CNA / CPR Training Center open in McIntosh

McIntosh Senior Living recently opened up a Training Center in downtown McIntosh. Taking over the former Win-E-Mac Dental office on the Main Street in McIntosh. The facility recently held an Open House for the public to check things out. The Center will be a great asset for McIntosh and is run by Carissa Affeldt.

Carissa started at McIntosh Senior Living in September of 2017 as the Infection Preventionist and Education Coordinator. Last summer, she became certified by the American Heart

Association to teach CPR and first aid (BLS for healthcare workers and Heartsaver for general public). Since then, she has been teaching the classes to MSL employees, other healthcare workers, and the general public, even going to other facilities to teach employees in their workplace. Carissa will be teaching the CPR and first aid classes at the MSL Training Center.

Carissa learned about how to start a CNA (Certified Nursing Assistant) Training Program. She took a "Train the Trainer"

course last fall and then began the application process to start a new training program.

McIntosh Senior Living received state approval at the beginning of 2019 and purchased the former Win-E-Mac Dental office to be used as a training site primarily for the CNA program, as more space was required than what was available at McIntosh Senior Living.

About half of the building was remodeled and set up for training, including a large, open classroom area, lab (complete with 3 hospital beds and mani-

kins), supply room set up with everything you would need to care for residents or patients, including mechanical lifts and oxygen equipment provided by Northwest Respiratory, and a kitchen/breakroom. The use of the other half of the building has not yet been decided. The remodeling project was completed by McIntosh Senior Living's Maintenance Director, Paul Ruckreigle. Visitors that are former dental patients have commented that the building has really changed. It really is a great space for CNA students to

learn and practice their skills. The training center can have up to 10 students per class. Students don't need to work at McIntosh Senior Living to be

able to take advantage of this course.

“Milkweeds” Hand Printed Art Series

The Common Milkweed, native plant, has long been considered a weed. In recent years, it has been learned that a beautiful and important pollinator, the Monarch Butterfly, is dependent on the milkweed. The Monarch lays its eggs on the underside of the milkweed leaf, and after several growth stages (instars), a caterpillar emerges. This caterpillar will later turn into a monarch butterfly. But while it is growing, it needs to eat. The only food that a Monarch caterpillar eats is... yes... you guessed it: milkweed leaves. Without the milkweed, the adult Monarchs will not emerge.

“Is the Common Milkweed a weed... or is it an essential part

of the ecosystems and interdependence of the intertwined elements of nature?”

As more is learned about the Common Milkweed and its part in nature, we are less inclined to think of it as a weed, but rather consider its importance as a host plant essential to the survival of the Monarch Butterfly. Without the milkweed, we'd have no Monarchs, without the Monarchs, we'd lose an important pollinator which ensures continuation and survival of many of our plants, including some that we may use for food.

The Common Milkweed might also be considered by each of us as individuals as we co-exist and share our world: Are we a weed or are we an integral part of our natural progression... essential to the survival of a species... maybe our own?

released at a one-day exhibit at the Fosston Library-Art Center's Sorenson Gallery on June 13.

This is the first series of 12 different hand-prints of native plants originating from a pen & ink drawing by Cindy Kolling. After deciding to start with the milkweed, and while continuing a process of developing and experimenting in new hand-printing techniques, this series of 12 different prints has been produced. They are “unique prints”; no two are alike. There are no more. The original prints have been stored in high quality digital files for possible reproduction later, but the 12 different originals are the only ones. The different methods of presentation in varying colors and techniques are part of the

The Milkweeds hand prints are for sale to interested buyers. They will be available in a 16 x 20 studio mat & frame after all of the season's public showings are completed. Price is \$790 per print. Signed & numbered as Unique Print 1-12 of 1 in series 1.

Visitors to the Sorenson Gallery were asked to write down the hand print they liked best. Number 10 was the most popular (sold). Number 4 was second (available but with inquiries) and Number 7 was third (re-

served by artist). The others were fairly even and seemed to appeal to people with specific tastes, such as simplicity, color choice or contrast or number sequence. Number 1 of 1 of Series 1 is also sold.

The Coffee Crowd in Gully also gave Number 10 the most votes, but Number 8 was right behind it.

Future projects featuring other native plants are planned,

Red Lake County Sheriff

On the evening of 06/12/19, Chelsie Mae Johnson (32) of Lengby, was arrested in Fosston by deputies from the Red Lake County and Polk County Sheriff's Offices. She was taken to the jail in Crookston and was booked for felony theft. She is accused of embezzling nearly \$270,000 from her former employer in Red Lake County from November of 2016 through April of 2019. The criminal complaint alleges that Ms. Johnson used company funds, without authorization, to make payments on personal credit card accounts. Ms. Johnson made her initial court appearance in Crookston on 06/14/19. Bail was set at \$1,500 cash and another hearing was scheduled in Red Lake Falls on 06/19/19.

Ask a Trooper

Question: When golf carts are using a pedestrian

crosswalk, are vehicles required to yield? This happens in some towns where the roadway separates a golf course.

Answer: Unless there is an ordinance or some other special allowance set by local or state officials golf carts are treated as motor vehicles and not pedestrians. Minnesota State Statute talks about electric personal assistive mobility devices and how the person operating one has the rights and responsibilities of a pedestrian but this does not include golf carts.

In Minnesota where traffic-control signals are not in place or in operation, the driver of a vehicle shall stop to yield the right-of-way to a pedestrian crossing the roadway within a marked crosswalk or at an

intersection with no marked crosswalk. The driver must remain stopped until the pedestrian has passed the lane in which the vehicle is stopped. Drivers should try to stop far enough back so drivers in other lanes can also see in time to stop. Also, do not block crosswalks while stopped, and don't pass other vehicles stopped in these areas.

No pedestrian shall suddenly leave a curb or other place of safety and walk or run into the path of a vehicle which is so close that it is impossible for the driver to yield. Pedestrians, don't count on drivers paying attention — make eye contact with motorists before crossing. Continue to be alert and check for vehicles when walking in a crosswalk.

Just a reminder that anyone who is operating a golf cart under the influence can be arrested for DWI, as it fits the

definition of a motor vehicle. The DWI statute says that it is against the law to operate any motor vehicle anywhere in the state of Minnesota. No matter what vehicle you plan on driving, line up a sober ride before you decide to drink.

You can avoid a ticket — and a crash — if you simply buckle up, drive at safe speeds, pay attention and always drive sober. Help us drive Minnesota Toward Zero Deaths.

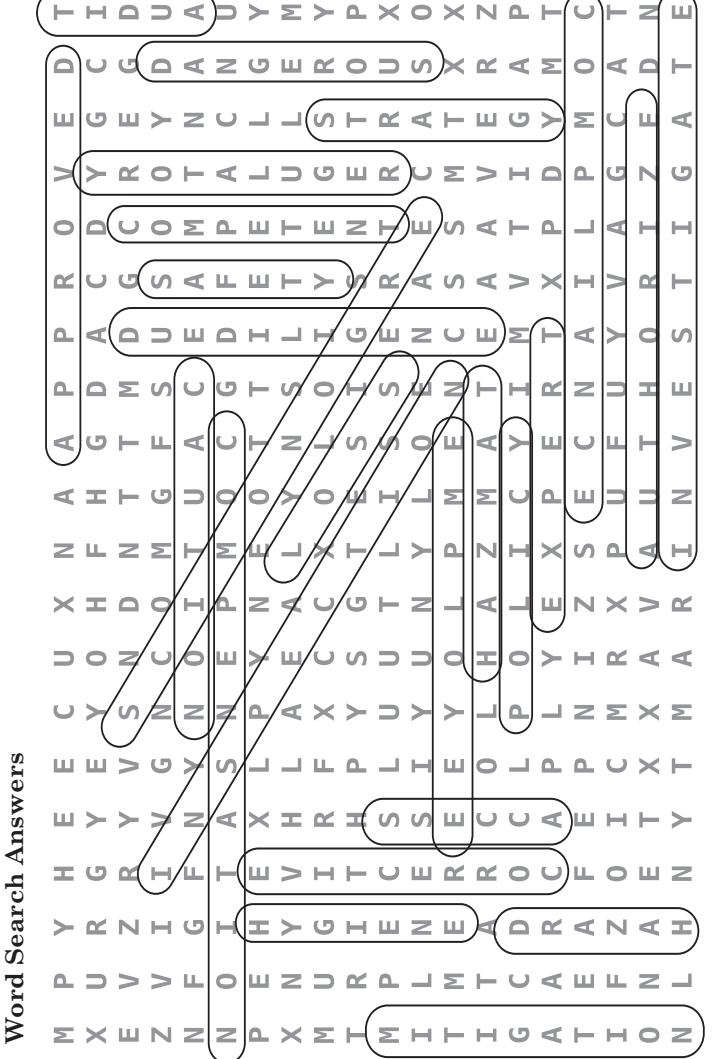
