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Dusty Paquin, Oklee native, aims to be youngest to play every golf course in state

Two parties eager for the full-fledged arrival of spring in Minnesota:

- 1) Lawn services.
 - 2) Dusty Paquin.
- The former? Well, duh. The latter?

"I got the itch now," Paquin, an ultra-avid golfer from Waverly, Minn., said by phone last week. He added the qualifier "now" only because he was briefly golfed out in January after playing seven days in a row in Arizona.

Paquin said he was going to take a pass on playing golf this week, even as the state's courses slowly began to open. Crosswoods in Crosslake was among those, and there is significance in that, because it has nine holes that Paquin has set neither foot nor bogey upon. But many of the state's courses remained mired in the slop of the spring thaw, and Paquin, an insurance adjuster, had work this week and family commitments over the weekend.

After that, watch out.

Paquin spends a lot of time on the golf course. He estimates that in 2018, he played 30 to 40 Minnesota courses for the first time. That is hardly unprecedented, but added on to his previous year's total, he is up to 411 push-pins on the map he keeps at home — one for every Minnesota golf course played.

That total isn't unprecedented, either. At least two men have played every course in the state: Art Hennington of Elk River completed the feat of prodigiousness or preposterousness (depends on your point of view) in 2014, and Dick Montroy of Maple Grove did it last September.

Paquin, at age 41, aims to become the youngest to have completed the grand tour. His mission is to do so by age 50.

Why? Basically, just because. Isn't that reason enough?

"Me being a 13 handicap," Paquin says, "I'm not winning tournaments or turning pro anytime soon. It's more just the challenge."

Paquin isn't sure which Minnesota golf course he will play first in 2019. He says it's "weather-dependent." He must tackle pockets of unplayed public courses in southwestern Minnesota, southeastern Minnesota and the Brainerd area. He hasn't played the nine-hole Northwest Angle Country Club at the state's northernmost point, at which sand greens and flannel shirts commingle, or many of the more historic and well-heeled private clubs around the Twin Cities area, which Paquin acknowledges will present a challenge to score playing privileges.

Still, Paquin counts fewer than 100 courses on his to-do list. (The golfers who have attempted or are attempting this feat all operate under different parameters. The Minnesota Golf Association counts 447 clubs as member facilities; there are other Minnesota clubs that don't belong to the MGA. Also,

clubs that since have folded are to be considered. Paquin lists his magic number as 507, and he is operating under the requirement that he play every hole at every club, including executive and par-3 layouts.)

Paquin has no formal plan of attack for reaching his 96 unplayed courses. "I know where I need to go," he says, "so if I just happen to be going up in that direction ..."

Paquin played only a handful of golf courses before graduating from Oklee High School in 1996. He bought his first membership at what is now Oak Lake Golf Course in Erskine, then started playing frequently while he was a student at Bemidji State University. "I ended up getting really hooked there," he says, "and ended up scheduling more night classes so I could golf in the afternoon."

He bought a promotional card that afforded easier and cheaper access to courses statewide, which he used in the Bemidji area and then upon moving to Rochester in 2003.

At that point, the let's-golf-em-all bug chomped.

"After awhile," Paquin said, "I wondered how many (courses) there are. I found a website, started checking them off and said, 'This is kind of neat,' and started playing courses all over."

The year 2005 "is when I started keeping track, and then maybe four to five years later, then I'm like, I was (thinking), well, I think I could play all of them, at least the public courses. I started making journeys, I'd have a day off, I'd drive two hours away to go play golf."

Traveling and golfing helps sate another of Paquin's interests: collecting. He says he has kept a scorecard from every round of golf he has played since 1997. He collects logo golf balls, where available, from every course he has played and has them displayed at his home.

"It's snowballed; it's definitely snowballed," Paquin says of his avocation, "and I'm very stubborn, so if I put my mind to things. ... If it's something pos-

sible, I'm going to try it."

CHARTING THE COURSES

Some of Dusty Paquin's favorites and recollections from having played 411 Minnesota golf courses:

Favorite courses: Superior National in Lutsen, Eagle Creek in Willmar, Mississippi National in Red Wing. "I grew up in northwestern Minnesota, where it's very flat, so anything with elevation is extra points in my book."

Most underrated courses: Oak Knoll in Red Lake Falls, Farmers Golf & Health Club in Sanborn, Wedgewood Cove in Albert Lea

Added attraction: "Any Joel Goldstrand-designed course. ... I like the unique hole designs."

In St. Paul: Paquin mentions Highland National, with the Snoopy-shaped bunker on the 15th hole, a tribute to St. Paul native and late cartoonist Charles Schulz, and Keller Golf Club and its historic clubhouse iterations.

"Played in all weather conditions. With snowbanks in fairways and ponds frozen over with golf balls on top of the ice. Women's underwear lying near a tree line on the course near Red Wing. Heard there was a large tournament the day before. I'm guessing cocktails were involved?"

Dusty is the son of Julie & Mike Paquin, Oklee, MN.

following the argument, the judges said they were impressed by both competitors. Both knew their facts well, and the final result of the case could have gone either way. Yakimchuck handled case situations well by disagreeing to certain statements and restating them, and Boomgaarden was skilled in presenting different cases, and weaving the law and facts into the argument.

It was a tight competition and the judges were split on who was the winner. The majority decision of the judges named Boomgaarden the 1L champion. The best oralist award and runner-up award went to Yakimchuck. The two other semifinalists, Tatiana Hamilton and Scott Fahrendorf, were also recognized for their success.

“The Stavig Letters” will be performed for Norwegian Heritage week

“Dear unforgettable brother Knut A. Stavig . . . America is good for everyone,” wrote Lars Stavig in 1881 from Minnesota to his half brother in Norway. Five years earlier, in 1876, Lars, his wife Maren, and their three young sons had rowed 30 miles down a fjord on the cost of Norway to reach an ocean steamer leaving for America. Lars said goodbye to his half-brother Knut, who stayed behind in Romsdal Norway.

They would not see each other again.

Lars and Knut exchanged more than 150 letters over five decades, giving voice to the immigrant experience. Woven through the letters are the dreams and aspirations, the joys and griefs of two brothers, one who came to the prairie and one who stayed by the sea.

Both families kept their letters and these treasures finally came together in the late 20th century to provide a first-hand look at the immigrant experience.

Lars' letters from America offer a first-person perspective of the arrival of the railroads on the prairie, changes in agriculture, the advent of aviation, World War I, and the Great Depression. Knudt's letters from Norway tell of the state of the Norwegian economy, the dangers of traditional fishing practices of the period, and changes in Norwegian culture.

The rare back-and-forth record covering more than fifty years has left side-by-side portraits of the American immigrant and the life he left behind in the old country. “This is the most unique collection in Norway,” says scholar Rasmus Sunde about the Stavig letters. “We have lots of letters from America to Norway, but we have very few from both sides of the Atlantic, and only for a few years.”

The correspondence was uncovered by Lars's grandson, Harold Torness, who heard about the letters while visiting relatives in Norway, and then discovered the

other half stored in a garage in California. After having them translated (all were written in Norwegian), Torness believed he had something special, something that could resonate with other people. And it did.

What started as just one family's story has grown into a readers' theater performed over fifty times in three states and a documentary (both supported by the South Dakota Humanities Council), a house museum, a book in Norwegian, and another from the South Dakota State Historical Society Press. South Dakota Public Broadcasting Television's production of “The Stavig Letters” earned an Emmy® Award in 2011 for their Historical Documentary.

Norwegian Heritage Week in Thief River Falls is proud to have “The Stavig Letters” readers' theater performed by great-granddaughter Jane Torness Rasmussen as narrator, her husband John as Knut, and Curtis Dahl as Lars, at the NCTC Auditorium in Thief River Falls on Tuesday, May 14, at 7:00 p.m. Freewill admission.

Lars settled in South Dakota. His homestead grew, as did his family, and he listed his acquisitions proudly to his brother, reporting that he had thirty cows, fourteen horses, and twenty-six chickens at one point. Knut asked, “What use is the milk you get from so many cows?”

Lars often had advice for his brother, telling him to come to America or to settle down. “Don't let the devil rule over you. Find yourself a woman, Knut Stavig,” he wrote. Knut offered his own wisdom: “Don't let the Savior's blood run in vain for us,” he urged his brother, frequently concerned for Lars's soul.

The possibilities and progress of farming in America thrilled Lars. When new threshing machines came into use, he told Knut that threshing time was “like a big wedding except we don't use whiskey.” Lars lived to see electricity, indoor plumbing, and cars become standard ame-

nities, and to see world politics hit the prairie. “What sad times we are living in,” he wrote in 1917. “A large company of soldiers left from our town. They are our young sons. We follow them to the train as if we are a funeral procession. Then we old people are left behind.”

Lars's experience makes for a classic immigrant story. He establishes a successful farm, his children go off and become educated and then find spouses and their own successes: The three oldest sons come to own the largest general store in the upper Midwest. The American Stavigs are so affluent they send money to help their Norwegian relative during hard times following Knut's wife's death.

America is good to Lars, until 1908 when his own wife dies. He moves into his son's house in town, and there becomes despondent and lonely. “Everything is going well, and then Lars suffers from being human,” says Wayne Knutson, a retired professor of English and theater at the University of South Dakota, who crafted the readers' theater adaptation. Knutson, culling through the letters, settled ground rules to ensure authenticity, but allowing himself the freedom to skip around chronologically and pick and choose the parts of the letters that worked best dramatically.

“The dramatic issue,” says Knutson, “is that suddenly, after all the successes and celebration of being in this country, he finds himself over sixty, his wife has died, the children have all left, and he's alone. Where he loved his language, the Norwegian language, the grandchildren are no longer speaking it. An alienation sets in.” Lars, who had once announced, “I am now a stranger to all things at home in Norway,” soon finds himself writing, “Memories of my childhood and youth will follow me to the grave.”

In our mind's eye, we can see the older Lars, living in a room of his son Peter's house, looking

out an ice-encrusted window onto the prairie. If you squint, you're not sure if it is grass or ocean swells undulating in the wind. Perhaps Lars was reminded of the similarity when he wrote, “I don't believe anyone can understand me. The world reminds me of a frothing sea, which can turn us in any direction.”

Lars died in 1933, at the age of ninety; Knut lived until he was ninety-nine, passing away in 1950. Because of their letters, their descendants—such as Lars's grandson who portrays him in the film and great-granddaughter Jane Rasmussen, who plays the narrator on stage—have an insight into the lives of

these men and their universal stories. When Knutson played Lars on stage for many years, he would ask audiences afterward to look for their own families' letters, and to “put something to paper. There is nothing quite so lasting as these old letters. We owe it to the next generation.”

Ask a Trooper

Question: Can you please explain the new hands free cell phone law?

Answer: Under the law, you may not hold your phone in your hand and cannot use it at any time for video calling, video live-streaming, Snapchat, gaming, looking at video or photos stored on the phone, using non-navigation apps, reading texts and scrolling or typing on the phone.

The new law does allow a driver to use their cell phone to make calls, text, listen to music or podcasts and get directions, but only by voice commands or

single-touch activation without holding the phone.

You are allowed to hold and use your phone to obtain emergency assistance or if there is an immediate threat to life and safety. Using a phone when in an authorized emergency vehicle while performing official duties is also allowed.

Traditional GPS units and other systems that can be used for navigation are exempt from the hands-free law. In-car screens and systems are also exempt. In both cases, most of these systems lock when the vehicle is moving.

The new hands-free bill was signed by Gov. Tim Walz on April 12, and goes into effect

on Aug. 1.

But don't wait until Aug 1. Now is the time to get into the habit of driving hands-free or purchasing a hands-free device.

This weekend we traveled to Milwaukee, WI, to celebrate a family wedding. We took a different route than usual and came by a sign that said APPLETON. We did not go into the city of Appleton, but as we passed by that road sign it made me think of a tractor I saw at a show last summer. The tractor I came across last summer was a tractor I had personally never seen before, an Eagle 6B. They sure look like they were a well made tractor.

The Eagle Manufacturing Co. was incorporated in 1888, with under a dozen employees. The company's purpose was to buy, sell, and repair farm equipment.

In 1899, they entered into manufacturing gasoline engines. By 1908 they were producing a pretty full line of farm equipment. WWI put a strain on the company and in the 20's they put most of their effort in tractor production. They started with a two cylinder design but in 1930, Eagle went to a 6 cylinder engine. (Sounds like John Deere!)

In 1932, they produced the Model 6A, a standard tread tractor with the "new" 6 cylinder engine. The 6B came out in 1936. This was a row crop tractor. A year later the 6C came out, with a standard tread

design and improvements that made it quite a handy tractor. The depression, lower sales, and higher costs all contributed to the end of the Eagle Manufacturing Co. after 50 years in

business!!

Whenever I hear a story like this I wish I could have seen an new Eagle tractor in 1938! But, I guess I'm glad I got to see one last summer!!

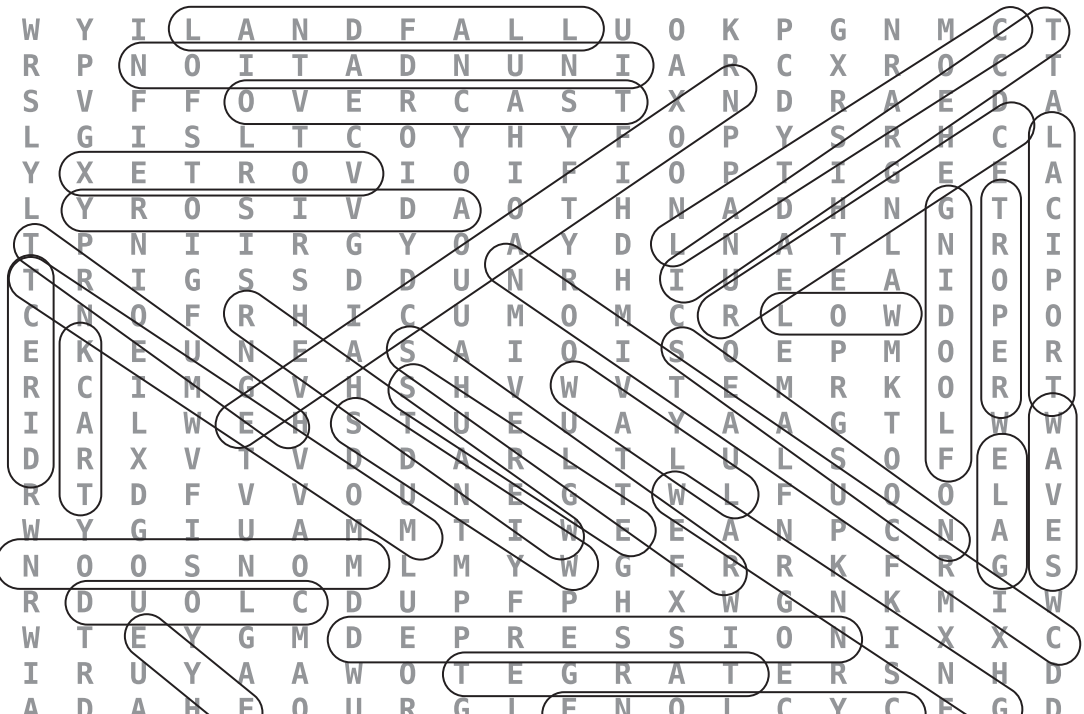

Dr. Odd Lovoll book signing and talk on his memoirs

Odd S. Lovoll has spent his career chronicling the stories of Norwegian immigrants to the United States and Canada. He, too, was an immigrant at a young age, and like many international migrants returned to his homeland for a period during his young adult life before settling permanently in the United States. This personal connection has long informed his work, and now he turns his academic's eye to his own story.

In his book talk based on his memoirs, Two Homelands, Lovoll narrates the full arc of his life, beginning with memories of hardship during World War II, while his father was separated from the family, followed later by the devastating loss of his older brother in a sailing accident. He considers language and cultural barriers faced as an immigrant to the United States and then as an outsider when he returned to Norway. He traces his early years as a teacher in Norway, his marriage and family life, and on through his scholarly work and extensive career as a researcher, writer, and professor in the United States.

Through autobiographical tales interwoven with details of his research, Lovoll links his experience with that of other immigrants and points to intriguing intersections in his professional and personal lives.

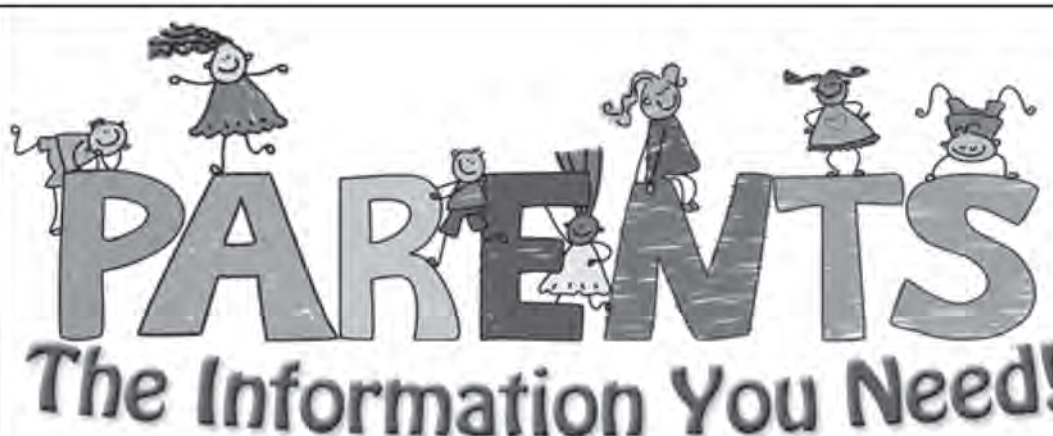

Services for Linda Nelson

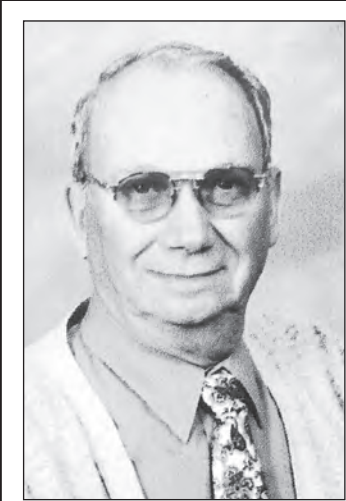
