## Family adds bench to honor Gerald Wraa

One more bench has been added to the Clearbrook Veterans Memorial Park recently.

The Gerald Wraa family put in a bench to honor their father's service during World War II. Ness Granite Works from Detroit Lakes put the bench in place. They had never put in a bench for a veteran who was present when they set the tribute in place.

The site located north of the dam in Clearbrook is a project of the Legion Post 256. There are benches and tribute bricks for veterans both living and in memory of those who have passed away.

Gerald Wraa is 96 years old and was born on March 11, 1922. He and his wife Edna live in Clearbrook. They lived out in the country and farmed until 2015 when they moved into an apartment in Clearbrook.

Gerald served in the US Navy during World War II from

1942 to 1946. He was on the USS Charles Ausburne (DD-570), a Fletcher-class destroyer. It was named for Charles L. Ausburne, a sailor who served during World War I and was posthumously awarded the Navy Cross. During the World War II campaign the ship received twelve battle Stars for serving in the South Pacific, North Africa, North Atlantic

and the occupation of Japan from 1945 to 1946. The mascot of Destroyer Squadron 23 is Little Beaver. That character was made famous by Fred Harmon's Red Ryder cartoon strip. This information and a drawing of the ship was put on the bench that was placed in the park.

Some of Gerald's family were there as the bench was being placed and afterwards.

## Red Lake Inauguration Held at Seven Clans

### Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer and Three Representatives Sworn-In

At 9:00 a.m., Tuesday, August 14, 2018, Red Lake Tribal members and friends of the Nation gathered for an inauguration held at Seven Clans Casino and Event Center, Red Lake.

Two months earlier on June 12, 2018, members witnessed the swearing in of Adrian Lusier as Little Rock's new Representative, and re-elected Ponemah Representative Gary Nelson. Each had won their respective seats in the first round election on May 16, 2018, receiving more than 50% of the ballots cast and winning the election outright.

Today Hereditary Chief James Loud would swear in winners of the run-off election held July 18, 2018.

Hundreds gathered filling nearly every chair on the floor. Red Lakers, friends, and allies sat at round tables tightly spaced - save an aisle down the middle - for the entrance of the colors and royalty. Among the crowd were several honored guests representing Federal, State, County, Bemidji City governments, including several public organization and business allies.

On stage stood emcee Gary "Rez Dawg" Jourdain, Jr., who welcomed Spiritual Leader and Hereditary Chief Greeting Spears who offered an invocation.

Jourdain soon called on

Young Creek and the celebrated Drum Eyabay for a song as members of Red Lake Veterans Post 6889 marched in in dance-step, colors flying. Behind them came the sound of jingle dresses synchronized to the Drum, as Red Lake Royalty danced their way to the stage.

On stage stood emcee Gary "Rez Dawg" Jourdain, Jr., who

welcomed Spiritual Leader and Hereditary Chief Greeting Spears who did the invocation.

Jourdain behind podium, the Colors behind him, then asked the Honor Guide to post the colors.

Red Lake Tribal Council members were seated facing the crowd behind tables directly at the front of the stage. Council

members and Hereditary Chiefs mixed with each other to the right and left of center stage.

A bit after 9:00 a.m., Chairman Seki called the meeting of the Red Lake Tribal Council to order from the floor. Secretary Darwin Sumner, seated to Seki's left, took the roll. A quorum present, Chairman Seki explained the morning's agenda.

Seki asked for a motion to accept the certified results of the recent election. On a motion and second, the motion passed unanimously. The swearing in would soon follow. Seki then recessed the Council meeting to reconvene in the Tribal Council Chambers at the Red Lake Government Center at 12:30 pm.

So began the Red Lake Band of Chippewa Indians Inaugural ceremony in honor of Darrell G. Seki, Sr., Samuel R. Strong, Annette Johnson, Julius "Toady" Thunder, Donald Good, Sr., and Michelle (Barrett) Cobenais.

Hereditary Chief James Loud took the stage at the request of the council to swear in the new Council. One by one, aided by emcee Jourdain, Chief Loud swore in Thunder as the reelected Redby Representative, Good newly elected from Red Lake District (replacing retir-

ing long-term Representative Roman "Ducker" Stately), newly elected Cobenais from Little Rock, Johnson reelected as Treasurer, Strong newly elected Secretary, and Seki reelected as Chairman. All took the oath of office.

Chief Loud yielded to Chief Darwin Sumner when Strong came to the stage. Sumner served as Tribal Secretary filling out the term of Donald Cook. As a symbol of unity, humility and respect, and as former campaign rivals, Sumner swore in newly elected Tribal Secretary Samuel Strong. Later all would give a short speech thanking families, constituents, members, and calling for unity as demonstrated by Sumner and Strong.

## The Buzz on Backyard Beekeeping?

## University of Minnesota Extension NW MN Soybean Plot Tours – August 28 & 29, 2018

Tours of field plots established by the University of Minnesota soybean breeding program and county associations are scheduled for August 28 and 29 at five locations in northwest Minnesota. The tours are sponsored county growers and the soybean checkoff through the Minnesota Soybean Research & Promotion Council (MSRPC). Speakers will include University of Minnesota Extension educators and representatives of both state and county soybean associations.

While the agenda for each location may vary depending upon speaker availability, topics might include: the status of soybean aphid management, the soybean cyst nematode (including distribution of soil sample kits for project-sponsored testing), performance of pre-emerge herbicides in soybeans, soybean variety trials and a comparison of planting date and plant population for northern soybean varieties.

The tour dates, start times, local sponsors, locations and directions are as follows:

August 28 – **Norman Coun-**

ty – 10 AM – Swenson Farms, 1 mile east of Shelly on Hwy 3, and south 3/4 mile on 130th St. (GPS point: 47.4424, -96.7943). A noon meal will follow the tour.

August 28 – **Becker/Mahnomen Counties** – 3 PM – Bill Zurn Farms and Mitch Hoekstra of Select Ag Inc., 3 miles west of Select Ag offices located at Hwy 59 and 250th St (plot is 1/4 mile west of Hwy 5 and Hwy 10 intersection, GPS point: 47.2824, -96.0023). Pioneer plot and meal will be at the Select Ag building.

August 29 – **Marshall County** – 8 AM – Jim Potucek Farm, 27001 County Highway 34, take Hwy 1 East two miles from Warren to County Road 34, then go North 5 miles to the plot (GPS point: 48.268188, -96.719311). Refreshments will be served.

August 29 – **Pennington/Red Lake Counties** – 11 AM – Kyle Mehrkens Farm, 1 mile North of St. Hilaire on the West side of HWY 32 (GPS point: 48.036195, -96.214879). Lunch will follow.

August 29 – **Polk County** – 4 PM – Mike Theis Farm, 748

Sumner exiting the stage, Chief Loud then stepped forward to present the oath of office to Chairman Seki.

The three representatives gave short thank you speeches. Treasurer Johnson is glad the election is over. “I hope to continue what we started and make progress in areas such as the drug and alcohol epidemic,” she said. “As Indigenous peoples, we must keep in mind our youth and future generations. We have always been taught this. And in keeping with that, we can’t forget our elders. It is they who have instilled in us who we are as Anishinaabe.”

Secretary Strong, who often works with and is concerned about youth, hopes to bring their voice to the table. “Change is exciting, to have the opportunity to make a difference is exciting. I think the most exciting part about politics is we have a chance to shape our communities,” he said. “There are many things to be grateful for, our lake, our culture, our way of life. We have these strengths. We need to keep our culture and language alive. And as we look towards the future, we also must realize there are perils. We can use these strengths to solve these challenges. Among these challenges is talking about and making decisions about enrollment. These are among the major issues I’d like to address.”

Seki would also speak to the audience. He spoke first, as is his custom, in his first language, Ojibwemowin before switching to his second language English, to present the majority of the speech.

Seki’s speech centered on healing the Nation, but also included past, current and future Council initiatives. He encouraged the Nation to work toward healing after a challenging year with losses of loved ones, storms, fires and “an election that brought out the best of us, but at times the worst of us.”

“Today, we are still battling the drug abuse. Now is the time to end this destruction, Seki said.” He vowed to empower law enforcement and to hold dealers accountable. He also promised to improve communication with band members to include social media.

Closing his speech, Seki got a bit emotional as he thanked his wife and family for their support. He asked for patience and understanding from his supporters and all tribal members. “Most importantly remember why we are elected and work together to move forward,” he said. “The healing starts now.” (An Abridged version of Seki’s Inaugural Speech follows this story)

Oaths of Office taken, speeches completed, an Honor Song was offered by Eyabay & Young Creek as the colors retreated. A Traveling Song followed. It was time to eat. Friends chatted while waiting in line or at table to be served a brunch feast of eggs, bacon, sausage, ham, potatoes, french toast, many fruits, coffee, and water.

Seki, taking the mic during the meal easily got the attention and applause from the crowd by announcing leave for council employees for the remainder of the day.

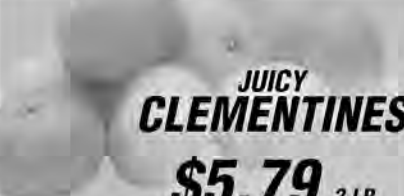

Ask a Trooper

**Question:** I have a question about carrying a driver's license while operating a vehicle. It was passed on to me that in Minnesota one must have the driver's license in the front seat area or glove compartment. Having it in a purse or backpack in the backseat or trunk is not allowed. Is this correct information? If so, what is the reason?

**Answer:** Minnesota law states that a person shall have their license in immediate possession when operating a motor vehicle and show it when a law enforcement officer requests it. I believe being able to produce the driver's license while having contact with the law enforce-

ment officer would still be sufficient. Let's use a traffic stop for example, and your driver's license is in the trunk of the vehicle. As long as you are able to provide your driver's license when asked, you would be just fine.

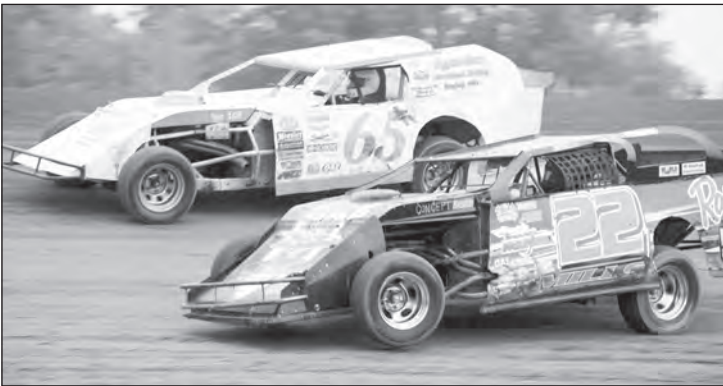

## Help kids get ready for fall sports season

Though summer is synonymous with R&R, parents of young athletes who hope to compete in scholastic athletics when the school year begins in autumn may need to take steps to ensure their kids aren't at risk of injury once the curtain comes up on fall sports season.

· **Examine and replace equipment if necessary.** The right equipment can protect kids from injury and help them realize their full athletic potential. But damaged or outdated equipment can increase kids' risk of injury. Examine kids' equipment long before fall sports season begins so you have time to bargain hunt should anything need to be replaced.

· **Schedule a physical for your child.** Many school districts mandate that athletes receive and pass physicals before they can compete. Speak with the athletic director at your child's school to learn the guidelines that govern athletic physicals. The physical will need to be conducted by a predetermined date, but you may also need the physical to be conducted after a certain date for it to be considered valid. Speak with your child's physician if any problems are found during the physical.

· **Let kids heal.** Kids' schedules are busier than ever before, and many youngsters play several sports during the school year. Summer vacation may be the only extended period all year that youngsters' bodies get to heal. While it's important that kids stay physically active throughout the summer, make sure they don't overdo it, as you should emphasize the importance of rest.

· **Gradually get back in**

**the swing of things.** While rest gives kids' bodies a chance to heal and develop, it's important that young athletes stay in shape over the summer. As the fall sports season draws near, help kids gradually get back in the swing of things. Tryouts tend to be physically demanding, so kids who have not lifted a finger all summer may be at risk of injury or missing the cut. Let kids ease back into regular exercise to make sure they are

not starting from scratch come their first tryout.

· **Speak with coaches.** Coaches can be great assets to parents who want to make sure their youngsters enjoy the summer without sacrificing their chances of making the team in the fall. Speak with kids' coaches to determine if there is any area your son or daughter can work on over the summer to improve his or her chances of making the team. Make sure kids are

the ones leading the charge to improve their games; otherwise, they may feel pressured into doing so and that can take away the fun of playing sports.

Scholastic athletes should take advantage of the opportunity to relax and recover that summer presents. But athletes who hope to compete in the fall can still work with their parents to ensure they're ready once the school year and sports season begins.

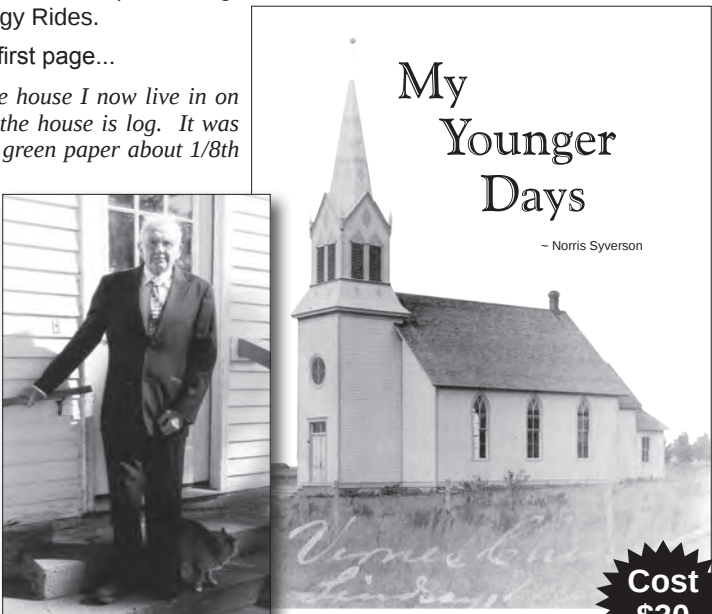
Here is just an excerpt from his first page...
