## Postal worker sentenced for stealing money, gift cards

Timothy Merle Conger, 25, of Bagley was sentenced on Tuesday, January 22, 2019 in Polk County District Court for mail theft. He had been stealing money from the mail by opening and resealing the letters with tape after the cash inside had been removed. The theft carries a maximum punishment of three years in prison. He was also given 24 months in prison, but that was suspended as long as he follows the conditions of his probation for four years.

Investigators tracked one of the gift cards that was for a graduate after he had used it at Target. He had worked at the

Gully Post Office for three years and when he transferred to the Gonvick Post Office he said the stealing stopped. He became the PTF, Part Time Flexible Clerk for a short time in July of 2017. Conger told investigators that he stole during in duties for the USPS between December 2016 through June of 2017. It was estimated that he took between \$1,500 and \$2,000 in cash and 80 to 100 gift cards.

He started working for the Postal Service in October of 2015 in various places including Bemidji, Gully and Gonvick where help as needed.

## New speed limits take effect when new signs are posted

BEMIDJI, Minn. – The speed limits on several highways in northwest Minnesota will increase from 55 to 60 miles per hour according to the Minnesota Department of Transportation. The new speed limits take effect when the new signs are posted.

**Highways that will receive new speed limits signs include:**

- Highway 1- North Dakota Border to Highway 89
- Highway 1- East Red Lake Reservation Boundary to Highway 6
- Highway 6- Deer River to Highway 1

- Highway 9- Norman/Clay county line to Highway 2
  - Highway 200- Highway 71 to Hill City
  - Highway 72- Shooks to Highway 11
  - Highway 89- Highway 2 to Red Lake
  - Highway 89- Grygla to Canadian Border
  - Highway 308- Highway 11 to Highway 89
  - Highway 317- North Dakota Border to Highway 220
- Speed limits lower than 55 miles per hour along these sections of highway will remain unchanged.

The speed increases are based on a traffic and engineering study of each location, which looks at past crash rates, physical attributes of the highway (such as shoulder widths and access points), and an analysis of current driving speeds.

In 2014, the Minnesota Legislature directed MnDOT to evaluate its two-lane, two-way 55 mph highways to determine whether speed limits could be reasonably and safely increased.

## Peterson and Young lead Bipartisan Letter Urging Action to Reopen Government and Protect Border

WASHINGTON – Congressman Collin C. Peterson (D-Minn.) and Congressman Don Young (R-Alaska) are leading a bipartisan letter urging President Trump and Congressional Leadership to come to an expeditious agreement to reopen the government while securing the border. Young and Peterson are currently adding co-signers to the letter, which illustrates a shared willingness to work across the aisle for common sense legislation. The letter is supported by an equal number of Democrats and Republicans.

"The partisan gridlock has gone on for too long, and the shutdown is hurting Minnesota as it draws on," Peterson said. "I have heard from hundreds of constituents who want to see the government reopened with increased border security. This ongoing stalemate is clearly hurting our constituents, and it is time we start working on measures that address these concerns. Bipartisan compromise is the only option for a long-term solution."

"I support securing our nation's borders, but in the long-run holding up the appropriations process does untold harm. I have experienced more than a dozen shutdowns and quite frankly, they aren't the answer. It's Congress' Constitutional responsibility to fund the government and the American public sent us to Washington to keep the government running. We must fulfill that duty," said Congressman Don Young. "This letter encourages good faith, bipartisan negotiations that will bring an end to this partial shutdown."

Congressman Peterson's office has continued to hear directly from constituents of

the 7th District of Minnesota regarding the negative impacts from this government shutdown. These include:

- Delayed Small Business Administration loan applications due to agency closures.
- Halted licensing for new businesses by the FDA and the Alcohol and Tobacco Tax and Trade Bureau, which is preventing businesses from opening. This is hurting small businesses like the Fergus Brewing Company, which cannot brew its products.
- Farmers are unable to sign up for Market Facilitation Payments and are unable to receive certifications of eligible production. MFP sign up would have ended on January 15, 2019 but will be extended as many days as the offices are closed by the shutdown.
- Closed Farm Service Agency offices, which are preventing farmers from cashing or depositing checks from grain and livestock sales. This stops our producers from paying their bills.
- Delayed discussions on availability of operating loans for 2019.
- Shut down applications for Farm Storage Facility Loan Program hurt farmers' availability to store grain and reduces their flexibility to market products at higher prices.
- Halted implementation of new farm bill commodity title provisions likely delaying sign-up for the 2019 crop year.
- Reduced IRS staffing, which limits new guidance on tax changes in 2018 tax bill.
- Potential delayed processing of tax refunds due to limited IRS staffing.
- Uncertainty in future SNAP benefits should the shut-

down continue past February.

• Air traffic controllers are concerned about the shutdown's effect on pay, training schedules, and the number of controllers able to take shifts.

• Furloughed Homeland Security staff leaving American soil less safe.

The negative economic effects of the shutdown continue adding up. The White House Council of Economic Advisers recently doubled the shutdown's impact on first quarter GDP growth, which will be decreased 2%.

Peterson has supported House measures to reopen the federal government and provide increased border security. He also supports building a wall where it's most appropriate in addition to the use of other border crossing technologies.

### The draft letter reads:

Dear President Trump and Speaker Pelosi, Minority Leader McCarthy, Leader McConnell, Minority Leader Schumer:

For the good of our country, we call on you to end the brinkmanship and commit to legislation that would immediately reopen the government. We represent constituents who support strengthened border security, including expanded physical barriers where appropriate. The government shutdown is not moving us closer to a more secure border and is in fact making our country less safe. Effective border security will take years to establish and requires bipartisan buy-in to be lasting. We stand ready to work with you in good faith on legislation to secure the border and call for the immediate end to this wasteful government shutdown.

## Polk County Sheriff

### Car vs Pedestrian

On 1-27-2019 the Polk County Sheriff's Office responded to a report of a car versus pedestrian crash on County road 21 near 240th Ave Sw (approximately 5 miles East of Hwy 75). Deputies responded and located the victim, 23 year old Zachary Foley of Thief River Falls Minnesota, laying on the side of the road. He was later transported to Altru Hospital in Grand Forks to be evaluated and treated. Foley's condition is currently unknown. It was later discovered that Foley had been traveling on County road 21 when he stopped to check on a vehicle on the side of the road with its hazard lights on. While crossing the roadway, Foley was struck by an east-bound vehicle, driven by 38 year old Joshua Melgaard from Thief River Falls Minnesota. Weather and road conditions were poor during the time of the accident and are believed to have played a part in the accident. This case is still under investigation and no further information will be released at this time.

Assisting with the accident was Minnesota State Patrol and Crookston Area Ambulance.

## Ask a Trooper

by Sgt. Jesse Grabow Minnesota State Patrol

**Q u e s - tion:** If you are stopped at an intersection at a red light and there is an emergency vehicle behind you should you go through the red light to let the vehicle pass?

**Answer:** Every situation varies when emergency vehicles are responding to an incident and how much room there is to yield and move over.

The state requires motorists to move to the right and not block any intersection when an emergency vehicle is approaching. The driver should stop and remained stop until the emergency vehicle passes.

When I'm responding to an incident and approaching an intersection, I will evaluate

what would be the safest action for myself and other vehicles that are yielding to me. Even though the law says that I have the right of way if I have activated my emergency lights and siren, I still approach each intersection with extreme caution and make sure that the intersections are clear before I proceed through.

If there is room for a vehicle that is already stopped at an intersection to safely move over to the right and provide me with enough room to proceed, I will keep my emergency lights and siren on. If there is no other options for the stopped vehicle at a red light to move over and there is no room for me to get around stopped vehicle(s), I will shut off my lights and siren and wait for the light to change to green. I don't want that vehicle to enter an intersection on a red

light and create the possibility of getting into a crash.

Each driver should evaluate the situation and move over if there is room, or stay stopped if the situation puts you or others in danger.

This is a great reminder to all drivers the need to avoid all distractions so we are able to hear and see emergency vehicle approaching from all angles and yield to them.

People make many renovations around their homes to improve their quality of life. When attention turns to the bedroom, some changes can greatly affect quality of sleep.

The temperature of the bedroom, its configuration and lighting can impact a person's ability to get a good night's sleep. However, the item that may bear the most influence is the mattress.

The Better Sleep Council says whether one wakes up feeling rested and healthy depends largely on the age of a mattress and its condition. A good mattress should alleviate pressure on joints while providing bodily support. It should not be a contributor to aches and pains. Mattresses that are seven years or older may need to be replaced.

A century or two ago, mattresses were constructed of whatever people had on hand - from feathers to pine needles to straw. That's all changed today. But even though there are many options, it's key for people to discover which material is right for them.

### Innerspring

Innerspring (also called coil) mattresses have been around for some time. These metal springs provide internal support. The number of coils, types of coils and distribution pattern throughout the mattress impacts how well the bed will conform to the body. These mattresses may be best for back or stomach sleepers due to their level of support. Keep in mind



that innerspring mattresses may have limited durability and may start to sag after just a few years.

### Memory foam

Memory foam mattresses are relatively recent additions to the market. According to the mattress shopping resource The Sleep Judge, memory foam mattresses may eventually replace innerspring mattresses. Famous for its ability to contour to the shape of the user's body, memory foam envelops a person and absorbs energy. This means there's less motion transfer. That's a big plus when sleeping with a partner who moves around in bed. Memory foam provides a high level of pressure point relief and promotes proper spine alignment.

### Gel foam

Gel foam mattresses bounce

back to their original form when pressure is released. Hollow columns in the mattress allow for increased air flow that improves this pressure release and enables people to sleep coolly and comfortably. Sometimes gel is paired with memory foam for a hybrid mattress.

### Latex

Latex mattresses are coveted due to their durability and comfort. Latex also conforms to the body, but more generally than memory foam, so it bounces back quickly. One of the biggest draws to latex mattresses is how natural they are. Latex is made from natural rubber. Cost can be prohibitive, however, as latex mattresses tend to be expensive.

Purchasing a new mattress can lead to better sleep. This is a bedroom renovation worth pursuing.

## Understanding Condensation in Your Home

What do houseplants, a boiling pot of pasta and your shower all have in common? They all add moisture to your home's interior. And, while some humidity in the home is good, excessive moisture can be uncomfortable.

Often people are concerned about their windows 'sweating' or leaking either inside or outside the home because they see moisture on the glass. In reality, that's simply not the case. While condensation may collect on the interior or exterior of energy-efficient windows, the units are really doing their job by helping serve as a barrier in the home.

Windows do not cause condensation -- they simply prevent the moisture in the home from escaping to the outside.

If the inside glass surface on double- or triple-glazed windows show excessive moisture, you can be reasonably sure that the moisture is also collecting on your walls and ceilings. This means you should take steps to reduce the humidity level in your home by using exhaust fans and dehumidifiers.

### Where Does Condensation Come From?

You'd be surprised how much water vapor homeowners create themselves on a daily basis. A family of four can add a half pint of water vapor every hour to the home just through normal breathing and perspiration. And, if you take a five minute shower, you produce another half pint of water vapor. Even the simple act of cooking dinner on a gas stove can produce two and a half pints of water vapor.

Invisible water vapor is everywhere in the home. The key is for homeowners to monitor the levels of moisture in their

homes and then take steps to manage the humidity levels.

### What Can a Homeowner Do to Help Reduce Condensation?

Water vapor is part of our lives and our homes. To help control the amount of condensation in the home, experts recommend the following tips:

- \* Use kitchen and bathroom exhaust fans.
- \* If you have a humidifier, set it to the correct outside temperature.
- \* If your home is overly humid, or if you have a damp basement, use a dehumidifier.
- \* Properly vent clothes dryers, gas appliances and stoves.
- \* Open a window in the bathroom.
- \* Make sure your attic, basement and crawl spaces are well ventilated and free from obstructions.
- \* Store firewood outside.

Freshly-cut wood can consist of

up to 45 percent water, which adds water vapor to the home. Even well-seasoned firewood generally has a 20 to 25 percent moisture content.

\* Open curtains and blinds to allow more air circulation around your windows.

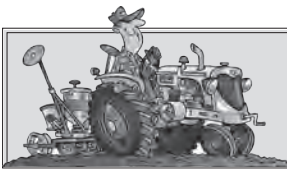
### Worrisome Windows

Homeowners with the most cause for concern are those with older, less efficient windows.

Windows are just like any other major part of the home, they wear out over time and need to be replaced. If your windows have air leaks, don't close properly, or are failing to act as a solid barrier to the environment, then it's time to consider replacing them with energy-efficient windows.

Know the difference between condensation on the glass and between the glass panes of the window.

If you are seeing moisture, fogging or cloudiness between the panes of glass in your window, this is a strong indication that the seal of your window has failed and it's time to replace your window. In operable window units, a failed seal can often be corrected by simply replacing the sash. However, seal failure reduces energy efficiency and the unit will not work as effectively to help you keep energy bills low and enjoy comfortable living in your home. While condensation on the interior or exterior of the glass is manageable, moisture between the glass needs swift attention by homeowners.



## Model D John Deeres...and making hay?

A fellow I know is restoring a model D John Deere. He keeps his friends updated on Facebook. It is fun to see the progress! It reminded me of a couple of D John Deere stories and memories I have.....First of all I have never owned a model D John Deere tractor, in fact I don't believe I've ever driven one, but I grew up hearing stories about a couple of them. You see my dad changed from a city boy to a farm boy in 1946. When they moved to the farm an F-20 Farmall, with steel on the back and rubber on the front came with the place. After a while grandpa "upgraded to a 1925(or 1926) D John Deere with a spoked flywheel and steel wheels. Man I wish I could have seen that D! At the time they lived in Clearbrook, MN, on the Sheep Ranch. After a while they upgraded again and traded the Spoker D for a newer 1936 model D on rubber. They got the D from George Felch, a blacksmith from Shevlin. It had come from the John and Olaf Hayes farm south of Bagley. When they moved to Oklee in 1952 the D came with them. A lot of farm work was done with that D until it was traded for a Case baler and a new disc at Bagley Implement.

A few years back I was talking with my neighbor, Arnold Person, who also had a model D John Deere. He told me an interesting story about making hay with that D John Deere. You see my grandpa had a few hundred sheep and Arnold came up to help my grandpa with some haying. They kind of haying they were doing was making round bales with an Allis Chalmers Roto-Baler. Arnold had the model D hooked up to the Roto-Baler. Arnold told me he baler 10,000 of those Allis roto-baled for my grandfather. Now those Roto-balers were best with a tractor having live PTO,

or the hand clutch on the Allis Chalmers WD series, which disengaged the transmission while still allowing the PTO to turn. This was important as the when a bale was made you needed to stop your forward motion, tie and eject the bale, then begin moving again and start a new bale. Now the model D John Deere did NOT have live PTO. In order to make a bale with a D John Deere you would have to pull the clutch, put the tractor in neutral, then reengage the clutch to tie and eject the bale, then pull the clutch and put the tractor back in gear, and then engage the clutch to start moving and start the new bale. So with a model D John Deere on the front of a Roto-baler, you would have to engage and disengage the clutch at least 3 times for every bale. So back to my neighbor Arnold baling for my grandfather, that would have meant clutching that D 30,000 times to make those 10,000 bales! Watching my friends pictures and videos of restoring a D John Deere sure make me want to have one. But, I don't want to hook it to a

Roto-baler and head to the field! My arm gets sore just thinking about it!!

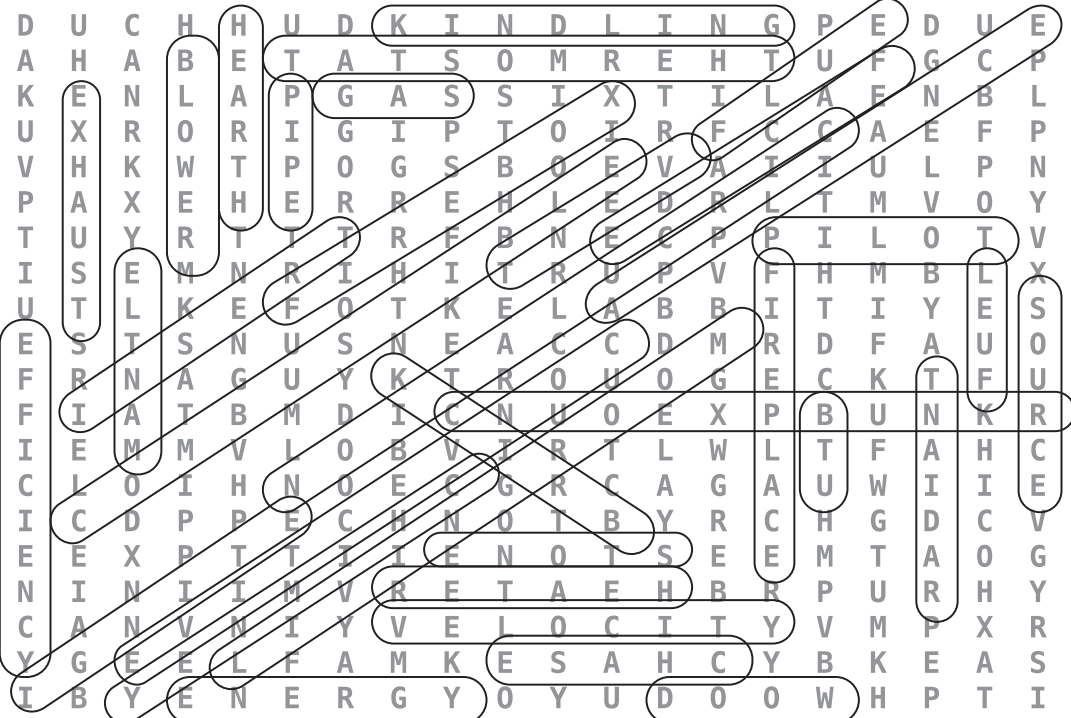

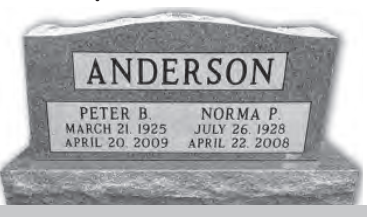

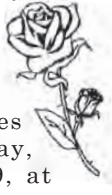

Separating the facts and fiction surrounding organ donation might compel more people to sign up as donors, saving untold numbers of lives as a result. • People with medical conditions can still be organ donors. Many people mistakenly assume that an existing medical condition precludes them from being organ donors. However, the DHHS notes that very few medical conditions would prevent people from becoming organ donors. Such conditions include HIV and active cancer. Transplant teams determine at the time of death if a donation is possible, so even prospective donors who have doubts can still sign up. • There is no age limit for organ donors. The health and condition of the organs, and not their age, is what matters. In fact, the DHHS notes that the oldest donor in the United States was 93 at the time of donation. • Religions do not prohibit organ donation. The DHHS notes that most major religion support organ donation, considering it a final act of love and generosity. Prospective donors who are uncertain if their religion supports organ donation can visit <https://www.organdonor.gov/about/donors/religion.html> for more information. • Celebrity status, race or financial well-being do not dictate who receives organs. In the United States, a nationwide computer system matches donated organs to recipients. Blood type, geographic location and time on the waiting list are just some of the factors used to match donated organs to recipients. Race, celebrity status or financial well-being are never considered. • Medical personnel will try to save organ donors' lives. Some people fear that signing up as a donor might compel medical personnel to abandon lifesaving methods if they become ill or injured. But that's not the case. 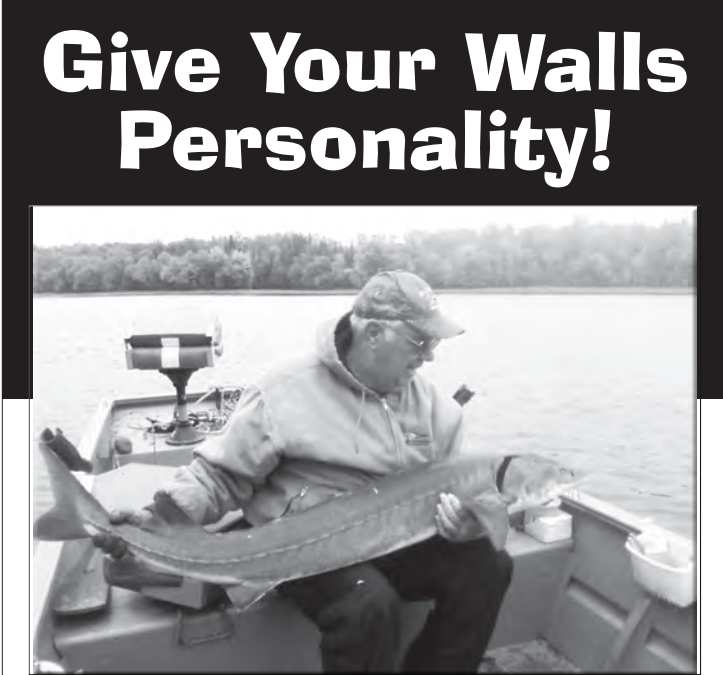
