Northwest Minnesota Art Exhibit Winners Announced

The Northwest Minnesota Arts Council is excited to announce the Northwest Minnesota Art Exhibit Winners. Student and adult artists residing in a seven-county region including Kittson, Marshall, Norman, Polk, Pennington, Roseau and Red Lake recently entered into the Northwest Minnesota Art Exhibit and competed for \$2,300.00 in cash awards. The winners were recognized at the Northwest Minnesota Artist Reception in Thief River Falls, Minnesota on Saturday, April 28.

Exhibit cash award winners were chosen while the exhibit was on display at the Ralph Engelstad Arena in Thief River Falls from April 18 to 28 by qualified juror and North Dakota Museum of Art Director of Education Matthew Anderson. "What was most interesting to me was to be able to witness an artistic conversation between the generations of art makers. Many of the pieces in the student work were highly emotive while the adult work tended to be more contemplative. At the end of the day, all of the works are part of a larger Conversation of Art that has been happening for hundreds of years."

Northwest Star Award Winner is Jim Kent

The Northwest Minnesota Arts Council is pleased to announce that Jim Kent of Crookston has been selected as the 2018 Northwest Minnesota Star Artist of the Year for his lifetime achievement in music.

Kent is a retired elementary music teacher and worked in staff development in the Crookston School District. He also taught elementary music education classes at the University of Minnesota Crookston. Kent is a tireless advocate for the arts in the Crookston community. He has served as president of the Crookston Civic Music League and Chair of the Pirate Fine Arts Boosters, performed with the Crookston Community Theater, and directed the Wesley United Methodist Church Choir for over fifty years.

Art Teacher Gary Stegman shared, "I was fortunate to work shoulder to shoulder with Jim



Kent for seven years. I saw Jim in action and can tell you he is good at what he does. Always. He's thorough, well prepared, and the ultimate professional. He cares more for those he works with, cares that they do well, cares for his community

to the point that he works and sacrifices for it. Jim makes us all better. I respect no one more than I respect Jim Kent."

Kent disclosed that music was the path he was always on. Voice is his specialty. Of the impact of music on individuals and society he said, "Music speaks to the soul. It transcends speech -- really speaks to humanity in a way that nothing else can."

Associate Professor and Director of Music/Theater at the University of Minnesota-Crookston George French also praised his abilities and commitment. "Working with Jim has always been a pleasure because, in my opinion, he is the best singer in town. His ability is truly at the professional level. Jim deserves every award that might be appropriate since his commitment to the arts is outstanding."

Finally, Belinda Fjeld a fellow music teacher and co-

worker explained, "It was a joy working with Jim. He was a wonderful role model and co-worker. Jim has shared his passion and enthusiasm for music in the school, in his church and in the community. The Crookston community has been truly blessed through Jim's love of music and his desire to share that love of music with others!"

The Northwest Star Artist Award is given each year to recognize artists within our seven-county region who stand out in terms of artistry. "Of the Year" Award winners are nominated by area residents. This award comes with \$5,000. Artists can only receive our Northwest Star Award once, as a lifetime achievement award. Funding for the Northwest Star comes from the McKnight Foundation.

Betsy Saurdiff is Northwest Arts Advocate of the Year

The Northwest Minnesota Arts Council is pleased to announce this year's recipient for the Advocate of the Year Award is Betsy Saurdiff of Grygla.

Saurdiff is a visual arts instructor in the Grygla and Goodridge School districts. She encourages art exploration in her community by teaching community art classes and other arts-related activities. Recently, she played a central role in planning Grygla's Centennial celebration. She worked to entice other artists to participate in the event. She also created the centennial mugs and one of her students designed the centennial logo. Saurdiff is an accomplished artist, working primarily in ceramics. She also enjoys printmaking and sewing.

Artist Janet Johnson praised Saurdiff's abilities and efforts as an art teacher. "Betsy has built a very successful program at the Grygla School, providing quality instruction and support-



ing students in arts opportunities outside of class time. Her students submit work annually to the Region 1 Spring Arts Exhibition and the Section 8 Arts Festival. She also searches out artist/mentors for her students who want more and varied instruction from artists in the field."

Superintendent Galen Clow explained that "Betsy has the personality and unique ability to use her artistic talent to connect with her art students and draw out the artistic talent of each student. She believes in each student's artistic ability and continually challenges each student to bring out that ability. Betsy is an outstanding educator and lifelong learner who serves as a role model to staff, students and community through her positive attitude, passion for the visual arts and compassion for those she works with."

"I've always been happiest making things," Saurdiff admitted. Being a teacher has allowed her to continue learning. It's also a way to use her creativity and work with kids. She enjoys the light bulb moment the most when working with students. "The time you can tell it clicked for them. And, watching them blossom and grow."

According to Goodridge Principal Becky Carlson, "Betsy is a true artist, and as we like to say, can make anyone else an artist as well. Students enter Betsy's classroom with the idea that they are not "good at art" and every student leaves her classroom as an artist. She is always looking for ways to improve her classroom, herself and her students. Betsy is one of the best educators that I have had the opportunity to work with."

Our Arts Advocate of the Year award is given each year to recognize arts advocates within our seven-county region who stand out in terms of volunteerism in the arts. "Of the Year" award winners were nominated by area residents. This award comes with a cash award of \$500.00. Bus rollover accident results in injuries

THIRTEEN TOWNS - As of Monday, May 7th, the ISD 318 School District in Grand Rapids, MN issued the following statement:

22 students and one staff member were traveling to the Great Plains Youth Institute in Crookston this morning when the bus they were on was involved in an accident five miles outside of Bagley. The cause of the accident was not known at the time of publication. Seven students and the driver were transported to the ER in Bagley and Fosston with minor injuries, such as cuts and abrasions. Four more students and the instructor were later taken to the ER as a preventative measure.

The State Patrol was on the scene and a bus had been dispatched to pick up the students to return them to Grand Rapids.

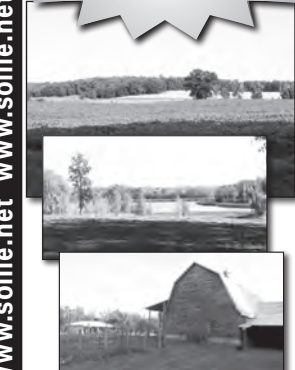

Grant Money Available to Minnesota Livestock Owners for Prevention of V

St. Paul, MN: New money is available to Minnesota livestock producers to help prevent wolf attacks. The Wolf-Livestock Conflict Prevention Grants provide \$120,000 for the upcoming fiscal year (July 1, 2018 – June 30, 2019). Applications are due June 29, 2018 to the Minnesota Department of Agriculture.

The grants provide reimbursement for costs of approved practices to prevent wolf-livestock conflicts. Eligible expenses for the grant program will include any or all of the following items:

- Purchase of guard animals
- Veterinary costs for guard animals
- Installation of wolf-barriers which may include pens, fladry and fencing
- Installation of wolf-deterrent lights and alarms
- Calving or lambing shelters
- Other measures demonstrated to effectively reduce wolf-livestock conflicts

“This grant program provides Minnesota livestock owners with additional resources to protect their animals and livelihood,” said Assistant Agriculture Commissioner Andrea Vaubel. “I encourage producers to examine ways they can decrease the chances of wolf attacks, and apply for this state funding.”

Producers must live within Minnesota’s wolf range, as designated by the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources, or on property determined by the Commissioner of Agriculture to be affected by wolf-livestock conflicts. Any animal species produced for profit and documented to have been killed by wolves in Minnesota in the past is eligible. This includes bison, cattle, chicken, deer, donkey, duck, geese, goat, horse, llama, mule, sheep, swine and turkey.

The grant application must be emailed or postmarked by 5:00 p.m. on June 29, 2018. Work for this grant cycle must

be done and expenses reported by June 30, 2019. The application and more information can be found at <http://www.mdn.state.mn.us/grants/disaster/wolf/wolfconflictprevent.aspx>.

This is the second round of grants available to the state's livestock owners after the Minnesota Legislature provided funding to the Minnesota Department of Agriculture in 2017. The first round awarded \$120,000 to 25 producers in 12 counties of the state. Grantees are using the money for items like fencing, guard animals, and motion lights – all deterrents to wolves.

- Pickups, vans and SUV's are not limited on the rear side and rear windows. It can be less than 50 percent behind the

front seat.

- Squad cars, limousines and vehicles used to transport human remains by a funeral establishment are not limited on the side and rear windows.

Most troopers have window tint meters in their patrol cars and will test the windows for the legal percent of light transmittance if they look to be below the statutory limit. If they are found below the legal limit, the trooper will issue a citation or warning. Prior contact data is stored in our Minnesota State Patrol computer system, and if the vehicle is stopped again, the trooper will be able to read what that vehicle was stopped for, driver and passenger information, if a citation or warning was issued and any comments entered from the previous trooper(s).
