“Not everyone needs a 4 year university degree or wants \$100,000 in student loan debt to pursue their dreams and provide a career for themselves and a comfortable livelihood for their families,” states Fully Charged Foundation Executive Director Patrick Hackley. “We are some 390,000 truck drivers short in the United States, with many soon wanting to retire. The same can be said for electricians, construction workers, plumbers and many other tradespeople. As the old country song goes, who’s going to fill their shoes?” “We feel very blessed to have the opportunity to secure an entertainer the caliber of David Lee Murphy in our small rural Minnesota community. David Lee Murphy is currently touring with Kenny Chesney on his “Song for the Saints” tour. He will play in Grygla Friday night and then be back on the road with Kenny the next night. His entire management and road team have been incredible to work with and we are so happy to host them in Grygla!”

“We will give out several

scholarships this first year. The Wendy Sandsmark Memorial Scholarship will go to a graduating senior from either Grygla or Goodridge High School. It is in memory of Wendy Sandsmark, a long time member of the Grygla community who passed away suddenly last spring.” “I didn’t know Wendy for very long, but she was the first person to welcome me to town when I moved two years ago. She had a profound impact in the short time I knew her and had a huge impact on the many friends and family who loved her. She was always wanting to help the youth in our area and we felt it only appropriate that her legacy and commitment to youth live on long after her time on earth.” Patrick states. “Our board of directors is currently fielding ideas or names for other scholarships, along with solidifying long term sponsorships from area businesses to grow our program.”

Program celebrates 35 years of leadership education

Extension recognizes leaders

The Emerging Leadership Program celebrated their 35th year by honoring Bruce and Aase Hamnes with the Friend of the Emerging Leadership Program award. Bruce was the Marshall County King Agassiz in 1976 and was the impetus for the evolution from King Agassiz to the Emerging Leadership Program. Bruce told the audience about how an idea, when nurtured, can grow into a program with 35 years of history and 1147 alumni. Bruce and Aase were thanked for their continued support of the program.

Other guests that evening were Extension Regional Directors, Lisa Loegering (Crookston) and Ben Anderson (Moorhead), Kent Olson, Extension Center for Community Vitality Associate Dean, Mary Holz-Clause, Chancellor of University of Minnesota Crookston, and Northwest Minnesota Foundation Development Officer Dawn Ganje, who each offered their comments about leadership and congratulated program participants.

The banquet program featured leadership stories by class participants, Eric Rice (Morris), Kristen Haase (Thief River Falls), and Justin Phillips (Rothsay). There was also the announcement of new Agassiz Ambassadors for 2020, Justin and Karen Phillips (Rothsay), who were selected for this honor from among other current participants in the program based on nominations from program participants and interviews with program alumni. Justin and Karen will put their leadership skills to work in public relations, recognition, and com-

munity leadership, and will work with Extension staff to develop and deliver the educational program in 2020.

The recognition banquet was the finale of the leadership program for the Class of 2019 after taking part in four training sessions since November 2018. Program seminars focused on several of the University of Minnesota Extension’s educational program components to strengthen civic leadership in the region.

The Emerging Leadership Program, a program of the University of Minnesota Extension, was created in 1985 to build skills in individuals while creating and sustaining a network of community leaders in the northwest and west central regions of Minnesota to focus on rural issues. The banquet carried on the tradition of recognizing rural leaders started by the Red River Valley Winter Shows in 1961.

The Emerging Leadership Program is led by Extension Educators Brian Fredrickson, Lisa Hinz and Jody Horntvedt, in partnership with over 1,100 alumni throughout the region. Soon those alumni will be coming together to select new participants for the program. Anishaa (Just for Fun) will make up much of the agenda when Red Lake hosts its Eighth Annual Gathering of Elders at Seven Clans Casino (Red Lake) on Wednesday and Thursday, May 1 - 2, 2019. The event will include informational booths on tribal programs and services available for elders.
An important part of the Gathering has been to provide a venue for youth and elders to interact and learn from each other. Red Lake young people will mix with their elders as volunteers, and providing information and entertainment.
The event begins with registration on Wednesday morning at 8. At 9 a.m., Spiritual Leader and Hereditary Chief Greeting Spears, Jr., will offer the invoca-

tion, followed by a flag ceremony with the drum Eyabay, and then a welcome and opening remarks by Red Lake Chairman Darrell G. Seki, Sr.
Information will be provided to elders by the various tribal program directors. Sessions on the agenda include; Red Lakes Solar and Elder housing initiatives, public safety, bingo, King & Queen selection, and a Youth Showcase featuring the Red Lake Lady Warriors.
Entertainment will include Music by "Travesty" from Turtle Mountain, a dance competition, and a special performance by nationally known comedian Marc Yaffee.

Nine Minnesota 4-H youth selected as delegates for this annual conference, April 5-11 in Washington, DC

McIntosh, MN (26/ April/2019) - On April 5-11, more than 230 youth from 46 delegations across the United States, United States territories, and Canada participated in the National 4-H Conference at the National 4-H Conference Center near Washington, DC. The conference engages youth in developing a briefing to a federal agency on an issue of interest for both the youth and the agency.

Eliza Meyer from the North Star 4-H club was one of nine Minnesota 4-H youth selected as a delegate for this year's conference. The youth engaged in three months of preparatory meetings before they departed for DC. While at the conference, each youth delegate was placed in a round table, a group of peers, that were challenged with the task of developing and delivering a briefing to a federal agency. Eliza was on the Cyber Bullying roundtable, and delivered a presentation on Cyber Bullying to Federal Trade Commission (FTC), Bureau of Consumer Protection, Division of Consumer & Business Education. Following their briefings, the delegates also had a chance to visit with Minnesota members of Congress and congressional offices. Conference activities also included an educational workshop on civility, a youth town hall, and networking activities with youth from the other 4-H programs. The delegates also had the opportunity to tour the White House, monuments and war memorials, and some museums along the National Mall.

"The National 4-H Conference provides youth with an incredible opportunity to share their perspectives with federal agencies and legislators who represent us in DC," said Jacquie Lonning, Extension 4-H Youth Development Director of Civic Engagement & Leadership. "As they develop their briefing, they also gain skills in decision making, intercultural communication, and public speaking, all important skills to prepare them to be change agents in their community."

Polk County 4-H'er Eliza Meyer stated, "I was given the wonderful opportunity to travel to Washington DC to represent MN 4-H. I will never forget the amazing experience and the wonderful people I met. As MN delegates, we got to tour the White House and meet with our senators and representatives. With my group on Cyberbullying I got to work with people from all over the states and even a guy from the Northern Mariana Islands to work as a group to solve a problem and present it to people from the FTC."

garding animals hanging out a driver's side window, paws on the steering wheel and animals jumping from the front seat to the backseat? I see this so often and most of the time it is elderly people, which I am. Turning the radio on and off is one thing, but an animal moving all over the car or distracting the driver is absurd.

A n s w e r : I agree that having a pet loose in a vehicle can be very dangerous to the occupants, the pet and others that are sharing the road with

this vehicle.

You are correct that there is not a law in Minnesota that directly covers this, but there is a law that covers obstructed view. The law could be applied in this situation.

Animals can be very unpredictable and having one loose in a vehicle can and has caused crashes. All it would take is for the pet to interfere with the driver's view, steering wheel, brake or accelerator to cause that vehicle to become out of control.

I investigated crashes where an unsecured pet had been thrown into other occupants in the vehicle, causing unnecessary injuries to the people. If you have a pet in your lap and

the airbags deploy in a crash, the pet could be thrown into you, causing serious injury or death to you and your pet.

For your pet's safety and the safety of other passengers in the vehicle, take the extra time and effort to secure your pets in a proper pet carrier.

Orange Allis Chalmers

I came across an article about the Allis Chalmers Model U tractor. Now the U was kind of a plain tractor not very advanced even for its time.

But the Model U tractor, with the help of Harvey Firestone, helped put Allis Chalmers on the map.

In 1931 Allis Chalmers acquired what they needed to be a contender in the tractor market, Rumley. Rumley was a name associated with the tractor industry. Now they could market their model U. From 1929-1931 the U was marketed under the name United. But, when the United Tractor and Farm Equipment Coop. failed Allis still had their "new" tractor, the model U. The model U sported orange paint. Most people say the orange color came from an Allis executive seeing orange poppies growing in the field while visiting California. Others say the color came from the United Company. Either way, one thing about the U, it was orange.

The model U is probably known even more for a huge innovation in technology. It was the first farm tractor equipped with pneumatic rubber tires. It was more quiet, easier riding, and capable of higher speeds. Firestone and Allis put together quite a marketing campaign. In 1933, they had race car driver, Barney Oldfield drive a

specially equipped U at speed up to 64 mph. I thought this was amazing but, apparently a fellow named Ab Jenkins also raced a U Allis Chalmers on the Bonneville Salt Flats reaching a speed of 68 mph!! When asked

about his record breaking run on the model U, he replied, "It was like riding a frightened bison!"

So orange paint, rubber tires, or over 20 years of production, no doubt the U was quite a tractor!!!

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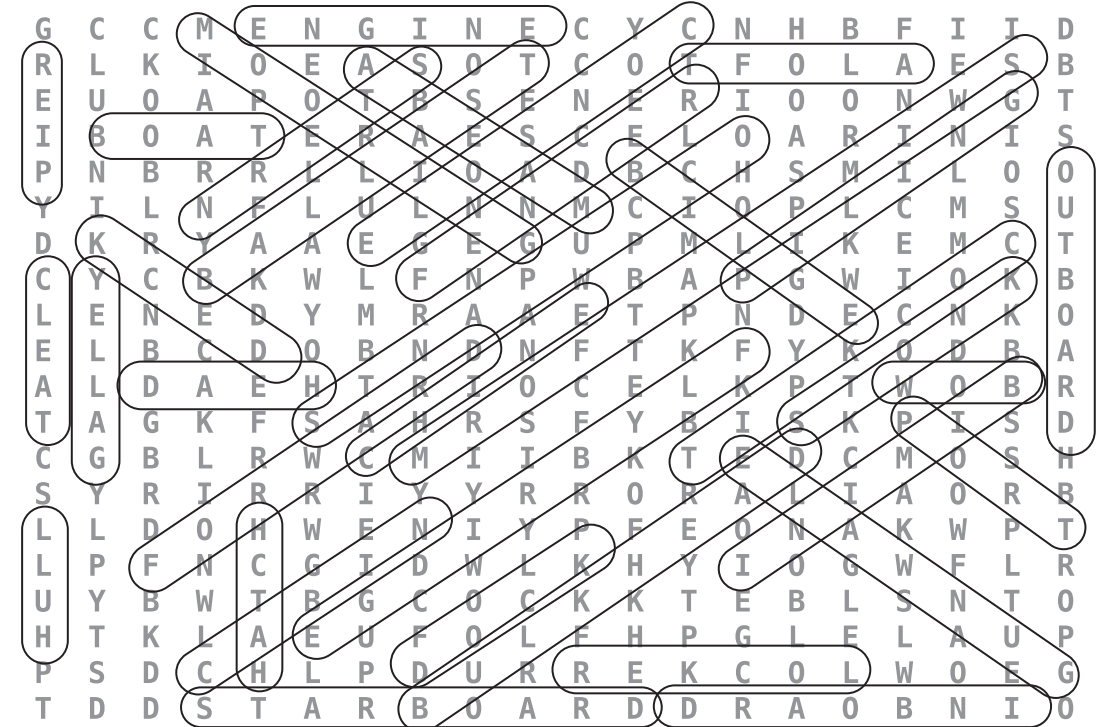

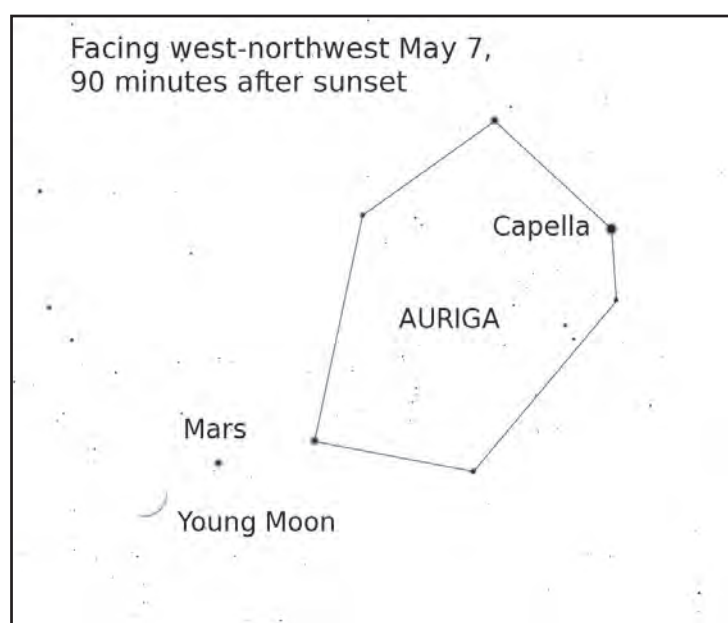
Minnesota Starwatch for May 2019

In May we start to lose our old friend Mars, which is dropping out of the evening sky after being a fixture there since last summer. The red planet has great staying power, thanks to being the speediest of the outer planets. But Earth is speedier yet, and now we're starting to round the sun, leaving Mars on the other side of it.

Mars gets a last hurrah, though, on the 7th. If you look as soon as the sky gets dark, you'll see a young crescent moon low in the west, just to the lower left of Mars. These two rocky bodies, plus two stars, form a nearly straight line that night. Below and east of the moon is Betelgeuse, in Orion, and high above and west of Mars is bright, multicolored Capella, in Auriga, the charioteer.

Taking center stage in the south now is Virgo, a large but dim constellation with only one bright star: Spica. If you're unsure which star it is, a waxing moon will be above it on the 15th. Slightly below and west of the star is Corvus, the crow, a small constellation resembling a rather bent-out-of-shape square. High to the upper left of



Spica, brilliant Arcturus shines from its kite-shaped constellation, Bootes the herdsman.

Jupiter, a morning planet since December, starts rising before midnight this month. It travels the sky between Antares, the red heart of Scorpius, to the west, and the Teapot of Sagittarius to the southeast. Just east of the Teapot, Saturn brings up the rear. Above Sat-

urn hangs the delicate, curved Teaspoon of stars.

The Eta Aquarid meteor shower is predicted to peak in the predawn hours of the 5th and/or 6th. This shower may deliver as many as 40 meteors per hour if skies are quite dark. Look to the southeast, toward the constellation Aquarius, to see remnants of Comet Halley burning up in Earth's atmo-

sphere.

May's full moon arrives on the 18th at 4:11 p.m.; look for it to rise just before sunset.

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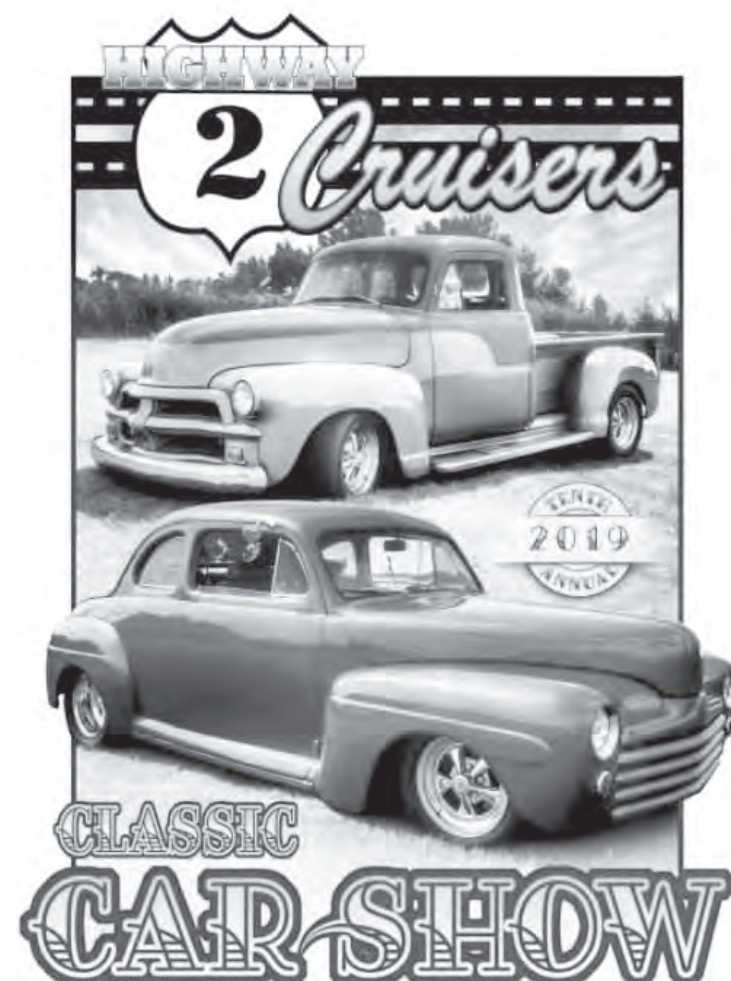
