Garden Valley Telephone Company begins search for scholarship applicants

Moorhead, Minn. (1/5/2018) Red River Valley Emerging Leadership Program representatives are Daniel and Shelley Johnshoy, Shevlin for Clearwater County; Bryan and Nicole Johnson, Fosston for East Polk County; and Anthony and Tracy Kuchan, Crookston for West Polk County. Alumni of the program from the counties represented nominated them to take part in the program because of their involvement in their community.

All of the Program's representatives have been taking part in educational sessions since November 2017. They are building skills for leadership and networking with other rural leaders from 16 counties in the region. Extension educators Lisa Hinz, Brian Fredrickson, and Jody Horntvedt are instructors for the sessions which focus on personal leadership styles, communication, community leadership, rural issues, life balance, dealing with challenges, change, and facilitating effective meetings.

Daniel and Shelley Johnshoy, Clearwater County

Daniel and Shelley own 90 acres of land and raise beef cattle on a small farm near Shevlin. Daniel has been the owner and operator of Johnshoy Repair, a diesel repair shop, in Bemidji MN for the last 8 years. He runs the shop with one full-time employee and one part-time employee. According to Horntvedt, "University of Minnesota Extension research shows one in 34 adults in rural counties must step up and serve in a leadership role, compared to one in 143 in metro areas. We are training leaders by helping participants gain competence, build connections, and increase confidence to lead." This is the 34th year the Emerging Leadership Program has brought together individuals from across the region for training workshops. Nearly 1,100 leaders in northwest and west central Minnesota are alumni of the program, which was established in 1985 to enhance the King Agassiz Program of the Red River Valley Winter Shows.

University of Minnesota Extension, with their long history of excellence in designing, delivering and evaluating leadership programs, is the primary sponsor of the Emerging Leadership Program. Additional financial support for the program comes from the Red River Valley Development Association, and from a variety of other sources including ag producer groups, electric cooperatives, community businesses, financial institutions and individuals in counties throughout northwest and west central Minnesota who contribute each year. The event will be held at New Journey Church, 505 9th St. NW, Fosston on Saturday, February 17, 2018 from 9:00 a.m. to 3 p.m. Pre-registration by February 11. Cost is \$20/person, pay at the door. This year's event includes several educational presenta-

tions by Minnesota farmers and includes a presentation on wool types, values and marketing by sheep specialist Travis Hoffman.

Brooke Hendrickx will be talking about and judging fleece. People interested in having one of their fleeces judged for free should contact SSFC for more information on entering.

This year's event again features concurrent breakout sessions:

Option one presenter is Alan Hendrickx, regional director of the Minnesota Lamb and Wool Producers Assn. Alan has been raising sheep for over thirty years and he will be presenting information on better sheep handling, feeding and equipment for a stress-free farming operation.

The concurrent session is by Sarah Karvakko of Karvakko Family Farm who will be talking about alpacas and the fiber they produce and how it's processed into yarn. She will also talk a little about the history of alpacas and lots about what makes their fiber so useful and

valuable.

The Sustainable Sheep and Fiber Community of Northern Minnesota has their annual meeting and nominations for board of directors will be accepted. The Small Scale Sustainable Sheep Farming event brings together people who raise sheep, or who want to raise them, with those who are interested in sheep products. This event provides information for those interested in raising sheep sustainably for meat, wool, or milk, with those interested in purchasing local sheep products. Consumers interested in local sheep products find this event helpful in connecting them with the right producers. Attendees are welcome to bring a fleece to be judged and available for sale after the judging. No cost to enter fleece

but please let us know you'll be participating when you pre-register. There is still space available for vendors who want to advertise or sell fiber or fiber animal-related products. Only cost is registration fee but you must pre-register and provide a MN ST-19 form.

\$11.1 Million in Fairgrounds Improvements Approved for 2018

The Minnesota State Fairgrounds will get \$11.1 million in improvements prior to the 2018 Great Minnesota Get-Together. The State Fair's board of managers on Sunday approved \$7.2 million in capital work and \$3.8 million in maintenance projects for the coming year.

Included is the construction of a new restroom and a new pet exhibition and demonstration area on the north end of the grounds, significant improvements to the livestock complex including upgraded ventilation to the Sheep & Poultry Barn, scores of miscellaneous upkeep projects across the fairgrounds and more than \$3 million in improvements to the State Fair's utilities and transportation infrastructure. All projects are funded through State Fair operating revenue and grants from the Minnesota State Fair Foundation. The fair is financially self-supporting and receives no government aid of any kind.

Northwest Minnesota Foundation Receives \$90,000 Grant to Address Child Care Shortages

January 16, 2018—BEMIDJI, MN – The Northwest Minnesota Foundation (NMF) has been awarded a \$90,000 grant from the Minnesota Department of Employment and Eco-

nomics Development (DEED). The grant will fund NMF's initiative to address child care shortages across the region.

Currently, Northwest Minnesota is experiencing a shortfall of 2,717 child care slots needed to accommodate the estimated number of children under 6 with both parents working. To meet this shortfall, the region needs a substantial 39% growth rate in the licensed child care capacity. NMF's will provide services to help address this issue:

- Provide small business start-up technical assistance that is tailored to child care businesses.

- With the Northwest Small Business Development Center, offer a series of child care business specific group trainings.

- Implement community-led viable, sustainable child care solutions in partnering communities with significant employer partner involvement—Roseau County, Park Rapids, Blackduck, Fosston, and Thief River Falls.

- Provide grants to communities developing and implementing viable, sustainable solutions to their child care shortages.

Ask a Trooper

Question: First of all, thank you for your service, it is greatly appreciated. I was recently told that I could not keep the trailer ball mount attached to the receiver of the vehicle when it is not actually hooked up to a trailer. Is this in fact true?

Answer: There is no law in Minnesota that specifically prohibits having a ball hitch in the receiver of a vehicle when not pulling a trailer at that time. It is also not illegal to have more than one ball hitch on the bumper at one time. There are laws that prohibit anything that obstructs the rear license plate that includes a ball that is attached to the hitch.

The ball hitch needs to be a device approved by the commissioner of public safety. The ball hitch must be of sufficient strength to control and support the weight of a trailer.

I recommend that you take out your receiver hitch and it

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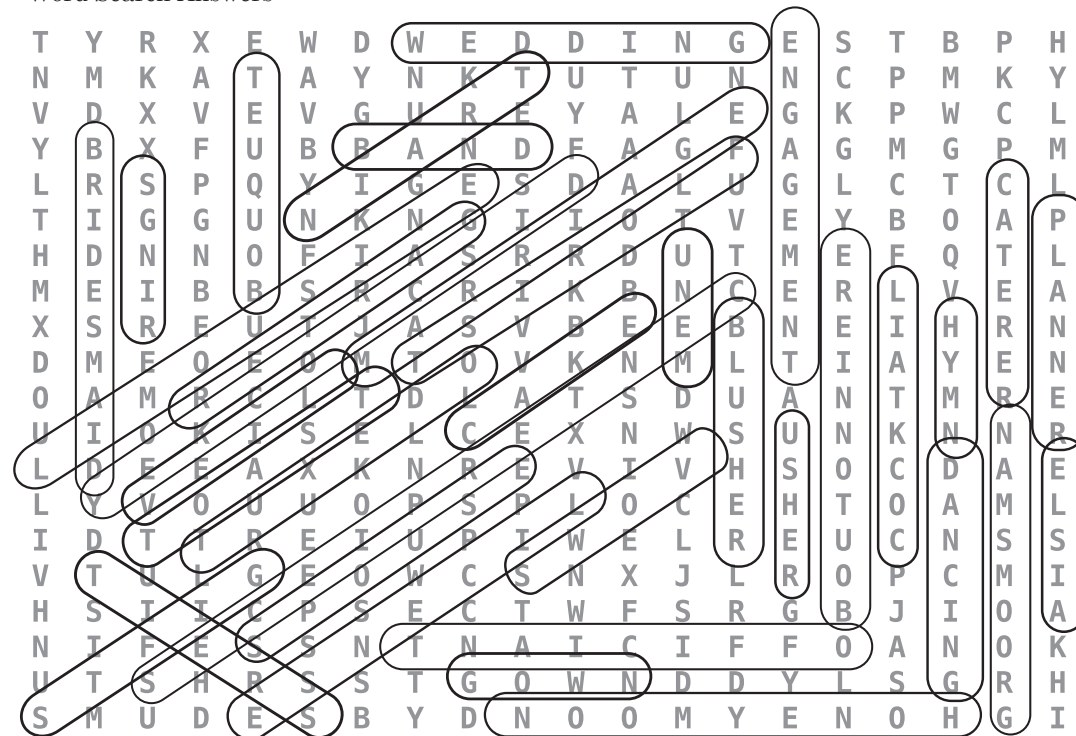

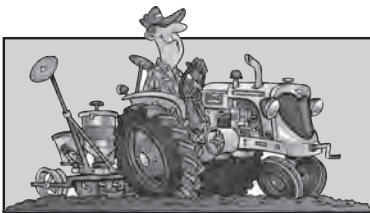

More Massey Harris by Auctioneer Eric W. Mickelson

I was watching my favorite tractor show on RFD network and they featured a 444 Massey Harris in one of their clips. Now I have not ever driven and I'm not sure if I have even seen with my own eyes a 444, but it got me thinking about Masseys!

One of the first tractors I ever got was a 55 Massey Harris. I call it "mine", although my dad traded an old not running R John Deere for it. The starter never worked so we always pulled it to start it. I have had it for 29 years, but last summer while raking hay the engine started to knock. Somehow I'll have to get it fixed up. I considered getting rid of it, I have had a few guys ask me to buy it, those old standard tread tractors are popular with collectors. But my tractors are like my children. I have only sold one tractor in my life!! Once you(l) have a tractor it usually becomes a sentimental part of my "family." I grew up on a John Deere farm, but since I purchased the 55 Massey I have become a Massey Harris fan too.

When my dad moved to Oklee in 1952 he has often told me the story of the Massey's he saw working around Oklee. "Big" tractors like 55 and 44 Massey's pulling 4 and 5 bottoms. Of course every town or region often has a certain brand or brands of machinery usually reflecting dealers in the area who had a good reputation. Well this is probably a reflection of Swenson Equipment. Earl Swenson purchased D & H Sales from Ed Halseth. Next the Ole Loiland garage was purchased and it became part of Swenson Sales and Service. In the fifties Swenson Sales and Service sold Massey tractors and equipment, thus the Oklee area was dotted with the red and yellow Massey machines.

Massey tractors of this vin-
