Sons of Norway Announces Special Guests for June 13 Meeting

Bud and Marlys Larsen, of Brainerd, MN, will present an exciting program featuring Bud's handcrafted Hardanger fiddles. The Hardanger fiddle is often called the national instrument of Norway and gets its name from the Hardanger region of Norway where it originated in the 17th century. It is similar to a violin but there are many differences. The Hardanger fiddle is longer and is highly decorated with mother of pearl and ivory inlays and some have drawn decorations on the surface. In Norwegian it is called "ros tegning". In addition, what really sets apart the Hardanger fiddle is the sound created by four understrings. Larsen says, "The sound is more layered. With regular violins you will hear two strings at once, just once in a while but with Hardanger fiddles it is all the time. There are very few parts of the music that are played just on one string."

Robert "Bud" Larsen is an American craftsman and maker of Hardanger fiddles. Larsen's father, Herman Larsen, played violin and Hardanger fiddle and emigrated from Forde, Sunnfjord, Norway. Bud lived for many years on the farm by Mandan, ND, and then in Fargo, North Dakota. While a student at MSUM in Moorhead, Bud worked in Gunnar Helland's shop in Fargo, restoring and repairing violins. Gunnar was one of Herman's friends and was an instrument maker, revered among groups like the "Hardanger Fiddle Association of America". Bud learned many skills from Gunnar as they built guitars, mandolins and other instruments.

Bud and Marlys spent 20 years on the mission field with Wycliffe Bible Translators in Papua, New Guinea, where they worked with the Orokaiva people to translate the New Testament into their language. Currently Bud and Marlys live in a log cabin with a grass roof by Brainerd, MN. In his basement workshop, Bud builds and restores Hardanger fiddles and other instruments for customers nationwide. They have performed in dozens of music fests



including the Norsk Hostfest in Minot, Scandinavian Hjemkomst Festival in Moorhead, and several Sons of Norway lodges.

In addition to the upcoming Sons of Norway program, where they will display and perform their instruments, there is a bonus! Bud says, "If anyone has a violin to bring or show, or fix up, bring them along! I can give

them an idea of what needs repair, evaluate it, and give them an estimate to fix it. They can bring any stringed instrument for an evaluation."

The Sons of Norway meeting begins at 6:30 at the Embassy Center in Fosston on Thursday, June 13. The public is invited to see the display and hear Bud and Marlys Larsen and their Hardanger fiddles at 7:30

Death in Fosston

On 6/2/2019 at approx. 0344 hrs. the Polk County Sheriff's Office responded to a 911 call of a reported assault on 8th St. NW at the intersection of N. Mark Ave. A second 911 call from a different residence came in shortly after the first reporting that somebody is trying to break into their house at that intersection. When officers arrived there was one male standing around that intersection and another male party laying on the curbside, whom was not breathing. Deputies started CPR and Essentia Health EMS responded to the scene. The male laying on the curbside was later pronounced deceased. The other male, identified as Nicholas Hauge, 29 years of age, from Fergus Falls, MN, was arrested and transported to the North West Regional Correctional Center. The deceased male was later transported to the Medical Examiner's Office in Grand Forks, North Dakota. The Bureau of Criminal Apprehension was contacted and assisted

with the scene processing. The name of the victim is Timothy Hauge 19 years of age from Fosston, MN. An Autopsy was conducted on Timothy 6/2/2019, the preliminary cause of death was Cranio-Cerebral Trauma due to blunt force trauma to the head. The preliminary Manner of Death is Homicide resulting from an assault by another person.

Nicholas Patrick Hauge is being charged with 2 counts of Murder in the Second Degree. Timothy and Nicholas were brothers.

No other information is available at this time.

The Polk County Sheriff's Office has no information that there is a continued threat to the public.

There is no information that a firearm was involved in this incident.

The investigation is ongoing. Also assisting was the Fosston Fire Department

No further information will be released at this time.

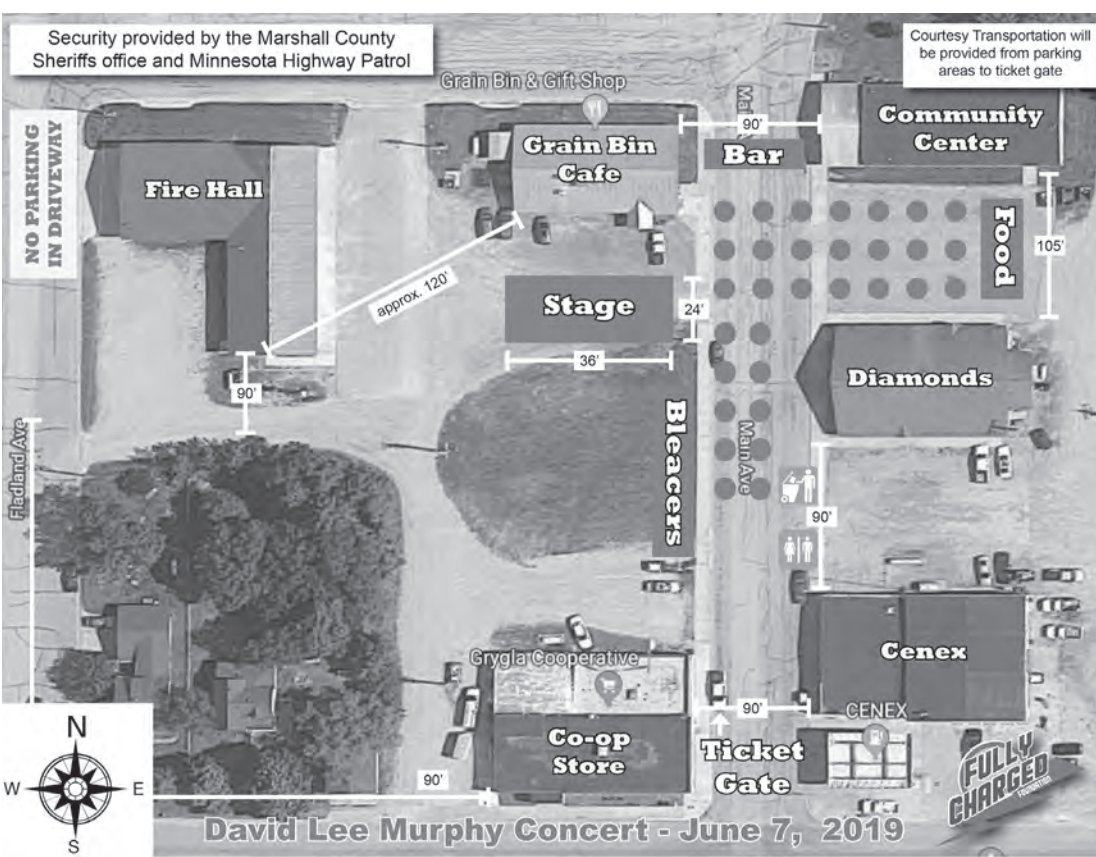

The miracle made itself known at a point when Mary least expected. But as He knows our needs before we even ask, perhaps it wasn’t so unexpected after all. Before her heart received the gift of miracle, it was first broken. Into a million tiny shards it shattered when Abel died. It wasn’t supposed to be this way. Son’s don’t leave this earth before mamas and every mama knows that. It’s sort of an unspoken code in the book of life. Isn’t it? We assume we will outlive our children. However, that’s not always the case, and so it was with Mary. This is her story.

Life was good. For a while all was well with Mary. Struggles within the norm prevailed but nothing too out of the ordinary. After all, she’d married well. Her husband whom she’d selectively chosen had met Mary’s number one criteria. He was a believer.

Years later after much wear and tear within the marriage, she was left with little choice but to leave. With her children grown, she held it together the best she could by continuing to press into prayer. It came quite natural as her faith had been strong since childhood. It was a gift she could never put into

words other than those spoken to her precious Lord.

Once settled into her new home, Abel, the middle child of three, came for a visit one weekend. He hadn’t been feeling well for quite some time now, but he was 19. hospital, he quickly made his decision. A transplant it would be and as Betsy, his sister, was a partial match, she would be the donor. January would be the month in which this would happen and once completed the 100 day countdown to being home free would begin. (100 days is the mile marker indicative of success.)

Take this information for what it’s worth. It tells you the back story but not necessarily the inner workings of a mama’s heart nor her swaying world laid bare upon the table of grace. Mary shared the following. “I never prayed so hard in my life! I bargained with God. I pleaded. I begged Him to not take my son but to let Him live!”

May 7th... The 100 day celebration took place.

May 8th... A follow up doctor’s visit dashed all hope. The leukemia was back.

May 17th... Abel died. Silence. Pause. Breathe. (to be continued)

This story will be continued for the next two weeks. It is the only time I’ve ever written a column that will expand over three weeks. I pray that you, the reader, will hang with me...as it is a story worthy of it. I pray you find it a gift to be invited into Mary’s journey. She shared this in honor of all who have gone through the depths of despair and beyond. May you be blessed. Amen.

Ask a Trooper

Question: I moved to Minnesota from Arizona

about a year ago and I have a car that has tinted windows. What is the window tint law in Minnesota?

Answer: Even if your previous state allowed tinted windows, you will now need to comply with Minnesota law:

- No vehicle can have ANY tint to the front windshield.
 - Passenger cars are limited to 50% on all side and rear windows.
 - Pickups, vans, and SUV's are limited to 50% on the front side windows.
 - Pickups, vans, and SUV's are NOT limited on the rear side and rear windows. (Can be less than 50% behind the front seat).
 - Squad cars, limousines, and vehicles used to transport human remains by a funeral establishment are not limited on the side and rear windows.
 - No person shall sell, offer for sale, or use any motor vehicle with windows or windshields that have window tint on them.
- State Patrol has two types of tint meters. The first type of

meter slides over the window to give the tint percentage. The second is a two piece meter,



Window tint obstructs your vision at night and during poor weather conditions. It is also a safety concern for law enforcement at night. Illegally tinted windows make it nearly impossible to see in the vehicle while conducting a traffic stop.

If you need to have window tint removed, you can check with a body or detailing shop or you can do it yourself. Look on the internet for advice and suggestions.

You can avoid a ticket — and a crash — if you simply buckle up, drive at safe speeds, pay

attention and always drive sober. Help us drive Minnesota Toward Zero Deaths.
