Grand Opening held for new buildings at Red Lake

As the blessing, opening prayer and drum ceremony took place at the new Red Lake Nation Capitol building a young eagle soared overhead. Red Lake Nation spiritual advisor Eugene Stillday spoke of a vision of an eagle that came to him in a dream. He thought it was a premonition that it should appear that day. Several people spoke during the opening ceremony for the "New Capitol".

There were about 200 people who were in the natural wood grain open air area surrounding the pavilion where the Battle River Singers drum group performed honor songs. Two buildings, the new tribal college building with an eagle head in the center with a wing span of 300 feet and the government center with an eagle with a wing span of 213 feet long. DSGW with Erik Wedge and Julie Spiering is a Minnesota firm with offices in Duluth, Virginia, Grand Rapids and Lake Elmo did the work for the project.

Dan King, the Red Lake Nation College President was the Master of Ceremonies for the event. He stated that the planning for the buildings, which includes the Government Center and the Red Lake Nation College, began five years ago. The tribal council and the hereditary chiefs voted for the \$21.4 million project. A grant from the United States Department of Agriculture helped to pay for the new capitol center.

Darrell Seki, Sr. the Tribal Chairman thanked the dignitaries for attending both in Ojibwe and English. He also thanked the tribal council because he said it takes more than one person to get things accomplished on the reservation.

Minnesota Governor Mark Dayton made comments at the Veteran's Memorial dedication. He wanted the youth in attendance to promise to stay in school, graduate and become leaders of the Red Lake Nation, the State of Minnesota and the United States.

Other officials who spoke included: Eugene McArthur, Red Lake Nation College Development Director, U.S. Congressman, Collin Peterson, Minnesota 7th District; Colleen Landkammer, MN State Director for USDA Rural development; Rod Skoe MN State Senator from the 2nd District and Dave Hancock State Representative for District 2A.

The day continued with the community lunch at noon provided by the Red Lake Tribal Council.

Tours were given of the Red Lake Government Center and the Red Lake National College. A mini pow wow with tribal drums and dancers was open to the public at the new Red Lake Pow Wow Grounds.

At 8:00 p.m. there was a Community movie night.

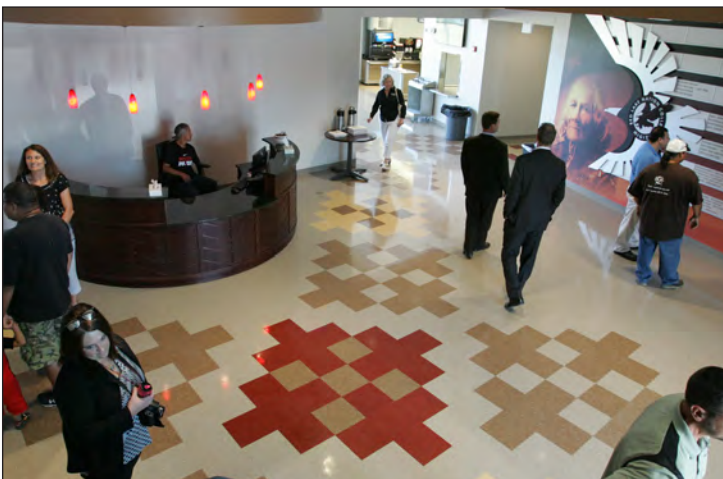

Musician Mike Farris Returns to the U of M Crookston on September 2, 2015

CROOKSTON, Minn. – Musician Mike Farris, a 2015 Grammy Award winner, will perform at the University of Minnesota Crookston on Wednesday, September 2, 2015, at 7 p.m. The concert in Kiehle Auditorium, recognizes Recovery Month and admission is free.

Farris became the first artist to receive a Grammy Award for Best Roots Gospel Album, for his "Shine for All the People." Farris was presented the award by the National Academy of Recording Arts and Sciences at the 57th annual Grammy Awards ceremony held on February 8, 2015, in Los Angeles. Best Roots Gospel Album is a new Grammy Award category that recognizes 'roots' gospel albums, the heritage of this music, and the growing interest and support of these genres.

Farris has performed with the who's who of American music legends including Stevie Ray Vaughan, the Dave Matthews Band, Sheryl Crow, and Bob Dylan. With a personal history that includes alcohol and drug addiction, Farris' music celebrates his freedom from chemicals and his faith in God.

Back in 2005, Mike Farris cracked open the hallway door

when, for the first time since the age of 15, he was clean and sober. Recording what would become the critically acclaimed Salvation in Lights (2007), a resurrected Mike eagerly anticipated the future. But with two ruptured discs, back surgery and the death of his beloved manager Rose McGathy all within a few weeks of the record's release, a rolling fog settled in. And with it, denial. Nevertheless, Mike's career was picking up steam. He won an American Music Award for New/Emerging Artist in 2008, followed by a Dove Award in 2010. DNR: ATVs are always in season

Back to school sales and State Fair advertisements are the first signs of a waning summer, and with Labor Day just around the corner, there's an uptick in all-terrain vehicle (ATV) recreation as adults and teens try to squeeze in a few more rides before the snow flies.

According to the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources, ATVs are always in season regardless of sun or snow. And DNR conservation officers want to get the word out to both adults and youths to ride with caution and care. "Six people, ranging from ages 6- to 53-years-old, have been killed in all-terrain vehicle accidents in Minnesota so far this year," said acting Capt. Jon Paurus, DNR Enforcement education program coordinator. "That compares to 13 total fatalities in 2014."

A DNR survey found that 72 percent of respondents said they ride ATVs on private land and trails, 15 percent ride on public road ditches and 15 percent ride on public land and trails.

Knowing where and when can ride ATVs is important. It is illegal to operate on the inside slope, shoulder and road-way of state and county roads. Class 2 ATVs (1,200-1,800 pounds) may be operated on

the shoulder or extreme right side of county or township roads and city streets if not prohibited by the road authority or other local laws. Class 2 ATVs may not be operated on the shoulder of a state trunk highway.

Understanding the rules and regulations governing ATV use can also prevent a court appearance and fine. Depending on the county, a citation for illegal ATV use can cost the rider \$90 to \$130, Paurus said. He urged ATV users to contact the DNR or their local law enforcement agency to learn the rules in their areas. Paurus also recommends completing the ATV safety training course.

Anyone born after July 1, 1987, who operates an ATV on public lands and waters in Minnesota, must successfully complete the ATV safety training online course. Those under age 16 must complete the ATV online course and riding component before operating ATVs on public lands.

"Recreational ATV use can be enjoyable, but sometimes people don't understand the rules and regulations that govern their use," Paurus said. "Although they are usually a small percentage of users, these are the riders who can cast all ATV users in a bad light."

This workshop is geared for all ages and experience levels.

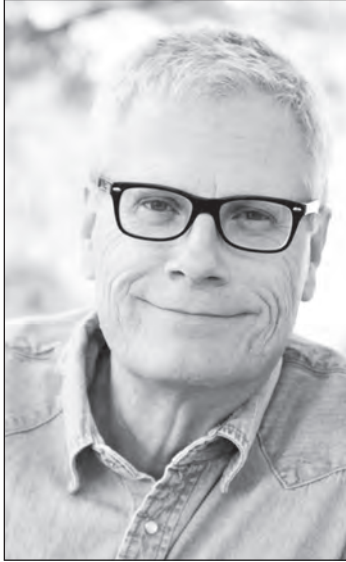
Did You Know There Was an Essex Car?

The Essex four door sedan sold for \$1495, which, adjusted for inflation today in 2015 would cost between \$16,000 - 20,000. By 1929, the Essex was third in sales in the country, behind Ford and Chevrolet.

Gates pressing in...child's face pressing upon gate...looking out...reaching out. “Mommy...mommy...mommy...” she cries from deep within.

Mulching Your Way to Fall

Have you noticed the days shortening? So have many of the trees in our region! Deciduous trees like Oak, Maple, Elm, and Birch rely on day length to tell them when to grow their leaves in the spring and drop them in the fall. The brilliant colors of autumn soon turn to frustration for many as leaves collect on their lawns. But before you take a rake out of the garden shed consider the advantages of leaving leaves on your lawn.

Leaves contain many nutrients that the tree absorbed from the air and the soil over the summer. Trees pull carbon from the atmosphere and water from their roots to produce sugar in a process called photosynthesis. When you bag up leaves these stored nutrients don't have a chance to be recycled. On the other hand, when leaves are burned they release their stored carbon back to the atmosphere. You can improve your soil and slow the release of carbon to the atmosphere by mulching leaves into your lawn.

Simply going over your yard with a mower and chopping the leaves into small pieces will not only result in time savings but perhaps spare you a

DNR seeks designs for Minnesota's 2016 pheasant stamp

Wildlife artists can submit entries for the 2016 Minnesota Pheasant Stamp from Monday, Sept. 7, to 4 p.m. Friday, Sept. 18.

The pheasant stamp validation costs \$7.50 and is required for pheasant hunters ages 18 to 64. For an extra 75 cents, purchasers can receive the validation as well as the pictorial stamp in the mail. A pictorial stamp without the validation is available for \$8.25 but is not valid for hunting. Revenue from stamp sales is dedicated to pheasant management and habitat work.

The ring-necked pheasant must be the primary focus of the design, though other species may be included in the design if

they are used to depict common interactions between species or are common inhabitants of Minnesota's pheasant range.

Artists are prohibited from using any photographic product as part of their finished entries. Winning artists usually issue limited edition prints of the artwork and retain proceeds.

Final judging is open to the public and will take place at 2 p.m., Thursday, Sept. 24, at DNR headquarters, 500 Lafayette Road in St. Paul. The public is welcome to come and view the winning design 10 a.m. to noon, Friday, Sept. 25.
