Bob Carriere age 62 from Oklee received a heart transplant

In 1995 Bob Carriere, age 62, started having heart problems and ended up having a triple heart bypass and it lasted until 2002 and then he had to have the triple bypass again. After that he has had stents put in and then more recently he had a pace maker and defibrillator put in.

His heart was failing and in March 2016 he was sent to the University of Minnesota in Minneapolis to be evaluated to get on the heart transplant list. They did a variety of testing that lasted 3 days and he was put on the transplant list.

On Nov. 21st, 2016 his heart was at its worst and he was airlifted from Thief River Falls to the University of Minnesota. He was again evaluated by the heart team and was then put at the top of the heart transplant list that day but was admitted to the hospital until a new heart came. He had a chance for a new heart three times but they didn't meet all the qualifications for him.

The donor matching process is done in the evaluation to get on the transplant list and it tests the size of your heart, your blood type and lots of other testing is done to determine the right match. He knew he was waiting for a young heart and his blood type was a common type so they hoped the chance of a new heart would come soon.

He waited 55 days in the hospital and on January 15, 2017 at 3:00 am he was told his new heart was coming. The transplant took place at the University of Minnesota in Minneapolis, it started that Sunday morning at 11:00 am and was completed around 5:00 p.m. that day. He woke up the following day and was doing great. He had a few complications that arose through the days at the hospital. He was released from the hospital 18 days after surgery and then was moved to an apartment near the hospital where he stayed with his wife Sue for about a month. They both finally came home to Oklee on March 4th, 2017.

It's been a long process and lots of complications along the way. It took about 1 1/2 years to start feeling better and getting back to enjoying life again.

Bob's donor was a 21 year old named Ryan from Wisconsin and he is thought of everyday for his gift that he gave that day. Ryan choose to be an organ donor and that day he saved Bob's life.

A letter was sent to Life Source from Bob thanking his donors family for the gift of life he received and in Sept. 2017 Bob received a letter back from the donor family. Both families have been able to keep in touch with letters and thru Facebook and this summer the donor family saw that a Hero Hustle 5K for Organ, Eye, & Tissue Donor Awareness was being held

at Oklee Market Day. Ryan's parents, Tim and Kim asked if they could be a part of the 5K and meet Bob and his family. On August 10th Tim and Kim came to Oklee and met Bob for the first time. The meeting was emotional and everyone was

very excited to meet. They were such great people and the visit was wonderful.

115,000 men, women and children await lifesaving organ transplants.

Even the largest football stadium in the US could not fit the number of patients on the national transplant waiting list.

Every 10 minutes another person is added to the national transplant waiting list.

8,000 deaths occur every year in the U.S. because organs are not donated in time.

22 people die each day because the organ they need is not donated in time.

82% of patients waiting are in need of a kidney.

1 out of 3 deceased donors is over the age of 50.

Minnesota's First Female Member of Congress, Coya Knutson, honored with Senate Resolution

MINNESOTA [08/22/18]—Today, Minnesota's U.S. Sens. Tina Smith and Amy Klobuchar honored the storied life of Minnesota's first female member Congress, Coya Knutson, with a Senate Resolution heralding her life as a trailblazer who, despite great obstacles when she served in the 1950s, succeeded in making a difference for the families and communities in her state.

The resolution, offered Wednesday on what would have been Knutson's 106th birthday, notes that after ar-

riving in Washington, D.C in 1954, she convinced Speaker Sam Rayburn to appoint her to be the first woman ever to serve on the House Agriculture Committee, despite the committee chairman's "grave apprehensions" that a female could not handle the work of the panel.

That Chairman, Harold Cooley of North Carolina, later recanted that sentiment by saying in a speech, "Frankly, I

The sawmill located at Itasca Pioneers Farmers grounds was in action during the three day event. The J. Neils/Redby Sawmill was used in two different places, at Cass Lake and at Redby. The mill ran at Redby well into the 1950s when it was replaced by new equipment powered by large electric motors that ran off the grid. The steam engine and sawmill were purchased by Alf Eiden of Oslo around 1960. He erected the engine at his farm where it remained for many years. In 1997 the engine and sawmill were purchased by the Lake Itasca Region Pioneer Farmers. Since its relocation many hours of labor and monetary donations have brought the mill into a working piece of American History.

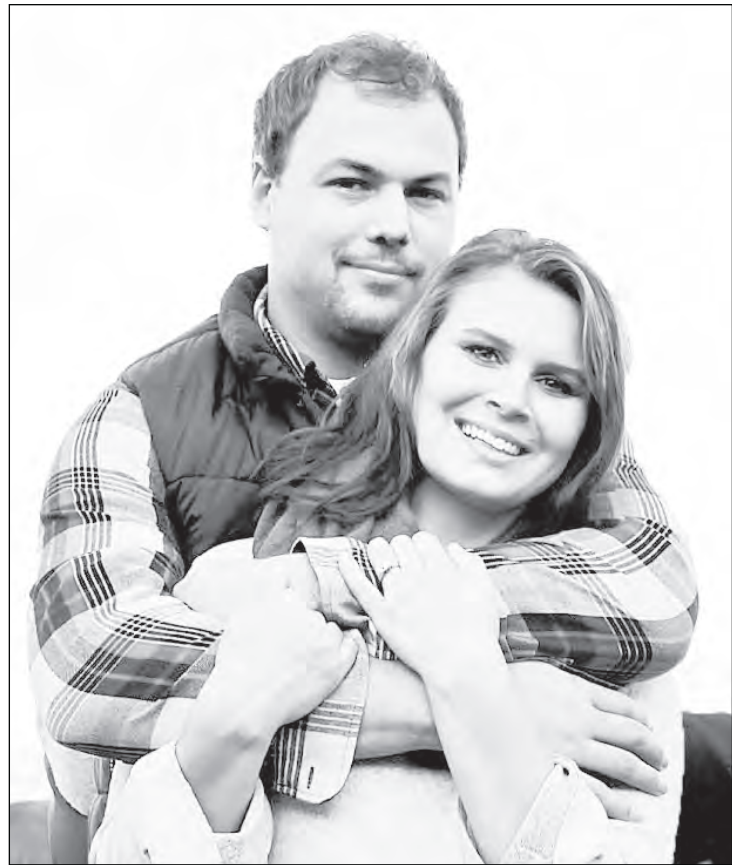

Sanford Joe Lueken Cancer Center opening soon

BEMIDJI, Minn. – Sanford Health opens the Sanford Joe Lueken Cancer Center on Monday, Sept. 10, bringing the latest cancer care to northern Minnesota.

An open house and tours are scheduled Aug. 28 from 4:30 to 7:30 p.m. Construction began in June 2017 on the \$12 million, 20,500-square-foot center named in honor of Bemidji grocery store owner Joe Lueken. Lueken was very active in his community, supporting many organizations and charities and was known for his overwhelming generosity. He died in 2014 at age 72 after a battle with cancer.

The Joseph and Janice Lueken Family Foundation gave a significant lead gift to the Care Without Limits campaign to expand and centralize cancer care and honor Lueken's legacy. Every year more than 500 people are diagnosed with cancer in this area. The family agreed there was no better way to remember the local luminary than through a gift, making the dream of a new cancer center come to life.

"My husband was tireless in his efforts to enhance the quality of life in this region. He was the son of a small-town baker who grew up to be a successful businessman and philanthropist," said Janice Lueken. "But he was also a 30-year cancer survivor and lived with Parkinson's for 20 years. Through it all it was his positivity, spirituality and determination that were a testament to his character. Joe was truly an inspiration to us and all who knew him."

The new cancer center is connected to Sanford Bemidji Main Clinic and brings all the cancer services into one location, providing better continuity of care for patients and collaboration among staff. It has 20 infusion suites, 15 exam rooms, on-site infusion pharmacy and lab

services, boutique, bistro, garden and other patient-centered amenities. It also creates a hub for services like radiation and medical oncology, palliative care, infusion pharmacy services, patient navigation, nutrition, financial counseling, social services, genetic counseling and survivorship. Additionally, patients will have access to the latest in clinical trials.

Unique features include an outdoor patio and indoor fireplace lounge where patients can receive infusion treatments, conference room space for meetings and patient education, a meditation room overlooking a flower garden and space for the addition of a second linear accelerator for radiation treat-

ments in the future.

"For years Bemidji had limited cancer care available, and patients had to travel long distances to receive lifesaving treatment. This is particularly difficult when you consider how often and how long cancer patients are cared for," said Bryan Nermoe, president of Sanford Health of Northern Minnesota. "This new center ensures that people can receive the care they need close to home. As Sanford continues to grow, one thing will always hold true, our commitment to putting patients first by investing in the communities we serve."

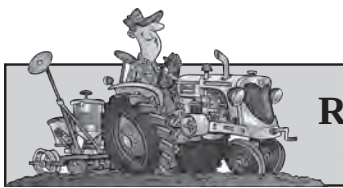

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Rollag and Cockshutt

Labor Day Weekend means the last hurrah of summer to many of us. Teachers and students will be off to school. Lake time and camping are probably also about done. But to me it means ROLLAG. The Western Minnesota Steam Threshers Reunion has been held at Rollag, MN, since 1954. I believe I have attended the gathering for probably 27 or so of the last 30 years. I seldom miss and when I do it is a sad occasion. My wonderful wife of the last 30 years graciously attends with me so it is doubly fun for me!

This year we departed Friday morning we came across a rummage sale just north of Rollag. This is one of my wife's favorite pastimes, so we stopped. Surprise-next to the rummage sale was a line up of Cockshutt and Oliver tractors.....darn. So while Patty was rummaging I asked the lady in charge of the rummage sale if I could go take a look. She explained her husband was at work and the tractors were his. The first tractor was a beautifully restored 2150 Cockshutt, with front wheel assist. Next I made my way over to a nice 77 Oliver. A few other Olivers were out front of the shed. As I was looking a "young" rummage sale helper(I believe a granddaughter) came and told me to come and look in the shed at a 2050 Cockshutt. It was impressive!

The owner of the tractors is Stewart Aakre. I sorry I missed him but at least I have an excuse to come back again!! In talking I did find out the Aakre family has around 100 Oliver and Cockshutt tractors. So you see why I would like to come back and visit again! I hope I got the story correct that those two beautiful Cockshutt tractor got shipped down from Canada, near Niagara Falls, and then trucked to Minnesota, to be made into the beauties that I got to see. I certainly am no expert but I am really a fan of Cockshutt tractors!

The Cockshutt Farm Equipment company was acquired by the White Motor Company in 1962. White had previously acquired the Oliver Corporation. Cockshutt had used several different tractors over the years,

including Olivers. Instead of the Oliver green the Cockshutts were painted red. After White's take over the Cockshutt Company they ceased production at the Brantford, Ontario, Canada, plant but wanted to continue selling Cockshutts since they had a long history of tractor sales. From 1964-1969 Oliver manufactured the 1450 thru 2150 models. This was their "50" series. White produced Cockshutts identical to the Oliver "50" series, only painted red. Many of the tractors in the Aakre collection that I had a chance to see were in this "50" series of models. I had one Oliver in my life, a 1650 row crop. Being a John Deere man I sold it and bought 4020 John Deere.....but after looking over some of the beautiful tractors in the Aakre collection, maybe I should get another Oliver, or even better a Cockshutt!

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Ask a Trooper

by Sgt. Jesse Grabow Minnesota State Patrol

Question: I am new to the school bus world and have recently begun running a non-profit school bus company. Today I had a driver report a stop arm violation and I am uncertain where I direct those reports to in order for law enforcement to follow up. I did a little research and the only thing I was able to find as a helpful reference, aside from the MN State Statutes, is an article you were quoted in. Hoping that you can point me in the right direction for how to handle these reports.

Answer: School Bus stop arm violations should be reported to the law enforcement agency where there would be jurisdiction in which the violation occurred.

Report the violation immediately by calling "911" and the dispatcher will be able to determine which agency will need to respond and investigate.

Some of the information that law enforcement will need to investigate a stop-arm violation would include: Date, time and location of incident. In additions, vehicle description such as the license plate, make, model, color and any other features of the vehicle are helpful in tracking down the driver. The violator's direction of travel, how they passed the school bus, and was a child inside or outside of the bus are also important. Other helpful information includes the description of driver, number of passengers if any, and any other details you can provide.

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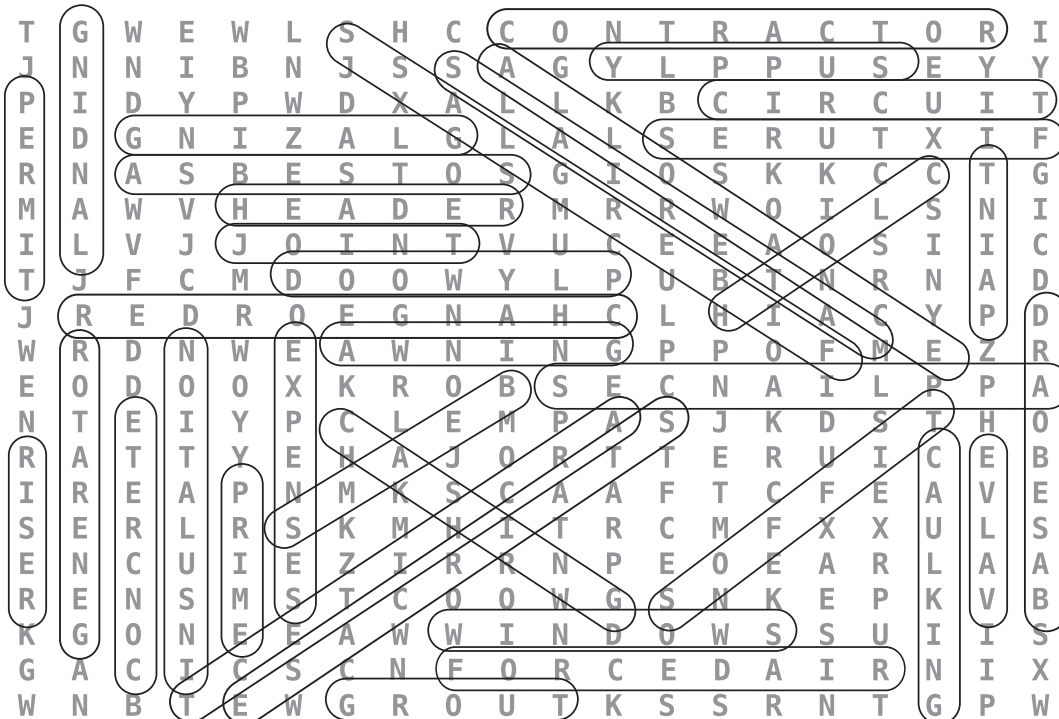

would not swap her for one-half dozen men. Mrs. Knutson has been intensely and constantly interested in the work of the committee, in the welfare of the farmers... She is a brilliant woman,...a statesman in the true sense of the word." Both Sens. Smith and Klobuchar currently serve on the Senate Agriculture Committee.

The Senators' Resolution notes that during her two terms in Congress, Knutson was a trailblazer who championed expanded assistance for school lunches, the first-ever federal student loan program, and the first-ever research funding for cystic fibrosis.

Rep. Knutson drew national attention when her husband

Andy, whom she later divorced, voiced his opposition to her service in a public letter asking her to return to Minnesota to "make a home for [her] son and husband." The letter spawned "Coya Come Home" headlines in newspapers around the country and helped defeat her in her bid for a third term in 1958.

Prior to serving in Congress, Knutson was an active member of the Minnesota State legislature, where she sponsored the state's clean air bill that prohibited smoking in some public places. Earlier she taught school and was well known as an active volunteer who helped establish a medical clinic in Red Lake County in Northwest Minnesota. She was inspired to a life of public service after hearing Eleanor Roosevelt speak about the importance of women being involved.

After retiring from federal service, Knutson returned to Minnesota, where she died in 1996 at age 82.

"Just as Eleanor Roosevelt inspired Coya Knutson to get involved and make a difference in her community, Rep. Knutson's life is an inspiration for me and my work," said Sen. Smith. "She should also inspire many others to get involved and create needed change. Our resolution honors her life and the difference she made for Minnesota and the entire country."

"Coya Knutson defeated the odds to become the first woman elected to Congress from Minnesota. Even when the party bosses refused to support her—and her own husband wrote a letter to the local paper titled, 'Coya, Come Home,' begging her to quit politics—she barnstormed Minnesota's 9th Congressional District, driving more than 25,000 miles and sometimes delivering a dozen speeches a day and earning her place in Washington," said Sen. Klobuchar.

Help kids get ready for fall sports season

Schedule a physical for your child. Many school districts mandate that athletes receive and pass physicals before they can compete. Speak with the athletic director at your child's school to learn the guidelines that govern athletic physicals. The physical will need to be conducted by a predetermined date, but you may also need the physical to be conducted after a certain date for it to be considered valid. Speak with

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DPS News: 100 Deadliest Days on Minnesota Roads

With Labor Day behind us, Minnesotans are easing back into the routine of school events and anticipating fall activities. For the families who lost loved ones in traffic crashes this summer, life is now far from routine.

100 Deadliest Days

During the 100 deadliest days (Memorial Day weekend–Labor Day) on Minnesota roads:

- Preliminary numbers show 116 people have lost their lives on Minnesota roads. That's 52 percent of all traffic fatalities so far in 2018. The 116 fatalities compare with 121 road deaths in 2017.
- Preliminary numbers show out of the 116 deaths:
 - At least eight are known to be distraction-related.
 - 32 are speed-related.
 - 30 are alcohol-related.
 - 17 were not wearing their seat belts.
 - 40 were motorcyclists. Of the 40 motorcyclists who died, 28 (70 percent) were not wearing a helmet.
 - Preliminary numbers show there were 33 days with no fatal crashes during this time period.

protective gear, including a DOT-approved helmet. This is all that separates you from the road and other vehicles in case of a crash.

- Be prepared for inattentive drivers and other unexpected situations on the road. Stay focused on riding and keep your speed in check.
- Take a training course. Courses are available for beginner to expert riders and are an opportunity to polish and learn life-saving maneuvers to keep you safe on the road.

- Motorists:**
 - Always look twice for motorcyclists before entering a roadway or changing lanes. Motorcycles are smaller, so their speed and distance is difficult to judge.
