Essentia Health leads the nation in rollout of rapid one-step strep and flu testing

Essentia Health is one of the first health care organizations in the United States to roll out a large-scale rapid result testing system for Influenza A and B, strep and respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) in most of the communities it serves. Now, when patients go to their local Essentia Health clinic to be tested for these common ailments, they will be given accurate results within a half hour, rather than waiting for a hospital laboratory to confirm an initial diagnosis.

"The Cepheid analyzers are molecular-based systems that detect the DNA or RNA of infectious bacteria or viruses in patient samples," says Dr. David Carter, an Essentia Health pathologist. "The tests are more sensitive than the traditional culture most people are familiar with." Essentia is the first health system to implement the complete line of Cepheid's systems at one time including the Infinity, GX, and Xpress analyzers.

Hospitals have had the molecular-based testing equipment for years. But just this year, the Food and Drug Administration waived regulations to allow outpatient facilities like convenient care and community clinics to

feature the advanced diagnostic system.

"Diagnosis of infections traditionally has required a screening test followed by a confirmatory test, delaying diagnosis and patient care," says Jodie DeMenge, a laboratory technical manager. "With this testing, we can provide complete results in one test. Faster results not only will help our patients get the care they need without having to wait for a hospital to confirm test results, it will also reduce the use of unnecessary antibiotics."

Last year alone, Essentia performed more than 40,000 strep tests on patients across its coverage area of Minnesota, Wisconsin, North Dakota and Idaho. Essentia invested \$2 million to purchase 60 Cepheid analyzers to place in hospitals and clinics across its service area. Dr. Carter and DeMenge add the rapid results will also ease crowded clinic waiting rooms as the influenza and strep season begins.

Essentia will begin using the new analyzers in its outpatient facilities in early November. The molecular test is covered by most insurance companies.

New Look, New Name, and New Developments for Fosston Mobile Home Park

October 16, 2018
Fosston has had a mobile home park for decades, located on the west side of town, along Omland Avenue. The park now has a new name, Omland Court. The park design features two circular drives, with homes radiating outward, like spokes on a wheel, and another row of homes on the east side.

In the 1960's and 1970's the park was very well-maintained, but in the past several years, there has been a gradual decline. In an effort to turn things around, the City of Fosston purchased the property in July, and contracted Greater Minnesota Management (GMM) to manage the property for them.

Since then, several improvements have been made, most importantly, the removal of several blighted (vacant) homes. Other site improvements are either underway or being discussed. The site has many trees and includes a small, centrally located play space for children.

The City of Fosston is one of a handful of cities across the United States who are purchasing mobile home parks. Many of the parks established across the United States in the 1960's and 70's have fallen into poor condition. Cities like Fosston believe that mobile home parks are an important type of housing, because they provide an affordable option for home ownership.

Michelle Landsverk, economic development consultant for the City of Fosston is enthused

about the improvements to the park. "This is an important part of the continuum of housing that the City of Fosston has to offer," Landsverk said. "The site is lovely and has so many trees! I applaud the City for their decision to purchase the property and expect to see additional improvements in the next couple of years."

In addition to sites where homes can be placed, there are three homes within Omland Court that are owned by the City of Fosston and which are available to lease. These are very new, high quality homes, constructed by Homark. A third option is for individuals who would prefer to purchase their own new home and place it within Omland Court. New, high-quality homes are available through Homark Homes, with several styles and options to choose from.

Did you know?

Watchdog organizations like the Better Business Bureau warn against donating to charities over the telephone, but reports indicate that fraudsters are still utilizing robocalls to great effect as they prey on donors' generous natures. According to the Federal Trade Commission, consumers report losing hundreds of millions of dollars a year to robocalls, a scam used by perpetrators of fraud in which donations to bogus charities are solicited over the phone. While some people may be surprised to learn such scams are still effective, a report

from YouMail, a free robocall-blocking service, sheds some light on just how common robocalls are. According to YouMail, in July 2018, 1,591 robocalls were placed every second. That means roughly 137.5 million such calls are made every day. And the people behind these calls are very clever, sometimes using famous people's actual voices to convince innocent people of a bogus charity's legitimacy. In 2017, the Connecticut Better Business Bureau issued a warning about robocalls using the voices of celebrities. The warning indicated that, after hearing the voice of a famous person, consumers were prompted to press a button to speak with a "donation agent."

Consumers concerned about being victimized by robocalls should heed the advice of watchdog organizations and never donate or agree to donate over the phone.

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Ask a Trooper

Ques- My ex-husband was pulled a few months back and charged with a DWI. Per his report he paid just about \$1,000 in fines prior to his court date. In court he was fined another \$400 AND THAT WAS IT! He was not ordered to place the "whiskey plates" on his truck. He had a suspended license for a measly 30 days.

My question for you: Is this truly all the regulation placed on a person who is arrested for drunk driving?! This sort of thing makes my stomach turn flips. People are not being held accountable for their actions and are given a slap on the wrist for poor decision making skills. In this day n' age there is no excuse for driving a vehicle under the influence of alcohol.

Answer: In my career, I have investigated far too many crashes where someone was seriously injured or killed as a result of a driver's decision to operate a motor vehicle while under the influence.

In Minnesota, it's against the law for a person who is under the influence of alcohol, controlled, or hazardous substances to operate a motor vehicle. The severity of the offense increases depending on impairment level and past DWI convictions.

If convicted of impaired driving, the penalty for a first offense is up to 90 days in jail and/or a \$1,000 fine.

If the driver has prior DWI convictions, the penalties increase to 2-7 years in jail and/or fines of \$3,000-\$14,000.

Refusal to submit to a chemical test may also result in a fine and jail time.

Along with possible fines and jail time, a driver's license will be revoked from 3 months - 4 years. The offender may also lose their license plates and car and their insurance costs will increase.

Minnesota law enforcement officers are trained to identify drivers who are under the influence of alcohol and drugs, and we are committed to taking impaired drivers off the road before they injure or kill themselves and others. If a person chooses to operate a motor vehicle while impaired from alcohol or drugs, they will face consequences.

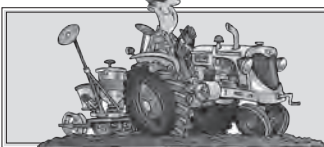

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Wisconsin, Wedding, and Allis Chalmers

We attended our niece's wedding in Lake Geneva, Wisconsin, last weekend and had a great time. As we drove through Wisconsin I scoured the countryside for tractors. Of course I saw a few but I didn't get that great inspiration for a new article. But, my mind did think of Milwaukee's Allis Chalmers and my memories of Allis .

When I was growing up on the farm, west of Oklee, we had all John Deere's except for an H Farmall. Dad told stories of the neighbors farming with Farmalls. Some stories included the Minneapolis-Molines dad and his uncle had used in years past. Even more stories included all the Massey tractors farming around Oklee. Allis Chalmers was somewhat foreign to me. Our neighbor, Walter Pederson did have an RC Allis and I loved

tractors so I knew about those orange tractors, but I did not know a lot about them.

Edward P. Allis dabbled in many businesses. In 1861 he purchased Reliance Iron Works renaming it Edward P. Allis and Company. With the demands of the Civil War the company flourished. Edward P. Allis died in 1889, then in 1901 his company merged with Fraser and Chalmers and Allis-Chalmers was born.

The company did have some struggles but to escape financial woes they decided to enter the tractor market. Allis's first few attempts at a tractor were unsuccessful. In 1918 introduced the 15-30. It featured a 4 cylinder, 461 cu. in. engine and weighed over 6000 pounds. It draw back was the selling price \$2100! Eventually the

15-30 was changed into the 20-35 by increasing the engine speed. The only problem was that price tag. So Allis went to work. Replacing some parts and eliminating others. By 1934 they had dropped the price to under \$1000 dollars. Still not as cheap as the Fordson had been, but Allis had made leaps and bounds figuring out how to make a dependable and affordable tractor. This is just what the farmers wanted!

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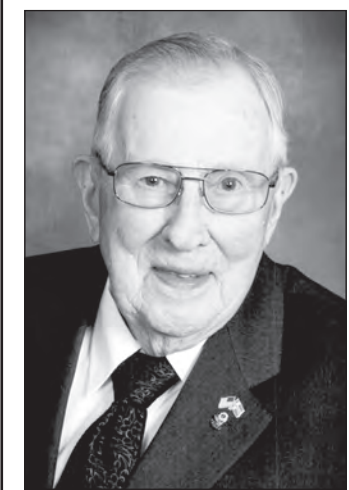
