Storms hit hard around the area in the overnight hours of Sunday, August 26



Terry and Heidi Storm of Erskine had just moved into their spot at the Pine Lake campground south of Gonvick this spring. Their trailer is upside down but their new deck they had put in was in great shape.



Wesley Coleman from Grand Forks has a permanent cabin on Pine Lake and heard the thunder and saw the lightning and that is when the power went out. About 11:50 p.m. he heard the sound of a train before the roof of his cabin went off. The east end was untouched but the side facing Pine Lake was where the damage occurred. The propane tank was moved and lines were broken. He could smell the odor from the tank.



Brandon Carlson from Denver, Colorado had only two broken windows on his cabin after the storm that hit Pine Lake in the wee hours of Monday morning. But his pontoon was thrown off the lift and went 500 feet without any marks in the grass indicating that it had not touched ground before it landed. The cover from the motor was also found in the campground.



Last night, August 26th, 2018, an apparent tornado touched down at the City of Fosston's cable TV east of Fosston on the Columbia road. The Verizon cell tower that was a self supporting tower twisted and buckled. Fosston cable subscribers received channel 12 from that tower. The antennas that receive all of their other local channels were also destroyed as well as two large satellite dishes that receive numerous other channels. 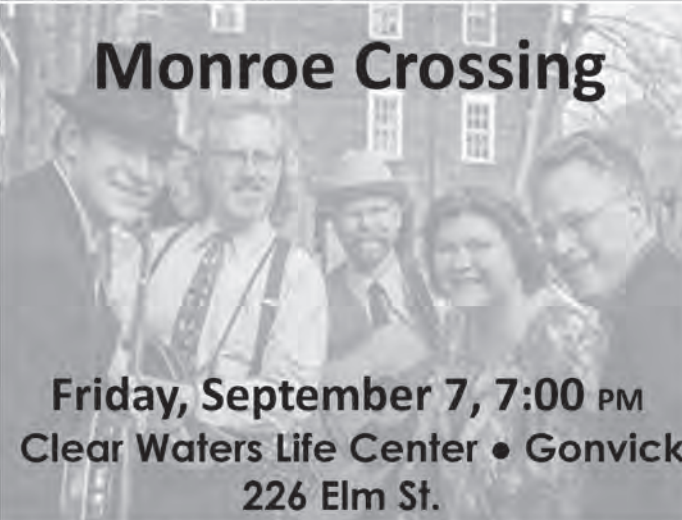


A late night storm that hit NW Minnesota Sunday night did considerable damage in Winger. Calvary Lutheran Church had severe damage.

ATV Accident Knute Township

On 8/20/2018 at 15:02 hours The Polk County Sheriff's Office was dispatched to a report of an ATV accident in Knute Township. When Deputies arrived on scene, they found two juvenile occupants in a Polaris RZR. The passenger complained of leg pain and was later transported to Riverview Hospital in Crookston for an apparent non-life threatening medical condition and injury. The driver was uninjured.

Deputies later learned that the ATV had rolled over and both occupants were wearing their seatbelts at the time of the crash. The owner of the ATV is 70 year old James Noyes of rural Erskine.

Assisting agencies were Essentia Ambulance and Erskine Fire Department. No further information will be released at this time.

Krueger escapes custody, apprehended

On 08-22-2018 a Northwest Regional Corrections male inmate escaped from custody. Inmate, Tony Mitchell Krueger age 20 was being transported from the Correctional Center to Riverview Emergency Room in Crookston for an apparent non-life threatening medical condition and injury.

Krueger was not restrained during the transport due to the nature of the reported injury. During the transport, Krueger was able to coax the corrections officer into pulling over and away from the driver's seat by acting like he was in extreme pain and needing assistance to adjust his positioning in the transport vehicle. When the Correctional Officer pulled over and went to assist Krueger, Krueger was able to steal the vehicle and flee from the area. No injuries were sustained by the transport officer. Krueger



was later apprehended in rural Winger, Polk County and returned to the Northwest Regional Correctional Center where he remains until additional charges are filed.

Case remains under investigation.

Verizon 911 Trunks Down

At approximately 4pm the Polk County Sheriff's Office dispatch was notified by Verizon Wireless that two of their 911 trunks were down. One of the trunks services Polk County. All 911 cell calls from Verizon phones are going through but will be answered by Polk County Dispatch from the office administrative phone lines. The public should be aware that although calls are being answered, the location information and phone number is not coming to the dispatch center with the call. All callers should be ready to relay all location and phone number information to the dispatcher when they place a 911 call.

At this time there is no estimated time for trunk recovery.

Storm Damage

The Polk Sheriff's Office along with Emergency Management is reporting storm damage from multiple areas of East Polk County including the Winger area, Fosston area and Tilberg Park and Campground, located in Queen Township, north of the City of Fosston. This occurred late Sunday evening, 8/26/2018.

The City of Winger experienced loss of power, extensive damage to homes, outbuildings, vehicles and to the CHS-Winger Elevator. Also reported was a gas line leak involving a grain dryer at the CHS Elevator, which resulted in a temporary short term evacuation of residents living nearby.

The City of Fosston had some downed trees and a downed Verizon Cellphone Tower located northeast of the City of Fosston off of Polk County 1. Damage to Tilberg Park included downed trees, damage to several campers and one vehicle.

No reports of any injuries at any of the affected areas were received.

The National Weather Service out of Grand Forks is surveying the damaged areas in Polk County area to determine if the damage is the result of high winds or tornadic activity.

Given the stormy weather period Polk County has been experiencing, we are reminding everyone to pay close attention to any weather notices put out through the national Weather Services. We are also encouraging all Polk County residents to sign up for Code Red Weather alerts. Information on Code Red can be found on the Polk County Website or by calling the Sheriff's Office at 218-281-0431.

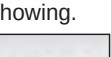

Ask a Trooper

Question: I am wondering what your thoughts are and the legal reprimands with people getting out of their cars to do the "in my feelings/Kiki challenge."

I've seen so many videos of people getting out of their car, while driving to dance alongside the moving car while people record them dancing to a song by Drake who started this entire ordeal.

Personally I think it's dangerous and very dumb for people to be hopping out of a moving car while driving. I've also seen videos of people getting hit by cars while doing this challenge.

I think you should do an "Ask A Trooper" segment on it because it's becoming more popular. We all know how people love media fads and have to try to fit in and be cool, but it's not very smart and it's dangerous.

Answer: This is a very good topic to have a conversation on with your children and friends. I've seen the "nae nae" and the "floss" but this is the first dance craze I've seen involving a moving vehicle. The #KiKiChallenge is a dance trend featuring a willing volunteer who opens up the passenger door of a moving vehicle and hops out and proceeds to dance alongside this moving vehicle to Drake's hit single, "In My Feelings." Meanwhile, the driver is video recording the person doing this.

As one would expect, there are going to be multiple risks involved with jumping out of a moving vehicle and dancing alongside it in the middle of the road (or even near the road in general.) This house had only two rooms downstairs, each one about 12 feet by 14 feet, with low ceilings about 7 1/2 feet high....There were 5 boys and 5 girls aging from 1 year to 16 years old, plus Ma and Pa living in this small house at that time....

St. Scholastica awarded \$2.76 million to prepare nurses in primary care

DULUTH, MN – The College of St. Scholastica has been awarded \$2.76 million by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services – the largest grant in St. Scholastica’s 107-year history.

“This four-year federal investment in our School of Nursing will fund the Rural Registered Nurses in Primary Care project,” said St. Scholastica President Colette Geary, Ph.D., “enabling St. Scholastica to advance its leadership role in addressing the critical RN primary care workforce shortages in rural and underserved communities. It will also strengthen our longstanding academic and clinical partnership with Essentia Health.”

RNs practicing in primary care are key to addressing poor health outcomes by providing long-term preventative care, particularly given the shortage of Advanced Practice Registered nurses and physicians in rural Minnesota. However, Minne-

sota nurses are heavily skewed toward acute care rather than primary care. Essentia Health regularly reports numerous unfilled positions in primary care throughout their service area.

Through the RRNPC project, St. Scholastica Nursing students will gain primary care competencies in theory, in skills training and simulation, and in real-world clinical experiences. They will participate in multiple shifts in primary care settings. Instructors at Essentia clinics and sites throughout the region will provide mentoring.

President Geary noted that St. Scholastica is the only recipient of a grant of this type in the state of Minnesota. Of the 42 grants awarded nationwide, only three other recipients are in the Upper Midwest (Iowa, Nebraska, and South Dakota).

Dr. David Herman, CEO of Essentia Health in Duluth, said the RRNPC project builds upon a close, symbiotic partnership.

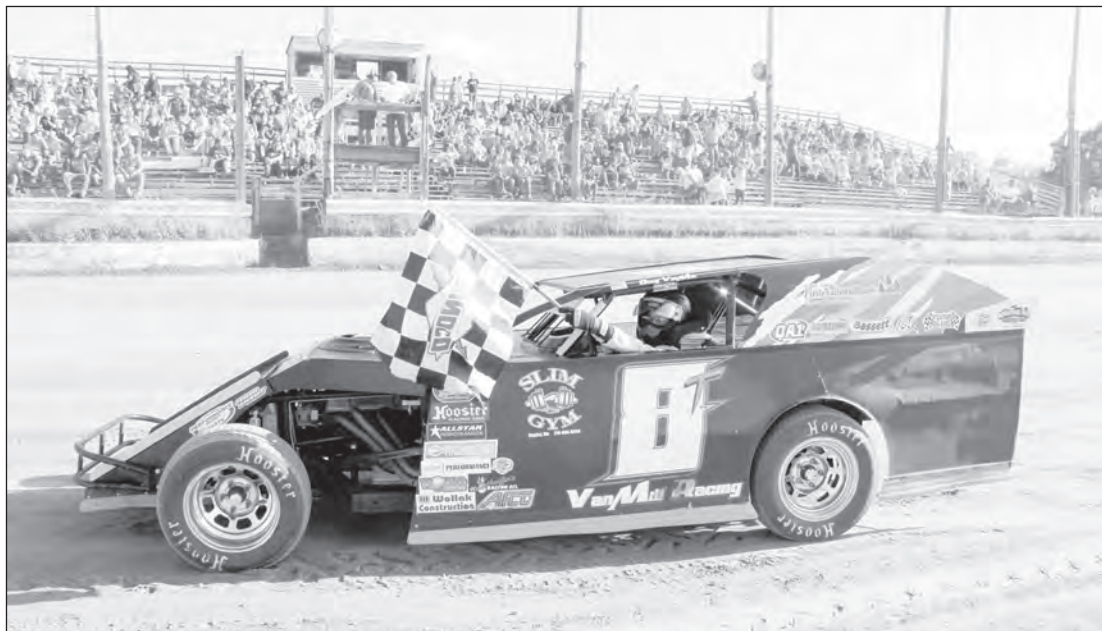

Be aware of all of the costs for college

College is often met with excitement and interest by students pursuing their passions and what they hope will be fulfilling, lucrative careers. Farmer's Financial Solutions, a division of Farmer's Insurance, says off-campus dining expenses cost an average of \$770 a year.

• **School supplies:** A new laptop or tablet, textbooks and other supplies a professor requires can cost thousands of dollars. The College Board estimates students spend \$1,300 on books and supplies in a typical school year.
