The Crusade for Forgotten Souls Featured During Norwegian Heritage Week

The Thief River Falls Branch of the American Association of University Women will be hosting author Susan Bartlett Foote at the Thief River Falls Public Library at 10:00 a.m. on Saturday, May 19, 2018, as part of Norwegian Heritage Week. Author Foote recently published The Crusade for Forgotten Souls that has strong ties to a northwest Minnesota Norwegian immigrant family.

The stirring story of the reform movement that laid the

groundwork for a modern mental health system in Minnesota

In 1940 Engla Schey, the daughter of Norwegian immigrants, took a job as a low-paid attendant at Anoka State Hospital, one of Minnesota's seven asylums. She would work among people who were locked away under the shameful label "insane," called inmates—and numbered more than 12,000 throughout the state. She acquired the knowledge and passion that would lead to "The Crusade for Forgotten Souls," a campaign to reform the deplorable condition of mental institutions in Minnesota. This book chronicles that remarkable undertaking inspired and carried forward by ordinary people under the political leadership of Luther Youngdahl, a Swedish Republican who was the state's governor from 1946 to 1951.

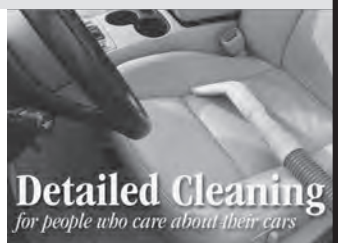

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Ask a Trooper

by Sgt. Jesse Grabow Minnesota State Patrol

Question: Is there a presentation provided by

law enforcement for new teenage drivers? Can a driver, under the age of 18 with a valid permit, tow a trailer in Minnesota?

Answer: A driver who is under the age of 18 with a valid permit or provisional driver's license may operate a vehicle towing a single trailer as long as they comply with all of the license restrictions and requirements. If towing a recreational vehicle combination of three, the operator has to be at least 18 years of age. Please keep in mind that this is a Minnesota law and may not be legal if traveling into other states. If you are planning on traveling through other states, check with their officials on their state towing laws.

Teen Driver Safety

I have helped present on teen driver safety for the past several years, and law enforcement's goal is to reduce all teen-related crashes through education and enforcement.

The graduated driver's licensing (GDL) law requires driver education programs to offer a 90 minute class for parents of teens who are in the

process of obtaining instruction permits and provisional driver's licenses. This class provides information regarding teen driving risks, teen driving laws and adult influences on teen driver behaviors.

The parent awareness class is critical to understanding today's teen driving risks, Minnesota's teen driving laws, and how to help your teen become a safer driver. As a parent, don't put convenience ahead of safety. Just because teens have their licenses doesn't mean they're ready for every driving situation. Parents should continue to supervise their teens driving after they're licensed.

The GDL law also requires that students under the age of 18 submit a supervised driving log to the driver exam staff at the time of the road test for the provisional driver's license. The log must verify the student completed 50 hours of supervised driving time, 15 of which must be nighttime hours. If a parent/guardian completes the parent class and submits a certificate of completion to the driver exam staff at the time of the road test, or if it was submitted when applying for an instruction permit, 40 hours of supervised driving time are required, 15 of which must be nighttime hours.

The key to developing safer teen drivers is to provide supervised experience — a lot of "windshield time," discuss driving responsibilities with your teen, establish clear family driving rules and follow through with consequences when warranted. We encourage parents to practice with their kids well beyond the minimum requirements of the law to ensure they're prepared to drive in many driving and weather conditions. The extra required driving practice hours and the supervised driving log help teen drivers become more experienced and help parents track progress and areas to improve.

they, too, love their sons...as Mary loved Jesus.

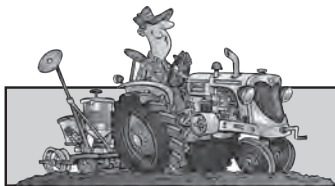
Perhaps Mary would have been asking the same questions about my daughters had their paths crossed back in the day even if her son's intentions were for salvation purposes.

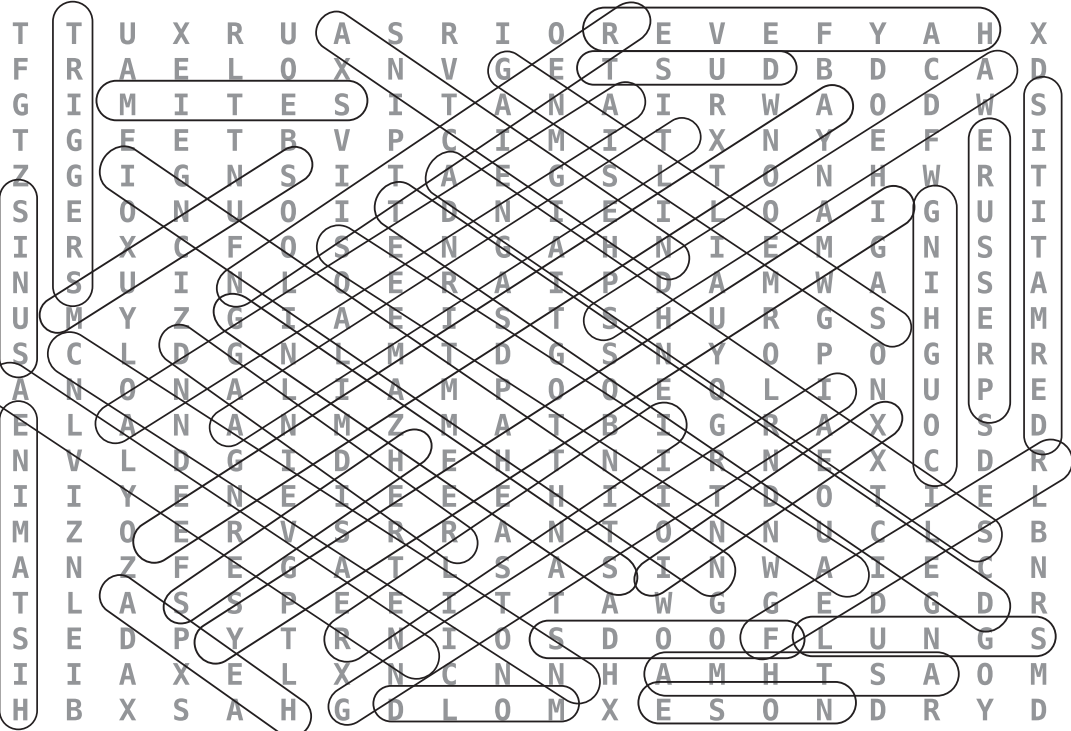

Apply to hunt elk in Minnesota, help manage elk populations

Hunters have through Friday, June 15, to apply for one of 22 elk licenses offered this year by the Department of Natural Resources. Elk hunting is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity for Minnesota residents.

"A number of antlerless-only elk licenses are being offered this year for the Kittson-Central herd to reduce that population," said Erik Thorson, DNR acting big game program leader. "Our latest survey counted 75 elk in this herd, which is above the population goal of 50 to 60 identified in the elk management plan."

Licenses will be available for three elk seasons in Kittson County's central zone and just the first season in the northeast zone. The Grygla area elk zone will not be open to hunting in 2018 because that area's elk population remains below the population goal.

The first 2018 elk season (A) runs from Saturday, Sept. 8, to Sunday, Sept. 16, in both open elk hunt zones. Two either-sex licenses and five antlerless-only elk licenses will be available in the Kittson County central zone (zone 20) and two bulls-only licenses will be available in the Kittson County northeast zone (zone 30).

The second 2018 elk season (B) runs from Saturday, Sept. 22, to Sunday, Sept. 30. One either-sex license and six antlerless-only elk licenses will be available in just the Kittson County central zone. The third 2018 elk season (C) runs from Saturday, Oct. 6, to Sunday, Oct. 14. One either-sex license and five antlerless-only elk licenses will be available in the Kittson County central zone.

Hunters may apply individually or in parties of two at any DNR license agent, the DNR License Center at 500 Lafayette Road in St. Paul, mndnr.gov/buylicense or by telephone at 888-665-4236. There is a non-refundable application fee of \$4 per hunter and applicants should use Code 625. The license fee is \$287. Hunters will

have to select a zone and season when applying. Hunting information including maps of the elk hunting zones is at mndnr.gov/hunting/elk.

Although the northwestern Minnesota radio-collared elk research is ending this summer, the DNR will use research findings to inform management decisions.

Applicants should be aware that license purchasers will be required to attend a mandatory orientation session prior to their hunt, register their elk in person and provide biological samples from any harvested animals.

Celebrate all military this May

Memorial Day is celebrated each May to commemorate the people who died in service of the United States of America.

Even though barbecues and visions of the upcoming summer weather may command much of the attention come Memorial Day weekend, the holiday really serves as a remembrance for those military members who paid the ultimate sacrifice for their country, as well as the personnel who continue to protect and serve today.

Memorial Day origins

Memorial Day was first known as Decoration Day and was borne out of the Civil War. On May 30, 1868, General John Logan, a national commander of the Grand Army of the Republic, decreed General Order No. 11, which designated the day for the "purpose of strewing with flowers, or otherwise decorating the graves of comrades who died in defense of their country during the late rebellion, and whose bodies now lie in almost every city, village and hamlet



churchyard in the land." May 30th was chosen because it wasn't the anniversary of any particular battle.

It took several years for the first state to recognize the holiday, which New York adopted in 1873. By 1890, all northern states recognized Decoration Day. When the holiday changed from commemorating those who died fighting the Civil War to honoring Americans who died fighting in any war after World

The military is comprised of the Army, Army National Guard, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps, and Coast Guard. Each of these military branches also has its own reserves.

- Help Veterans of Foreign Wars distribute red poppies as a visual reminder of the military's efforts.

- Help to maintain the veteran area of a nearby cemetery. Place flags on all of the graves.
- Befriend military families who frequently relocate, making a concerted effort to welcome

them into your community.

- Educate children about past wars and the services the military provides.
- Visit a military museum or historic site.
- Observe the National Moment of Remembrance at 3 pm local time for one minute.
- Post a message to the troops at the USO website (uso.org).

Ray enjoyed golf and hunting.

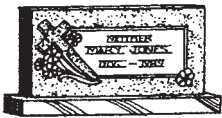

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MnDOT asks motorists, farm equipment operators to safely share the road during planting season

ST. PAUL, Minn. — Motorists traveling on Minnesota highways this spring need to be aware of large farm equipment moving from farm to farm, according to the Minnesota Department of Transportation.

“Planting season is in full swing and farmers in every corner of the state are out on the highways,” said Ray Starr, acting state traffic engineer. “Motorists need to be prepared to encounter slow-moving farm vehicles, especially on rural, two-lane roads.”

Farm equipment is large and heavy, making it hard for operators to accelerate, slow down and stop. The equipment also makes wide turns and sometimes cross over the center line. In addition, farm vehicles can create large blind spots, making it difficult for operators to see approaching vehicles. All of these factors can cause serious crashes.

Over the past five years, there were 688 crashes involving farm vehicles that resulted in 23 fatalities and 348 injuries.

Nearly half of the fatalities were an occupant of the farm vehicle.

Twenty-two percent of all farm equipment crashes and 29 percent of the fatalities were distraction-related. Other factors were speed-related and alcohol-related.

Motorists should:

- When approaching farm equipment, slow down and use caution.

- Watch for debris dropped by trucks. It is safer to brake or drive through debris than to veer into oncoming cars or off the road.

- Wait for a safe place to pass.

- Wear seatbelts.
- Drive with headlights on at all times.

Farm equipment operators should:

- Use lights and flashers to make equipment more visible.

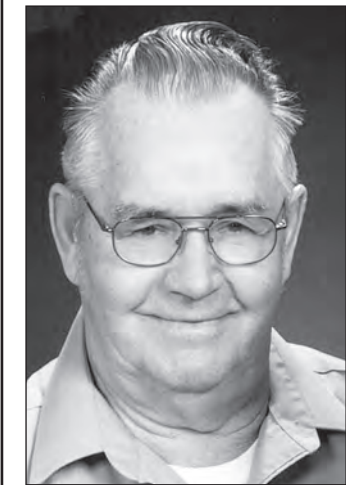
- Use slow-moving vehicle emblems on equipment traveling less than 30 mph.

- Consider using a follow vehicle when moving equipment, especially at night.

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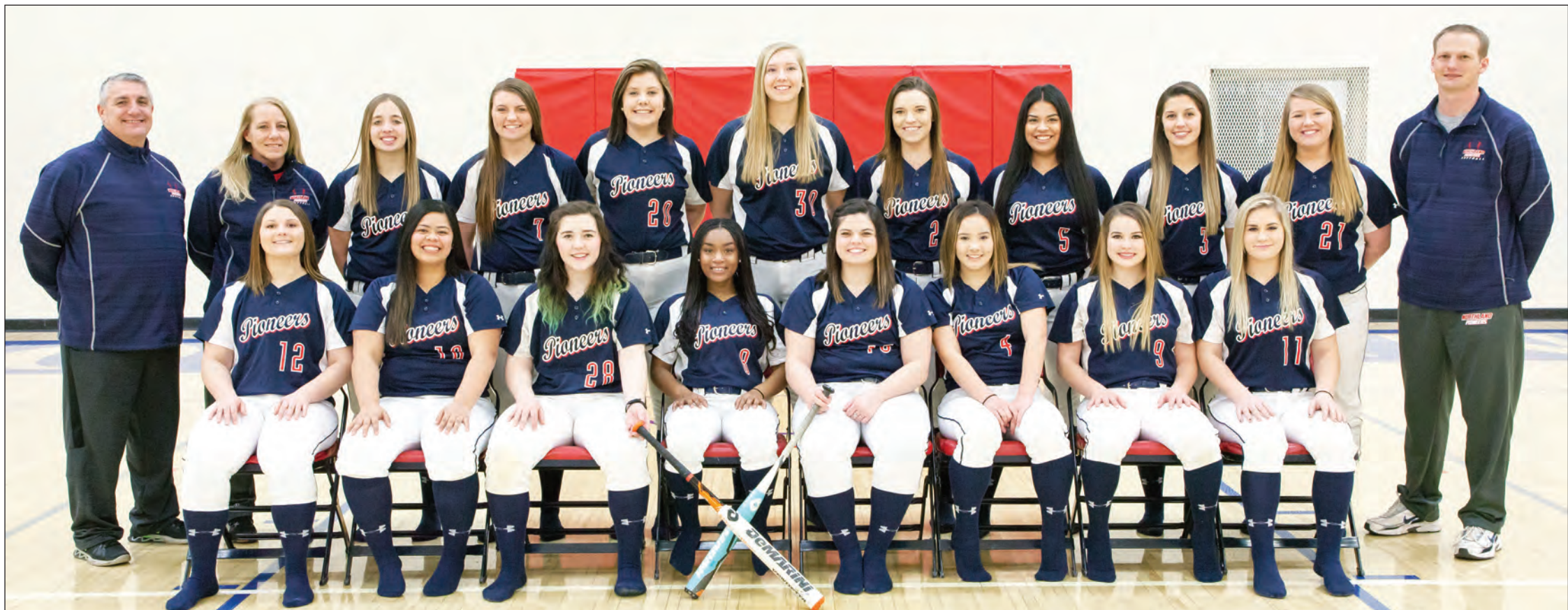

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Australia's first Unmanned Aerial Systems (UAS) maintenance training to be delivered in partnership with Northland Community Technical College

MAY 9, 2018 — Aviation Australia has partnered with one of the premier aerospace colleges in the United States of America, Northland Community & Technical College (NCTC), to deliver the first Unmanned Aerial System (UAS) maintenance training program in Australia.

The courses are designed to educate and up-skill qualified aircraft mechanics into UAS maintenance technicians. The course will educate students with a broad understanding of commonly used UAS platforms at a functional level, creating uniquely skilled individuals for jobs of the future.

The training course will be compliant with key international and Australian regulatory requirements, enabling graduates to leave with multiple domestic and international outcomes.

"There has been significant growth in the usage and application of unmanned aerial systems in Australia. There is a clear need for skilled and well-trained maintenance technicians to support this growing industry," said Bill Horrocks, Aviation Australia Chief Executive Officer.

"Aviation Australia is thrilled to be developing this capability with Northland Community & Technical College, who are a leading aerospace training provider in the USA."



The course is a key enabler for Australian industry to up-skill maintenance staff, supporting the multiple Beyond Visual Line of Sight (BVLOS) commercial and military UAS platforms that are evolving in Australia.

Northrop Grumman has already identified the need to up-skill Australian aircraft mechanics with UAS training to support cutting edge unmanned capabilities.

The Royal Australian Air Force (RAAF) is expected to be the first international partner to field the MQ-4C Triton, a U.S. Navy maritime surveillance UAS built by Northrop Grumman, and this will require in-country sustainment.

Northrop Grumman made the initial connection between the two world-class training organizations, previously providing NCTC with 14 Bat UAS aircraft and associated equipment for use at their USA based

campus in Minnesota.

A range of NCTC-owned UAS training assets will be shipped to Aviation Australia's Brisbane campus in late 2018 for use in the practical portion of the first Australian based UAS course.

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
