Stardig log cabin makes the move

This week a historic building was moved from Knute Township south of McIntosh to the East Polk County Heritage Grounds, located on the north side of Highway 2 on the east end of Fosston. The building was a log cabin home built by Olaf Stardig, a resident of the McIntosh community for over half a century. The 2 story log cabin was still sitting on the original farmstead, though it had been moved to make way for a new house. The farmstead, most recently owned by Lowell and Sue Ostenson, has been in the family since Olaf Stardig filed

claim to the land in 1883. After his passing, his 3 daughters, Ida, Emily and Minnie, lived in the home until the Ostensons, Lowell being a great-nephew of Stardig, purchased it in 1971.

Mr. Stardig was born in Lima, Vallsjon, in Delarne, Sweden in 1848. As an adult and a married family man, he received letters from friends in America telling him about the Country. So, in 1882, he left his home, Country, wife and family and journeyed to America, finding himself in Alexandria, Minnesota where he found work in order to earn enough money to

send for his wife and five small children, whom were still living in Sweden.

In 1883, the Thirteen Towns was opened and in August of that same year, Olaf Stardig came to Polk County. He filed on 160 acres of land 4 ½ miles southwest of what is now the City of McIntosh, though the town did not exist at the time. The township where he filed for his acreage was later named Knute Township after the late Senator Knute Nelson.

Vandals destroy gates on East Park Wildlife Management Area in Marshall County

While doing a routine check at the East Park Wildlife Management Area in Marshall County, Minnesota Department of Natural Resources wildlife managers discovered both gates along the north dike of the WMA had been vandalized and people had been illegally driving the road past the water control structure.

The east gate is bent in a U-shape, the lock is broken and it can no longer be closed and locked. The west gate is completely destroyed. The metal and concrete posts are bent over and the gate has been crushed. Both gates will need to



be replaced. "We repaired the east gate twice in the last two years," said Jason Wollin, Karlstad assistant area wildlife manager. "We replaced the west gate last fall."

The road is closed to vehicle traffic because this portion of the WMA is a waterfowl sanctuary.

ary and closed to use during the spring, summer and fall. The gates are open in the winter for snowmobiling.

Vandalism of public property is a crime. It is also costly to those who support DNR natural resource management efforts. Hunter and trapper license dollars pay for wildlife management, public land infrastructure maintenance and habitat management.

"This type of vandalism has been going on at East Park WMA since the early 1980s when the gates first went up to address the destruction caused by drivers disobeying the 'no motorized vehicle' signs," said DNR Enforcement Lt. Pat Znajda.

There on his land, Olaf Stardig built a log cabin home during the winter of 1884. He continued to work at any employment that he could find, and by carefully saving his earnings, he was able to send for his family in the Spring of 1884.

Mrs. Marina (Ostenson) Stardig, Olaf's wife, along with their 5 small children traveled from Sweden to America to join her husband. Anna, the oldest daughter, was 12 years old at the time. Along with Mrs. Stardig and the children, Olaf's mother also traveled across the ocean to America.

As Polk County was still a sparsely settled wilderness in 1884, Mr. Stardig and his family had to undergo all the hardships and privations of frontier life. Hardy and resolute, armed with a determination to wrestle out an existence from the land, Mr. Stardig worked to develop his farm and make a permanent, secure home for himself and his family. He became one of the most prosperous farmers of Knute Township, with many friends and acquaintances, and a strong connection to his Community and Church.

In December of 1902, Olaf Stardig was one of the five men who signed the Petition requesting the formation of Columbia County, a division of the eastern townships of Polk County into the separate and independent Columbia County.

Olaf Stardig was also a char-

ter member of Salem Lutheran Church. In 1887, several area community members were interested in organizing a Swedish Evangelical Lutheran Church,

meeting at the Garan Hendrickson home they adapted a constitution that 29 new communicant members signed, including Olaf Stardig.

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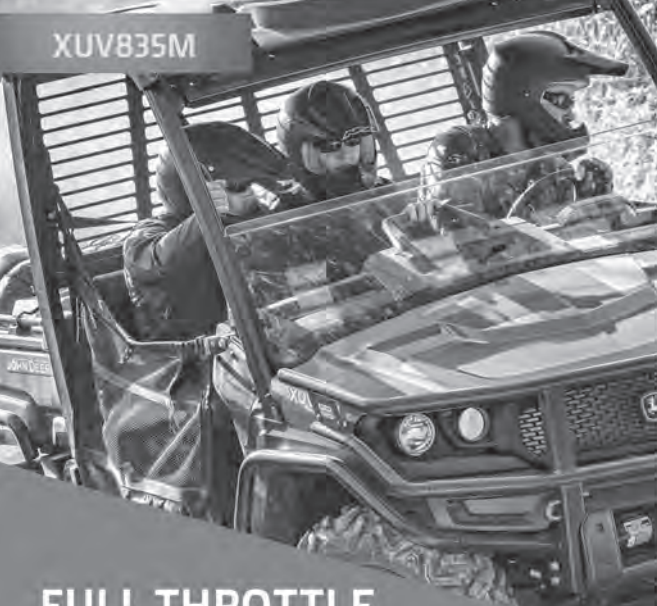
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Family Reunions

We fixed it up from days gone by to help meet the needs of our growing family. The enclosed front porch is now open so we might linger upon it in the evening. Closets were expanded, and the hardwood floors redone. Some rooms were combined to make more room and to top it all off, an addition was added.

Ask a Trooper

Question: If I sell my vehicle to a private party, what do you recommend I do to protect myself in the event the new owner gets into a crash or is arrested prior to them transferring the title into their name?

Answer: This can be an issue for you if the vehicle you sold is ever involved in a hit and run or pursuit and the driver flees the scene. Law enforcement may be contacting the registered owner in an attempt to locate that person who was driving. There are steps that will help protect you as the seller or buyer of a vehicle from a private party.

When you sell a vehicle, you (owner/seller) are responsible to file the "Notice of Sale" within ten days of the sale. This is located in the lower portion of the Certificate of Title. By doing this in a timely manner, this protects you and helps law enforcement by having access to the most current registered owner information in the event that your vehicle's license plates are entered for any reason. Also, create some type of receipt that has the buyer's information recorded on it and date of sale and keep this document so you have proof on when you sold that vehicle and to whom.

This brings up the importance of transferring the vehicle title as soon as possible when purchasing a vehicle from a private party. Minnesota state law says that you have to transfer the vehicle's title within ten days of the date of sale, other than a sale by or to a licensed motor vehicle dealer.

New residents have a 60-day grace period in which to register their cars, passenger vans, 3/4 ton or less pickups, motorcycles, utility trailers, or house trailers as long as the displayed license plates are current. If your registration expires before the 60-day grace period is up, you must obtain Minnesota registration at the time of expiration.

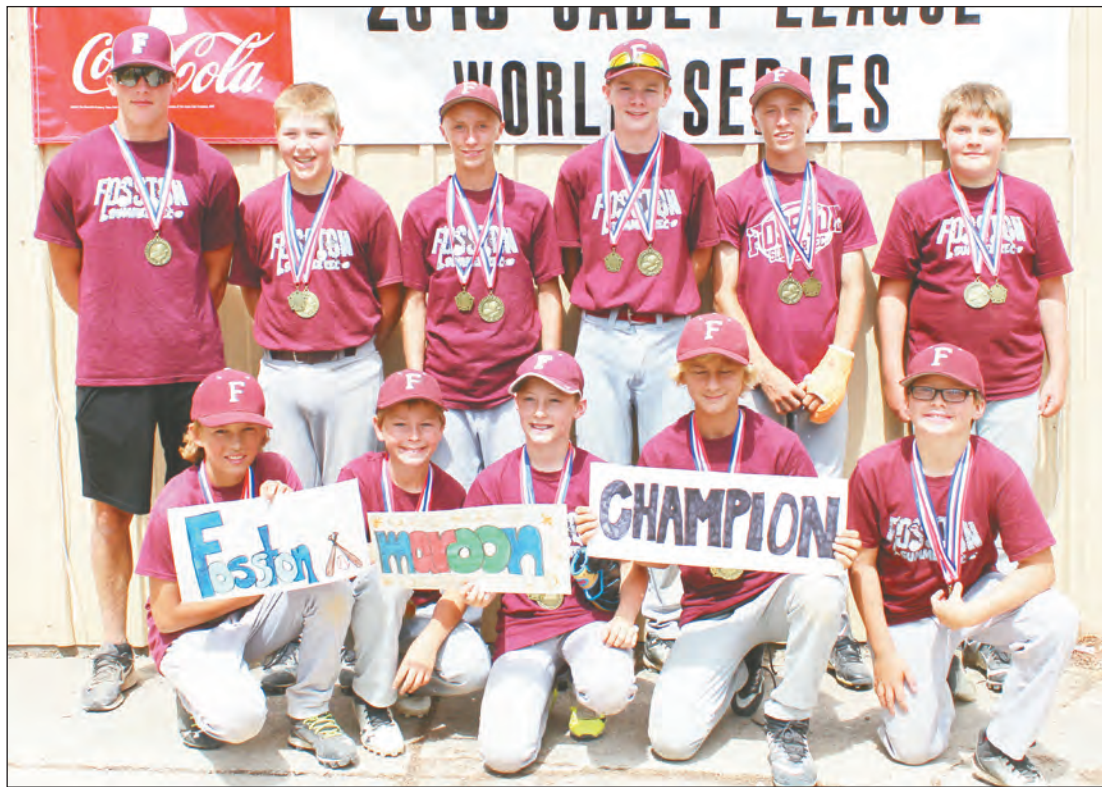
