## Statement from Rep. Steve Green re: PUC Line 3 vote

ST. PAUL – State Rep. Steve Green, R-Fosston, issued the following statement regarding today's vote by the Public Utilities Commission to deny the Gov. Tim Walz administration's petition to reconsider the certificate of need for the Line 3 replacement pipeline. This is the third unanimous vote the PUC has taken to uphold the certificate of need decision. Walz must now decide whether he will appeal and continue the state's legal efforts to challenge the Line 3 replacement project.

"The governor has been handed a golden opportunity to redeem himself after making the mistake of throwing this

project back in court during his first month or so in office," Green said. "It is time for him to put pride aside, stop siding with Twin Cities environmentalists and accept this unanimous decision put forward by his own commission so Line 3 replacement can move forward after more than four years of heavy scrutiny. Many good jobs, millions of dollars in property tax revenue and improved environmental protection are all at stake. Dragging this issue back to the courts at this point would be nothing more than partisan gamesmanship and a waste of tax dollars."

## Jobs for Minnesotans Statement on the Upholding of the Line 3 Replacement Project Certificate of Need

St. Paul, Minn. (March 26, 2019) – Jobs for Minnesotans today released the following statement in response to the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission decision not to reconsider, but uphold the Line 3 Replacement Project's Certificate of Need today:

"Jobs for Minnesotans firmly stands behind the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission's (MPUC) decision today to uphold the approval of the Line 3 Replacement Project Certificate of Need following the reconsideration hearing today. Time after time, the project has been deemed necessary by the MPUC in the best interest of the state. Today, the MPUC commissioners understood the sense of urgency to replace this line as much as when the Certificate of Need was first approved back in June 2018 and re-confirmed again in November 2018. We commend the MPUC's diligence

in upholding the thorough regulatory review process and rule of law.

"The Line 3 project is a critical \$2.6 billion dollar private investment in Minnesota's energy infrastructure, replacing an aging pipeline on which the state relies for energy security

and economic competitiveness. The project will provide quality jobs to more than 6,500 Minnesota workers during the course of the project, including 2,100 family-sustaining construction jobs. And, bring Minnesota tradespeople back home to work.

## Legislation passed preventing the use of taxpayer dollars for Governor Walz's appeal of Enbridge Line 3

(St. Paul, MN) The Minnesota Senate passed legislation on Thursday that will protect Minnesota taxpayers from paying for the Governor's appeal of the Public Utilities Commission order issuing a Certificate of Need for Enbridge Line 3. The bill, authored by Senator Paul Utke (R-Park Rapids), comes just over a month after Governor Walz and the Department of Commerce announced that

they would renew an appeal of the Certificate of Need for the pipeline replacement project planned for Northern Minnesota.

"This is a new low in our state government," said Senator Utke. "We have one department suing another over a politicized issue that's only outcome will be the delay of a critical infrastructure project and the waste of taxpayer dollars. This is not

how a governor's administration should be run and is a blatant misuse of Minnesota's taxpayer dollars."

"This continued stonewalling is unacceptable. Enbridge's project has been extensively vetted and has received unanimous approval from the PUC. On top of that, it has received significant support throughout Northern Minnesota with most local elected officials and land-

owners asking for it. It's time for this administration to end the political posturing so that Minnesota can move on and get this project completed for the benefit and safety of all our state's residents."

Earlier this month Enbridge announced that it would delay its construction timeline on the project due to slower-than-expected permitting in Minnesota. Instead of being operational in

2019, Enbridge has said that the pipeline would be up and running in late 2020.

"This whole issue is about the replacement of an aging pipeline that needs to be replaced," continued Senator Utke. "For the safety of our communities and state it is time to let this company replace this pipeline and remove the considerable number of oil cars rolling down the tracks every day."

## Jobs for Minnesotans Celebrates Final Federal Permit Issued for PolyMet NorthMet Project

St. Paul, Minn. (March 22, 2019) – Jobs for Minnesotans today released the following statement following the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers issuance of the last remaining major permit for the PolyMet NorthMet Project:

"Jobs for Minnesotans celebrates the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) decision today to issue the Section 404 wetlands permit, which is the final federal permit needed for the PolyMet NorthMet Project. This USACE action marks a major achievement for a new era of mining in Minnesota – allowing the first non-ferrous copper, nickel, precious metals mining project in the state to be built.

"Jobs for Minnesotans commends the USACE, along with all involved state and federal regulatory agencies, for its rigorous process and thorough review of the NorthMet Project over the last decade. The project and its supporters can now put into action what we've been saying all along – that it's possible to mine for these important metals while also protecting the environment.

"PolyMet will bring approximately 360 well-paying and family-sustaining jobs to north-eastern Minnesota communities, re-energizing the region's supplier and professional service network and assure long-term employment for skilled tradespeople. 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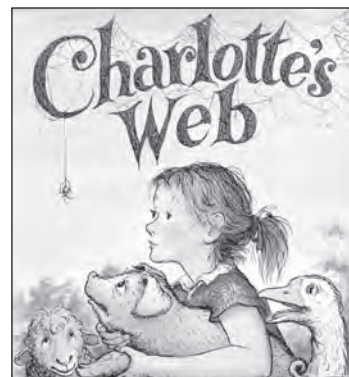
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## Bagley High School Spring play production, "Charlotte's Web"

## Democrats should support Trump's Medicare rebate proposal

The Trump administration just proposed a Medicare reform that will be great for seniors' prescription drug spending.

Like every Democrat, I'm not a big fan of this administration. But this is a really good move that I hope my friends in Congress will support. It could save seniors more than \$50 billion at the pharmacy counter over the next decade.

The proposed rule would affect the almost 45 million Americans who rely on the "Part D" Medicare benefit for prescription drugs. Part D plans are subsidized and regulated by the federal government but sold by private insurers. Each plan covers different treatments -- and premiums, co-pays, and co-insurance vary.

Most insurance companies hire pharmacy benefit managers, or PBMs, to administer their drug plans. PBMs thus have great power to decide which drugs are available under each plan. They use that power to negotiate steep discounts.

The problem with this sys-

tem is that the discounts and rebates PBMs secure -- which amount to about \$150 billion a year -- are seldom passed on to consumers at the pharmacy counter.

That drives up pharmacy costs for customers. Say your medication has a list price of \$200. The PBM might negotiate a rebate that brings the cost of that drug down to \$80. But since they don't disclose that massive discount, a patient's co-pay is pegged to the full list price of the medicine. So if a patient has a 25 percent co-pay, he would spend \$50 at the pharmacy. If insurance plans instead disclosed the actual, true cost of the prescription drug, the patient would only spend \$20.

The administration's proposed rule would classify most discounts and rebates as illegal kickbacks unless insurers and PBMs share the savings with patients.

My party has a long history of standing up to corporate interests in defense of the poor, sick, and elderly. So I'm surprised and saddened that some

of my fellow Democrats have reflexively dismissed the proposed rule just because it came from the Trump administration.

Seniors' drug spending would plummet under the proposed rule. If 90 percent of discounts and rebates were passed on, Part D beneficiaries would save \$53 billion over the next decade.

By reducing co-pays and co-insurance, the rule would make it easier for Medicare enrollees to fill prescriptions. When folks take their drugs, they're much more likely to stay healthy and avoid costly hospitalizations. Over the next decade, the rule could reduce total healthcare spending on diabetes patients alone by \$20 billion.

My fellow Democrats don't agree with the Trump administration on much. But in this case, I hope it's different. This reform will greatly benefit Medicare enrollees, particularly the sickest who rely on multiple medications to stay healthy.

## Ask a Trooper

**Q u e s - t i o n :** I was wondering what to do at a pedestrian flashing crosswalk lights. Am I to wait till the lights stop flashing and the crosswalk is clear of pedestrians or can I go forward when it is safe to?

**A n s w e r :** Most pedestrian flashing lights are set up at a crosswalk. Reminder that if there is a pedestrian that is curbside and is waiting to cross in a crosswalk, motorists must yield the right of way and stop for them. There are some crosswalks that have activation systems where a pedestrian can push a button to activate the flashing amber pedestrian light, while others have a flashing light that flashes even if there are no pedestrians.

If you are driving and approach a flashing amber pedestrian light and you see no one in the crosswalk or anyone waiting to cross, you can proceed through the crosswalk and intersection.

Vehicles stopped for pedestrians can proceed once the pedestrian has completely crossed the lane in front of the stopped vehicle.

Each year in Minnesota, ap-

proximately 39 pedestrians and 7 bicyclists are killed as a result of collisions with motor vehicles. Preliminary figures currently show 14 pedestrians were killed compared to 8 this same time last year in Minnesota.

As a group, pedestrians and bicyclists comprise nearly 12 percent of all traffic fatalities each year — 69 percent of these fatal crashes occur in urban areas.

35 percent of pedestrians and 18 percent of bicyclists killed had consumed alcohol.

19 percent of pedestrians killed were crossing improperly.

- Drivers must stop for crossing pedestrians at marked crosswalks and at all intersections without crosswalks or stop lights.
- Pedestrians must obey traffic-control signals at all intersections that have them.
- Pedestrians must obey pedestrian control signals.
- Pedestrians must not enter a crosswalk if a vehicle is approaching and it is impossible for the driver to stop. There is no defined distance that a pedestrian must abide by before entering the crosswalk; use common sense.
- When a vehicle is stopped at an intersection to allow pe-

destrians to cross the roadway, drivers of other vehicles approaching from the rear must not pass the stopped vehicle.

- Failure to obey the law is a misdemeanor. A second violation within one year is a gross misdemeanor.

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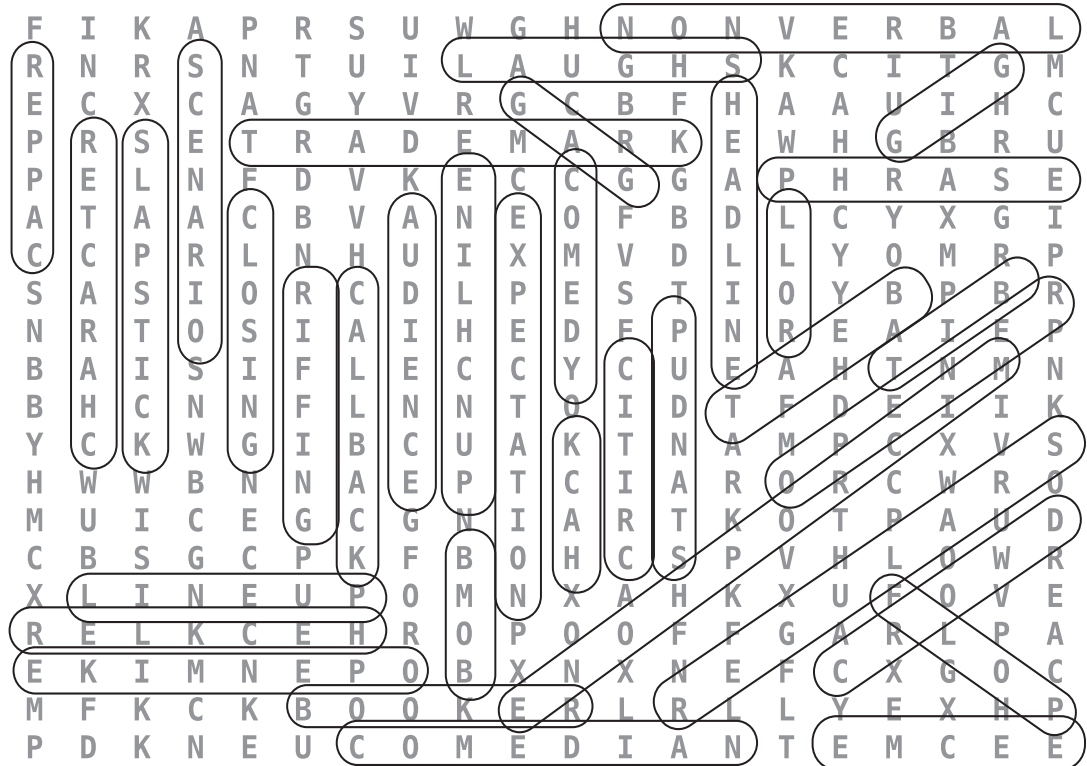

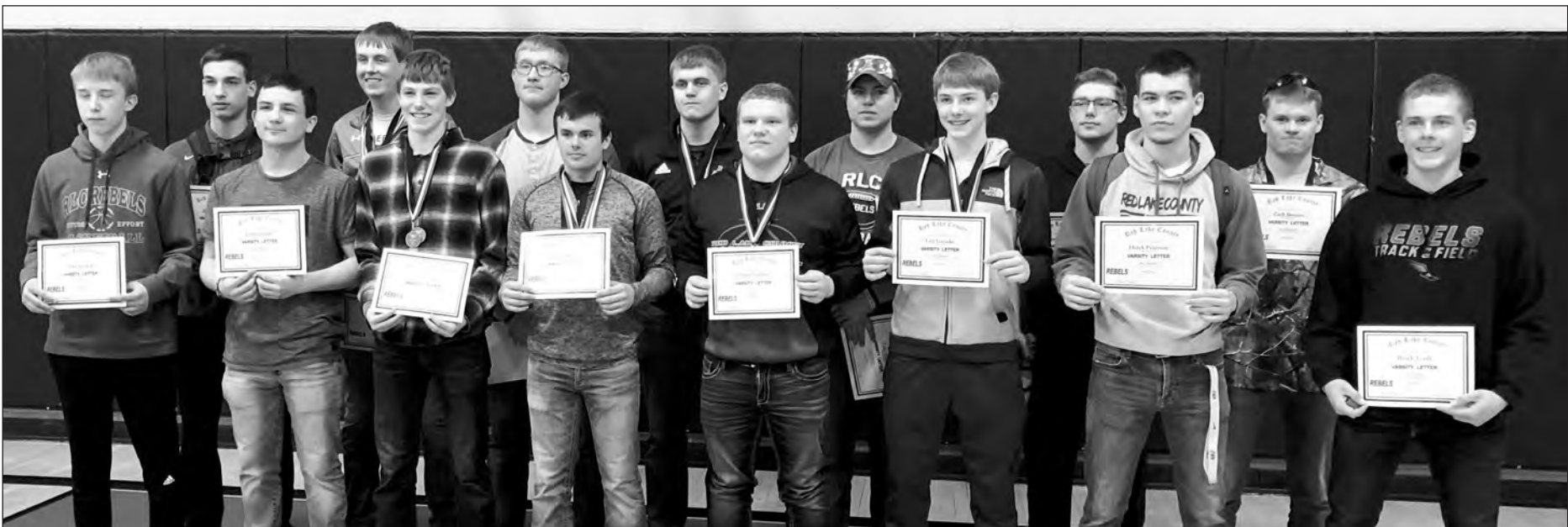

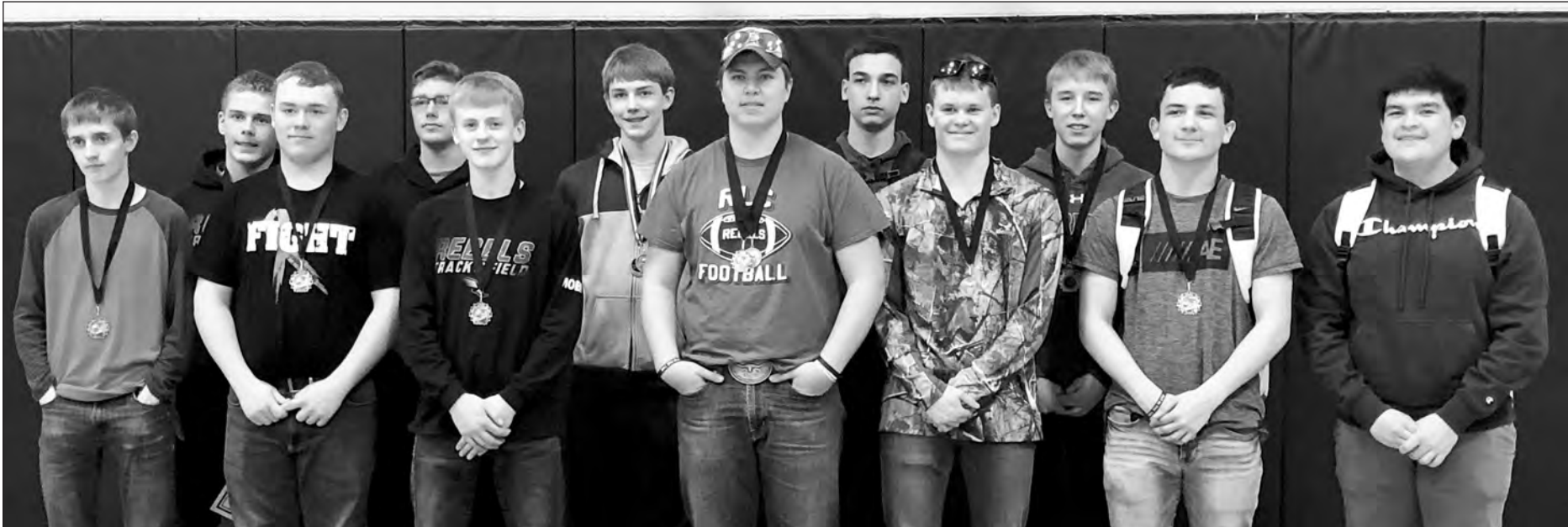
