International Competitors Arriving for World Ploughing Contest



Baudette, MN - They are here to represent. Represent their home country and represent their knowledge and skills to the world. The hundreds of hours of practice are coming to fruition.

They have traveled thousands of miles across the world to get to Baudette, MN. Many have shipped their tractors and

ploughs on a container prior to their arrival. They have arrived early to gain an advantage, get settled in, use to the time change, dialed in on the soil.

The prize, a trophy, and of course, the privilege to show the world you are the best plougher in the world. August 30 - September 1, competitors from 28 countries are competing

in Baudette, MN to be named world champion at the 2019 World Ploughing Contest.

The list of countries arriving early to the Lake of the Woods area is growing fast. Austria, New Zealand, Scotland, Wales, Ireland, Canada have feet on the ground and are tilling up soil with others arriving daily.

Lake of the Woods is known by most as The Walleye Capital of the World, not for farming. Although overshadowed, the region has a rich farming tradition with tens of thousands of acres of farmland and some unique crops. Located so far north, crops like specialty soybeans, rye grass, canola, barley, sunflowers, wild rice and wheat grow here. The area is the top producer of grass seed used throughout the U.S.

The World Ploughing Contest comes to the U.S. once every 30 years. Last year it was in Germany, next year, it's in Russia.

Competitors use a two bottom mouldboard plough to carefully configure the soil and accumulate points based on important criteria in the world of ploughing such as straightness, depth of furrow, consistency of rows. Judges closely monitor each competitor during this

timed event.

"Everything is about the plough," explains Joel Wagner, USA Ploughing Organization member who is in charge of the marshaling yard located adjacent to the competition fields. "Competitors are working with both metal and plastic mouldboards figuring out what is working best for this soil type." "They heat up and bend their mouldboards to perfectly form the soil for the best looking rows. This isn't about just ploughing soil, this is a work of art with the best looking rows possible."

"They are also modifying the jointers (the part of the plough that first enters the soil) on the plough so they clear the top of the soil leaving the perfect looking rows."

This event is open to the public and takes place just two miles south of Baudette. Aug 30 - 31 will feature the World Ploughing Contest. Sep 1 features the USA Nationals who determines who will represent the U.S. next year in Russia as well as the North American Championship, a contest between U.S. and Canadian ploughers.

In addition to the contest, there will be live music with



5 bands each day, a variety food vendors, international beer garden and a myriad of displays and demonstrations.

BBB issues warning, tips for college students more likely to be scammed

Burnsville, MN (Aug. 15, 2019) – August can be an expensive month for students returning to colleges and universities. Better Business Bureau of Minnesota and North Dakota has some tips to make sure scammers don't make the start of school even more expensive for those paying tuition, figuring out student aid, and buying school and dorm supplies.

According to BBB's 2018 Scam Tracker Risk Report, nearly 42% of students reported a loss when exposed to a scam as compared to 28% of non-students. Students, who are freshly exposed to managing their own finances, are online looking for ways to save. Whether you're starting school yourself or have kids who could be vulnerable to financial scams as they get started living on their own, BBB suggests watching out for these very red flags:

- **Fake Credit Cards** – It's no secret that college students are targeted with these as a quick and easy way to get money. Some credit cards deals could be a fake gimmick to get a student's personal information, and it could potentially stir up credit problems. Do your research on those credit card flyers and read the fine print before applying.
- **Too Good to be True Apartments** – An affordable, conveniently located apartment close to campus sounds like a great deal, but don't jump on it until you've viewed the apartment in person. And never give out credit card or other payment information until after you've viewed it and signed a lease.
- **Fake Credit Reports** – After the age of 18, it's a good idea to start becoming more aware of your credit score and start adapting some healthy money habits. It's also a helpful signifier of any unusual activity and possible ID fraud. While there are multiple traps online trying to snag your social security number with a fake credit score scam, you can safely check your credit score at annualcreditreport.com.
- **Scholarship and Grant Scams** – Phone calls from companies guaranteeing they can help reduce loan payments or set you up with a hefty grant are worth researching. Even searching the company online could bring up scam alerts from other victims. Contact the school's financial aid office for advice on the company's legitimacy or how they can help otherwise.
- **Employment Scams** – In 2018, employment scams were the No. 1 culprit for scams attacking 18- to 25-year-olds. Job offerings can be sent directly to school emails, promising flexible hours and beyond expected pay. There would be no need to send a social security number electronically without knowing exactly who you are sending it to.
- **Awareness of Current Scams** – As tech savvy as current college students can be, a surprising number of scams reported to BBB's ScamTracker (bbb.org/scamtracker) are from students who learned their lesson too late. Use Scam Tracker to learn of the latest scam trends and read local reports of specific incidents.

Ask a Trooper

Question: I recently saw someone pulled over to the side on the freeway with a flat tire. I pulled over also to approach them. Was what I did illegal?

Answer: This is legal as you were stopping on the freeway to offer assistance and this would fit under the "emergency stopping" criteria in the law.

Minnesota law does not allow motorists to stop on a freeway unless it is for an emergency. Signs are posted at all entrance ramps onto the freeway. Pedestrians, bicycles, motorized bicycles and non-motorized traffic also are prohibited onto the freeway.

If your vehicle ever becomes stalled on a roadway, attempt to move your vehicle out of the lanes of traffic and as far off onto the shoulder as possible. Activate you 4-way flashers and

call for assistance if needed. Tow truck operators will change the flat tire for you or tow your vehicle to a safe location where it can safely be changed. If you plan on changing a flat tire and you are in a dangerous section of the road, we can provide emergency lights and assistance, but the best and safest option is to call for a tow truck.

While waiting for assistance to arrive, stay in your vehicle and put on your seatbelt. In the event that your stalled vehicle is ever struck, being inside your vehicle with your seatbelt on can save your life and keep you from being injured.

If you are approaching a stalled vehicle and see someone changing a tire or working on their vehicle on the roadway, slow down and move over for them, just like you would for an emergency vehicle.

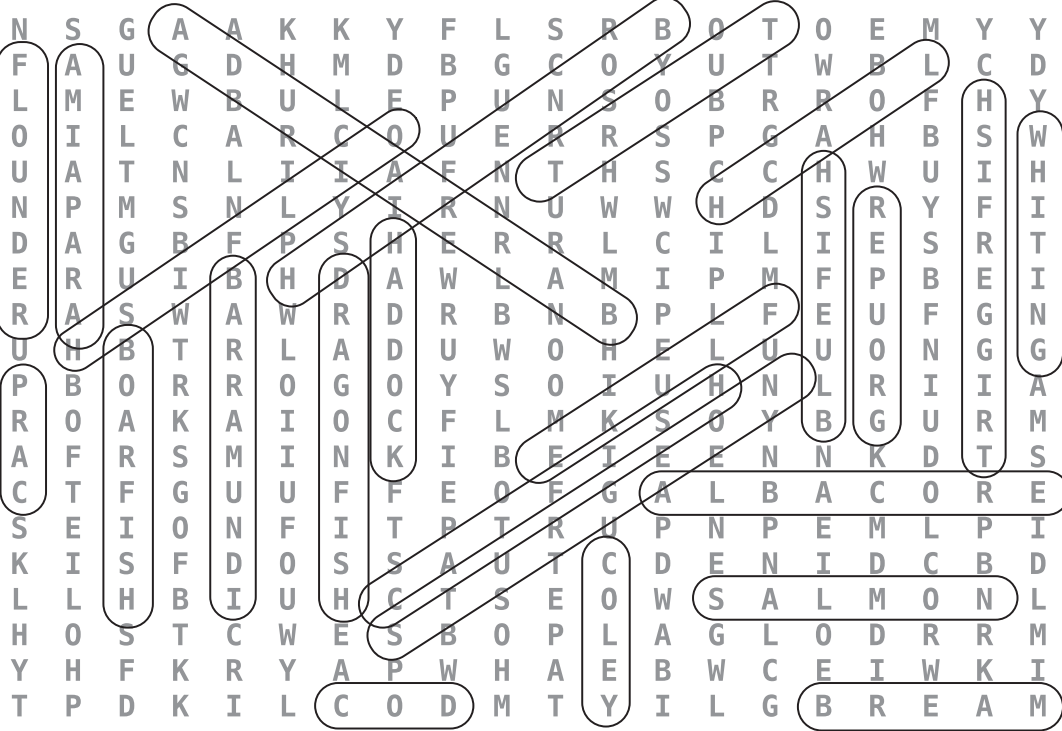

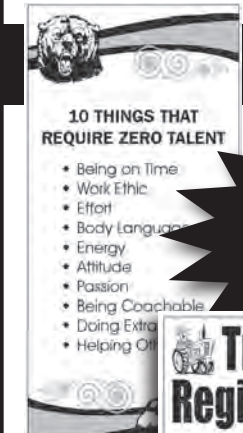

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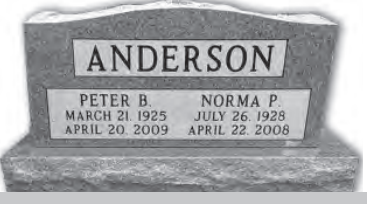

2018-19 winter costs MnDOT \$133 million

Season was most severe in nearly a decade

ST. PAUL, Minn. — The Minnesota Department of Transportation spent nearly \$133 million dollars to clear roads during the 2018-19 winter season and crews faced some of the most severe weather in the state in a decade, according to a new MnDOT winter maintenance report released today.

“The Winter Maintenance Report helps tell the story very clearly: with the fifth-largest roadway system in the country and more extreme weather conditions than most states, it costs a lot of money to maintain transportation infrastructure and keep people moving in Minnesota,” said Commissioner Margaret Anderson Kelliher. “I’m so proud of the employees of MnDOT, who worked long hours through challenging conditions to keep our roads safe.”

The annual report breaks down fiscal year costs, winter severity, snow totals and other factors. Statistics are separated by each of MnDOT’s eight transportation districts to show the

variety of impact across the state.

The statewide snowfall average was 97.2 inches, the result of 31 snow events during the 2018-19 winter season. Those storms created a statewide Winter Severity Index score of 154, nearly 40 points higher than during 2017-18 and the most severe since MnDOT began tracking a severity level this way. The Winter Severity Index compares nine factors that affect snow and ice removal, including temperature, hours of snowfall, blowing snow and precipitation type.

“Snowfall amounts don’t tell the whole story about the challenges MnDOT crews face during winter,” said Jed Falgren, acting state maintenance engineer. “Every area of the state experienced more hours of snowfall compared to the previous winter. Road and air temperature averages were down and hours of freezing rain were up – those elements have a huge impact on how quickly we

Austin McClellan and Alex Johnson led the field of Midwest Mods to the green flag with McClellan taking the lead down the front straight. Zach Jackson, Brandon Bahr, Weston RAMs-rud and Dean Eggebraaten held the top five spots. Bahr moved up on the inside into third and then took second in the first turn. Eggebraaten powered up into third on the back straight before spins once again brought out the caution flag for a restart sending Jackson tailback. With the green flag once again waving Bahr pulled up side by side with the leader McClellan with Eggebraaten tight on their bumpers. Eggebraaten grabbed the backup position following another restart as point leader Skyler Smith makes his first appearance in the top five behind fourth place Matt Fullerton. Eggebraaten raced up side by side with McClellan and eventually took the lead and cruised to the victory. Smith finished third ensuring his Season points championship. Later the second place car of McClellan was DQ'd for failing to tech moving Smith into second with Bahr third, Jeff Reed fourth and Fullerton fifth.

Wisconsin Mod Four Feature:

Dean Shaver and Garrett Masurka brought the pack of mod fours down the front straight with Shaver taking the lead. Blake Erickson, Masurka raced side by side for second with Adam Prieve racing inside into third dropping Masurka to fourth as Conrad Schwinn moved into fifth. Erickson coming out of turn four took the lead down the front straight. A rare spin by Prieve brought the

yellow flag out sending him tailback for the restart. The restart was controlled by the leader Erickson with Shaver, Masurka, Schwinn and Trevor Voss in the top five. Prieve showing why he is the current point leader quickly brought his #9 mod four back into the top five and then racing on the high side passed several cars to take the lead with an impressive comeback. Prieve pulled into victory lane with the win and the Season points championship. Erickson, Schwinn, Voss and Nicole Feda finished in the top five.

Wisconsin Super Stocks Feature:

Harley Kroening and Tim Carlson led the Wisconsin Superstocks to the green flag with Kroening taking the lead followed by Matt Sparby, Carlson, Dalton Carlson and Brandon Bahr. Racing side by side for first between Kroening and Tim Carlson and side by side for third between Sparby and Dalton Carlson the laps ticked off on the fast track. Kroening regained the front spot and held it to the finish line. Dalton Carlson powered up to take second and claim the Season points championship. Sparby was third with Tim Carlson fourth.

Wisconsin Modified Feature:

As the skies got heavier the Wisconsin Modifieds roared on track with John Farrington on the pole and Doug VanMill outside. Farrington powered into the lead with VanMill. Josh Beaulieu, Ken Hron and Tim Jackson trailing. Beaulieu raced up into second in turn two before a spin brought out the caution flag setting up a restart. Hron did a 360 in turn two and continued to race from the rear of the field and quickly caught and returned to contention. Farrington was running away from the field with a big lead as Scott Engholm raced up into fourth as Van Mill dropped back. Engholm moved up into a side by side race with Beaulieu but the #22 of Beaulieu held his line and the position. Hron raced up into fourth where he finished an impressive race. Farrington went on to win his first ever Modified feature with Beaulieu, Engholm, Hron, and Jackson in the top five.

Wisconsin Hornets Feature:

Jordan Thayer and Andy

Hanson led the Hornets down the front straight for their feature with Thayer taking the early lead. Jared Miller in the Pookie Strong car powered up and into the lead in turn one and two on the next lap. Following a two car spin and restart it was Miller out front with Thayer, Hanson, Travis Olafson and Paul Ripley in the top five. Ripley moved up and raced door to door with Thayer for second and eventually took the spot. Heavy contact between Andy Hanson and Ross Magnuson sent Hanson rolling down the front straight three times and landing on its roof. The race was red flagged as track safety personnel checked on Hanson. He was unhurt but done for the race as his car was loaded on the flatbed truck. Miller drove to the victory with Ripley second and Thayer third.

Bemidji Mini Stocks Feature:

John Current and Connor Drewry led the pack of mini stocks to the green flag with Current taking the lead over Drewry. Jake Geschwill was third with Nic Jacobson and Conrad Schwinn in the top five. Schwinn moved up quickly on the inside taking third and then drove up to challenge Current for the lead. Racing down the front straight Schwinn made the pass. Racing into turn two the two lead cars tangled in a spin sending Current tailback for a restart. Geschwill put in his best effort of the year to pass Drewry for second as Schwinn took the win and secured his Season points championship. Geschwill, Drewry, Jacobson and Travis Seitz finished in the top five.

Outlaw Mini Mod Feature:

The Outlaw Mini Mods were the final feature of the night as Jerry Larson and Tyler Jonson led the pack on track. Larson took the lead over Justin Besch with Jonson, Kelly Steele and Ben VanSile in the top five. Besch raced inside in turn two and took the lead and quickly created some space between himself and the field. Charging up from his fourth row starting position was Justin Cutrer racing into second and then took the lead following a restart after Steele rolled his mini

mod in turn two and returned remarkable to finish the race. Cutrer grabbed the lead late in the race following a side by side race with Jonson. The 17 year old Cutrer drove to victory lane with the win. No other results available for this race.

In 1996 Northern was sold to Southwest Gas Company and employs over 4000 people. Northern's name is now NPL.

As the company grew, some individuals spun off and started their own companies: North Central Service, Wilde Const., (now owned by Mas Tec), Sovde Enterprises, Aconite, Charps and Gustafson & Goudge. Founders of these companies are: Torgersons, Wildes, Sovdes, Falldorf, Rongstad, Brunkow, Charpentiers, Gustafson and Goudge.

As the companies grew so did local employment and more and more local people further enhanced their knowledge and expertise in the construction and ongoing maintenance of mainline pipelines, natural gas distribution systems, pumping stations, fiber optics and underground telephone/electrical utilities. This LOCAL EXPERTISE coupled with LOCAL EXPERIENCE in constructing high quality products in a safe manner became very valuable to local and national industries and economies. These LOCAL employees continue to bring home to our 7 county area multi-millions of dollars in disposable income yearly which is invested in the communities. These employees are now an economic power house that is a major economic contributor to the 7 county area from Thief River Falls to Bemidji.
