Northland Community & Technical College Announces 2019 Thief River Falls Student of the Year

Honoree to give the student address at commencement ceremony

May 13, 2019 – Northland is proud to announce that Thief River Falls student Josiah Dyrud has been chosen as 2019 TRF Campus Student of the Year. Dyrud is graduating with highest honors earning a diploma in Welding Manufacturing Technology and certificates in Welding Manufacturing Technology and Welding Process Technology. Dyrud already holds an Associate of Arts degree which he received from Northland last spring, graduating from college and high school in the same week.

Dyrud is the eldest of five siblings who have been members of the Thief River Falls community for about seven years. The Dyruds, however, have deep roots in the community. His father is a native of TRF. “We moved around a lot when I was growing up,” shares Dyrud, “I was lucky to live in many unique places.” Stops along this journey included Texas, Illinois, Germany, the Philippines, and even Pakistan, where his parents, Lars and Sarah, worked with an international development organization.

“When we returned to the United States, it was during the recession, jobs were hard

to come by, so my dad has encouraged me to always have a back-up plan. As an artist, employment can be hit or miss,” explains Dyrud, “Because of that, I decided to pursue welding to guarantee myself a paycheck.”

An accomplished artist, Dyrud won a Minnesota State High School League Spotlight on the Arts award in northwest Minnesota for digital art in 2017. Dyrud continued developing his artistic abilities at Northland taking art classes while pursuing his A.A. degree last year.

Welding, however, was completely foreign to Dyrud. There was a steep learning curve. “There were subtleties that I wasn’t expecting to deal with—percentages of gasses, metric measurements, and conversions. These were all things I needed to learn,” expresses Dyrud, “On top of that, it takes a lot of practice to become a good welder.” Dyrud hopes to one day be able to combine welding and art.

“Josiah showed tremendous work ethic and initiative in the time that I was able to work with him this year,” shared Northland welding instructor Joel Ziegler. “He came into the

welding program not knowing a lot about the process, but through hard work and determination, he not only received his degrees from the college, but he also earned industry-recognized certifications that he will be able to utilize. I have no doubt that whatever Josiah decides to take on next, he will be successful.”

Ministry is another passion of Dyrud’s. He is a volunteer group leader working weekly with 6th - 12th graders at the Elevate Youth Center in Thief River Falls. “Ministry is very important to me. It is something my entire family shares and I plan to carry on with it throughout my life,” expresses Dyrud. In addition to art and ministry, Dyrud plays guitar, sings, and volunteers his time at his church aiding the music and production team.

Dyrud will attend the Bethel School of Supernatural Ministry in Redding, California this fall to further his ministry education. When asked where he sees himself in five years, Dyrud responded, “I see myself still continuing my education. I know I’ll be a life-long learner.”

The 14th Annual Red Lake Nation Youth Leadership Conference will be held Wednesday thru Friday, May 28 - 31, 2019, at Red Lake High School in Red Lake Minnesota. The conference theme this year is “Indigenous Power.”

The conference will feature national and local presenters and performers, youth activities and banquet. Wednesday, Day One, will not begin until evening at 6 pm at the Red Lake Nation College and feature a fashion show and entertainment.

Workshops and presenta-

tions will be held from 8:30 AM to 3:00 PM on Thursday and Friday. As usual, several workshops will occur simultaneously. Topics will include: powwow Zumba, Indigenous hip-hop, natural skin care products, self-care, healing through culture, hand drum making, moccasin making, moccasin game teachings, keeping tobacco sacred, and story of hoop dancing.

In addition to the workshops, a banquet will be held Thursday evening at Red Lake Nation College at 6 p.m., followed by entertainment by Supaman and a performance by the Sampson Brothers (See attached agenda)

The impetus for the Youth

Leadership Conference occurred after the formation of the Red Lake Nation Youth Council in 2006, after the Red Lake tragedy. The group began looking for ways to teach leadership skills, and to celebrate the accomplishments of the Nation’s youth academically and in other ways. Topics and organization are by Red Lake Youth.

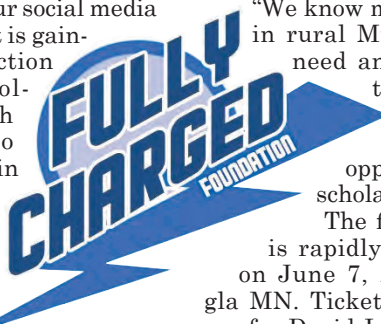

Fully Charged Foundation Scholarships & David Lee Murphy LIVE in Grygla, MN!

You may have seen a new non-profit organization in NW Minnesota on your social media news feeds and it is gaining a lot of traction to provide scholarships to youth in our area who pursue careers in the skilled labor trades. The Fully Charged Foundation based in Grygla, MN was an idea and vision by a group of local individuals who saw a need for opportunities for youth who may want to enter the workforce right away or attend a trade school/technical college for a shorter time period. “It was honestly an idea that started on a restaurant napkin and has grown into something that we believe will be very beneficial to youth in our area” states Executive Director Patrick Hackley. The organization is 100% volunteer driven, with proceeds from their events going directly back to area students in the form of scholarships. The foundation will award 3 scholarships this year: The Wendy Sandmark Memorial Scholarship will go to a graduating senior from either Grygla or Goodridge, MN high schools in honor of the late Wendy Sandmark. Two Fully Charged Foundation Scholarships will be awarded to a graduating senior or college student pursuing careers in the trade areas listed below (see attached photo). The foundation will accept applications for the Wendy Sandmark scholarship from students at Grygla or Goodridge High School and for the Fully Charged Foundation scholarships from students in high schools in MN within 90 miles of the Grygla/Goodridge area. The application is available



on our Facebook page and can also be emailed to applicants.

“We know many students in rural Minnesota just need an opportunity to shine and we want to provide the opportunity thru scholarships.

The first big event is rapidly approaching on June 7, 2019 in Grygla MN. Tickets are on sale now for David Lee Murphy in concert along with a meal and beverages. The meal includes a New York cut beef steak, pasta salad, fruit salad, dinner roll & beverages. Alcohol will be served by Yohawns Bar & Grill and will include Busch Light tap beer, well whiskey, & well vodka with mixers. Soft drinks and water will also be available for those who choose not to drink alcohol. Photo ID’s will be checked at the gate and wrist bands distributed to those 21 & older. All food and beverage is included in the admission ticket price. Tickets are \$30 for Ages 18-64 and \$20 for children under 18 and seniors 65 & older. This admission price is strictly for the meal and concert.

In conjunction with the concert event, raffle tickets are being sold for \$20/each for a chance to win a new 2019 Ford F-150 or \$40,000. Purchasers must be 18 years of age or older to purchase tickets. Tickets for the raffle can only be purchased with cash or check. The winner does not need to be present to win. Only 3,000 raffle tickets are being sold!

“There is sure to be confusion as we started selling tickets at \$100 for a combined event. We were informed by the Minnesota Gambling Control Board that the event was out of compliance, hence the reason for the new ad-

mission and raffle ticket structure. In the coming days we will be contacting those who have already purchased tickets and offering refunds or exchanges to the proper ticketing on a case by case basis to protect the integrity of the event and to be in compliance with Minnesota statute. We sincerely want to thank Brian Holcomb with the Minnesota Gambling Control Board for helping us thru this process and keeping the event going. It basically came down to a wording/clerical error along with a combined misinterpretation of the regulations, but Brian was very helpful in getting everything in compliance” Hackley states.

Older Americans Month 2019

Every May, the Administration for Community Living leads our nation’s observance of Older Americans Month. The 2019 theme, Connect, Create, Contribute, encourages older adults and their communities to: Connect with friends, family, and services that support participation. Create by engaging in activities that promote learning, health, and personal enrichment. Contribute time, talent, and life experience to benefit others.

Communities that encourage the contributions of older adults are stronger! By engaging and supporting all community members, we recognize that older adults play a key role in the vitality of our neighborhoods, networks, and lives.

Each year the Land of the Dancing Sky Area Agency on Aging looks forward to recognizing our older Americans by providing them with creative programs that are not only educational but fun. Here are a few classes you need to know about.

Many older adults experience a fear of falling. People who develop this fear often limit their activities, which can result in physical weakness, making the risk of falling even greater. Matter of Balance is a pro-

gram designed to reduce the fear of falling and increase activity levels among older adults. This class includes eight two-hour sessions for a small group led by a trained facilitator. The Chronic Disease Self-Management Program is a workshop given two and a half hours, once a week, for six weeks, in community settings such as senior centers, churches, libraries and hospitals. People with different chronic health problems attend together. Workshops are facilitated by two trained leaders, one or both of whom are non-health professionals with chronic diseases themselves.

Powerful Tools for Caregivers consists of six weekly classes where caregivers develop a wealth of self-care tools to: reduce personal stress; change negative self-talk; communicate their needs to family members and healthcare or service providers; communicate more effectively in challenging situations; recognize the messages in their emotions, deal with difficult feelings; and make tough caregiving decisions. Class participants also receive a copy of The Caregiver Helpbook, developed specifically for the class.

Tai Ji Quan: Moving for BetterBalance (TJQMBB) is a research-based balance train-

ing regimen designed for older adults and people with balance disorders. TJQMBB represents a substantive enhancement of traditional Tai Ji Quan training and performance as it transforms martial arts movements into a therapeutic regimen aimed at improving postural stability, awareness and mindful control of body positioning in space, functional walking, movement symmetry and coordination, range of motion around the ankle and hip joints, and lower-extremity muscle strength. Seeking Landowners to Protect Tallgrass Aspen Parklands in Northwestern Minnesota

St. Paul, MN – The tallgrass aspen parklands of northwestern Minnesota is a region with a unique mix of wetlands, woodlands, and grasslands. Through time, the region has been maintained by dynamic cycles of precipitation, fire, and grazing which provide essential habitat to birds like the sharp-tailed grouse, upland sandpiper, American bittern, least bittern, Franklin’s gull, and countless other wildlife species. In order to protect high-quality habitat throughout the tallgrass aspen parklands, the Minnesota Land Trust and Audubon Minnesota are launching the Protecting and Restoring the Tallgrass Aspen Parklands Program. This Program is seeking willing landowners who want to conserve natural habitat in Kittson, Roseau, Marshall, Pennington,

Red Lake, and Polk Counties.

Applications for the next round of the Protecting and Restoring Tallgrass Aspen Parklands Program are being accepted until August 1st, 2019.

The Program uses a market-based and cost-effective approach to protect wildlife habitat with private landowners in Northwestern Minnesota. Priority properties for the Protecting and Restoring the Tallgrass Aspen Parklands Program will be larger in size and will have high quality natural lands with little development. The Minnesota Land Trust will purchase permanent conservation easements with funding from the Outdoor Heritage Fund. Landowners retain private ownership of their land, and are able to use and manage it in line with the terms of the easement. This includes

selling, leasing, or renting the land as well.

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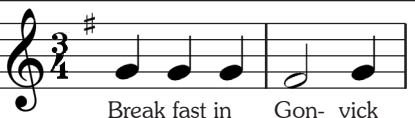

The Greenbush Race Park has lined up 16 nights of racing including WISSOTA Modifieds, Streets, Midwest Modifieds, and Pure Stocks*, along with Lightning Sprints and select dates for the 4 Cylinders and Outlaw Mini Mods. The NLRA Late Models will be back for three shows and the NOSA Sprints will be back for their lone show. Making their first ever appearance at the Park will be the Northern Renegade Non-Wing Sprint cars.

The Greenbush Race Park along with the Red River Co-op Speedway in Winnipeg, Mb., and the Lake of the Woods Speedway in Kenora, Ont., have decided to sanction Pure Stocks under the WISSOTA banner. What this means is that together, all three tracks will have three years to find a way to merge with the current WISSOTA Pure Stock rules package. In the meantime each tracks Pure Stock rules will be grandfathered in. WISSOTA is going to create a region for the three tracks, but are exempt from garnering any national points as they are not 100% rule compliant. During this time the three tracks will be working on 305 and 350 engine packages as well as trying to keep the class affordable. If at the end of the three years we cannot come up with a satisfactory rules package, we can opt out of the sanctioning agreement with WISSOTA.

The 2019 race season kicks

off May 25th with all classes racing. June 1st and the 8th are just regular nights with all classes racing. June 15th will be the 4th running of the "Dugan" Nelson memorial for the Midwest Mods. On the 22nd the NLRA Late Models make their first appearance of the summer and the month wraps up on the 29th with a special for the Pure Stocks*.

July opens with a bang as the NOSA Sprints make their only appearance of the summer on the 6th, on the 13th the Advantage RV Mod tour is back at the Park after a three year absence. The 20th will be a special for the Lightning Sprints, and the NLRA Late Models are back on the 27th to close out July.

August 3rd will be a special for the Streets, on the 10 will be the 21st Elliot Baker memorial for the Modifieds. The 17th will be the Race of Champions qualifiers for the WISSOTA classes and on the 24th the NLRA Late Models make their final appearance of the summer.

The 2019 season will wrap up on Labor Day weekend with our annual double header season finale. The 31st of Aug. will be the rain date for the Race of Champions qualifiers. All classes will be running along with the Northern Renegade Non-Wing Sprints.
