Joining Hearts for Paisley

When imagining a typical child, most see a tiny human who runs around with no cares or worries in the world. This specific little girl acts like an ordinary toddler who loves to play, dance, sing, and laugh. Looking at this three-year-old girl with amazingly high spirits, a bystander would never guess she has faced extreme health problems and continues to fight each day. This energetic and strong little girl is Paisley Straub who has battled heart issues her whole life.

Paisley Straub is the daughter of Candice and Chad Straub of McIntosh and granddaughter of Rod Brown, Jeff & Sherrie Witherbee, Shirley Straub & Chad Smeby, and Danny & Gail Straub. She was born on May 10th of 2016 with a heart defect known as Pulmonary Atresia with Intact Ventricular Septum. This defect means that the valve in Paisley's heart that allows blood to travel from the heart to the lungs did not exist. She did not have that key connection between her heart and her lungs so doctors wanted to get Paisley started on a medication called prostaglandin when she was born that would give her a patent connection of the heart and lungs. After this, the plan was to perform a series of three surgeries to put a shunt in.

Three days after Paisley's birth, her doctors discovered that Paisley also had Right Ventricular dependent Coronary Circulation. This meant the lower right part of her heart was smaller than it should be and was too firm, making it difficult for blood to be pumped out of the heart. Because of Paisley's overworked coronary arteries, the series of surgeries planned was scratched and at ten days old she was placed on the transplant list and in the meantime kept on her medication. After five and a half months of waiting for a new heart, Paisley underwent a direct heart transplant on October 13th of 2016. The results of this transplant were very pleasing, doctors had no major concerns and she accepted the new heart nicely.

Paisley got to go home in November and started living somewhat of a normal life with mom and dad keeping an eye on things and providing a safe and sterile environment for her. It wasn't until last summer in a post-transplant lab, that she started to have problems again. The doctor's confirmed that

Paisley's EBV (Epstein-Barr Virus) levels were beyond high and that she also had developed a post-transplant lymphoma. Her doctors decided to observe these levels for about a year and then in May of 2019 they started Paisley on rituximab infusions over the course of four weeks in hopes of shrinking the lymphoma.

Paisley definitely hasn't been able to completely experience the life of a stereotypical child with her struggles. She struggles with eating, has major reflux, doesn't gain enough weight, and has a gastrostomy tube. Living so far away from her main hospital down in the cities means there is a lot more at-home therapies and training that Paisley's parents, Chad and Candice, have to take responsibility of.

Several trips to the cities, medical bills, and prescriptions have overwhelmed the Straub family when they should only have to focus on their healing little girl. Chad, Candice, sister Taydin, brother Weston, and Paisley herself would genuinely appreciate any support from the surrounding communities that they can get. Please join us on August 10th of 2019 for a benefit to help Paisley's family lessen the burden of money. The "Joining Hearts for Paisley Benefit" will be a family-friendly event held at the Ruffed Grouse Roadhouse in Lengby, MN at 4 pm. There will be a pig roast at this event and plenty of activities including a silent auction, bean bag tournament, raffles, kids games, shirts for sale, and a DJ playing later in the evening.

Walter Dahlberg farm is named Century Farm

The family of Walter Dahlberg of Clearbrook has been notified by the Headwaters Farm Bureau Federation and the Minnesota State Fair that their farm has been designated a Century Farm in Clearwater County. What this means is that the farm has been under the ownership of a Dahlberg family member for 100 years.

To understand this award, we need to go back into one hundred years of history for Clearwater County and the surrounding area.

Hans Dahlberg was born in 1869 in Rittvik, Dalarna, Sweden. At age 23 (in 1892), he joined other Swedish immigrants and came to the Cambridge, Minn., area to work with some cousins. He met his wife in Cambridge and married her in 1901. They raised three children: Walter, Mary Ann, and Henry.

In January 1919, Hans and son Walter, age 17, loaded four freight train cars in Cambridge with their horses, cows, chickens, pigs, hay, grain and wood to burn at the farm that they had bought in Clearbrook. It took them three days to come from Cambridge to Clearbrook. Hans' wife Anna, son Henry, and daughter Maryann came later in the spring.

Hans bought the farm in 1919 from John Asplund, secured a loan, and paid him off. In their early years at Clearbrook they raised potatoes, and within four years paid off the loan, built a new barn, and bought a new car. Walter met his wife Ellen Sjolander when she helped pick potatoes for the Dahlbergs.

Walter and Ellen married in 1939 and bought a farm in another township. They raised four daughters: Linda, Dianne, Pam, and Cindy. All four girls attended Clearbrook High School. In 1953, Walter bought the Dahlberg farm from his dad.

Ellen graduated from high school at the age of 16, and after one year of normal training at Bemidji began teaching country school. She taught from 1929-1939. She quit teaching when she married Walter.

When World War II started, Ellen was recruited by Supt. Mae Barness to return to teaching at the Winsor School (north of Gonvick). When the war was over, she again quit teaching but returned to the classroom in the 1960's. By then, country schools were closed. She went back to college and earned her

teaching degree, graduating in 1966, the same year their daughter, Linda, graduated from high school. She taught in Lengby for two years and then in McIntosh until she retired at age 65.

After Walter retired from farming, his nephew David Dahlberg rented the Dahlberg farm and he continues to rent the pasture and fields today.

Besides teaching, Ellen raised raspberries and a big garden. Their daughter Dianne explained, "We canned everything, all kinds of fruit, including the raspberries. We also raised chickens and helped gather the eggs. Dad cut the heads off the chickens and we plucked and canned them."

"Mom loved to entertain and we had company almost every Sunday. The standard meal was fried chicken with lemon pie for dessert. Mom was famous for her cooking...especially her desserts." Pam's favorite was angel food cake with a chocolate sauce over it; Diane's was pumpkin pie.

The Dahlberg family belongs to the First Baptist Church in Clearbrook. Hans was one of the founding fathers of the First Baptist Church. Dianne's husband, Rick Moore, is also a pastor.

Walter enjoyed music, too. He was part of a male quartet called The Four Swedes. He sang tenor, along with Bill Anderson, Emil Nelson, and Elmer Anderson. Their pianist was Selma Nelson. They sang at many events around this area for over 30 years.

Life was much easier for the whole Dahlberg family when electricity was brought to rural farms by the REA. Before electricity, lanterns were a common source of light for the family. Diane added, "I still have one of the lamps that my father used."

Walter also drove school bus for many years. In the early years he used a sleigh and horses. He would heat bricks for the children to put their feet on to keep warm. He also drove bus for Lewis Emmel and later for Harlyn Johnson.

Dianne said, "Both Mom and Dad spoke Swedish, especially when they didn't want us girls to know what they were saying. Dad didn't learn to speak English until he went to grade school because his family spoke only Swedish all the time at home."

In 1995, Ellen went to Sweden as a tourist with Mary Eddy so she "could see her roots."

Today, Dianne's daughter

Heidi and granddaughter Anna live in the original farm house. Dianne and her husband Rick own a home on the Dahlberg property. Anna is the fifth generation to live on the Dahlberg farm.

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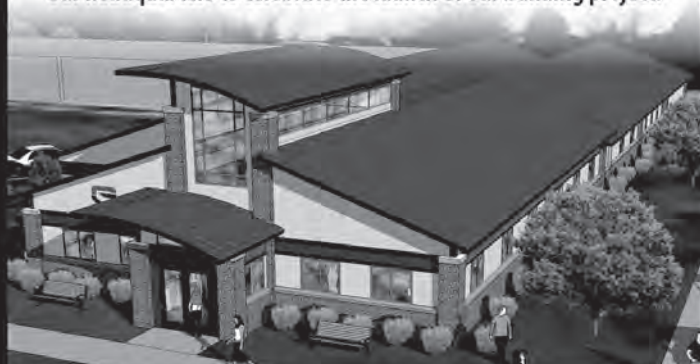

Road Weather Information Systems to be installed in Northwest Minnesota

BEMIDJI, Minn. – Beginning Monday, August 5, motorists traveling throughout northwest Minnesota can expect short term lane closures as Road Weather Information Systems (RWIS) are being installed in nine different locations. The project will be completed in October.

- Hwy 59 near Lancaster Mile Post (MP) 421.9
- Hwy 59 near Thief River Falls MP 363.4
- Hwy 9 near Beltrami MP 212.5

- Hwy 11 near Warroad MP 87.1
- Hwy 72 near MP 67.85
- Hwy 89 near Red Lake MP 19.13
- Hwy 1 near Goodridge MP 71.8
- Hwy 2 near Lengby MP 75.8
- Hwy 71 near Lake Itasca MP 281.1

A RWIS is an environmental sensor station in the field that is used to collect weather data such as atmospheric parameters, pavement conditions,

and visibility. MnDOT uses the information gathered as well as the camera images for maintenance decision support. The information is also sent to the National Weather Service as well as Minnesota's 511 system. There are currently 98 RWIS systems throughout Minnesota, with an additional 62 systems plan to be added over the next 3 years.

MnDOT reminds drivers to slow down, avoid distractions and follow traffic signs in work zones.

Clearbrook resident in custody after stabbing

On July 31, 2019 at approximately 9:50 p.m., the Clearwater County Sheriff's Office received a 911 call of a stabbing in the Rice Lake community in North La Prairie Township. Deputies from Clearwater and Mahanomen Counties and Officers from the White Earth Police Department responded to the call.

Upon arrival, a female victim was found lying outside a residence with an apparent stab wound to the chest. Bagley Sanford Ambulance attempted life saving measures but they were not successful. The victim, 37 year old Natasha Marie Thompson of Rice Lake was pronounced deceased at the scene.

A 23 year old male, Tristan Edward James Kilde of Clearbrook, MN was taken into custody and transported to the Clearwater County Jail where he will be held until his court appearance. The case remains under investigation by the Clearwater County Sheriff's Office.

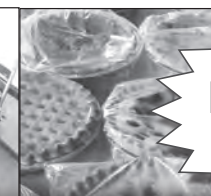

Ask a Trooper

Question: With the upcoming new hands free law that is effective August 1st,

can a teen that is under 18 years old and has a driver's permit or provisional driver's license use their phone in hands-free mode?

Answer: The new hands-free law does not change anything for teens under 18 with a driver's permit or provisional driver's license: They cannot make or answer calls while driving (hand-held or hands-free). They can use their phone in hands-free mode in the following situations:

- Using their phone as a GPS device, but only in hands-free or voice-activated mode. They must

set their destination before driving. They can't hold their phone at any time.

- Listening to music or podcasts in hands-free or voice-activated mode is OK, but hand-held scrolling through playlists or channels is not allowed under the law.

Teens under 18 are allowed to use the phone in either hand-held or hands-free mode for emergency situations only.

Corbitt Tractors

Summer is flying by but that doesn't stop me from keeping tractors on the mind. Last week I was scanning some episodes of my favorite show, Classic Tractor Fever, and I saw an episode that I hadn't watched in a long time and it caught my eye. It features the Corbitt tractor. I had never heard of the Corbitt until I saw this program. One thing that caught my eye was the apple green tractor with yellow trim. Not quite John Deere but close!

Corbitt began by building horse drawn buggies in the 1890's. Then Corbitt began building trucks and continued during WW II manufacturing trucks for the US army. After the war they made a try at tractors. The hope was that they would export 1000 tractors to Brazil, but the order fell through after they had manufactured about 50 tractors. There are only five known to exist today. The Corbitt had a Leroy engine and sure looked to be a well made tractor. Of course other than this episode of Classic Tractor Fever I have never seen a Corbitt.

When I was young my mom and dad bought me a book called Agricultural Tractors 1855-1950. I poured over that book.

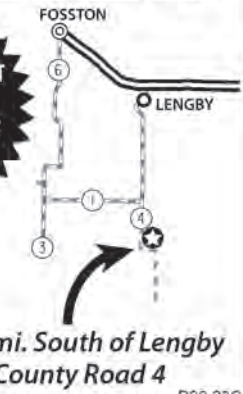
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Cadet World Series Brings Summer Recreation to Exciting Finish!
