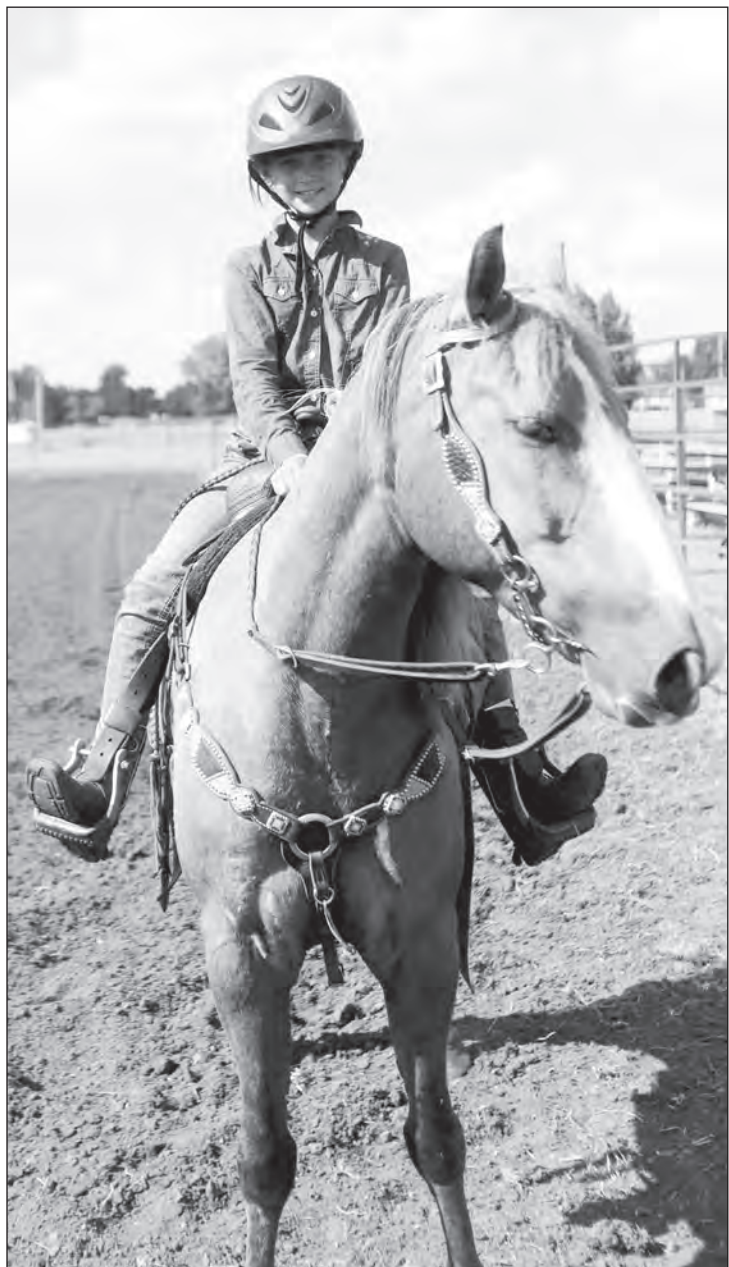

Fatal motorcycle accident

On July 13, 2019 at 3:37am, the Clearwater County Sheriff's Office received a call of a motorcycle accident on County Road 2, about 1.5 miles South of Leonard, MN. Upon arrival, a 26 year old male from Solway, MN was found deceased at the scene. The case remains under investigation by the Clearwater County Sheriff's Office. The Sheriff's Office was assisted at the scene by Minnesota State Patrol, Clearbrook Fire Department and Sanford Ambulance.

The male subject's name is being withheld pending notification of family.

Structure Fire / West Central AG Elevator Beltrami

On 07/09/19, at approximately 1347 hours, the Polk County Sheriff's Office received a structure fire complaint at the West Central AG Elevator, Beltrami MN. Beltrami Fire Department, Fertile Fire Department, County EMS and the Polk County Sheriff's Office responded to the scene.

Quick response and action by both the Beltrami Fire Department and Fertile Fire Department lead to the fire being quickly extinguished. It was discovered this was a mechanical fire with no severe damage. No one was injured.

Shed Fire west of Fertile

On 7/13/2019 the Polk County Sheriff's Office was advised by pilot flying an airplane that a shed appeared to be on fire near Co 1 approximately 3 miles west of the city of Fertile. Fertile Fire Department along with a Polk County Deputy located the fire at 42170 150th Ave SW in Liberty Township. When the Fire Department and a Deputy arrived on scene the shed was full engulfed and a total loss. After speaking with the owners of the shed it was determined that the shed was full of alfalfa and no equipment.

Single vehicle crash

On 7-14-19 the Polk County Sheriff's Office responded to a single vehicle crash on County Road 12 near the intersection of 430th St SE and Center Ave. Deputies arrived on scene and located the vehicle at the bottom of the ditch. It appeared the vehicle had struck multiple trees after entering the ditch, causing heavy damage to the vehicle. Two adult females were located inside the vehicle. Fertile Fire Department and County EMS also arrived on scene. All three agencies worked together to safely remove the females from the vehicle, both were taken to Riverview ER in Crookston. The driver was later airlifted to Sanford Hospital in Fargo. Both parties were wearing seatbelts and alcohol is not believed to be a factor.

The extent of the injuries for both parties is unknown at this time.

The driver is identified as Deloris Fritz (63) of McIntosh, MN and the passenger Brenda Fritz (36) of Plymouth, MN.

Also assisting was the Minnesota State Patrol.

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Don't get rolled over by shady paving companies, BBB warns

Burnsville, MN – July 10, 2019 – Better Business Bureau® of Minnesota and North Dakota is warning consumers of a seasonal scam that tends to pop up in warmer months – asphalt paving schemes.

These suspect asphalt companies often place ads or go door-to-door claiming to have extra asphalt from a nearby project, allowing them to give you a discounted rate. Unfortunately, these jobs usually end in sub-par work that costs much more than originally quoted.

A woman from Grand Rapids, Minn., lost \$50,000 to one of these sub-par asphalt companies. The company first advertised in a local newspaper, calling themselves Convenient Paving, but the following year, a company with the same phone number advertised as Convenience Driveways. The woman contacted the company for a quote and was told they had extra materials and could do the job right away.

Despite the driveway having a three-year warranty, the woman reported to BBB that grass was growing through the asphalt within two weeks of the job being done. After following up with the company, a representative agreed the driveway needed to be fixed and said he would be in contact to schedule a day and time.

The woman followed up with several phone calls but never heard from the company again, she told BBB.

"I told him I paid him too much and that this was not acceptable," she said. "I questioned their credibility and other issues."

To avoid being tricked by asphalt schemes, always know whom you're dealing with and research the company at bbb.org. You can always ask the salesperson if they have a solicitor's license from the city in which they're doing business, or you can call your city officials directly to ask if they've received any complaints about a certain business.

It doesn't hurt to follow these general rules to avoid an unethical asphalt company:

- Be wary of paving companies stating they are "in the neighborhood" and have extra asphalt at the ready to repair your driveway for a minimal cost. Professional asphalt contractors know, with great accuracy, how much paving material is needed to complete a project. They will rarely have leftover materials.

- Never hire someone on the spot. Trustworthy contractors provide a written estimate that will be valid for many days. If you feel that you are being subjected to high-pressure sales tactics, BBB advises you to end

the conversation and tell the company you're not interested.

- If the quoted price seems very low, chances are the quality of work will be quite low.
- Get at least two estimates before hiring anyone.

- Don't pay with cash. Credit cards are always best as there are options for recovering your lost funds.

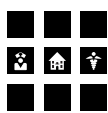

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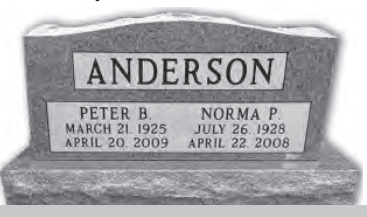

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UND's Doctor of Physical Therapy class of 2021 begins clinical studies

GRAND FORKS, N.D.—In a few short weeks, 49 physical therapy students, members of the University of North Dakota School of Medicine & Health Sciences (SMHS) Doctor of Physical Therapy (DPT) Class of 2021, will start the clinical studies portion of their journey to become doctors of physical therapy. The students received their white coats at the Entrance Into Professional Service Ceremony on Thursday, July 11, 2019, at the Alerus Center in Grand Forks.

The students, 38 women and 11 men, range in age from 20 to 30 years, with the average age of 22.6. Many are from North Dakota, and most completed their pre-PT coursework at UND.

The ceremony's keynote speaker was Beverly Johnson, P.T., D.Sc., GCS, CEEAA. Dr. Johnson is associate professor emeritus of the SMHS Department of Physical Therapy where she was on faculty for over 30 years and was director of clinical education for 26 of those years. She earned her Bachelor of Physical Therapy and Master of Science in Sport and Exercise Science degrees

from UND. She obtained her Doctor of Science in Physical Therapy from Rocky Mountain University of Health Professions and is a board certified clinical specialist in geriatrics. Most recently, Dr. Johnson completed an appointment as chair of the Physical Therapy Panel for the Commission on Accreditation in Physical Therapy Education (CAPTE).

"The ceremony emphasized to the students the professionalism required in the clinic and within the physical therapy profession," said David Relling, P.T., Ph.D., professor and chair of the SMHS Department of Physical Therapy.

After completing their first year of the professional component of the physical therapy curriculum, the students have to pass an intense, comprehensive examination of their knowledge before they begin their clinical studies. The first three years of the curriculum are considered pre-physical therapy (pre-professional). The professional component of the DPT degree requires three academic years and two summer sessions following completion of the

90-credit pre-physical therapy entrance requirement.

Clinical experiences are a crucial component of the UND physical therapy curriculum and take place at more than 300 clinical sites across the nation, the majority of which lie outside the Grand Forks area. These experiences meld academic information with hands-on clinical experience. Students participate in direct delivery of physical therapy services in a variety of settings under the direction and supervision of one or more clinical instructors.

"Students are making the transition from being a student to being a health care professional," Relling added. "With that transition comes a great deal of responsibility and accountability to these new professionals and to their clients. For many students, this will be the first life experience they will have had that requires such a high level of professionalism and responsibility. We have trained them well, they have worked hard, and we anticipate they will do a great job working within a comprehensive, interprofessional health care team."

Rep. Winkler Attends RL Independence Day Parade/Powwow

Minnesota House Majority Leader, and Bemidji native, Representative Ryan Winkler (DFL) District: 46A, attended Red Lake Independence Day celebrations, parade and powwow Saturday, July 6, 2019.

Red Lake Nation's annual independence day parade and celebration (July 6) commemorates the tribe's formal sovereignty under an 1889 land agreement with the U.S. government. The tribe's political sovereignty is a point of pride for members. Red Lake is one of only two “closed” reservations in the country, its land never ceded to the US, and held in common by its members.

Winkler, majority leader of the Minnesota House of Representatives, rode on the Beltrami County DFL float in the parade with Bemidji Representative John Persell. Later, he had the opportunity to greet the crowd at the powwow, saying a few words to those attending after grand entry. Winkler also visited with Red Lake Tribal Officers, Chairman Darrell G. Seki, Sr., Treasurer Annette Johnson, and Secretary Samuel Strong.

“I enjoy coming home for summer events like Independence Day and visit with family, and old friends and school mates from both Bemidji and Red Lake,” said Winkler. “Ya can’t beat summertime in the North Woods.”

“It’s also important to maintain government to government relations with Indian Nations,” said Winkler. “Partnerships between the Legislature and tribal communities were important in the passing of several bills during the 2019 legislative session. Issues addressed in bills that were passed included improved funding for tribal contract schools, the creation of a Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women Task Force

and removing the requirement that police in federally recognized tribes must have consent from the county sheriff to enforce state laws.”

Winkler/Flanagan, Majority Leader/Lt. Governor, Succeed Each Other

In 2006, Winkler ran for and won a seat in the Minnesota House of Representatives, representing Golden Valley, St. Louis Park and Plymouth.

In May 2015, Winkler announced he would resign effective July 1. His wife at the time Jenny, accepted a job as an executive with the Rezidor Hotel Group, headquartered in Brussels, Belgium and his family moved there to support her.

The Minnesota Post wrote at the time that the legislature would miss Winkler as he “brought a combination of passion and biting wit to the Minnesota House.”

Peggy Flanagan, a DFL activist who lived in the same district, ran for Winkler's seat in a special election and won, succeeding Winkler.

In February 2018, Winkler announced his intentions to run for the legislative office he previously held in District 46A. He was re-elected, succeeding Flanagan who had left the house to run for Lieutenant Governor with Governor Tim Walz, an office Flanagan currently holds. Flanagan, a member of Whiter Earth Nation, is the first person of American Indian heritage to hold that seat.

DFL legislators elected Winkler to serve as Majority Leader in November 2018, and he took office in January 2019.

Born and raised in Bemidji, Minnesota, Winkler grew up in a family that worked hard, cared deeply for one another, and gave back to the community. His father owned

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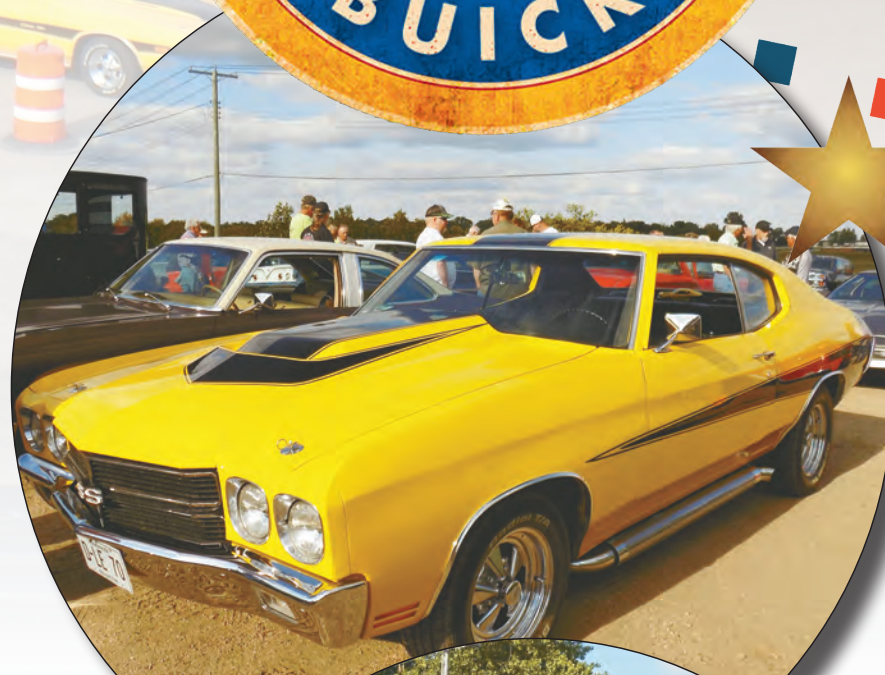
