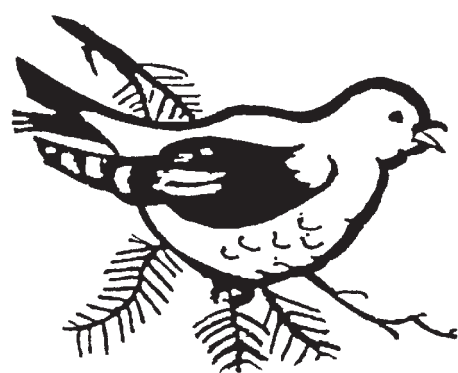

Summerfest 2015 Coming Sunday

On Sunday, August 16, 2015 Agassiz Environmental Learning Center (AELC) will be holding its annual Summerfest event from noon to 3 p.m. at the Nature Center located 3/4 mile west of Fertile on Summit Avenue. Free sloppy joes, chips and keg root beer will be served.

The featured presentation for this year will be the "Raptors Rule" outreach program from the Headwaters Science Center (HSC) in Bemidji, MN. A program for all ages, you will have an exciting opportunity to get a close up view of live raptors and learn about what makes these birds unique. Learn about the various raptors found in our state and what you can do to help preserve their habitat.

The HSC opened its doors in July 1993 with the help of its parent organization Opportunities In Science, Inc. (OIS). OIS is a private IRS 501(c)(3) organization that has worked to promote science education in northern Minnesota since 1988. Located at the headwaters of the Mississippi River and near those of two other major

watersheds the HSC strives to provide hands-on science and technology programs for the children and adults of Northern Minnesota.

The raptor program will begin at 1pm followed by a presentation by Danielle Meunier, AELC's Education Director who will be introducing two new slithery friends who have taken up residence at the Nature Center. There will also be crafts, children's activities and much more. Visitors can take a Sand Hill Safari motorized tour, a guided hike through an oak savanna and an active sand dune or float down the Sand Hill River in one of our new kayaks.

This event is free to the public. AELC memberships can be purchased that day as well. A family membership is \$35 and individual membership is \$20. Members receive news of upcoming events and have free use of our trails and cross country ski equipment. We hold an annual meeting every January and members have a voice in deciding the future of the AELC and our programs.

Local Library Systems Receive Technology Update

Two regional libraries in Minnesota are moving forward with an automation project that will allow them to better serve their customers. Lake Agassiz Regional Library, headquartered in Moorhead, Minnesota with 22 library service locations, including branches in Bagley, Fosston and McIntosh and a LINK Site in Gonvick, is continuing its partnership with Northwest Regional Library as they migrate their 374,000 combined items to an open-source integrated library system. This technical update, which includes the purchase of new servers, is made possible by a \$25,000 grant from the Northern Lights Library Network, an organization which coordinates services and resources among all types of libraries in 23 counties of North Central and Northwest Minnesota.

A Mysterious Apology

The earliest surviving piece of Christian literature not addressed to fellow Christians.

"Now then, clear out all of the thoughts that take up your attention, and pack away all the old ways of looking at things that keep deceiving you.

You must be like a new man from the beginning, since as you yourself admit, you are going to listen to a really new message."

"For Christians cannot be distinguished from the rest of the human race by country or language or customs. They do not live in cities of their own; they do not use a peculiar form of speech; they do not follow an eccentric manner of life. This doctrine of theirs has not been discovered by the ingenuity or deep thought of inquisitive men, nor do they put forward a merely human teaching, as some people do. Yet, although they live in Greek and barbarian cities alike, as each man's lot has been cast, and follow the customs of the country in clothing and food and other matters of daily living... They live in their own countries, but only as aliens. They have a share in everything as citizens, and endure everything as foreigners. Every foreign land is their fatherland, and yet for them every fatherland is a foreign land. They marry, like everyone else, and they share their board with each other, but not their marriage bed."

"To put it simply: What the soul is in the body... Christians are in the world. The soul is dispersed through all the members of the body, and Christians are scattered through all the cities of the world. The soul dwells in the body, but does not belong to the body, and Christians dwell in the world, but do not belong to the world. The soul, which is invisible, is kept under guard in the visible body; in the same way, Christians are recognized when they are in the world, but their religion remains unseen. The flesh hates the soul and treats it as an enemy, even though it has suffered

no wrong, because it is prevented from enjoying its pleasures; so too the world hates Christians, even though it suffers no wrong at their hands, because they range themselves against its pleasures. The soul loves the flesh that hates it, and its members; in the same way, Christians love those who hate them. The soul is shut up in the body, and yet itself holds the body together; while Christians are restrained in the world as in a prison, and yet themselves hold the world together. The soul, which is immortal, is housed in a mortal dwelling; while Christians are settled among corruptible things, to wait for the incorruptibility that will be theirs in heaven. The soul, when faring badly as to food and drink, grows better; so too Christians, when punished, day by day increase more and more. It is to no less a post than this that God has ordered them, and they must not try to evade it."

"He did not send to men some subordinate...an angel, or principality, or one of those who administer earthly affairs, or perhaps one of those to whom the government of things in heaven is entrusted. Rather, he sent the Designer and Maker of the universe himself. Now, did he send him, as a human mind might assume, to rule by tyranny, fear, and terror? Far from it! He sent him out of kindness and gentleness, like a king sending his son who is himself a king. He sent him as God; he sent him as man to men."

"In his mercy, he took up the burden of our sins. He himself gave up his own Son as a ransom for us...the Holy One for the unjust, the innocent for the guilty, the righteous one for the unrighteous, the incorruptible for the corruptible, the immortal for the mortal. For what else could cover our sins except His righteousness?" Amen.

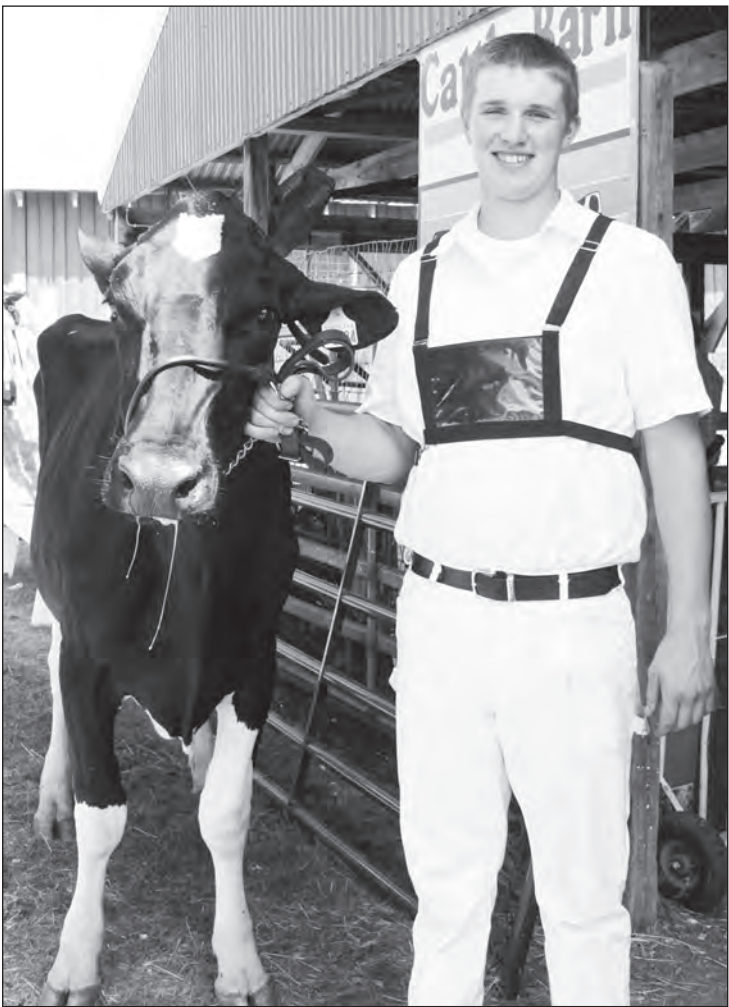
