Traveling from Grygla to Norway

In January of 2013 I received an email at Richards Publishing Company in Gonvick from Rev. Olav Berg Lyngmo in Norway. He was looking for relatives of Pete Levang who had immigrated to the United States in 1899 and settled in Grygla. We put an article with three pictures in the paper from him. One was the house that Levang lived in near Grygla and one was of him and the other was of Rev. Olav Berg Lyngmo who had contacted the paper. Julie Sparby worked at the American State Bank in Grygla and after the information was in the paper she called right away as she knew of the man and she got in contact with Olav. He has again emailed to me.

Descendents of Peder Isachsen Levang which includes the McLean sisters and their husbands went on a trip to Norway. The sisters Bette Sundberg and Sandra Bragg live in Grygla. Joy Austin lives in East Grand Forks and Dee Wells lives in Mission Viejo, California.

They took the Hurtigruten Cruise on the Finnmarken Ship from Bergen to Kirkenes in Norway and back to Bergen!

Hurtigruten ships have been travelling along the Norwegian coastline for almost 125 years, stopping off at towns and cities to deliver mail to those areas.

One stop with the Cruise Ship was Nesna, the parish where Levang was born and grew up. That is between Øksfjord and Kirkenes, in Finnmark County, which is the West East at the top of Norway.

Rev. Olav Berg Lyngmo and his uncle, Hans Mathiassen went with these Americans from Harstad to Tromsø. Hans (85) can remember Levang visiting his family just before 1940. Therefore he liked to follow the Americans to the ship. But he does not speak English. The time took over six hours.

Lyngmo sent this picture of the group that visited Norway. He also said, "Thank you again for your help in 2013, finding descendents of Peder Isachsen Levang!"

At The Little Log House Pioneer Village in Hastings July 27, 28, 29 was the 27th annual antique power show. This years feature was the gathering of the International Cockshutt Collectors Club of which I am a member.

In the early 1800's the United States began to attract European immigrants. Some came for freedoms promised in America. Some came to escape crop failures and poverty. Some came for land which was much more prevalent than in many smaller crowded countries in Europe. One such immigrant was James Cockshutt. He and his family came to Canada, in 1827, with hopes of migrating further to Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. Upon arriving in Montreal he entered into a partnership starting a general store in Toronto. The business was successful and in the 1830's his

Wallbank sentenced

Kittson County District Judge Eric Schieferdecker sentenced Xoyo Karz Wallbank, 19, of Clearbrook on June 9 to 36 months in prison, but that sentence will be suspended for 25 years if Wallbank follows a long list of conditions, including attending sex offender treatment and registering as a sex offender.

Court documents accuse Wallbank of sexually assaulting a minor who was less than 13 years old that began in 2014 in Lake Bronson and ended in April of 2017.

Wallbank pleaded guilty in April to two second-degree felony counts of criminal sexual conduct. Three first-degree counts of criminal sexual conduct were dismissed.

Federal trial begins for Eric James Reinbold

The federal trial of Eric James Reinbold, 41, of Oklee, began Monday, July 23 in Fergus Falls. Jurors will decide whether he is guilty of possessing unregistered destructive devices. The federal case against Reinbold is focused on an explosive charges. He was arrested after a search of his hunting property near Oklee. The search followed the discovery of a bag of pipe bombs and a copy of the Anarchist Cookbook and another bombmaking notebook and a receipt in Reinbold's name on the family's hunting property.

You Don't Pay for Merchandise You Didn't Order

What are your rights and obligations when you receive merchandise through the mail that you did not order? Just recently, a friend of mine responded to a newspaper ad offering a free pair of pantyhose. She was surprised when she received a package containing four pairs, and a bill!

Thousands of people are placed in similar situations every year. Fortunately, they do not have to pay for merchandise they did not order because federal laws prohibit mailing unordered merchandise to consumers and then demanding payment.

If you are sent merchandise you did not order you have the right to keep the item, whether it be a free "trial" pair of pantyhose, a pocketknife or any other merchandise you did not order, as a free gift.

If you keep the unordered merchandise do you have to notify the seller? You are not obligated to send a letter to the seller but it is an advisable precaution. Your letter may discourage the seller from billing you in the future and may help to clear up an honest mistake. If you do not notify the seller you run the risk of being turned in to collections and possibly having it recorded on your credit record.

What if they bill you? If you receive billing notices, write to the business. State that you never ordered the item and, therefore, you have a legal right to keep the merchandise as a free gift. Request that they do not send you any more billings.

It is a good idea to send your letter by certified mail, return receipt requested. Be sure to keep copies of the receipt and letter for your records.

If you think the unordered merchandise you received was the result of an honest shipping error, you may want to offer to return the merchandise at the seller's expense. Write to the seller and express that you will return the merchandise within a specific time (30 days is appropriate) if they send some form of prepaid postage for you to use. Inform the seller that after the specified time period has passed, you reserve the right to keep the merchandise or dispose of it as you wish.

Where can you go for help dealing with unordered merchandise problems? Always start by trying to resolve your dispute with the company itself. If this is unsuccessful, you can

seek assistance from your local U.S. Postal Inspector, your state or local consumer protection office, the Better Business Bureau, or the Direct Marketing Association, 6 East 43rd Street, New York, New York 10017.

Although the FTC cannot resolve your individual complaint, the agency can take action against the company if it finds evidence of a pattern of deception, unfair practices, or statutory violations. Send your letter to: Correspondence Branch, Federal Trade Commission, Washington, D.C. 20580.

Answer: Leaving or parking a camper or travel trailer in the ditch or on any highway right-of-way is illegal. A highway right-of-way typically extends near the top of the outside slope. It would only be allowed where signs designate it as a campsite.

Clean indoor air can help reduce asthma attacks

Did you know that, according to the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, more than 25 million Americans, including roughly seven million children, have asthma? It's true, and those numbers have steadily risen in recent years.

Asthma is more than occasional wheezing or feeling out of breath during physical activity. Asthma is chronic and can lead to coughing, wheezing, shortness of breath, fast breathing, and chest tightness, states the Asthma and Allergy Foundation of America. In the 21st century, people spend significant time indoors at home, school or work, and indoor air environments could be triggers for asthma. Improving indoor air quality can help people breathe clearly. The AAFA notes that the following agents can adversely affect indoor air quality, potentially triggering asthma attacks.

Allergens

Allergens such as mold, dust mites, pet dander and fur, and waste from insects or rodents thrive in many homes. Ensuring indoor air quality is high can cut back on the amount of allergens in the air. People with asthma can invest in an air purifier and vacuum regularly, being sure to use a HEPA-equipped appliance. Routinely replacing HVAC system filters can help prevent allergens from blowing around the house. Also, frequent maintenance of HVAC systems will ensure they are operating safely and not contributing to poor indoor air quality.

Mold can be mitigated by reducing moisture in a home. Moist environments in the kitchen and bathroom may pro-

mote mold growth. Ventilation is key to keep mold at bay.

Tobacco smoke

Thirdhand smoke, or THS, may be unfamiliar to many people. A 2011 report published in Environmental Health Perspectives says THS is an invisible combination of gases and particles that can cling to clothing, cushions, carpeting, and other materials long after secondhand smoke has cleared from a room. Studies have indicated that residual nicotine levels can be found in house dust where people smoke or once smoked. Studies have indicated that smoke compounds can adsorb onto surfaces and then desorb back into air over time.

Keeping tobacco smoke out of a home can improve indoor air quality and personal health.

VOCs

Volatile organic compounds, or VOCs, are gases released from commonly used products. These can include paints and varnishes, cleaning supplies, air fresheners, new furniture, and new carpet. People with asthma may find that VOCs can trigger attacks. Airing out items, reducing usage of products that are heavily scented and choosing low- or no-VOC products can help. Making cleaning products from baking soda, vinegar and liquid oil soap also can keep indoor air quality high.

Homeowners who plan to renovate their homes can consider using the appropriate specifications for HVAC systems to promote good indoor air, as well as address any other potential problems that may be compromising indoor air quality.

son, Ignatius, opened a branch of his father's store in an area nearby known as "Brant's Ford." Eventually the Toronto store was closed and business was focused in Brantford, Ontario.

As the industrial revolution swept across North America it was now 3rd generation businessman James G. Cockshutt (Ignatius's son) that saw the need for farm implements to farm the prairies of Ontario. He opened the Brantford Plow Works in 1877. The name was later changed to the Cockshutt Plow Company.

In 1929, the successful plow and implement company wanted to enter the tractor market. A deal was made to distribute the 20-35 Allis Chalmers tractor under the name United. The tractor had the name UNITED stamped on the radiator, Allis Chalmers on the side of the radiator, and a Cockshutt decal on the fuel tank. This agreement fell through and in the 1930's Cockshutt began to market Oliver tractors under the Cockshutt name. In 1935 when Oliver model 70 debuted, the Cockshutt 70 with it's red paint job also appeared. This successful agreement continued though production numbers were reduced by WWII. Since Canada was part of the British Empire the war years began in 1939, not 1941 as it was in the United States. Cockshutt factories turned to wartime production making aircraft parts and artillery.

The Cockshutt company continued to look to the future. They decided to pursue the manufacture of their own tractor. In 1946 they released the Cockshutt Model 30. The Cockshutt 30 had a great new feature, live PTO. To expand their marketing the made an

agreement with cooperatives in the United States. These tractors were identical to the Cockshutt 30, but were painted "cooperative" orange and labeled with a CO-OP decal and designated the model E-3. These are some of my favorite Cockshutt models.

Later Cockshutt continued tractor production using Oliver models again painted red instead of Oliver green. My neighbor growing up, Walter Pederson, had an Coop E-3 and guess that always made me wish I had a Coop or Cockshutt tractor.

This brings me back to Hastings, MN. The 2018 ICCF show at The Little Log House grounds was one of the nicest shows I have ever attended. Don't get me wrong, I am proud to attend all of our local NW Minnesota shows but the grounds and vendors present in Hastings were amazing. My wife had fun at the craft and flea market area and commented it was the most fun she had ever had at a tractor show.....so I guess I might be able to talk her into a few more!!
