Find new studios, artists at Art Leap 2019

Art Leap, an “open studio event” featuring artists and guest artists, will offer 20 sites and feature more than 65 artists and musicians at studios and other locations in Hubbard, Becker and Wadena counties.

The event will be held Saturday and Sunday, Sept. 28 and 29. Studios will be open from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Saturday and 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. Sunday.

It's a great time to purchase original art for your home, office or as gifts and meet the artist who created it.

As you drive from studio to studio you can expect to see fall colors at their peak. At some studios and other sites, visitors will find artists doing demonstrations, hear live music and enjoy treats. Brochures will be available in mid-August at the Park Rapids Lakes Area Chamber of Commerce Visitor Center, Park Rapids Area Library and other locations and at www.prlaac.org.

Three new sites will be part of this year's event.

The Hubbard County Developmental Achievement Center (DAC) will be showing work created by clients working with local artists Nate Luetgers and Marsha Wolf. Art here will include mosaics, paintings and murals, woodworking and rugs made using recycled materials. Client artists will be available to discuss their work and the experience. Visitors also are invited to see a new sculpture created out of reused materials located at the Salvage Depot at 320 Career Path (Highway 34 east, north of the AmericInn).

Sandy Fynboh Andress will return after a two-year hiatus. She is currently focusing on her original love of glass beads and small sculptural works. Using a torch and a few simple tools, she creates art beads and floral sculptures from both Effetre and borosilicate glass. These techniques include scientific glass blowing processes using

boro tubing, murine cane making in soft glass and much more. Guest artist Dianne Poncelet will be displaying her floral abstracts in acrylic. Sandy will be doing demonstrations at 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. Saturday and noon Sunday. Dianne will be demoing her techniques at noon Saturday. Visitors will be able to try making layered backgrounds at an activity table.

Mary Follett is opening her studio at Bad Medicine Lake for Art Leap visitors. A retired art teacher, she uses meaningful objects given to her to include in artworks she has done for family and friends. Her mediums are found object assemblages and paper mache. Some of her artworks have been influenced from winter trips to Mexico. Her sister, Barb Christiansen, will be a guest. She does fiber

arts and metal works, weaving and knitting and may bring her spinning wheel and spin.

In addition to new locations, several studios who have participated in past years will host new guest artists and new works that will interest first time and returning visitors. Live performances also are scheduled at several sites both days.

Forestedge Winery and Gallery near Laporte also invites guests on the tour.

Essentia Health unveils anti-vaping campaign, toolkits

As the use of electronic-cigarettes continues to rise, Essentia Health and community partners are aggressively pushing back against the epidemic with a “Don't Blow It” anti-vaping campaign.

Campaign toolkits are hosted online and feature a variety of resources aimed at curbing vaping. Tools include educational materials, posters, fact sheets and infographics, as well as support for users looking to quit. The campaign is the result of repeated requests from area schools seeking help in educating their students about the dangers associated with vaping.

Earlier this month, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention issued a warning against the use of e-cigarettes, which are battery-operated devices that simulate smoking and contain nicotine and heavy metals like nickel, tin and lead — among other harmful chemicals.

The CDC's alert came amid its investigation into hundreds of vaping-related sicknesses and at least five deaths. A rash of users have reported possible pulmonary disease. Lung injuries and seizures have become increasingly prevalent.

According to the 2018 National Youth Tobacco Survey, administered by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration, 1.5 million more students used e-cigarettes compared to 2017. There was a 78 percent increase in use among high school students, from 11.7 to 20.8 percent. And there was a 48 percent increase in use among middle school students, from 3.3 to 4.9 percent. Overall, e-cigarette use also has led to a surge in tobacco use.

Locally, the 2017 Youth Risk Behavior Survey shows that 35 percent of students in the Fargo area have tried vaping.

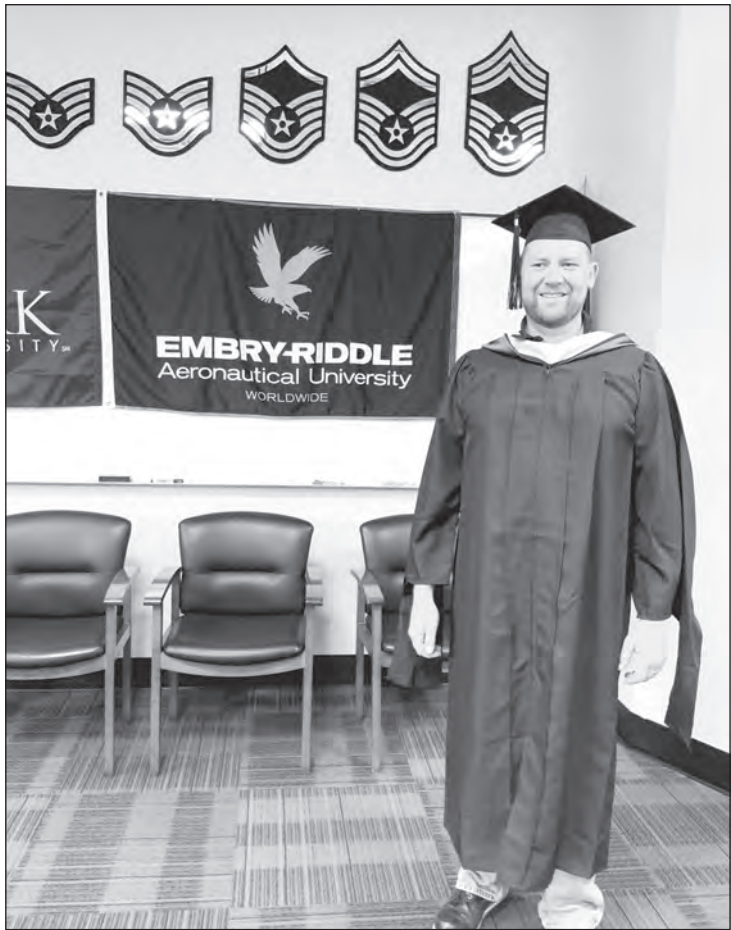

Polk County Sheriff

Motor Vehicle Accident City of Fertile

On 9/10/19 shortly after 11:00 AM, the Polk County Sheriff's Office was dispatched to JT's Station in Fertile for a report of a vehicle that had struck the building and drove away. A short time later a second call was received stating the vehicle had returned to the scene and struck the building again.

Deputies arrived and spoke with the driver of the vehicle identified as Benjamin Michael Brant of Fertile. They observed damage on Brant's vehicle consistent with the damage on the exterior of the building. After further investigation, Brant was placed under arrest for suspicion of DWI and driving after revocation.

There were no injuries. No further information will be released at this time.

Meth Lab

On 9-4-19 at approximately 1603 hours Polk County Deputies initiated a traffic stop approximately 3 miles south of Fosston on Polk County Road 6 resulting in the arrest of Cohen James Curfman (10-21-91) of Fosston for meth possession and DWI. Also arrested for meth possession were Alicia Jill Muth (11-14-85) of Becker, MN and Jorden Anthony Shea (1-19-91) of Princeton, MN.

Further investigation conducted by the Pine to Prairie Drug Task Force resulted in the execution of a search warrant at 43988 340th Ave SE, Cohen Curfman's residence. Investigators found all the active ingredients for a one pot style methamphetamine lab and an old one pot style lab in residence.

Investigators with the Pine to Prairie Drug Task Force/ Polk County Sheriff's Office and Clearwater County Sheriff's Office/ Headwaters Safe Trails Task Force safely dismantled the lab.

Complaints filed in Polk County District Court as follows:

Cohen James Curfman - 1st Degree Manufacture of Methamphetamine, Attempted 1st Degree Manufacture of Methamphetamine, Possession of Methamphetamine Precursors with Intent to Manufacture, 2 counts of Felony Controlled Substance Crime in the 5th Degree - Possession, and 4th Degree DWI.

Alicia Jill Muth - Felony Controlled Substance Crime in the 5th Degree - Possession and Giving a False Name to a Peace Officer.

Jorden Anthony Shea - Felony Controlled Substance Crime in the 5th Degree.

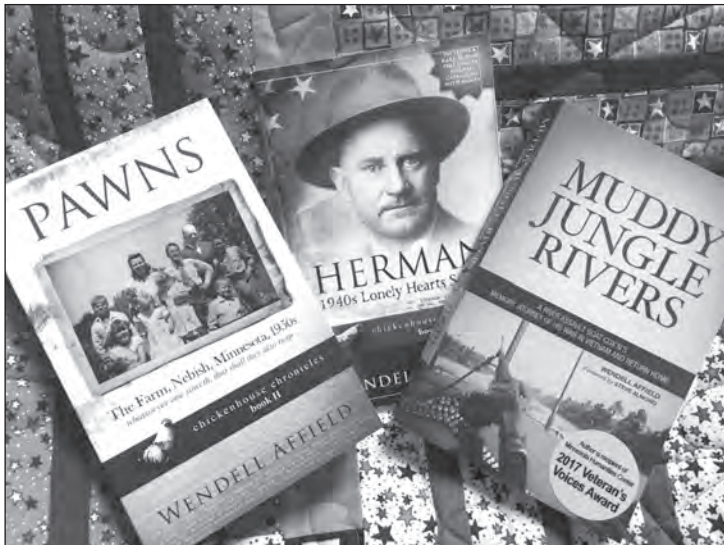

NELL speaker Wendell Affield to share "Links to the Past"

Wendell Affield never knew who his father was. His mother Barbara lived an unusual life. He grew up listening to her stories about being a concert pianist, playing in Carnegie Hall, touring Europe, and teaching at Juilliard School of Music—he never heard about her homelessness and struggle with mental illness. In 2006 Wendell began a series of interviews with his mother, hoping to tell her story, never suspecting that the key to it lay decomposing in the chickenhouse, seventy feet from where they sat visiting in the old farmhouse near Nebish,

Minnesota. After she died in 2010, Affield and his sister salvaged the chickenhouse treasures dated back to 1822.

In the attic of his childhood home he discovered 1940s lonely hearts publications and his mother's advertisement in Cupid's Columns where his stepfather Herman Affield had discovered her. Herman was a first-generation German immigrant's son who had been born in Wahpeton, North Dakota. Over the past nine years Wendell has spent countless hours studying, scanning, and transcribing thousands of documents.

Clearwater County Sheriff

On September 12, 2019 at 8:19 pm, a report came into the Clearwater County Sheriff's Office about a female walking along 340th Street west of the Bagley Shooting Star Casino. The caller was concerned as the person was walking partially into the traffic lane. A Clearwater County Deputy responded to the call and while enroute a second call was received relaying the same information. When the deputy arrived in the area, he observed a vehicle driving slowly and then pull off to the side of the road. The deputy stopped to speak to the driver and was notified that they thought they had just hit something in the roadway, possibly a deer. It was discovered that the vehicle had struck a person who had been laying in the roadway. Life saving measures were performed on the victim and the person was transported by ambulance but later died from injuries sustained at the accident scene. The victim was identified as 28-year-old Emily Ann Stevens of the Rice Lake area in Clearwater County. The accident remains under investigation by the Clearwater County Sheriff's Office. Other agencies assisting at the scene were the White Earth Police Department, Bagley and Clearbrook/Gonvick Police Departments and the Bagley Sanford Ambulance.

Fake Radio War Stirs Terror Through U.S.

On October 30th, 1938, Orson Wells and the CBS Mercury Theater on national radio performed the show, War of the Worlds. This was performed on prime time in the golden age of radio.

When the show started most Americans were listening to NBC where Ventriloquist Edgar Bergen and his dummy, Charlie McCarthy were performing a twelve minute comedy skit. When they were done an unknown singer came on so a lot of people switched their dial to CBS where War of the Worlds had already started.

Perhaps as many as a million radio listeners believed a real Martian attack was underway.

Panic broke out all over the

Diaries and old letters took him down many paths. From a WWI groomsman that his grandmother wrote KIA next to, to a sleepy town in southern Poland where his mother met and fell in love with a Polish engineer just weeks before Hitler invaded. In 2018 Wendell visited the home of his 4th great grandfather in Racine, Wisconsin. Many documents opened doors—clues discovered in a 1946 deposition led to a recent DNA link and discovery of his paternal family.

Wendell will share—through a PowerPoint discussion—treasures he unearthed through research—his mother's commitment records from Fergus Falls State Hospital; court documents taking away parental rights when he and his siblings were placed in foster homes; generations old insights he gained from the current owners of the Fratt Mansion in Everett, Washington.

Wendell is the author of three books; Muddy Jungle Rivers, a Vietnam War Memoir. In 2017 he published the first in his Chicken house Chronicles series, Herman, and in 2018, Pawns.

A drive through town turns up a friend walking briskly with husband. Recognizable they are as their family owned the local grocery for many a decade. The store remains the hub of predictability. Although the market is no longer operated by them, the location is the same and so I enter...just because

I make my way to dad's house. He is there. Within his favorite chair he sits...waving one finger in the air. It's a familiar greeting. I like it. It comforts. It is predictable. Ask a Trooper

Question: As we are ending the Motorcycle season

I heard of an individual near Rochester, MN whom was killed by going off the road and struck a sign head on. He was not wearing a helmet. Being an individual whom has been in a motorcycle accident with the helmet likely saving my life, why are helmets not required in the State of Minnesota for all two and three wheel bikes?

Answer: In my law enforcement career, I investigated far too many serious injury and fatal motorcycle crashes where a helmet could have made a difference.

There is no helmet law in Minnesota, unless the operator is under 18 years of age or is operating with a permit. Even

though there is no helmet law, it is recommended that one is worn to help prevent death or serious injury.

The benefits helmets offer are clear; they protect the head in the event of a crash. In 2018, only sixteen (28%) of the 58 motorcycle riders killed were known to be wearing a helmet. Of the 913 motorcyclists injured, only 416 (46%) were known to be wearing a helmet.

In 2018, 550 (55%) motorcycle crashes were single-vehicle crashes. In these crashes, the factors that reporting officers list most often are run off road (14%), careless/negligent/erratic driving (13%) and driver speeding (9%).

Just under half of all motorcycle crashes involve a collision with another vehicle. In many crashes, the driver never saw

the motorcyclist — or did not see the rider until it was too late. It is important for everyone to pay attention and avoid all distractions while driving. We need to be 100 percent attentive when driving any type of motor vehicle.

My advice is to always wear an approved helmet as it can and will reduce your chances of being seriously injured or killed.

Here is just an excerpt from his first page...

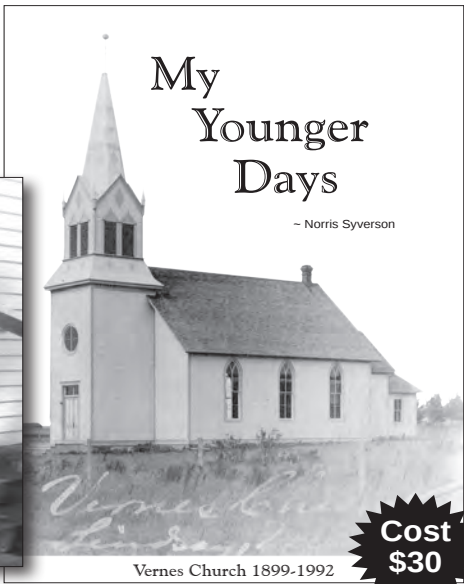

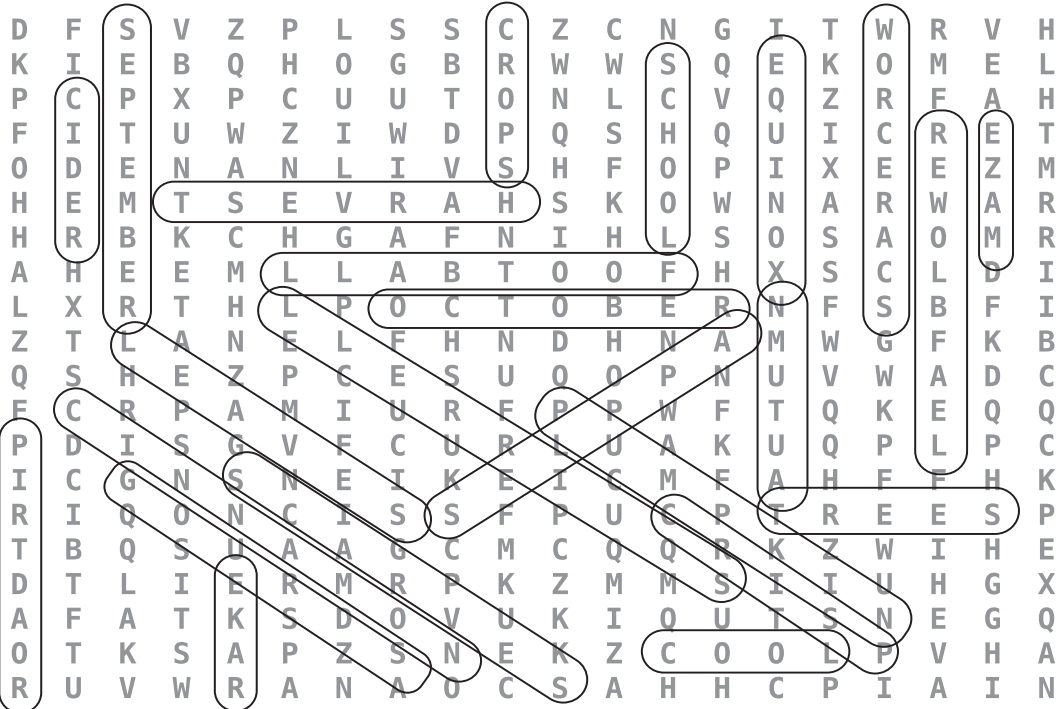

Plowing Model D John Deere

Last weekend I went to do a little more research for my tractor article. I went to Strathcona to the Northland Threshing Bee. The fall is always busy so occasionally I don't get to go. This year my wife and I got to make the trip. When we arrived they were having their parade. We watched many tractors go by, Farmall, Oliver's, a Gambles Farm Crest, lots of John Deeres, and even a couple Minneapolis Molines. After the parade we walked around to some to the buildings and exhibits. We watched a Rumley Oil Pull run the threshing machine. Then I looked over and saw one of my favorite activities...a couple guys were running a John Deere binder with an A John Deere and another rack pulled by an Allis Chalmers was picking bundles. But my favorite was a D John Deere pulling a three bottom John Deere plow. I love plowing and I love the old

model Ds.

One of my fondest memories of tractor stories includes hearing my dad tell about the 1925, "spoker D", they owned on the farm near Clearbrook in the late 1940's. When they moved to the farm it came with an F-20 Farmall. Grandpa traded with George Felch of Shevlin. So long F-20, hello Model D John Deere! I think this was the start of a family farming with mostly John Deere tractors. So I guess this old D is the reason I love John Deere!!

When John Deere wanted to release the model D tractor sales were poor and John Deere's board of directors were not sure if they should release their model D. Who would buy it? But, farmers bought the model D and John Deere tractor sales grew. Starting in 1923 the very early D's had a 26 in. spoked flywheel, and the steering on the left side. In 1925 the 24 in.

spoked flywheel was used, and in 1926 a solid flywheel replaced the earlier spoked flywheels. This of course makes a "spoker D" a real collector's item. These early unstyled D's had 2 forward speeds and one reverse(not known for it's speed!). In 1939 the model D was styled. The new sheet metal design streamlined the tractors, just as automobiles were doing during this time. The D went through many changes over the years. It became the longest produced tractor model in history.

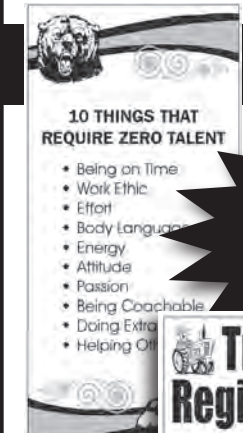

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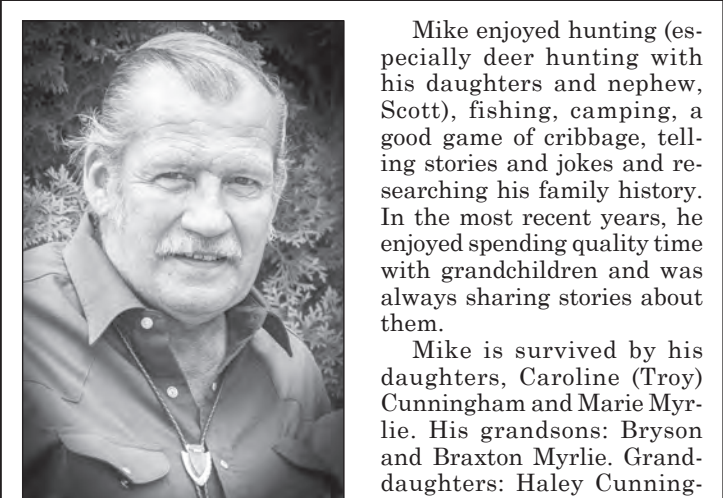
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Services held for Michael Myrlie

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Did you know?
The American Academy of Family Physicians notes that children should get at least one hour of physical activity per day. The AAPF notes that many kids easily achieve that marker simply by being children and engaging in the activities kids are drawn to each day, such as running, climbing and playing games like tag with other youngsters. The Canadian Paediatric Society notes that exercise needs change as children advance through various stages in life, and that means activities should change along with them. For example, the CPS recommends that physical activities for toddlers should be fun and encourage children to explore and try new things. Unstructured physical activity or free play can benefit toddlers. As toddlers become preschoolers, physical activities can become more structured, though the CPS notes that children this age may not understand the rules of organized sports nor are they necessarily coordinated enough to participate in them. However, structured activities like games of tag and throwing and catching may be appropriate for some preschoolers. As children enter kindergarten and advance through elementary school, physical activities can be moderate to vigorous in intensity. Organized sports can become part of the fitness regimen at this time, though the CPS recommends short instruction times, flexible rules, free time in practices, and a focus on fun rather than competition. Parents who want to learn about age-appropriate physical activities can encourage their children to embrace fitness and are urged to speak with their children's physicians.
