Father builds special chair for paralyzed son, opens world for many since

Tim Swenson, originally from Oklee, was faced with the challenge of helping his son Jeff, have a better life, after being injured in a car accident and becoming paralyzed. Swenson, who owned power-sports dealership Action Sports at that time, had spent most of his life around all-terrain vehicles and motorcycles. And his family had grown up loving the outdoors, often riding ATVs and snowmobiles. A standard wheelchair offers very little mo-

bility when it comes to outdoor activities and Swenson started thinking about a way to let Jeff enjoy some of the freedom he had lost. The standard wheelchair really hasn't changed much since it was developed about 2,500 years ago. The dimensions, wheel diameters, and materials have changed, but the basic design has stayed the same. A wheelchair provides mobility on hard flat surfaces but limits travel when inclines get steeper and surfaces get softer.

Swenson, with his mechanic's understanding of how machines work came up with a plan for a new type of wheelchair, a way to build a better more mobile chair. The design had two tracks rather than four wheels. And using standard wheelchair components for the propulsion and control systems, and relying on his decades of experience around sport vehicles, he got to work. Making the first chair took about a month, but no matter. The results were an extremely capable chair and a newly enabled—and thrilled—son. The name: ActionTracker.

His plan wasn't to go into business of making these new chairs. He was building it to help his son, but if there was any interest, he would build a few more. Well, the first Action Tracker™ generated quite a bit of interest, so more chairs were built. As Swenson learned more about his customers' needs, he realized that just getting around wasn't enough for most people in wheelchairs. They wanted to be able to participate in activities. Borrowing ideas from other outdoor vehicles, Swenson added a fishing-rod holder, gun mount, and a headlight. Other options followed: an umbrella holder, a headrest, gun scabbard, generator mount, utility box, and a utility tray. Swenson realized that his chairs might help people get back to work too.

The next issue in the continuing development of the ActionTracker was to help people get closer to their work. And that was the sitting position. The next big development was a chair that would lift the user to a standing position, and is Swenson's second design, the Action Trackstander. It is intended to get people back to enjoying their hobbies or jobs that are best done from a standing position. With this new chair, people have used them to play golf, do home repairs, yard work, and many other things. Swenson's project of making his son's life better has led to a new career and a growing business. He started with a small shop and limited tools and has grown larger as well as his in-

terest in helping people. It is not about selling the chairs, it about the people and their stories. The demand for the company's chairs grew from about 125 chairs in 2011 to 300 in 2012. Managing the company's growth is important to Swenson, who is more interested in helping people than merely selling chairs. Swenson displays many photos of his customers in his shop and knows quite a bit about their lives, their interests, and their hobbies. Swenson is steadfast in his belief that close customer contact is a key ingredient in developing new options and enabling more people to do as much as they can. Salem Lutheran Church of McIntosh comes down

People are reminded of the many blessing God has bestowed on them, and asked not only to look backwards, but to look inward and upward as well. — Pastor J. Elmer Dahlgren, Salem Lutheran Church Pastor from 1933-1941
Salem Lutheran Church of McIntosh Minnesota formed as Salem Augustana Lutheran Church in 1887 in rural McIntosh, the village church that began in the late 1930's and Asphalt Lutheran Church organized in 1889. The churches merged in 1969 to form the present congregation. As small groups of Swedish immigrants settled in the Northwestern Minnesota wilderness, small communities arose, and the people somehow managed to survive the long,

cold winters with determination, sacrifice and trust in God. **Salem Swedish Evangelical Lutheran Church**
In 1883, one of these settlers, Olof Stardig, a native of Sweden, came from Alexandria, Minnesota where he had journeyed from across the ocean just a year earlier, when the Thirteen Townships was opened for settlement. Mr. Stardig filed with Polk County for 160 acres of land southwest of McIntosh, which did not even exist at the time, in Knute Township. In 1887 Olof Stardig and other hardy pioneers organized the Swedish Evangelical Lutheran Salem Church in rural McIntosh. The founders had come largely from Sweden. Pastor J.P Lundblad was the first to serve as Pastor at the church. The Charter members of the Church set to task to build



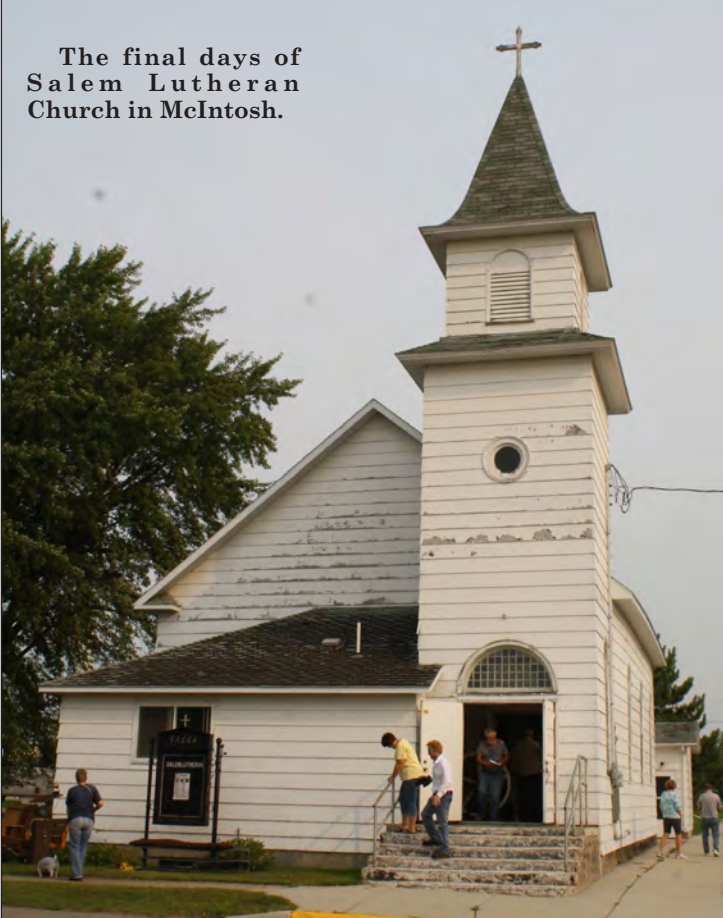
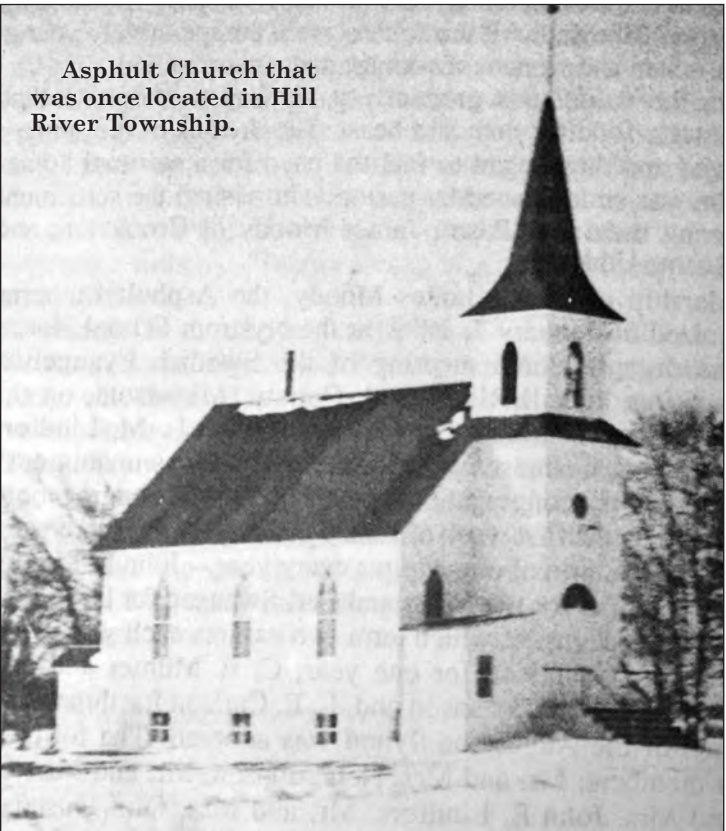
a church building. Each male communicant was to furnish four logs delivered to the site of the church on or before March 15, 1887. In addition to the four logs, each male member furnished lumber and other building supplies as to what they could. The time came to build a log building that was to be the first church of Salem's. Olof Stardig was named foreman. The Church stood until 1902 when a tornado took the roof and chimney. Workman set to work and by the summer of 1903, a new church had been constructed. The belfry was made complete with the installation of a bell in 1914. This was Salem's second church. **Asphalt Lutheran Church**
Under the leadership of Pastor James Moody, the Asphalt Lutheran Church was organized in 1889 in Hill River Township. Shortly after the congregation was organized, land for a cemetery and the future church building site was secured. Two and a half acres was purchased from Nels Jeppson for the price of \$25, a sum that was donated to the church building fund by Nels Jeppson. They chose, indeed, a beautiful location for the future church building and cemetery. In 1911, Asphalt decided to

go to work and build the church that had long been envisioned, as the congregation had been worshipping at the Nystrom School for 22 years. By October of 1911, the church was completed. Several festive events were held at Asphalt Lutheran Church, including the dedication of the church and cemetery the last Sunday in October 1916. The last and final celebration was June 15, 1969, under the leadership of Pastor Carl E. Anderson. At this time, Asphalt consolidated with Salem of McIntosh. **Salem moves to Town**
Signs were clear that Salem would have to be relocated from the rural location to the Village of McIntosh. In the midst of the planning, the Congregational Church, which was being used during the transition, suffered fire damage. With the help of cabinet makers, Andrew Peterson, plans were made to rebuild and repair on the site of that Church. This was Salem's fourth Church. It remained until the final service on July 19, 2015. **More Salem photos**

DNR seeks designs for Minnesota's 2016 walleye stamp

Artists can submit entries for the 2016 Minnesota Walleye Stamp from Monday, Oct. 5, through Friday, Oct. 16.

The voluntary walleye stamp validation costs \$5 but is not required to fish for or keep walleye. For an extra 75 cents, purchasers will be mailed the pictorial stamp. A pictorial collectable stamp without the validation is available for \$5.75.

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Walleye stamps are available year-round and are not required to be purchased at the same time as fishing licenses.

"When people voluntarily buy walleye stamps, the money they pay goes into an account dedicated to walleye stocking," said Neil Vanderbosch, fisheries program consultant for the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources. "We use this money to buy walleye from certified private producers."

The stamp contest offers no prizes and is open to Minnesota residents only. The walleye must be the primary focus of the design, though other fish species may be included in the design if they are used to depict common interaction between species or are common inhabit-

ants of Minnesota lakes and rivers.

Artists are not allowed to use any photographic product as part of their finished entries. Winning artists usually issue limited edition prints of the artwork and retain proceeds. Judging will take place 2 p.m. Thursday, Oct. 23, at DNR Headquarters, 500 Lafayette Road in St. Paul.

Hunters: Blaze orange clothing required

With Minnesota's small game hunting season underway, conservation officers (CO) with the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources report some hunters not wearing required blaze orange clothing.

"The blaze orange requirement is for safety," said CO Marty Stage of Ely. "One hunter said that he wasn't very far from his home, to excuse him from needing blaze orange."

Making a blaze orange fashion statement this fall might not get you on the best-dressed list, but it just might save your life.

"Wearing blaze orange clothing is a safety requirement to hunt or trap during Minnesota's small game season or firearms deer season," said Jon Paurus, DNR enforcement education program coordinator. "It's important to be seen by others."

Small game seasons: At least one visible article of clothing above the waist must be blaze orange when taking small game, except when hunting migratory birds from a blind or on the water, wild turkeys, raccoons or predators, when hunting by falconry, when trapping (outside deer seasons) or when hunting deer by archery while stationary.

Deer season: The visible portion of at least one item of a cap and one item of outer clothing above the waist, excluding sleeves and gloves, must be blaze orange when hunting or trapping during any open season where deer may be taken by firearms (including special hunts, early antlerless, youth

seasons and muzzleloader). Blaze orange includes a camouflage pattern of at least 50 percent blaze orange within each square foot.

"The failure to wear to wear blaze orange puts a hunter in jeopardy of not being seen by someone who does not take the time to properly identify their target and what's beyond it," Paurus said.

Paurus recommends faded blaze orange garments be replaced.

"Blaze orange clothing is a tremendous aid in helping hunters maintain visual contact with one another, particularly when moving through dense cover or woods," Paurus said. "Any hunter who has ever identified someone strictly by seeing blaze orange knows its value in keeping track of other hunters in the field, especially in low light conditions."

For those who use ground blinds, Paurus said to remember to place some blaze orange on the outside of the blind for others to see.

Some safety tips for non-hunters:

- Wear bright clothing. Choose colors that stand out, like red, orange or green, and avoid white, blacks, browns, earth-toned greens and animal-colored clothing. Blaze orange vests and hats are advisable.

- Be courteous. Don't make unnecessary noise to disturb wildlife. Avoid confrontations.

- Know the dates of hunting seasons. Learn about where and when hunting is taking place.

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Visit Minnesota state forests for fall color driving tours

Those looking for a scenic drive to take during peak fall color should consider visiting a state forest, according to the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources.

"State forests are an excellent place to see fall color," said Jennifer Teegarden, forestry outreach specialist for the DNR. "Hilly or rugged areas dominated by deciduous trees tend to have the best mix of color. And the dark green needles of conifers accent the yellow, orange and red leaves of deciduous trees in mixed forests."

Here are a few state forests and routes to consider:

Late September

- Finland State Forest heading northeast along Country Road 7 from Finland.

- Smoky Hills State Forest along state Highway 34 between Park Rapids and Detroit Lakes.

- St. Croix State Forest along County Road 25 south of Duxbury to the Mallard Lake Forest Road.

Early October

- Big Fork and Bowstring state forests along state Highway 38 between Grand Rapids and Effie.

- Rum River State Forest along Rum River State Forest Road off of Highway 20.

Mid-October

- Richard J. Dorer Memorial Hardwood State Forest has two good options:

- Along Zumbro Bottoms Road off state Highway 60 southwest of Wabasha.

- Along state Highway 16 between Interstate 90 and state Highway 26.

More information about state forests is available on the DNR website at www.mndnr.gov/stateforests. Entrance into a state forest is free. State forest campsites are available on a first-come, first-served basis for \$14 a night.

Ask a Trooper

Question: What does the State of MN require the seller of a vehicle licensed in Minnesota to do or report when a vehicle is sold through a private party sale?



Answer: When you sell a vehicle, you (owner/seller) are responsible to file the "Notice of Sale" within ten days of the sale. This is located in the lower portion of the "Certificate of Title", and you would tear that small piece off. The information you would include would be the transferee's full name, address, driver's license number, and date of sale. Mail to: Minnesota Department of Public Safety, Driver and Vehicle Services Division, 445 Minnesota Street, St. Paul, MN 55101-5168. This can also be filed over the internet at mndriveinfo.org, or call 651-284-1234. If you go to the mndriveinfo.org, click on Vehicle Services & Report of Sale and fill out the online form and submit it. This notice is not required if sold to a licensed dealer. For your protection, upon

the sale of a vehicle to a private party, it is recommended that the seller and buyer take the completed transfer to a deputy registrar.

I've seen several incidents where people had sold vehicles and failed to file the "notice of sale". This has caused several issues and headaches for the former vehicle owners later down the road. Some of these included hit and run crashes and numerous other types of criminal activity.

If selling a vehicle, I strongly suggest viewing a valid form of identification from the new owner. If not, I'd most certainly be going to the deputy registrar with the buyer.

DNR to sell 7 lots in Lake Bronson State Park at auction

Seven cabin lots in Lake Bronson State Park will be sold by the Department of Natural Resources at a public oral auction on Oct. 9, 11 a.m., at the Kittson County Courthouse, 410 5th St. SE, in Hallock. Registration begins at 10:30 a.m. All bidders must be registered by 11 a.m.

This is the first time in the park's 78-year history that cabin lots will be sold within Lake Bronson State Park. Proceeds from the auction will be used to purchase a parcel within the park that can be better managed as parkland.

A small area of the original park on Lake Bronson's north-

ern boundary was platted into a residential subdivision in the 1930s after the lake was formed by the Two Rivers Dam. The platted subdivision contains 134 lots of 0.2 to 0.4 acres, a lot size that was common at the time. Nine roads were also platted, and the entire subdivision was approved as Percy's Lakeside Subdivision.

Only a few of the lots were purchased, and several legally-established roads were developed. Over the years, a few driveways were informally established across some of the legal lots.

To sell lots that could be developed for cabin sites, the
