Grygla Fall Festival enjoyed by many

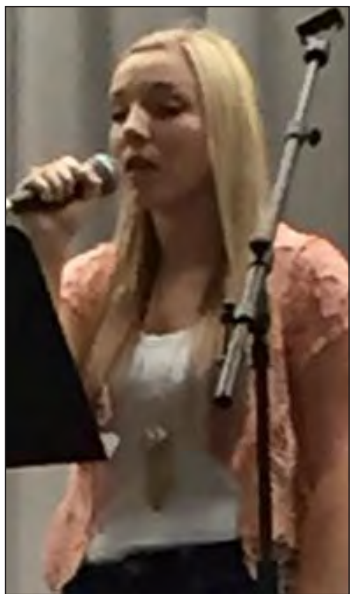

Letter to the Editor

New school in Greenbush will hurt our district

I am a very concerned member of the Greenbush-Middle River school district. We are academically strong, our facilities are in compliance, and we are not in financial trouble, yet.

Our district consists of two communities, 18 miles apart, working together for 1 common purpose: giving our kids a great education while utilizing and supporting both communities. It's all about balance. Many of the Middle River area families work for companies to the south: Digi-Key Corporation, Arctic Cat, and Sanford Medical. Many of the Greenbush area families work for companies to the north: Marvin Windows and Doors, Polaris, and Altru Medical. Even though it seems the communities may gravitate towards employment away from each other, the uniting factor here is the school set-up. Each community hosts an elementary program (Pre-K to 5th grade), giving the ultimate convenience and sense of safety to each community as kids would not have to travel as far for a great education. The students unite in Middle River for grades 6-8 (more travel for Greenbush area students), and continue that balance of travel for grades 9-12 in Greenbush (more travel for Middle River area students). The point is, this: we have a great balance of education and community and have had it for the past 20 years.

Over the summer, our school board decided (5 to 2 vote) to pursue a new K-12 school building in Greenbush, eliminating the Middle River site completely. This decision was made without any recommendation from our Facilities Committee (which consisted of 3 school board members, our superintendent, both principals, plus

2 coaches, 2 Greenbush community members, and, as an afterthought, 2 Middle River community members.) What happened to our balance? It's being disrupted, and many community members (from both areas) are concerned and upset. I, as well as others, believe this new school in Greenbush will hurt our district socially and financially.

School-Community Partnership should be for all residents. The Middle River community would not be able to use the new facility as we would be able to use our current facility in our own town, further disjoining our once harmonious partnership. The strain on the Middle River community would not end there. Along with an immense amount of added traveling (all activities, events, programs to be held in Greenbush), more families would be apt to make fuel and food purchases at the event's location, hurting the Middle River community as no school events and activities would be held there.

In addition, the tax burden will also greatly affect both our communities as we have a lot of farmers, elderly, and single-parent/families on a fixed income. Many of the farmers in our towns have land that has been passed down through family and are the source of their livelihood. The tax implication on these farmers can sky-rocket into thousands, and for some, tens of thousands, of added tax dollars each year. Most home owners that live in town will see a tax increase of a few hundred dollars each year. Where's the balance in that? Others are getting ready for retirement or have already retired, hoping they have saved up enough money to live comfortably. How much will you have to spend? Both Roseau and Marshall County Auditors have confirmed the formula: take the number from line 9 of

your taxes, and multiply it by 6.7 and you will have an accurate reflection of this tax implication. Remember that this number is only for the building and site fee and does not include any operating referendum or other taxes. This tax increase may take that sense of security away. The rise of single-parent families will also feel the pinch. Only having one income means a strict budget, and a few hundred dollars a month for a new building (most teachers and curriculum would remain the same) could be the difference between just getting by, and sinking for these families. Our once balanced partnership between two towns to give our students an excellent education is being compromised, and the community members would pay the ultimate price.

I fear we will lose many Middle River area students to open enrollment at Marshall County Central, which is only 10 miles away, and students of upset Greenbush residents may enroll in Badger, which is only 8 miles away. That can equate to a lot of revenue our district

will lose on something that could be prevented. By keeping the partnership balanced, it's a win-win for both communities: events and activities are held at each site, all students travel for a few years of their schooling, and all students still have the opportunity to receive a state recognized award winning education that they may not get at another school district.

Our district is being split apart by this decision. Community members are being pressured to "take sides," even on social media. A Facebook group was started by a GMR teacher in favor of the new school, and only those who support the new school are allowed to join. Please help us keep our school district united as two communities working together and supporting each other to provide a quality education to our students without harming friendships and bank accounts. Please keep all facts, figures, and community members in mind when voting and restore balance to the Greenbush-Middle River school district.

Polk County Sheriff

One male pulled from Cable Lake near Mentor

On 09/05/2015 at approximately 1937 hours, the Polk County Sheriff's Office received a report of an adult male that was pulled from Cable Lake in rural Mentor, MN. The male was reported to be unresponsive.

Deputies responded to the scene where life saving measures were attempted on Todd James Steinke from St. Cloud, MN. Life saving measures were attempted by paramedics, who were unable to revive Todd Steinke. Todd Steinke was pronounced dead at the scene.

An investigation by the Polk County Sheriff's Office revealed that Mr. Steinke was at a cabin on Cable Lake with numerous family members. Mr. Steinke dove into shallow water just off the shore of the lake where his head is suspected to have struck the bottom of the lake. An autopsy was performed by the University of North Dakota's Forensic Pathology Laboratory, which revealed that Mr. Steinke fractured his neck when he dove into the lake. Mr. Steinke was pulled from the water by two family members who were on shore and witness Mr. Steinke dive into the lake.

Todd James Steinke, dob 10-13-1967, age 47, is survived by his wife, daughter, and numerous other family members who were present at the scene.

Mentor area first responders, Mentor Fire Department, and Polk County EMS also responded to the scene.

No further information is being released at this time.

High speed chase near Erskine

On 09/07/2015 at approximately 0155 hours, a Polk County Deputy attempted to stop a vehicle for speeding on County Road 34 in rural Erskine. The vehicle accelerated at a high rate of speed attempting to flee from the Deputy, who had his emergency lights and siren activated. The pursuit lasted for several minutes and ended at a residence on Duerr Cir SE, south of Erskine. The pursuit reached speeds in excess of 100 mph.

Once the vehicle stopped, the male driver and passenger of the vehicle attempted to flee on foot. The driver of the vehicle, Andrew Thomas Bruggeman, dob 6-25-1988, was apprehended by the pursuing Polk County Deputy after resisting arrest. Bruggeman, resident of Polk County, was taken to the NWRCC correctional facility in Crookston on charges of fleeing a peace officer in a motor vehicle, fleeing on foot, resisting arrest, and 3rd Degree driving while impaired. The adult male passenger of the vehicle was not apprehended.

This case is currently under investigation. Anyone who has information regarding this case is encouraged to contact the Polk County Sheriff's Office.

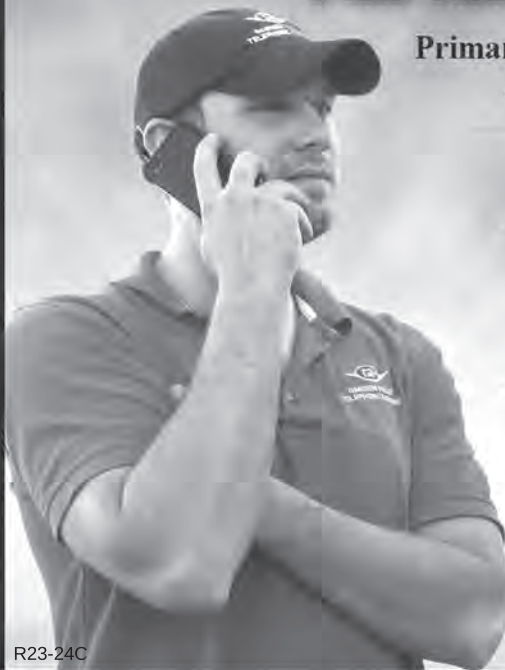

Composting: A WIN at home and for our waters

Composting and compost use can be a useful tool in our toolbox for working towards improved water quality and better water retention.

Composting is the transformation of organic material (plant matter) through decomposition into a soil-like material called compost. Invertebrates (insects and earthworms), and microorganisms (bacteria and fungi) help in transforming the material into compost. Composting is a natural form of recycling, which continually occurs in nature.

It has many benefits, including its ability to help reverse soil degradation. By adding compost to our soils, we are adding organic matter which leads to a return in biological activity, improved mineral availability, reduced compaction, improved water retention, and reduced pollutant leaching. In addition, by composting, we reduce the volume of organic material sent to landfills. In landfills, organic material mixes with other waste and can create a chemical leachate that can enter our water systems.

Composting is something that can be easily done at home. All you need is a compost bin (or even just a spot in your yard for a pile), organic waste (fruit and veggie scraps, coffee grounds, leaves and grass are all great additions to your compost), and a tool like a pitchfork or a shovel to turn your pile. By piling your organic waste and periodically turning it and adding water (the microorganisms in the pile need air and water to survive), you can create wonderful finished compost that can be used as an excellent natural fertilizer.

Composting can also be done on a larger or smaller scale. Many communities, educational institutions and businesses have set up large composting operations to divert a lot of waste from landfills. People without backyards can compost at home with vermicomposting, which involves the use of a plastic tub and worms called Red Wigglers. These worms can eat up to their body weight in organic waste each day and produce a very rich fertilizer.

One of the many benefits of composting is its contribution to water quality and quantity. Composting is one strategy to improve soil's water retention capacity (which can aid in a flood situation), and improve water quality by acting as a biofilter, reducing the potential for organics to create chemical leachate in landfills, and stabilizing nutrients like phosphorous and nitrogen so that they don't run off into waterways.

As we enter into the fall, you may contemplate if you should let your compost go dormant or continue into the winter months. Active composting in the winter months will give your garden a head start in early spring and also provides a welcome boost to your indoor plants during the dreary winter months. Ask a Trooper

With school starting this article will be entirely focused on the safety of the most precious cargo in the world – our children. Traffic safety is a two-way street and everyone has an investment.

School Bus Safety Tips for Motorists:

-Motorists must stop at least 20 feet from a school bus that is displaying red flashing lights and/or its stop arm is extended when approaching from the rear and from the opposite direction on undivided roads.

-Red flashing lights on buses indicates students are either entering or exiting the bus.

-Motorists are not required to stop for a bus if the bus is on the opposite side of a separated roadway (median, etc.) – but they should remain alert for children.

-Altering a route or schedule to avoid a bus is one way motorists can help improve safety. In doing so, motorists won't find themselves behind a bus and as a result, potentially putting children at risk.

-Watch for school crossing patrols and pedestrians. Reduce speeds in and around school zones.



-Watch and stop for pedestrians – the law applies to all street corners, for both marked and unmarked crosswalks (all street corners) – **every corner is a crosswalk.**

School Bus Safety Tips for Children:

Parents should discuss and demonstrate pedestrian safety with their children and reinforce safe crossing after exiting a bus:

-When getting off a bus, look to be sure no cars are passing on the shoulder (side of the road).

-Before crossing the street, take five “giant steps” out from the front of the bus, or until the driver's face can be seen.

-Wait for the driver to signal that it's safe to cross.

-Look left-right-left when coming to the edge of the bus to make sure traffic is stopped. Keep watching traffic when crossing.

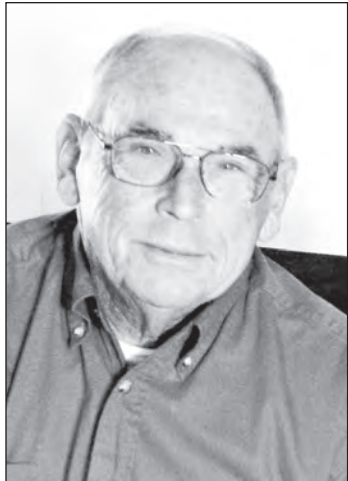

Born in Crookston, Minnesota on May 26, 1938, he demonstrated exceptional musical talent while attending high school in Erskine, earning superior ratings for his vocal performances repeatedly at both district and state competitions. As a unique distinction, Rayome was selected from hundreds of vocal and instrumental soloists to perform at an evening concert as a culmination of the district-level music festival at Fosston. He sang "O Sole Mio" in Italian.

Rayome decided to pursue teaching as a career and attended teacher training school in Thief River Falls, after which he began teaching at Sunnyside School in rural Fosston. He graduated from Bemidji State College and began teaching elementary school in Fosston for almost two decades. In keeping with his artistic talent and keen business acumen, he opened Koehler Floral in Fosston and

eventually opened branches in both Mahnomen and Fertile. A passionately community service-oriented person, Rayome founded the Embassy Community Center in the 1980s (located in the old Baptist church) and served as both director and board president. The Center became a hub of activity over the years—the site of senior meals, the Fosston Community Theater, the Singles' Christian Fellowship, area musical concerts, and meals for the homeless. "I want to make sure that people in the community aren't lonely," Rayome said. He also founded the Fosston Garden Club and was an active participant in the Sons of Norway.

Rayome turned to the local press to disseminate information and give readers a sense of community. He contributed inspirational columns and area news to the Erskine Echo, Thirteen Towns, McIntosh Times, and the Fertile Journal for years, always with a goal of keeping people connected.

Music pervaded his entire life. During his early years in Fosston, Rayome produced "Moments of Melody," a weekly gospel music broadcast via KROX in Crookston. Later he brought teens and seniors together to create a multigenerational choir that rehearsed at the Embassy and performed frequently throughout the years. He also sang at countless weddings, funerals, and other events in Fosston and the surrounding area.

A double header weekend of racing was planned for this past weekend at the Greenbush Race Park, but mother nature was the winner on Saturday night. Sunday night turned out to be a beautiful night for racing with 92 cars in the pits and points titles to be decided in six classes.

Only one point seperated Rick Delaine and Aaron Holtan going into Sunday night's racing as both drivers won their heats and sat on the front row for the 12 feature. It would be the Stoney Mountain, Mb. driver Delaine getting the holeshot. Two laps in Holtan would end up losing the second spot to Dustin Wahl of Greenbush, Mn. James Wall of Winkler, Mb. would put Holtan down another position about the midway point, but the Newfolden, Mn., driver would get both spots back with about seven to go. It was too little too late for Holtan as Delaine had a straightaway length lead on the field and would cruise to his third win of the year and the points title. Holtan would finish second and three points behind Delaine in points. Wall would finish third and Jamen Foss of Greenbush, Mn., would finish third in points.

26 Midwest Modifieds had signed in at the pit gate, and 20 of them lined up for the green. Heat winners Justin Olson of Thief River Falls, Mn., Hunter Hougard of Karlstad Mn., Aaron Blacklance of Thief River Falls, Mn., and Jordan Wahl of Greenbush, Mn., occupied the first two rows of the feature lineup, and it was rookie Hougard to take the early lead. On lap six, Wahl would get by Hougard for the lead coming out of corner four. Two cautions and six laps later the rookie would get his lead back by passing Wahl down the front stretch. Hougard and Wahl would run some of the closing laps side by side but it was Hougard getting the checkers. Wahl would finish second, and Olson third. Olson would pick up the points title with Blacklance edging John Halvorson of Warren, Mn., for second by a single point.

It took four tries for the 14 car Street feature to get past lap one and it would be Ryan Johnson of Karlstad, Mn., leading the way. Johnson won his heat and started on the pole and was never really challenged for the lead but Shawn Teunis of West St. Paul, Mb., and Nick Linert of Badger, Mn., were never more than a couple of car length's back. The final yellow flew on lap eight and one lap later Kyle Dykhoff of Perham, Mn., passed Linert on the frontstretch for third. Dykhoff was tagged with an early caution so he had worked his way through the field and with a couple to go got by Teunis for the second spot but the laps ran out as Johnson would pick up the win, with Dykhoff second and Tuenis third. Johnson would claim the points title with heat winner Teunis second and Linert third.

The 17 car Pure Stock feature was slowed by five yellows with the guy to beat all year sitting on the pole. Jerome Berger of Badger, Mn., had eight feature wins on the year and was looking for number nine, but when a caution came out on lap eight, Berger had a tire go down and after getting it fixed, would have to start from the rear of the field. This would hand the lead over to Ryan Hagen of Thief River Falls, Mn. Hagen would hold everyone off even through the last three cautions to pick up his first ever feature win. Casey Vargason of Edinburg, N.D. would finish second and Ryan Weston of Roseau, Mn., third. Heat wins went to Berger, Hagen, and Jared Palm of Warroad, Mn. Berger would claim the points title, with Weston second and Jeremy Anderson of Newfolden, Mn., third.

Dexter Dvergsten and Alan Truscinski, both of Greenbush, Mn., would win their heats and start on the front row for their feature, and it would be Dvergsten out early for the lead. Dvergsten would hold the number one spot even through three cautions while the father son duo of the Truscinskis' were never far behind. Alan was in second while son Alex had to hold off a hard charging Chris Sorin of Dufresne, Mb. Sorin got by Alex for third in corner

two, but Alex took the spot back when they came past the flag stand. Dvergsten would get the win with Alan Truscinski finishing second and Alex Truscinski third. The Trio would finish the same way in the points race.

Grady Shearer of Fargo, N.D. made his first trip to the Race Park a good one as he picked up the win in the 4 Cylinder feature. Leadership through the years at ICCC

Reflecting on the day she spent with Roy Jorgenson and Bob Melby, Catherine Johnson, director of Inter-County Community Council, Inc. (ICCC), was overwhelmed with gratitude for all that these two past directors have done for the agency.

"I am humbled by the good stock of these men and so grateful to be part of such a special group of people," Johnson said.

Johnson and Melby, who was executive director of ICCC from 1986 to 2011, recently traveled to Fergus Falls to visit, Roy Jorgenson, 95, who served as the agency's director from 1966 to 1986. Steve Nagle, director of the West Central & Lakes and Prairies Community Action Partnership, helped arrange the visit. Mr. Nagle continues to visit Jorgenson to keep him up to date on Community Action news.

"To have all three Executive Directors who ran the organization for 49 ½ years in the same room is pretty remarkable," Johnson said, and to be able to have candid talks about what has changed and what has stayed the same is really quite incredible."

This year ICCC looked back on serving the community for 50 years. The private non-profit was organized in April of 1965 by a group of local people to combat poverty. A 20 member Board of Directors hired three

people as the nucleus of ICCC in 1965. Ed Bilek was the first executive director and served until his death in July of 1966. Bilek was succeeded by Roy Jorgenson, and Jorgenson was succeeded by Bob Melby, who served for 24 years. Melby was succeeded in 2011 by Catherine Johnson. Both Melby and Johnson had previously worked at the organization for 10 years before taking over as executive directors. A Community Action Agency incorporated under the Laws of Minnesota; ICCC provides core services to residents of Pennington, Red Lake, East Polk and Clearwater Counties.

"There were commonalities that were evident in all three off us though we are all three very different," Johnson said, "I thoroughly enjoyed hearing stories of the early days and the years that were tough to keep the doors open."

"Roy asked almost right away, 'what programs are we operating these days. Johnson explained how some were the same and some were new. 'I loved the fact that he used 'we', it made us feel a common connection even though it was my first time meeting him'.

A source of Agency pride revolves around the fact that many of the agency's long-term employees started out

by participating in programs that were operated through our organization. Working on one of our youth employment programs, being Head Start parents or being enrolled in Head Start themselves.

Funding has never been secure, which all the directors had experience in. In the 1985 annual report Jorgenson said, "It has been a hectic year trying to survive".

One common thread is that there has always been respect for the people that we serve from the top down. Without them there would be no reason to exist as an organization or a movement at all. Roy Jorgenson said in the 1980 annual report, "Finally to the residents of the area, especially the poor. It has been a pleasure to have had the opportunity to serve you over the years. Thanks for having been patient with us. Your rewards have been ours."

Johnson said, "There is a tremendous amount of respect that I have as the current Executive Director for those that have paved the way. The constant fight to survive and be the voice for the low-income is something that we as an agency have been doing for the past 50 years and I am honored to be part of this organization."
