45 Star Flag discovered in Leonard

The Leonard Legion Post 619 dissolved their post in 1954. Members of that post then joined the Clearbrook Legion Post 256. What happened to their flag that they used for parade and display at their meetings was recently found by Ken Brien.

He was up in the stairway that leads to the church bell in Our Saviors Church in Leonard. There he found a large case which contained an American flag with 48 stars and a Legion flag with the leader stirrups and poles to be used in parades.

Brien found two area men who were members of the Leonard Legion, Duane Johnson and Lowell Stevens. Both are now members of the Clearbrook Legion #256. They remember meeting in a building that was located where Dyrdaahl has their business now in Leonard. It also housed the Klongerbo Drug Store. One of the first meetings that Stevens attended in 1954 the group made a motion to dissolve. It had been formed on February 5, 1948. The Legion Chapter was given with the seal of the National Commander

and then the National Adjutant Headquarters in Indianapolis, Indiana on February 26th, 1948. It was then signed in February by the Adjutant for the Department of Minnesota in St. Paul.

The case that the flags were in were in perfect shape. Keeping the contents like new. The group has no idea how the flag was put up there and when. They have decided that the best place for the items from the Leonard Legion would be at the Clearwater County Historical Society Building in Shevlin.

Red Lake Hosts 8th Annual Gathering of Elders

Anishaa (Just for Fun) made up much of the agenda when the Red Lake Band hosted its Eighth Annual Gathering of Elders at Seven Clans Casino (Red Lake) on Monday, April 30 and Tuesday, May 1, 2018.

Red Lake Elders (55 and older) came not only from reservation communities, but from Bois Forte, White Earth and Leech Lake, Duluth and the Twin Cities. They were coming home, coming home to visit with relatives and long-time friends.

An important part of the Gathering has been to provide a venue for youth and elders to interact and learn from each other and do it “anishaa.” Red Lake youth mixed with elders as volunteers, helping to serve meals, and providing information and entertainment.

Upon entering Seven Clans, the lobby was abuzz with old friends laughing and catching up on the latest news. Some were lined up registering for the Gathering. They received a tote bag, which was filled with agendas, an evaluation form, nomination form for King and Queen, and an array of small gifts.

Twenty-one informational booths, many detailing tribal programs and services available for elders, filled the available space left and right. Some visited these displays registering for prizes, while others chatted on comfy couches and chairs at the center of the lobby.

Others already seated in the Event Center sipped coffee while enjoying a hearty breakfast. Just before entering the center and off to the right, “Gatherers” chose a souvenir T-shirt. Turning around, one saw the convention center filled with more than 500 registrants, the largest ever, with nary an empty chair available. Many young men and women scurried about visiting with and assisting elders, highlighting again a key part of the Gathering, the mixing of youth and elders in intergenerational activities.

Monday, April 30, 2018

The event began with registration on Monday morning at 8. Around 9 a.m., Emcee Gary “Rez Dawg” Jourdain welcomed the crowd and gave a brief overview of the agenda. Spiritual Leader and Hereditary Chief

Greeting Spears, offered the invocation. The Eyabay Drum filled the event center with the sound of the heart of the people, as the Red Lake Honor Guard posted the colors.

Next came a welcome by Red Lake Chairman Darrell G. Seki, Sr. Seki, as is his custom, began his remarks in his first language, Ojibwemowin. An elder himself, Seki encouraged those present to talk to young people about this maazhi-mashkiki (bad medicine) that is ravaging the youth of the nation, drugs, alcohol, gangs, and suicide.

“500 years now, they’ve been trying to get rid of us, but we’re

still here,” said Seki. “Drugs and opiates brought in by non-members we cannot prosecute. We have an unfriendly administration Washington, who continue with promises broken and treaties violated.”

“Be friends with one another,” said Seki, “talk to your children and grandchildren. We as elders, we are the teachers, we have an obligation.”

Seki then excused himself informing those present that he’d be attending four ground-breakings at noon. They included a new Dialysis Center, Chemical Health Treatment Center, and two Fire Halls for Red Lake and Ponemah. “One never does these things alone,” noted Seki, “I want to thank the tribal council for sticking with these important initiatives, it’s taken awhile, but here we are. Miigwech!”

Morning Session

Oran Beaulieu, Director of Comp Health was first up. He spoke of personal care, provided home health care information and medicaid funding before introducing three EMT’s who spoke about the new Urgent Care building, now under construction, to take the weight off the emergency room. Beaulieu then introduced a team who spoke about Suicide Awareness.

Next up was Red Lake Director of Public Safety Officer

Minnesota Beef Producers Take on Trade Mission to China and Japan

Maple Plain, MN – Representatives from the Minnesota Beef Council and Minnesota State Cattlemen’s Association recently embarked on a trade mission with United States Meat Export Federation (USMEF) to promote U.S. beef in China and Japan.

Representatives from Minnesota included Minnesota Beef Council directors Katie Brenny and Davis Wulf. Minnesota State Cattlemen delegates included Ashley Kohls, Ted Reichmann and Ted Brenny.

“Meeting with influencers, United States beef customers, and trade negotiators reinforced our take home message that there is a big world out there with a tremendous appetite for U.S. beef. This is the good news for U.S. beef producers!” said Davis Wulf of Morris, Minn.

In addition to visiting with retail and food service influencers in China, the delegation of cattle producers from the U.S. met with leaders of China’s Inspection and Quarantine Service (CIQ). During this meeting, a five-year agreement was signed between CIQ and USMEF to continue working collaboratively to promote im-

ports of U.S. beef into China.

“There is currently a big shift in where global middle-class populations reside. Of the world’s middle class population, 70% will reside in Asia by 2030. As these markets continue to grow, so will their demand for beef,” stated Greg Hanes, Assistant VP of International Marketing and Programs for USMEF, “Asian countries don’t have the infrastructure to fill this demand domestically, so it will need to be imported.”

In addition to China, the group also traveled to Japan where they spent time in Tokyo. Compared to China, Japan is an established and thriving market for United States beef. Last year, the U.S. sold nearly \$2 billion to the country, making it the largest export destination for U.S. beef. While in Japan, the group visited with grocery stores, meat merchandisers and restaurant owners who currently market U.S. beef. Additionally, they had the opportunity to connect with Japanese consumers at a grilling demonstration by a Minnesota and a Colorado cattle producer grilling U.S. beef.

In 2017, the United States beef industry enjoyed record-breaking U.S. red meat exports with beef export values exceeding \$7 billion for just the second time ever. According to USMEF, beef exports add more than \$282 per head to the value of cattle marketed in the United States.

“As a U.S beef producer, you are an exporter whether you realize it or not. China, Japan, and other markets around the world seem may far removed from your daily farm or ranch activities,” stated Ashley Kohls, Executive Director of the Minnesota State Cattlemen’s Association, “However, given the increasing importance of exports to our industry, international markets are closer than they appear.”

Funding for this trade mission was provided through a Minnesota Department of Agriculture market development grant awarded to the Minnesota State Cattlemen’s Association and the Minnesota Beef Council, in addition to funding provided by the Minnesota State Cattlemen’s Association and the Minnesota Beef Council.

Kelly Brunelle and other public safety personnel who educated elders on drug awareness and other topics. Brunelle and his team told what to watch for and symptoms of those who might be engaged in dangerous drug use or activity. The elders were very engaged in this exercise with both questions and comments. Brunelle introduced one of the K-9 units describing the work the dog does in regard to law enforcement. The team concentrated mostly on the opioid epidemic, a high priority with Tribal Government.

From 11 am to 12:30 pm, Elders were treated to music and comedy provided by the well-known and long time entertainers Williams and Ree aka “The Indian and the White Guy,” who now appear to be Elders themselves.

Soon lunch was served in a quick and efficient manner by young people and event center employees.

Afternoon Session

After lunch, all those present were treated to an Ojibwe Puppet Show, while ballots were distributed for King and Queen, due back the next morning. From two to three pm, blotters and paper bingo cards were passed out with several folks winning some great prizes.

For the final formal activity of the afternoon, Hereditary Chief and Acting Tribal Secretary Darwin Sumner ran a PowerPoint presentation on the Chief Meskokonay Youth Cultural Camps he organizes and sponsors. He had several slides showing youth participating in cultural activities suited to the season.

During free time, some elders took advantage of the free cell phones available, clipper cuts for men, and more. Some perhaps, migrated to the casino. During both days, elders could get free photos taken at a Photo Booth staffed by Elwyn Jourdain Photography. A light supper was served at 5 pm.

Evening Activities

In the evening people went

their separate ways. But for those so inclined, a Late Night Session provided a little friendly competition for cash prizes. Games included Cribbage, and Slot Tournaments. Little by little competitors were elimi-

Red Lake County Sheriff

James Douglas Congdon (45) died as a result of an ATV crash, in the City of Plummer, in the early morning hours of 05/26/18. At approximately 02:30 hours on 05/26/18, the Red Lake County Sheriff's Office received several 911 calls reporting the crash. Red Lake County law enforcement, the Plummer Fire Department, the Oklee Ambulance and the Thief River Falls Ambulance were all dispatched to the scene. 1st responders attempted life saving measures, but Mr. Congdon was ultimately pronounced dead at the scene.

It appears that he was returning to his residence in Plummer, from a neighbor's house approximately 4 blocks away, when his 2008 Kawasaki 750 cc ATV overturned while he was negotiating a corner. Mr. Congdon was not wearing a helmet and he was the only occupant of the ATV. His body was taken to the Forensic Pathology Department at the University of North Dakota in Grand Forks for an autopsy. The preliminary autopsy report indicates that head trauma was the likely cause of death. The incident is still under investigation.

Question: Are bolt on bumper hitches legal in Minnesota?

Answer: Bolt on bumper hitches are legal but you must know and follow the rated capacity. Keep in mind, they’re not going to pull much of a trailer in most circumstances

(for example a rating of 2,000lbs with a 200 lb tongue weight.)

Many people spend a lot of time choosing the right vehicle, the right camper, or the right boat. Unfortunately, many people give little thought to the most vital link between the tow vehicle and trailer, the hitch. Do your homework and research when purchasing a trailer and hitch to determine what you will need. Note: Ratings vary slightly between manufacturers. <https://dps.mn.gov/divisions/>

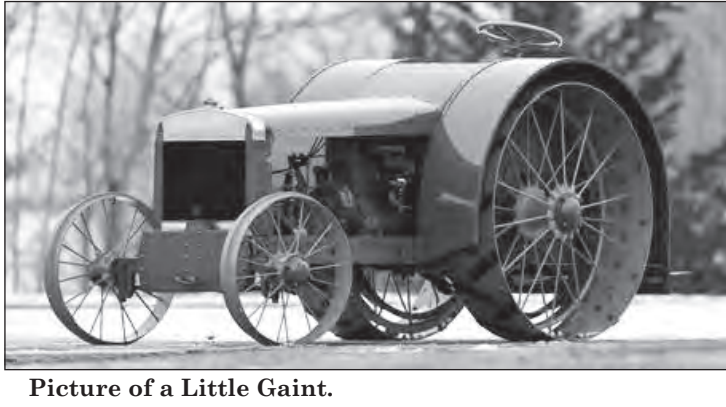
Little Giant!

The great state of Minnesota was overflowing with tractor companies in the early 1900’s. Louis and Lorenz Mayer started a shop in southern Minnesota, in 1876. They worked on steam engines and machinery and began to experiment with the idea of their own tractor. In 1911 they assembled their first tractor which they called The Little Giant. One of their advertising slogans stated, “It will make farming so interesting that your boys will rather remain on the farm that leave for the city!” Proud of their design they jumped in with both feet in 1914, plunging into the tractor industry.

The Mayer brothers believed in their product. They boasted if any part or workmanship failed, within a year, it would be replaced free of charge. The factory was enlarged in 1917 expecting more business and exports anticipating the end of WW I. In 1919 workers demanded higher pay and were turned down. Finally the workers “strike” was settled and the Little Giants were made for about 8 more years.

This Little Giant was never a huge seller and fell into the category of an “Orphan” tractor company. But to me, it is another interesting chapter in the Minnesota Legacy of tractor

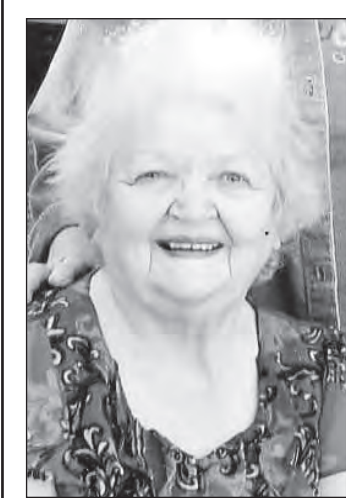

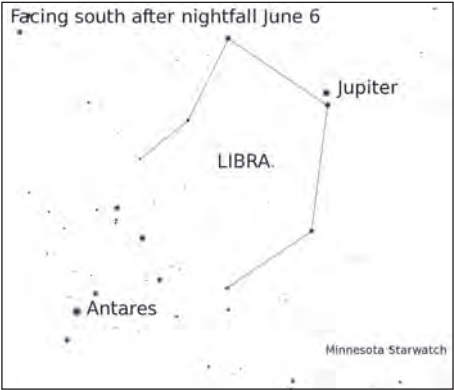

Minnesota Star Watch 2018

By Deane Morrison Neither the Big nor the Little Dipper holds much water after nightfall in June; the Little Dipper stands on its handle while the Big Dipper hangs down by its. But the Big Dipper's handle makes a handy guide to stars and planets. Follow its curve to Arcturus, the brightest star in the evening sky this month. Arcturus shines high in the south, anchoring the kite-shaped constellation Bootes, the herdsman. Continue the curve to Spica, in Virgo, then turn to the east, where Jupiter reigns over dim Libra, the scales, a constellation that resembles a jellyfish. Next to Jupiter is Zubenelgenubi. Its ancient, Arabic-derived name refers to the southern claw of Scorpius and recalls a time when stars of Libra were considered part of Scorpius. The scorpion and its red heart, Antares, rise low in the southeast and trail Jupiter into the sky. Rising even later, Saturn glows above the Teapot of Sagittarius, the archer. On the 27th, Earth laps Saturn in the orbital race, and the planet will be up all night. Its glorious rings will be tipped to show a near-maximal amount of surface area, so if you have access to a telescope, this is a perfect time to have a look. Trailing Saturn into the night sky, Mars brightens dramatically this month as Earth gains on it. Earth laps the red planet in the last week of July—an event not to be missed. In the west, Venus continues to outshine everything else. On the 14th, a young crescent moon begins working its way up



toward, and then past, Venus. After nightfall on the 16th, grab your binoculars and look for the lovely but subtle Beehive star cluster midway between Venus and the moon. You'll see two stars bracketing the Beehive to the upper left; these are the Aselli, or asses. In Latin the Beehive is called Praesepe, the manger, and the Aselli are feeding at it. On the 19th, the Beehive will appear immediately southeast of Venus, but by then a nearly first-quarter moon will wash out the stars somewhat. As Earth's orbit carries it farther from Jupiter, the giant planet drifts westward toward Venus. Watch the gap between the two beacons narrow over the summer. Speaking of which, the summer solstice occurs at 5:07 a.m. on the 21st, as the sun reaches a point over the Tropic of Cancer. June's full strawberry moon arrives at 11:53 p.m. on the 27th. It won't look very big because it will go through apogee, its farthest point from Earth in a lunar orbit, just two days later. However, since it reaches fullness in the evening, it'll be very round as it peeks above the horizon. It glides across the night sky in company with another famous orb—Saturn.
