Bryan Dyrdaahl inducted into Snowmobile Hall of Fame Hall cites five I-500 wins, plus more accomplishments

The only snowmobile racers in history to claim five I-500 wins, Bryan Dyrdaahl has earned his place in the Snowmobile Hall of Fame. Dyrdaahl, age 39, of Bagley, was inducted into the Hall of Fame in a ceremony that took place Saturday, Feb. 17, at St. Germain, Wis.

Dyrdaahl comes from a family well known in the snowmobile racing world. His late father, Gerald Dyrdaahl, was an avid and accomplished racer, and he instilled a love of the sport into his sons Chad, Bryan and Brady, who all spent their share of time in the winner's circle.

The Hall notes, "Bryan Dyrdaahl of Bagley, Minn., is one of the all-time great snowmobile cross-country racers. During a 20-year career that began with a win aboard a Kitty Cat at Eagle River in 1987, Dyrdaahl amassed wins at nearly every premier cross-country event in the ISOC, FANS and USCC circuits aboard Arctic Cat and Ski-Doo machines.

"He stands alone as the only racer to have won five I-500 cross-country events (2000, 2004, 2006, 2008 and 2009), plus he was a three-time USCC High Point Champion and was part of the 2009 Soo I-500 enduro-winning team."

Besides cross-country, he has also raced in snowcross and enduro categories.

Six of Bryan's snowmobiles -- those he rode to win the I-500 and his Kitty Kat -- will take their place of honor in the museum. They will remain on display in the museum for at least one year. Bryan rode his 2009 Ski-Doo that he rode to win his fifth I-500 in the "Ride with the Champs" last weekend as part of the celebration. His other four winning sleds were driven in the Ride with the

Champs by his brothers Chad and Brady and Jim Boe and Todd Brustad -- all members of his pit crew.

Also inducted on Feb. 17 were the following snowmobilers: Team Decker Racing of Eagle River, Wis.; Lynn and Wayne Trapp of Woodruff, Wis.; and the late Rick Ward of Sugar City, Idaho.

The Hall of Fame inducted its first members in 1988. Quite a number of the inductees are recognizable to snowmobile enthusiasts in Northwestern

Minnesota. Those include: Steve and Mike Houle, Brad Pake, Kirk Hibbert, Brian Neslon, Jerry Bunke, Edgar Hetteen, Pat Mach, Joey Hallstrom, Roger Skime, Burt Bassett, C.J. Ramstad, Guy Useldinger, Jerry Bunke and Steve Thorsen. Not all inductees are racers, some had major roles in developing and improving snowmobiles as well as the racing sport itself. Red Lake 2018 Tribal Election Schedule Set Richard Barrett Seat to be Included

The Red Lake Tribal Council at their February monthly meeting set the dates for the 2018 tribal election. All three officers and one representative from each of four districts will be elected or reelected to four-year terms. Two representatives from each community on the reservation, Little Rock, Red Lake, Redby and Ponemah, and three officers, Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer, make up the eleven member tribal council.

Do to the recent passing of Little Rock Representative Richard Barrett; his seat will also be included in the election for a candidate to finish his two-year term. Citing Article 10, Section 4, of the Red Lake Constitution and Bylaws, "The Tribal Council by an affirmative vote of the majority may hold a special election to fill any vacancy of a district representative or officer, caused by removal, death or resignation for the unexpired term."

The council then decided, "We should use the Regular Election to fill the vacancy and not call for a Special Election due to the timing of election and

the passing of Representative Barrett." Whoever is elected then would finish Barrett's term or two years.

Seats (and incumbents) up for election or reelection for four-year terms are; Darrell G. Seki, Sr., Chairman, Annette Johnson, Treasurer, Gary Nelson, Ponemah Representa-

tive, Julius "Toady" Thunder, Redby Representative, Roman "Ducker" Statley, Red Lake Representative, and Robert "Charlie" Reynolds, Little Rock Representative. In addition the two-year term to finish Barrett's term. Appointed Tribal Secretary Darwin Sumner, also a Hereditary Chief is not expected to seek election to the Secretary's office, also a four-year term.

If a candidate receives 50% of the vote plus one in the general election on May 16, they are the declared winner. If no one attains this threshold in any or all seats, a run-off election will be scheduled sixty days after the conclusion of all certifications, challenges or recounts...probably mid to late July.

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At the Crossroads: When to Stop Driving

With people living longer and baby boomers turning gray, the number of people behind the wheel who are in there 70s, 80s and 90s will increase significantly in the coming years.

Everybody wants to remain independent and continue to drive for as long as possible, no one wants to be a threat to themselves or to others when they are no longer able to drive safely.

Some older drivers are able to recognize these functional changes on their own and take adaptive or self-restricting measures that moderate their declines as safe drivers; other individuals will lack this level of self-awareness and will continue to drive. People who drive at reduced skill levels will be at a greater risk for crashes, with potentially serious consequences for themselves and others.

While most people take appropriate steps when they detect a problem with their driving, it's not always obvious when a general health problem, vision problems, or a side effect of medications lead to a driving impairment. That's when the observations of loved ones and health professionals are most vital.

As we grow older, we do not turn into bad drivers. Some remain good drivers, regardless of age. Others simply have changes in their ability to handle a car safely. These may include: physical changes in our bodies, changes in the way we think, health problems and some medications.

As people age, our joints may stiffen, our muscles weaken and our ability to respond quickly to certain situations slows. Turning our head to look back or steering and braking the car may become hard to do. Movements are slower and may not

If you are unsure of your performance to operate a vehicle, ask a trusted friend or family member to monitor your driving. The decision to stop driving is a tough one, but most of us want to make a responsible choice that protects ourselves and others.

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Ask a Trooper

Ques-tion: The law states that an active duty military member with residence in Minnesota can have an expired license. But what will happen if I were to be pulled over for a traffic violation and my license was expired?
Answer: As long as you are on active duty in the U.S. military, you do not have to renew your expired Minnesota license until after you are discharged from the military. This is regardless of how long you have served in the U.S. military. As a Minnesota driver's license or ID card holder, you must renew your expired license or ID card within 1 year of being discharged from the military.
 If you are a spouse of an active duty military member, you are also exempt from license renewal if you do not live in Minnesota during the time of active duty.
 If you are stopped by a law enforcement outside of Minnesota you may provide your military ID, expired Minnesota license and In Service letter as

proof of valid status while in the military; however, be advised that not all states may honor the In Service letter. While on leave or prior to you renewing your driver's license, always have your military ID and expired driver's license with you. If you are stopped by a Minnesota law enforcement officer, you can explain your current military status and if you have notified DVS of being in the military, this is noted on your record. To make sure that your driving records are maintained after your license expires, you should notify Minnesota Driver and Vehicle Services (DVS) of your military status. Send a copy of your military orders showing where you are stationed and your service date or a letter from your commanding officer with the same information to the following address:

 This will allow DVS to provide you with an In Service letter that outlines Minnesota Statutes that exempts active

duty military members from renewal, up to 1 year from discharge. To expedite this process you may call 651-297-3298.
 To renew your license, present your expired Minnesota license and DD214 discharge papers at a DVS location that accepts driver license applications.
 When it comes to vehicle registration, vehicles owned or co-owned by active military men and women kept out of state are exempt from registration tax up to 90 days after discharge, but must pay any applicable sales tax, plate, contributions and filing fees. For complete instructions on how to renew registration call 651-297-2126.

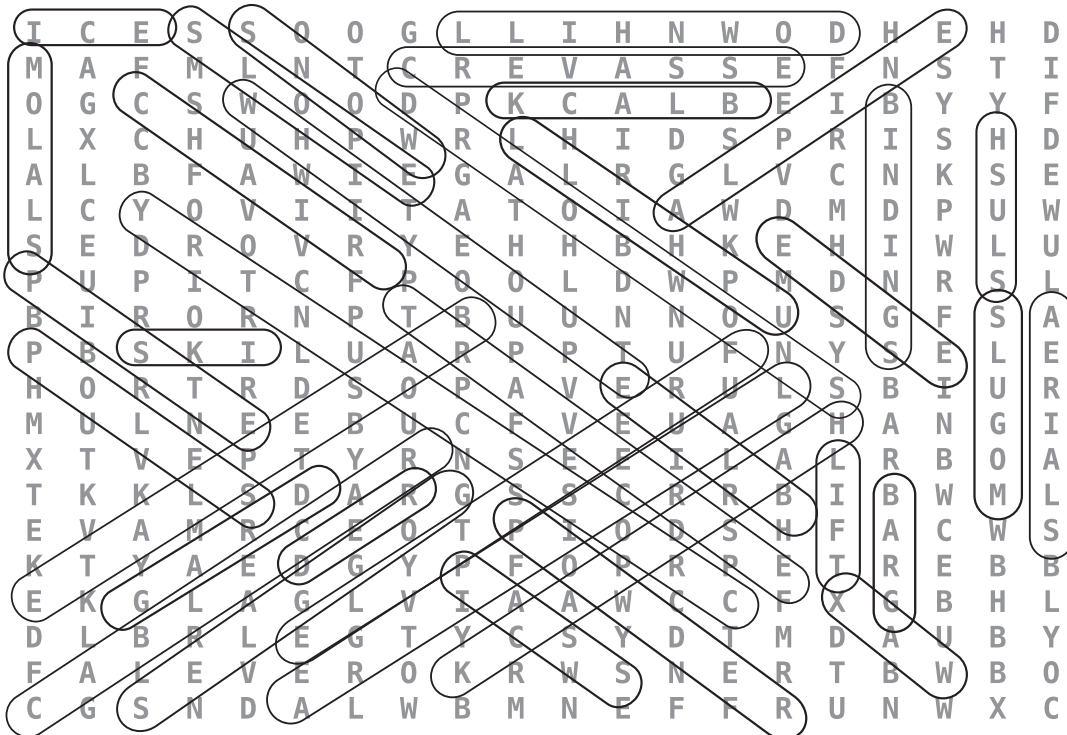

 Probably my attraction to Case tractors comes from another story my dad told about growing up in Clearbrook. He always paid close attention to the tractors of the day and what

tractors the neighbors had. Can you imagine being fairly new to the farm, like dad was, and see a new Flambeau Red Case DC-3 come roaring down the road! That probably looked pretty cool! My favorite color is green....John Deere green, but in 1939 Cases's new "orange" color made for an attractive machine! Well, dad's neighbor in Clearbrook Rueben Rydeen had a new DC-3 and it was one of the tractors that got dad's attention.
 Case came out with the "D" series in 1939 replacing the "C" series. It was really not a "new" machine. It used most of the components of the "C" were basically used on the new model "D".
 The model "D" was the standard version, and the model "DC" had several different versions.
 Over the years the "D" was upgraded many times. The hand clutch was converted to a foot clutch. Like most brands

the hydraulic system was improved along with the adding of disc brakes. After 15 years the model "D" production run ended in 1953. See what I mean, up to the early 50's, tractors are pretty cool!

Minnesota Starwatch for 2018

With two full moons and the spring equinox, what's not to love about March?

The first full moon arrives at 6:51 p.m. on the 1st, barely an hour after moonrise and just a couple of days after perigee, its closest approach to Earth in a lunar cycle. This means it'll rise about as round and luminous as any full moon gets.

The second arrives at 7:37 a.m. on the 31st. As the second full moon in a calendar month, it qualifies as a blue moon. However, it sets that morning shortly before the instant of fullness, so you may want to check your local time of moonset before deciding whether to get up to see it or to enjoy it the evening of the 30th.

Venus and Mercury appear very low in the west after sunset, bathed in the sun's afterglow. The planets are closest on the 3rd, but easy to tell apart because Venus outshines Mercury. After the 15th, Mercury plummets toward the horizon and is soon lost.

In the predawn sky, look south to see brilliant Jupiter. East of Jupiter, Mars is brightening as it moves swiftly eastward. Its motion carries it away from Jupiter and Scorpius, with its red heart, Antares (the "rival of Mars"), and toward Saturn, a shiny dot above the Teapot of Sagittarius. Mars waxes brighter every morning because Earth is gaining on it in the orbital race. This summer, we'll lap the red planet and it will be a treat for the eye.

On evenings between the 3rd and 18th, look for the elusive zodiacal light, a faint glow

extending up from the western horizon along the sun's path shortly after nightfall. It comes from sunlight reflecting off dust in the plane of the solar system.

Spring arrives with the vernal equinox at 11:15 a.m. on the 20th. At that moment, the sun crosses the equator into the northern sky and Earth will be lighted from pole to pole.

With the sun's crossing comes a turning point in day length. During fall and winter, travelers in the Northern Hemisphere who are heading north see the day length shorten. But after the March equinox, going farther north means a longer day length. Also, the day length increases fastest around the time of the spring equinox because this is when the sun is moving most rapidly north.
