It is located next to the elevator in the shop upstairs shared with North Central Feed Products. “Off The Tracks” is a full service grooming shop with retail as well. They sell dog food, treats, leashes, collars, personalized tags and so much more. Lexie is also the owner of “Off The Tracks Grooming” near Leonard. She has worked in and out of vet clinics since high school. “I first started right here, and I am very happy to be back,” Lexie stated, “It is not new but definitely not unfamiliar.”. Lexie is originally from Battle Lake, MN and has been a certified groomer since 2006. She now lives near Leonard with her husband CJ Lofgren and her son Cooper.

Those just weren’t her cup of tea, she has always wanted to work with animals so when Lexie called her in mid-May and asked her if she wanted to be full-time she didn’t pass up the offer.

Amanda also has two other dogs, 3 horses and a recently purchased donkey and not to mention two kittens that she is currently bottle feeding. “I like to rescue animals, especially baby animals,” Amanda said. Artist reception for Sarah McRae at Watermark

BEMIDJI, MN – Watermark Art Center will host an artist reception featuring one of the artists in their most recent installation, Bagakaande - It is brightly colored. This joint show, on display in the Miikanan Gallery, features the work of painters Sarah McRae and DG House. McRae will be available during the reception, held August 26 from 5-7 p.m., to visit with attendees and discuss her work.

"We are very excited to showcase these talented artists and bring their work to our community," said Karen E. Goulet, Miikanan Gallery program director. "These women share a distinct use of bold color and this exhibit is a vibrant intersection of work that reflects on their memories and connections to our woodlands."

Sarah McRae (Red Lake Nation) is an emerging artist who grew up in Minnesota. She received her BA in Art Education from Concordia College in Moorhead and her MFA in graphics from UW-Madison. Her artwork references traditional Ojibwe floral aesthetic in delicate and complex arrangements of elements and design. There is an ephemeral quality to her work that remembers traditional patterns in new ways that vibrate with life and possibility. McRae currently lives in Madison, WI, where she has been an art teacher at Velma Hamilton Middle School since 1996.

DG House (Cherokee Tribe of NE Alabama) has lasting memories of an earlier time spent in Minnesota's northern wilderness. She now resides in Montana living along the Gallatin River. A prolific artist, she has received numerous honors and awards, has exhibited around the country and is currently the guest artist in both Grand Teton and Yellowstone National Parks.

Essentia Health Receives Patient Feedback Awards

New Driver License Design
This past week, the Minnesota Department of Public Safety released a new look and features for Minnesota Driver's Licenses. These will be the new designs for orders processed after August 6th. Included is a new vertical orientation for those under 21 and a preview of the REAL ID-compliant license option available beginning this October. Full details are available here.
The standard Minnesota Drivers Licenses available beginning August 6th.

Recovering from Recent Storms
A disaster declaration has been issued for 36 counties in Minnesota, including Beltrami and Clearwater.
Cleaning up after these storms will be a long process. Hiring trusted local businesses from our communities is the

best way to protect yourself from falling victim to scammers who may try to prey on the situation. If at all possible, I encourage people to rely on reputable, local services during restoration projects.
Residents in the counties subject to the disaster declaration also may be eligible for low- or no-interest loans to help with recovery efforts. 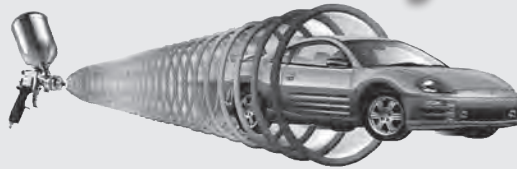

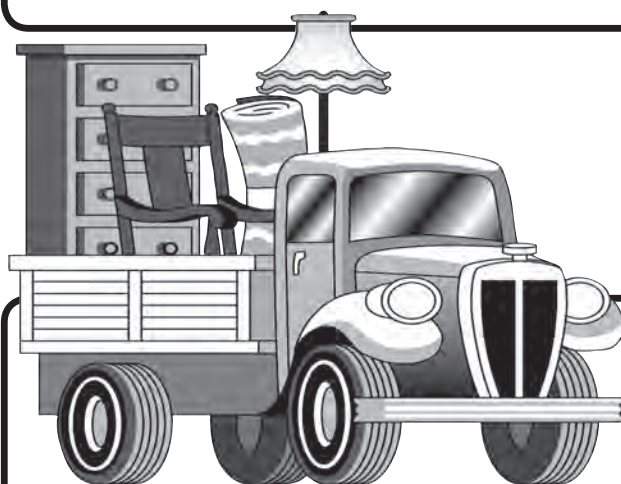

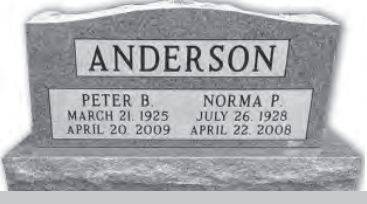

Simple hygiene tips that can have a lasting, positive impact

Personal hygiene isn't about just looking good. The effects of maintaining personal hygiene are myriad and include reducing one's susceptibility to infection and decreasing the risk for disease.

Because personal hygiene can have such a profound impact on overall health, some may feel that they need to go to great lengths to maintain their hygiene. But that's not the case. In fact, the following are a handful of simple ways that men, women and children can maintain their personal hygiene.

- Wash your hands. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention states that is one of the most important steps a person can take to avoid getting sick and spreading germs to others. Pinworms are small, white roundworms that sometimes live in the colon and rectum of humans. People infected with pinworms may itch or scratch infected areas, ultimately spreading the pinworms if they do not wash their hands and trim and clean their fingernails. Reinfection may occur among people infected with pinworms who do not clean their hands and fingernails and keep their fingernails short.

Menopause and breast cancer risk

Menopause occurs when a woman's reproductive cycle is over and she can no longer produce offspring. For many women, menopause occurs around age 50.

While menopause itself is not a risk for breast or other cancers, it's important to know that some symptom treatments and other factors can increase the risk for cancer among menopausal women. The North American Menopause Society says that a woman going through perimenopause and menopause may experience various symptoms, which can range from hair loss to food cravings to hot flashes to vaginal dryness. The National Institutes of Health indicates some women undergo combined hormone therapy, also called hormone replacement therapy, or HRT, to help relieve menopausal symptoms such as hot flashes and osteoporosis. This therapy replaces estrogen and progesterin, which diminish in a woman's body after menopause sets in. However, NIH's Women's Health Initiative Study has found that women undergoing HRT have a higher risk of breast cancer, among other conditions.

WebMD says evidence suggests that the longer a woman is exposed to female hormones, whether it's those made by the body, taken as a drug or delivered by a patch, the more likely she is to develop breast cancer. That means that HRT can increase breast cancer risk and also indicates that the longer a woman remains fertile the greater her risk for certain cancers. Females who began menstruating before age 12 or entered menopause after age 55 will have had many ovulations. This increases the risk of uterine, breast and ovarian cancers, states the American Society of Clinical Oncology. It also may impact a woman's chances of developing endometrial cancer.

Gaining weight after menopause can also increase a woman's risk of breast cancer, states the MD Anderson Cancer Center. Therefore, maintaining a healthy weight or even losing a little weight can be beneficial.

Women who enter menopause are not necessarily at a higher risk for breast cancer, but some factors tied to menopause can play a role. Females who want to lower their risk for various cancers are urged to eat healthy diets, quit smoking and maintain healthy body weights.

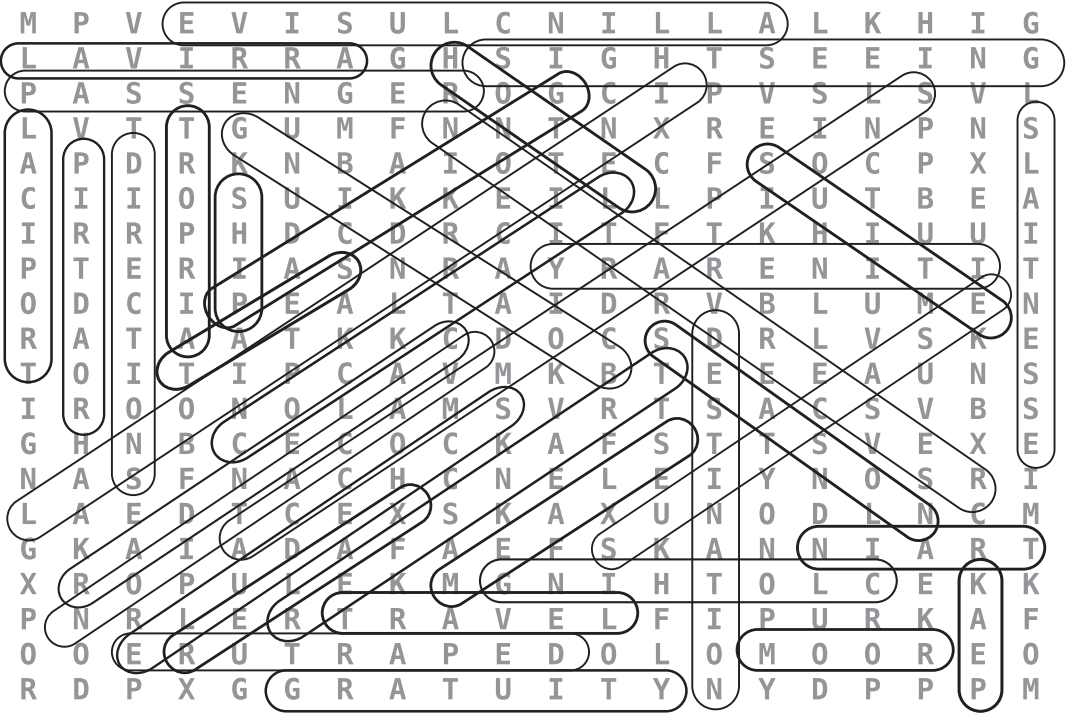

A much cooler night greeted racers and fans as the second half of the racing season kicked off with the Chad Olson Memorial for the Lightning Sprints and a special for the Pure Stocks here at the Greenbush Race Park.

Mike Tiani of Middle River, Mn., would lead the 12 car Modified feature to the green, and looked like the car to beat as the car looked like it was on a rail. A couple of laps in Tiani would have to hold off Halma, Mn., driver Jordan Duray. This battle went on for about eight laps, Duray would get along side of Tiani on the straights, but Tiani would pull ahead in the corners. Just after halfway, Stony Mtn, Mb., driver Rick Delaine would join in the fun. By lap 14, Delaine would use the high groove to make the pass for the lead coming out of corner four and put it in cruise to go on and pick up his second win of the year and a sweep of the evening. When the eye muscles fail to work together and the eyes turn inward, outward, upward, or downward. By the age of three to four months, an infant's eyes should be able to focus and be straight and parallel. Parents should consult an eye care professional if they notice eye alignment problems in their children.

Pink eye (conjunctivitis), diabetes-related eye problems and other refractive errors also can occur in children. Routine eye examinations can identify problems and get children the treatment they need.

Eye conditions that can affect children

While a loss of visual acuity is often associated with senior citizens, various diseases and conditions of the eye can affect children. The American Academy of Ophthalmology says many conditions and diseases can impact a child's vision. Early diagnosis and treatment are critical to improving a youngster's eye health and helping him or her see and feel better.

Learning about certain conditions and how to recognize their accompanying symptoms can help parents ensure kids get the treatment they need.

Amblyopia

Often referred to as "lazy eye," amblyopia may be characterized by reduced vision in an eye that has not received adequate use during early childhood. Amblyopia may result from misalignment of a child's eyes or from one eye focusing better than the other. If left untreated, the weaker eye can continue to weaken until it is rendered useless. Sight in the affected eye can be restored if treatment is begun early, says Prevent Blindness America. Glasses, eye exercises or surgery may be prescribed to help fix the underlying causes of the condition.

Astigmatism

Astigmatism is a condition wherein objects viewed at both a distance and close up can appear blurry. Experts say it occurs from the uneven curvature of the cornea or lens, which prevents rays of light from entering

the eye and focusing on a single point on the retina, otherwise known as a refractive error. Prescription eyeglasses often fix astigmatism. All About Vision also says that refractive surgery may correct astigmatism.

Color blindness (color vision deficiency)

The main symptom of color blindness is difficulty distinguishing between colors or making mistakes when identifying colors, particularly those shaded red and green. Typically by age five, children with normal color vision will be able to identify groups of colors, so if a school-aged child is having difficulty or showing disinterest in coloring, he or she may benefit from a colorblindness test. The National Eye Institute says color blindness is much more common in males than in females.

Pediatric glaucoma

This rare condition, also known as congenital glaucoma, occurs in infants and young children. The Glaucoma Research Foundation says incorrect development of the eye's drainage system before birth leads to increased intraocular pressure, which can damage the optic nerve. Enlarged eyes, corneal cloudiness and sensitivity to light can be symptoms. Medication and surgery are required in most cases.

Strabismus

Strabismus is a condition of misaligned eyes. It occurs

Here is just an excerpt from his first page...

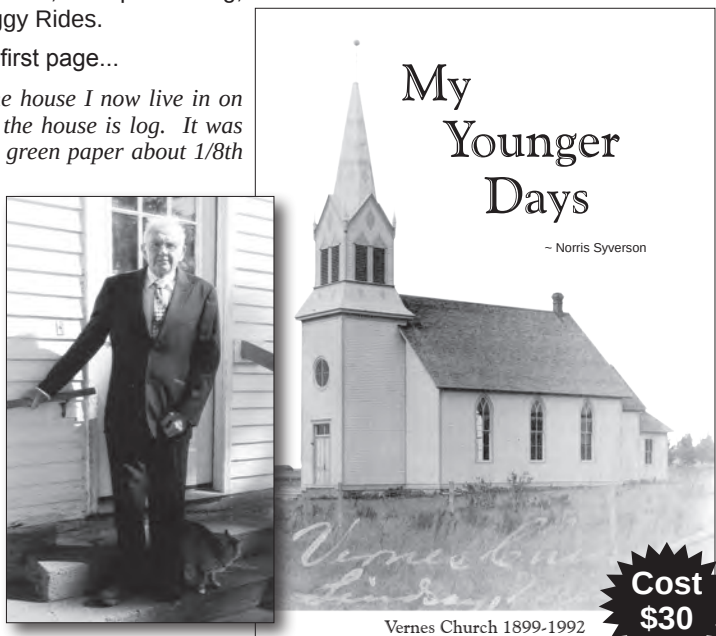
