Bergerson retires after 27 years on Township Board

Glenn Bergerson of Gully attended his last Gonvick Fire Department dinner as a member of the Johnson Township Board. He has been serving for the last 27 years on the town board since 1991.

He served as a supervisor for many years and the last few years he served as the chairman of the township.

Township roads are the biggest part of the duties of the board. They have road inspections both winter and summer. Pot holes have to be taken care of before they get any bigger. They always kept them up by putting pea rock to fill and then packed the gravel afterwards. They use a road grader to smooth out the area.

They have to maintain the right-of-way, check ditches for trees and shrubs and replace new culverts when needed.

The hardest part of the job was getting members together for meetings and to check the roads and other things. Most of the members also had farming and haying to do as well.

Glenn was the fourth son of Bennie and Mabel (Sweno) Bergerson. He has lived most of the life in the same area except when he entered the US Army in March of 1958. He did his

basic training in Fort Carson, Colorado and served twenty months with the First Battle Group, 21st Infantry in Munich, Germany. He retired in March of 1960 and returned back to the area.

Along with a beef cow-calf operation and putting up many big round bales he worked at the Cenex in Gully. He started there in April of 1966, the Lost River Bridge had gone out so he had to leave his vehicle on one side of the river and walk across on planks to get to work.

In November 1983 he was married to Crystal Carlson and he gained a family with her two children Kimberly and Travis.

He and Crystal like to spend time with the grandchildren. Kimberly lives in Breckenridge with her family, with three grand son and one granddaughter. Travis lives in Goodridge with his family and two grandsons.

He has cut back on his farming as he only buys a few steers to keep the grass down a little around the farm. He rents out his land to Lonnie and Wade Burrack.

He does enjoy gong to the Gully Cafe and visiting with everyone there.

Northland Community and Technical College and the University of Minnesota Crookston Establish Dual Admission Program

Instituting a cooperative relationship between the two institutions under NorthernConnect Banner

MAY 16, 2018 — Northland Community and Technical College (NCTC) and the University of Minnesota Crookston announced a new comprehensive Dual Admissions agreement between the two institutions on Tuesday afternoon, May 15, 2018, at NCTC's Thief River Falls campus. The agreement establishes a cooperative academic relationship under NCTC's NorthernConnect Dual Admission Program. NCTC President Dennis Bona and U of M Crookston Chancellor Mary Holz-Clause signed the new memorandum of agreement that will provide access and opportunity for students from both institutions.

The agreement offers academically qualified NCTC students dual admission to U of M Crookston with the goal of working toward a bachelor's degree through U of M Crookston while enrolled at NCTC in previously approved academic programs, and a reverse transfer program that permits U of M Crookston students to transfer

credits back to NCTC and apply them towards an AA, AS, or AAS degree. Additionally, faculty from both institutions will be provided opportunities to collaborate in sharing, jointly developing and aligning curriculum to advance the quality and efficiency of the program.

NorthernConnect allows NCTC students to be admitted at U of M Crookston through identified dual admission programs. Programs offered as dual admission options will be pre-approved by program faculty and possess specific credit hour and course requirements.

Selected programs in agriculture at NCTC and U of M Crookston, specifically involving Agricultural Education and Animal Science, will be the first to utilize the NorthernConnect Dual Admission Program. U of M Crookston Chancellor Holz-Clause said, "Initially the dual admission partnership will focus on agriculture. Working together we hope to attract students to the field of agriculture, where employment

opportunities are excellent and qualified individuals are in high demand."

This is the second NorthernConnect agreement implemented by NCTC. In 2016 NCTC and Bemidji State University executed a similar agreement. NCTC President Dr. Bona said, "The dual admission program takes all of the guesswork out of transferring and allows a student to simply begin work on their bachelor's degree from day one by taking advantage of the opportunities that both campuses have to offer."

East Polk SWCD offering easy to use water testing kits

DISCOVER WHAT'S IN YOUR WATER

Soil and Water Conservation Districts are local units of government designed to help citizens conserve their soil, water and other renewable natural resources. Their mission is to coordinate assistance from available sources – public and private, local, state and federal – to work together and contribute to the state's environmental goals of cleaner air and water, protection of fish and wildlife habitat. SWCD's often work primarily on a one-on-one basis with local landowners in rural and urban areas to connect them with the financial and technical resources they need.

Minnesota has 90 Soil and Water Conservation Districts and East Polk County is leading the way by partnering with RMB Environmental Laboratories to provide drinking water analysis. Residents and local businesses can pick up water testing kits at the East Polk SWCD, 240 Southwest Cleveland Ave., McIntosh MN. Testing is available for bacteria, nitrates, arsenic, lead, fluoride and secondary contaminants.

While schools, well drillers and daycares are just a few entities required to test their water by the Department of Health, there are plenty of reasons why voluntary testing is needed. Water testing should be done if there is a private water source on the property, there are children or elderly in the

home, someone in the home has a digestive illness or a vitamin deficiency, if you are living near livestock or heavily fertilized areas, a new well, pump or treatment device has recently been installed or if there is a change in odor, taste or appearance of your water.

It is highly recommended that water testing samples be collected and returned to the lab the same day to meet proper sample care and transportation criteria. RMB created a free courier service to pick up returned water samples at the East Polk

Soil & Water Conservation District and bring them to the lab for analysis to ensure no missed deadlines.

While the kits, materials and delivery to the lab for the testing are free of charge, there is a minimal cost associated with the actual analysis. Tests run anywhere from \$12-\$27 per test, depending on interest or requirements. There is a customer service hotline provided by RMB at 888.200.5770 to answer any questions on water analysis.

RMB Environmental Laboratories, Inc. is an independent,

analytical laboratory testing water since 1995. They are state certified in Minnesota and North Dakota. They do not provide, nor sell drinking water treatment, softening or purification services. RMB is proud to work with many governmental agencies, cities, industries, lake associations and the public by providing analytical water testing, on-site field services, lakes monitoring, taxonomy, environmental consulting, community outreach and education. Red Lake Election results

Unofficially, Incumbent Gary Nelson defeated Chele D. Kalstabakken in the Ponemah Representative race and he was elected to another 4-year term office.

In the Chairman's race Floyd "Buck" Jourdain came out on top with 1394 votes or 45.64% and Darrell Seki Sr. 1216 or 39.99%. They will be in a run-off election in July.

The Secretary's race had Darwin Sumner receiving 785 votes or 26.06% and Sam Strong receiving 677 votes or 22.46%, They will be in a run-off election.

In the Treasurer's race incumbent Annette Johnson received 1322 votes or 43.85% and Chad Prentice had 813 votes or 26.97%. They will be in a run-off election.

The Red Lake Representative seat had Donald Good Sr. with 243 votes and David Desjarlait receiving 186 votes; they will also be in a run-off election.

In the Redby District Representative seat it was incumbent Julius Thunder receiving 243 votes, while Thomas Westbrook came in second with 125 votes. They will be in a run-off election.

In Little Rock, Michelle Cobenais received the most votes with 212, followed by William Green with 145; they will also be in a run-off election.

In the second Little Rock seat Adrian Beaulieu received the most votes 257 or 50.47%, followed by Robert Reynolds with 138 votes or 20.06%. With the information received it was unclear if Beaulieu won outright or if there will be a run-off election for this seat.



New Red Lake Retail Center to Begin Construction

Three Times Larger, Groceries, Butcher Shop, Laundromat, Fuel, Restaurant

Harvey Roy III, CEO of Ogaakaaning Enterprises and Red Lake Retail Center, Inc. is excited to announce that construction will soon start for the new Red Lake Retail Center. The new Retail Center will be 26,803 square-feet and will include a fuel station, a restaurant, and new Laundromat.

The interior will include a larger deli, a larger produce section, new butcher shop, and space to include hundreds of new retail items that couldn't

be sold in the store we currently occupy because of space limitations.

The new facility will be over three times as large as our current building, and will be located across the street from our current store. The overall goal has always been to stimulate our own economy and provide more products and services to our Tribal members. The new store will also increase jobs for our members.

The total cost of the project

is roughly \$10.4 million dollars and has been funded using a U.S. Department of Agriculture guaranteed loan and the New Market Tax Credits Program, which is administered by the U.S. Treasury Department. Native American Bank will be the principal lender of the project. Red Lake Builders, Inc. will be the General Contractor of the project.

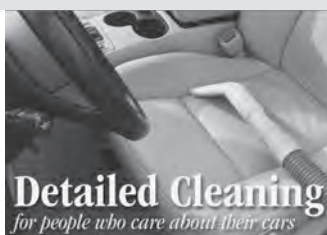

Ironing Out the Wrinkles

Calming it was, and calming it is. I remember well walking into the house and seeing the ironing board stoically placed like an icon between the kitchen and the living room. Pressing in and pressing on would be mom trying to get the wrinkles out of whatever it was that had been handpicked from the laundry pile.

Sprinkling water upon that which had long been dried out in order to keep the clothing damp was common practice. Things needed to be moist in order to decrease the creases. Special distilled water was purchased just for this purpose. If you were lucky, the iron did not spit back out rusty spots upon the cloth held hostage under the hot press.

There were days I'd awaken to mom standing near the scrunched up items as she continued pressing them in orderly fashion. There was just something about it that brought certain calm within the home. Upon completing the work, she would exhale with satisfaction.

As I grew older, she taught me how to do the job. It wasn't a matter of just getting the wrinkles out. There was a much more involved than that. There was order. First collars would

be pressed, then sleeves, and only then could you press the bodice.

Dresses had the same order, except you had to do the ties that flowed from the back before you did the skirt portion and the same with aprons. The ties always came first or you might end up re-wrinkling that which had been ironed out.

As I often grew impatient, I would take a short cut. Ironing the front and back of the item at the same time, I doubled up by pressing in hard. It never worked. Inevitably, the cloth would catch and instead of a perfectly ironed out section, I would end up with a sharp seam that was now pressed solidly into the middle of the material. Nope, there were no short cuts in this business. You either had to do it right, or not at all.

Every so often, mom would come over and see to it that it was being done properly. Having her trust others with the use of the iron was a big deal, and eventually, it brought much personal satisfaction.

I still remember looking suspiciously at the first tags within garments that came out announcing that they were made of material that was supposedly wrinkle-free. The extra expense of such items was rarely splurged upon, but now

and again it was, reducing the number of items that needed pressing. Of course, nothing back then was totally wrinkle-free unless you were able to grab it hot off the press which meant, right out of the dryer. A couple of shakes and a few hand presses would be all that was needed.

Times have changed. Now, many of the clothes worn are intentionally crumpled. They are left to sit within the dryer in order to ensure that a few more wrinkles are added. I guess it must give off the aura of nonchalance, casual, and attitudinally sends the message that we are comfortable with the comfortable...the casual.

In with the new concepts and out with the old! Wait, not so fast! Truth is...this is no new idea to come as you are. After all, in Isaiah 1:18 it says, "Come now, let's settle this," says the Lord. "Though your sins are like scarlet, I will make them as white as snow. Though they are red like crimson, I will make them as white as wool."

He didn't and doesn't even utilize an iron to get out the wrinkles but presses in with His promises. It all comes out in the wash so to speak. Just come as you are, and He'll do the rest while you rest in the truth of His promises. Amen.

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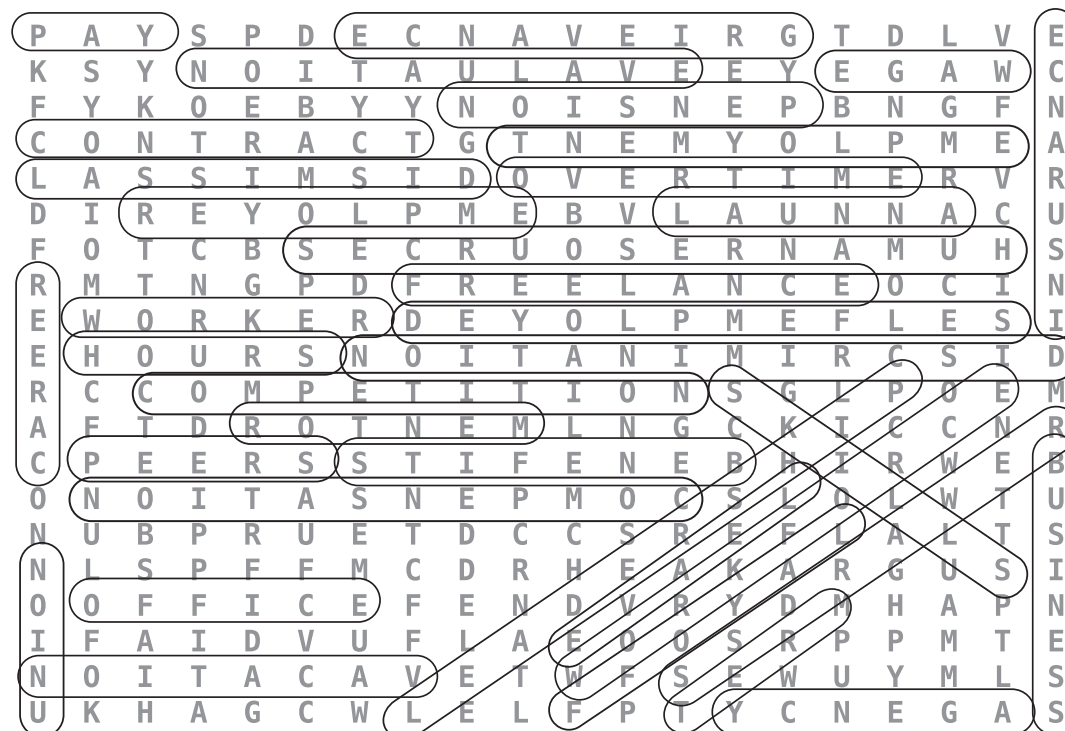
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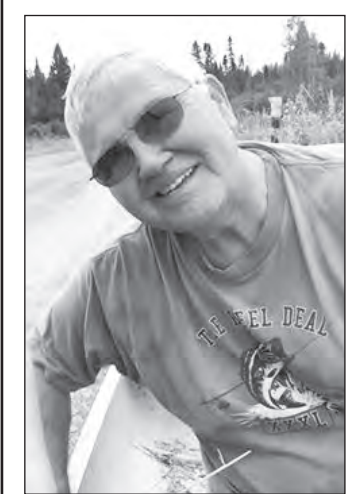

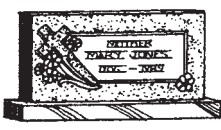

Essentia Health joins NIH in launching the All of Us Research Program to advance precision medicine

Enrollment begins nationwide for historic research effort

Recently, the National Institutes of Health opened national enrollment for the All of Us Research Program—a momentous effort to advance individualized prevention, treatment and care for people of all backgrounds—in collaboration with Essentia Health and other partners. People ages 18 and older, regardless of health status, are able to enroll. Precision medicine is an emerging approach to disease treatment and prevention that considers differences in people's lifestyles, environments and biological makeup, including genes. By partnering with 1 million diverse people who share information about themselves over many years, the All of Us Research Program will enable research to more precisely prevent and treat a variety of health conditions.

Volunteers will join more than 25,000 participants across the United States who have already enrolled in All of Us as part of a year-long beta test to prepare for the program's national launch. The overall aim is to enroll 1 million or more volunteers and oversample communities that have been underrepresented in research to make the program the largest, most diverse resource of its kind.

"The time is now to transform how we conduct research—with participants as partners—to shed new light on how to stay healthy and manage disease in more personalized ways. This is what we can accomplish through All of Us," said NIH Director Francis S. Collins, M.D., Ph.D.

"Precision medicine is already taking place today as we tailor treatments to individuals. The All of Us Research Program will gather a large, genetically diverse population that's a representative sample of the U.S.," explains Steve Waring, a researcher at the Essentia Institute of Rural Health (EIRH) and Essentia's principal investigator for the program.

EIRH will receive a \$7.5 million grant to conduct the study. Its goals are to lay the foundation for precision medicine, identify new ways to treat and prevent disease, test whether mobile devices can encourage healthy behaviors and help develop the right drug for the right person at the right dose.

Participants are asked to share different types of health and lifestyle information, including online surveys and electronic health records (EHRs), which will continue to be collected over the course of the program. At different times over the coming months and years, some participants will be asked to visit a local partner site to provide blood and urine samples and to have basic physical measurements taken, such as height and weight. To ensure that the program gathers information from all types of people, especially those who have been underrepresented in research, not everyone will be asked to give physical measures and samples. In the future, participants may be invited to share data through wearable devices and to join follow-up research studies, including clinical trials.

Also in future phases of the program, children will be able to enroll, and the program will add more data types, such as genetic data. In addition, data from the program will be broadly accessible for research purposes. Ultimately, the All of Us Research program will be a rich and open data resource for traditional academic researchers as well as citizen scientists—and everyone in between.

All of Us seeks to transform the relationship between researchers and participants, bringing them together as partners to inform the program's
