easy understanding. I went through stacks and stacks of papers and pitched what wasn't necessary and filed the important documents.

I came up with a list of 20 important items I, absolutely, needed to know where they were. Here's a list of 20 items to know the information or have safely locked away where it's accessible to the P.O.A (power of attorney) or potential P.O.A.

1. Know where their wills are located.
2. Where their Social Security cards are (the actual cards). Make sure these aren't being carried in their wallets like my parents carried theirs. Keeping them in their wallet is a possible identity theft situation.
3. Know what their health insurances covers, where the cards are and the important numbers. My parents carried their cards in their wallets, so I made copies for the safe, front and back, in case the cards were misplaced.
4. All bills should be in both of their names, if possible, in case of death. Credit cards could be something different as having their name on the account may signify the debt being passed to the other person upon death. In this case, #16 might be a better option.
5. Have signed P.O.A.s, wills, health directives completed and know where they are kept, even if they haven't been enacted.
6. Know their social security numbers (or where to find out this information) and birth dates including year of their birth.
7. Know where they were born. For instance, my father was born at home, but I know which county registered the birth.
8. Know where their birth certificates are located.
9. If they are veterans of military service, know where the discharge papers are located. This is very important if you are dealing with the Veterans Administration.

10. Know where they keep (should be in a secure location, not on them) codes and pin #s for all accounts.
11. Copy of their Union cards.
12. Know the benefits from their Union or Associations (such as burial plots, pensions, life policies, etc.)
13. Be familiar with their life insurance policies; where the actual policy is, death benefit amounts, companies, companies' address and phone numbers, and that the beneficiaries are up to date. Have they changed the death benefit amount? If their beneficiary to their life insurance policy has preceded them in death it can lead to a probate situation and hold up the paying out of the death benefit. This can be a sticky situation if those funds are needed to pay for their burial.
14. Know where the titles for their vehicles, boats, toys, deed to home, deed to vacation properties, and the abstract to their home(s).
15. Location of long term care policies.
16. Have them put you down as person to talk to for credit card bill, life policies, other bills, etc. If this isn't done, you will have to file P.O.A.s with the companies, before you will get any help. Most of the time, it is as easy as calling the company in the presence of your elder, who's name is on the account, and having them talk with the customer service representative to let them know it is fine to talk with you, the elder care person.
17. Know where they keep their bills before and after they are paid. What system do they use for paying their bills?
18. Know who the family treasures go to. Is it written down? Hearsay doesn't always work. It can lead to hard feelings later. It helps to have it written down so everyone can see where these items go after the elder is gone. Dealing with grief is hard enough, writing it down, in advance, cuts down on the unpleasant feelings later.
19. Know where their lock boxes are kept. If the lock box is at another locations, such as a bank, they may be locked down upon the death of the owner of the lock box.
20. Keep a key or the numbers to the combination to their safe or important papers box. My parents have dementia and it was very common for them to lose the key. My back up key came in very handy.

Everyone's situation is different. The P.O.A. or potential P.O.A. needs to know this information. Elders with dementia can be very unorganized and this can lead to a nightmare situation upon their death. As the old saying goes, "an ounce of prevention can be worth a pound of cure".
