Minnkota warns the public to avoid power line debris near Winger, Fosston

Minnkota Power Cooperative is warning the public to avoid downed power lines and related debris from the June 29 storm. About 13 miles of 230,000-volt transmission line running from Winger to Fosston was taken down by strong winds. Debris from the line has been removed from roadways, railroads and other transportation corridors; however, fragments of the 74 damaged power line structures remain in farmland and other areas. Minnkota has been in contact with affected landowners and continues to assess crop damage.

For your safety, please do not approach the downed lines. The structures can be dangerous, and one must always assume a line is energized. If there is a safety issue, please contact Minnkota Power Cooperative immediately at 701-795-4000.

Minnkota crews are working as safely and quickly as possible to remove debris from the area. The cleanup process is expected to be done within 4 to 6 weeks. Please be mindful that there will be extra traffic on Highway 1 for some time and heavier traffic and congestion along township roads from Winger to Fosston. Once the debris is hauled away, a contractor will replace the 12.5-mile line.

Redundancy built into Minnkota's transmission system allows for energy to be delivered to the area using alternate power lines. While some shorter power outages may be required to repair the system, Minnkota is working to limit any additional outage time for electric consumers in the region.

Red Lake County Sheriff

07-03-2018 - On the morning of 07/03/18, a formal criminal warrant was issued for Sarah Leah Kortan (30) of Red Lake Falls. Ms. Kortan was charged with Murder in the Second Degree, which carries a maximum sentence of forty years in prison. The criminal complaint alleges that Ms. Kortan, unintentionally caused the death of a two-month old infant girl, at her residence in Red Lake Falls, on the afternoon of 06/20/18. The death occurred as a result of injuries sustained during a physical assault and/or by acts associated with the malicious punishment of a child under the age of four. The criminal complaint also reveals that the infant victim had multiple skull fractures, and retinal hemorrhages and detachment in her eyes. A Forensic Pathologist at the University of North Dakota that conducted the autopsy, indicated that these injuries were not consistent with an accidental fall, but were sustained from inflicted trauma.

On the afternoon of 07/03/18, Red Lake County deputies arrested Ms. Kortan in Red Lake Falls. She was transported to the jail in Crookston and will be held in custody until her first court appearance later this week.

07-05-2018 - Sarah Kortan made her initial court appearance earlier today in District Court in Crookston to face the charge of Second Degree Murder. It was ordered that she be held in custody at the jail in Crookston, without the possibility of bail, until her next scheduled court appearance on 07-11-18 at 9 am in Red Lake Falls.

Q u e s - tion: When the speed limit is changing on a road, does the new speed limit start at the sign, or does it start when you can see the sign?
Answer: The speed limit zone area becomes effective at the point you reach the sign. So if the speed limit sign/zone changes to a slower speed, slow down before the sign and not after. If the speed limit changes to a higher speed, wait until you get to the increased speed limit sign before increasing your speed.
Each year, illegal or unsafe speed is a leading contributing factor in Minnesota fatal crashes. To continue educating the public on the dangers of speed, law enforcement across Minnesota will conduct extra

Theology in the Trenches

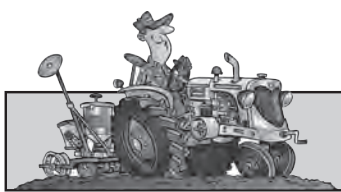

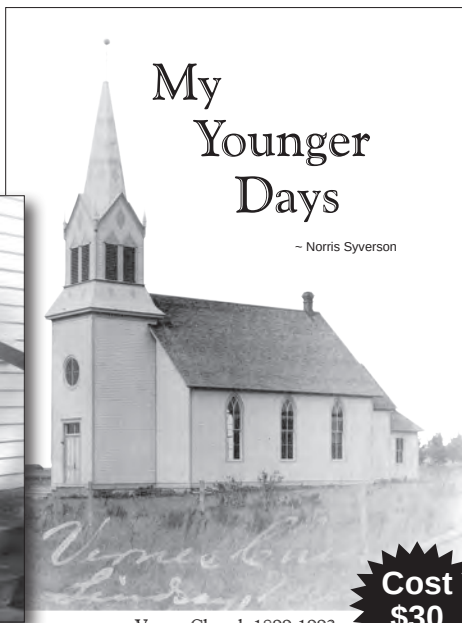
Here is just an excerpt from his first page...

“I hope every reader will seek the Lord and make sure you have the Lord Jesus deep in your heart for this is the Will of God.”

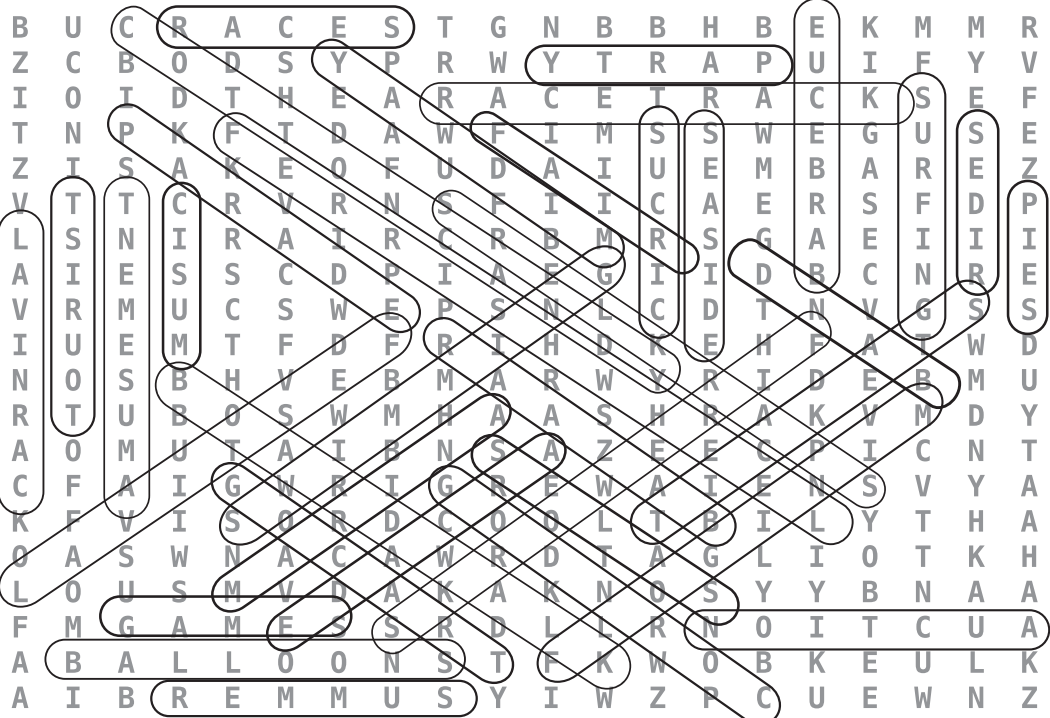

Marvin Wayne Sorgaard was born on May 17, 1937 in Fosston, Minnesota to parents Emil and Opal Handyside Sorgaard. He grew up south of Lengby in Island Lake Township and attended the Antel country school. He then went to work building and working on grain elevators in the area.

Marvin was married to Eunice Preisler on February 12, 1960 at Immanuel Lutheran Church in Bejou. After their marriage, the lived and began their family on a farm six miles east of Bejou. To this union, three children were born, Sherrie, Robin and Teresa. The family's young wife and mother passed away on April 23, 1970.

Marvin met Judy Wibbels of Bejou, who was widowed as well at the time. After a short courtship, they were married and joined their families together on June 6, 1971 at the Assembly of God Church in Mahnomen. To this marriage, Judy's four children, Vaughn, Renee, Vernetta, and Joni were added to the family. Then, in 1972, a daughter, Stacey, was born.

Marvin continued to farm small grains and livestock and raise his family on the farm. In 1977, he sold the cows but continued on with the field work. In 1986, he retired, and moved to Lengby with Judy and only remaining child at home, Stacey. Marvin tinkered and could fix anything. He was known as a "jack of all trades" and enjoyed doing small repairs for people in the area. He spent many years on the Lengby City Council and was an integral part of Lengby's care and upkeep. Even Santa called on Marvin for assistance with the town's Christmas party.

Yearly family RV trips were important to Marvin. The family had the opportunity to travel around the country in a small pick-up camper at first and kept increasing in size as the years went on. In later years, when the kids were gone, the RV ended up being quite large. There are lots of wonderful memories and many stories of those early family camping trips. He and Judy still would go Arizona each winter and continued for many years. In fact, even after Judy had a devastating stroke in 1995, this didn't stop them and

they still continued to travel. Marvin was her dedicated caregiver and companion until she passed away on October 21, 2011.

Marvin had a unique personality. His frugality and theory of money was well-known to his family and others. One example, being his strategy to save gas by throwing the transmission into neutral at any high speed usually at the top of a hill and coasting for as far as possible, sometimes in heavy traffic while slowly coasting up to the spotlight, with happy drivers behind him. The priority here is saving gas. One statement Marvin often made when he was getting passenger complaints about his lack of focus on the road ahead of him and drifting over the center line was, "Well, I pay taxes on this side of the road too!"

Throughout his life, Marvin enjoyed hunting, trapping, snowmobiling, waterskiing, golfing, and especially loved his fishing. His fish house was often the first out on the lake, even dangerously so. He loved a challenge. On outdoor adventures, Marvin would sometimes encounter wounded or abandoned wild animals and bring them home to surprise his young girls. They grew up with many unusual "pets", like baby deer, wild bunnies he'd chase down and catch from the field he was plowing, pet squirrels he named "Chip and Dip", raccoons he'd tame, put on leashes and named "Charlie and Fred". He loved showing off his latest critter at family reunions and graduation parties. He was a master at training his dogs fun tricks, and if he didn't have a wild animal to parade, our dogs Nikki or Lucy were sure to put on a great show! Marvin seemed to find a way to be the life of the party but in a way that was magnetic and interesting. He lived to get a rise out of people. He had a cannon to scare blackbirds from sunflower fields, that he loved to set off unknowingly for the reunion guests at his house. That went on for a few years until Judy must have put an end to the kid-at-heart's antics! He loved to visit with people, was truly a social butterfly, and he would often spend Sunday afternoons with family, enjoyed staying for supper, and dearly loved all of his children and grandchildren.

Marvin was also a bit of a paradox, for just as he could be extremely frugal, he could be just as incredibly generous. His faith and love for Christ was demonstrated through a life of service and generosity towards others in need. Often, he would do without, so others could have. He lived out "For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also". He didn't hold onto money for his self gain...he was frugal so he'd have plenty to give to a true need. He was a tenderhearted loving man and wonderful father. He will be dearly missed but he left a lifetime of many great memories and stories.

Red River Watershed Management Board Reorganization Well Underway

The Red River Watershed Management Board (RRWMB) was created in 1976 with the principal objective of assisting member watershed districts with the implementation of water related projects and programs. The purpose of these projects and programs is the reduction of local and mainstem flood damages and to enhance environmental and water resource management. The RRWMB is a joint powers agreement with eight watershed districts in Northwest Minnesota.

The President of the RRWMB is John Finney of Humboldt, Minnesota, and he is also the Treasurer of the Joe River Watershed District. "The RRWMB has transitioned and reorganized after many years and we are pleased with the progress that has been made and the professionalism that our staff have brought to the RRWMB. We have accomplished much in six months, but still have work to complete in several areas including communication and outreach activities" said Finney.

The RRWMB developed a phased strategic planning process in 2017 and started implementing it last fall. Phase I was to hire an Executive Director and Executive Assistant, and to establish an office in a public setting. The RRWMB office is temporarily located in the Arvig Telecommunication Building in Ada at the present time. The RRWMB also entered into an agreement this spring with the Wild Rice Watershed District for RRWMB staff to be co-located with them in Ada. It is anticipated that co-location will take place later this year or early next year.

Robert Sip, originally of Ada, Minnesota, was hired last fall as the Executive Director and has been with the RRWMB for just over six months. Sip brings over 20 years of local and state gov-

ernment experience to the position. "The RRWMB has been addressing several matters over the last six months related to transparency, accountability, openness, and is committed to being responsive to its member watershed districts and local units of government", said Sip. Nikki Swenson, also originally from Ada, was hired in January 2018 as the Executive Assistant. She brings approximately 9 years of financial and watershed district experience to the RRWMB.

The RRWMB approved a Communication and Outreach Strategy in June 2018 and will work on implementing it ongoing over the coming months and years. The RRWMB also distributes monthly meeting highlights after regular monthly board meetings. Constant Contact and Facebook are other social media tools that the RRWMB currently utilizes. Other tools will be explored in the future such as Twitter. Jerome Deal, Secretary of the RRWMB and Chair of the RRWMB Public Information Committee said, "Transition during a time of reorganization or restructuring can be difficult but the RRWMB is committed to this process. Increased communication about RRWMB activities, initiatives, and financial matters will continue as we move forward". Deal is also a board member of the Bois de Sioux Watershed District in Wheaton.

The RRWMB has also been working on internal controls, reducing administrative costs, and focusing on providing enhanced services to its member watershed districts. Phase II of the strategic plan calls for developing a path forward to guide the RRWMB into the next five to ten years.
