Peterson calls on U.S. Customs and Border Protection to reverse decision

WASHINGTON – In a phone call to U.S Customs and Border Protection, Congressman Collin C. Peterson asked the agency to reconsider their decision in reducing service hours and shifting staff at key border entry ports in Lancaster and Roseau. "These ports help drive the local economy when Canadians visiting Minnesota spend money at our restaurants, gas stations, golf courses, and campgrounds. In addition to tourism, this change will affect the ability for medical personnel in Roseau to respond to emergency calls in the Northwest Angle and smaller towns in Manitoba," Peterson said. "I hope the Customs officials will begin to listen to the concerns of those living and working in these communities."

On the call, the agency confirmed that a final decision has not been made and that there is still a possibility for an adjustment of the proposed hours at the ports. Since the decision was announced, both Lancaster and Roseau have had town halls for area residents to voice their concerns with CBP officials.

Accident takes lives of two Plummer women

Two Plummer women were killed in a collision between a car and a train in Red Lake County Wednesday.

Sgt. Jesse Grabow with the Minnesota State Patrol said the crash occurred at 10:47 a.m. Wednesday on a private road off of U.S. Highway 59, just north of Plummer.

A 2015 Ford Taurus was eastbound in a private driveway near the highway when it collided with a southbound Canadian Pacific train after failing to yield to a stop sign at a railroad crossing, according to a preliminary state patrol investigation.

Driver Emilie Genevieve Skjerven, 78, and passenger Carol Cecilia Gerardy, 79, were both pronounced dead at the scene, according to the state patrol.

Both women were believed to be wearing their seatbelts.

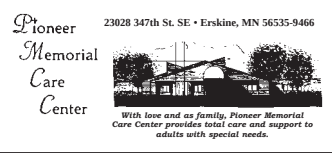

Other historians say that Black Friday has ties to Philadelphia. The sales also were held in advance of the Army/Navy football game that traditionally took place in Philadelphia on the Saturday after Thanksgiving. Stores knew that suburban shoppers and football fans would be milling about town during the extended weekend. As a

result, traffic cops and other law enforcement personnel had to work 12-hour shifts to corral the extra foot and vehicle traffic around the city. These cops referred to the day as "Black Friday." Despite city officials' best efforts to remove any negative connotations and rename the day "Big Friday," the name "Black Friday" stuck and even spread to other areas of the country.

Answer: A person would not be able to legally drive if temporarily wearing a neck brace. Permanent lack of neck mobility would require a restriction placed on the license that notes they can legally drive if there is an "outside rearview mirror."

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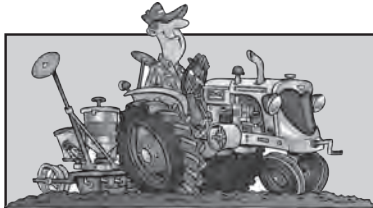
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Tractor Pull Fun!

Preheat oven to 350°F. In large skillet, sauté bacon, onion, mushrooms, and celery; cook until bacon is crisp. Stir in wild rice, oregano, sage, and bread crumbs; adjust seasonings. Place in greased 2-qt. casserole, cover and bake 30-40 minutes. Add ¼-½ cup chicken broth, if needed, for moisture.

Sausage Stuffing: Add ½ lb crumbled, cooked, and drained sausage. 6-8 servings.

FRUITED WILD RICE STUFFING

3 cups cooked wild rice
1 cup bread crumbs
½ cup raisins
½ cup chopped walnuts, optional
¼ cup fresh apple chunks
¼ cup extra light margarine, melted
¼ cup orange juice

Combine all ingredients. Use as stuffing for game birds, turkey, capon, or chicken, or turn into buttered 2-quart casserole and bake at 325°F for 1½ hours, covered. 8 servings.

WILD RICE WALNUT DRESSING

½ cup chopped onion
½ cup chopped celery
1 clove garlic, minced
1½ tbsp butter or margarine
3 cup cooked wild rice
½ cup chopped walnuts
¼ tsp rubbed sage
¼ tsp seasoned salt
½ tsp ground black pepper
¼ cup chicken broth

In small skillet, cook onion, celery, and garlic in butter until tender. Combine with remaining ingredients. Place in buttered baking dish. Cover and bake at 350°F for 20 minutes. Uncover and continue baking 5 minutes. 6 servings.

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Upper Red Lake winter walleye regulations announced

Anglers fishing Upper Red Lake in northwestern Minnesota this winter will be able to keep four walleye of which only one may be longer than 17 inches, the Department of Natural Resources said.

This same regulation has been in effect since the walleye fishing opener in May, but this will be the first winter season with the combination of a four fish bag limit and one over 17 inches allowed.

"Harvest under a three fish bag limit last year resulted in approximately 109,000 pounds for the winter season," said Gary Barnard, DNR area fisheries supervisor in Bemidji. "Total harvest for the past winter and summer seasons combined was below the target harvest range so there is room for additional

harvest this year."

Red Lake walleye harvest is managed under a joint harvest plan, revised in 2015 by the Red Lakes Fisheries Technical Committee.

"The new harvest plan recommends a more aggressive approach when spawning stock is in surplus, as it currently is," Barnard said. "The extra fish in the daily bag this winter is expected to increase winter harvest, and allowing one fish over 17 inches meets our harvest plan objectives by spreading harvest over a wide range of sizes and removing some of the surplus spawning stock."
