Red Lake Band Members File Court injunction Against Blood Quantum Action

Red Lake, Minnesota-Tribal members of the Red Lake Band of Chippewa Indians have filed a court injunction to stop an October 8, 2019 tribal council action declaring all Red Lake members on its 1958 enrollment membership roll as full blood Indians.

Band member Kim Baker cites a lack of adequate research, consultation with band members and political motives in what she sees as a "rush job" which should have been put before band members in a referendum vote. Red Lake Tribal Secretary Strong is the subject of the injunction.

The injunction comes after

an October 8, 2019 tribal council resolution spearheaded by Strong was ratified by the tribal council. Baker feels that the tribal council and Strong who led the effort was negligent by doing so without thorough research and voter participation.

Baker maintains that the Tribal Council action does not remedy the mathematical genocide quandary that many tribes are struggling to address. What it does is reset the clock and in effect allows potentially thousands of new enrollees who have very little Indian blood to become members. These new enrollees will compete with existing members over already

scarce financial resources, lands and natural resources.

A survey and community meetings were held to generate input, but Baker claims that attendance was low at the meetings and the survey sample size was a mere fraction of the overall voting membership numbering in the thousands, therefore unreliable.

The Red Lake Tribal Council will discuss the injunction and discuss new enrollee applications at the February Red Lake Tribal Council meeting, which is open to the public. Baker and other band members will attend with additional demands including a referendum vote.

Northwest Minnesota Arts Council Sponsors Winter Fantasy Art Exhibit at NCTC

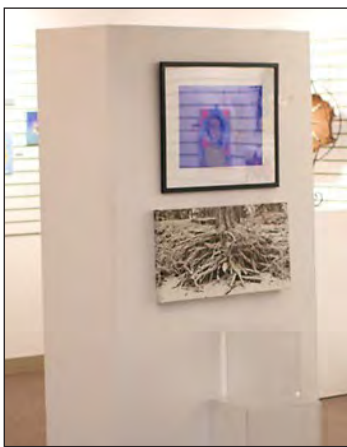

2020 Sculpture Trail entries are invited

The City of Park Rapids and Park Rapids Arts and Culture Advisory Commission are accepting entries for the Park Rapids Sculpture Trail.

Entry deadline is April 30. Artists will be notified of selection committee results by May 15 and will have until May 27 to install their works. Artists receive a \$350 honorarium during installation and \$150 during sculpture removal.

The entry form is available by calling City Planner Andrew Mack at 218-732-3163 or by emailing him at a.mack@arvig.net.

An unveiling and guided walk of the new installations are planned May 30.

Sponsors for each new sculpture also are being sought and will be recognized with signage and in a brochure. The number of sculptures selected will be determined by the number of sponsors who commit. Sponsors also may contact Mack at city hall for more information.

The Sculpture Trail project was initiated in 2018 in Red Bridge Park, providing a beautiful setting on the Fish Hook River. Last year, the Sculpture Trail expanded to two locations in Downtown Park Rapids. The Arts and Culture Commission's intent is to change the sculptures annually to expose visitors art both locations to new works.

The project meets three goals and objectives of the city's Arts and Culture Plan:

- * promoting the creation and inclusion of art in public spaces, making it accessible to all.
- * making the city a regional destination for unique arts and cultural experiences. It can be expected that art in an unexpected location will convey to park visitors and trail users that Park Rapids has much to offer as an arts community.
- * adding an element of creative placemaking as an approach to improving quality of life and economic opportunity.



The Park Rapids Sculpture Trail will be refreshed in 2020 with entries and sponsors invited for six locations in Red Bridge Park and up to two locations in Downtown Park Rapids. Patrick Shannon's "Sunrise" was among the entries accepted in 2019.

SILAGE AVALANCHE: It CAN Happen to Anyone

Keith Bolsen, Professor Emeritus, Kansas State University, says very emphatically that, "silage avalanches happen ... believe it!"

Keith has spent years working with the feedyard industry in the US to raise awareness about the safety hazards found around bunker silos and silage piles. He can share one story after the other about employees, nutritionists, or bystanders having a near-miss incident or being injured in a silage avalanche. Many survivors have shared their stories with Keith. But not everyone lives to talk about their experience.

"An avalanche happens without warning," Bolsen says. "In a fraction of a second, part of a silage face can silently break off and fall. It can be deadly for anyone located beneath it."

Taking samples from a feed-out face is a common practice in feedyards, but one that can quickly lead to tragedy. Mac Rickels, a nutritionist in Comanche, Texas, had done this many times without any trouble. But one day, after taking a sample from a 32-foot high feed-out face, Rickels was standing about 20 feet away when 12 tons of silage collapsed on him.

"His chest hit his knees with such force that it shattered two of the bones in his leg," Bolsen says.

Fortunately, a farm employee saw what happened and pulled Rickels out of the silage. Later, Mac said he didn't hear or see anything before the avalanche hit him.

"He acknowledged that he had become complacent about working around silage because nothing ever happened, until that one time," Bolsen says.

Bolsen, who regularly visits dairies and feedyards, says he sees far too many 20- to 25-foot high feed-out faces in bunker silos and silage piles. It's common sense to realize that a silage face that exceeds 20 feet tall is far more dangerous than one that is only 12 to 14 feet tall.

"A necessary part of my job is collecting silage and high-moisture grain samples," Al Kruse, a beef cattle nutritionist from Sterling, Kansas, says. "In the

spring of 1983, I was collecting a sample of high-moisture grain sorghum in a bunker silo at a feedyard. I had performed this task hundreds of times before and never thought about being in any danger."

As a feedyard employee and Kruse approached the feed-out face, it suddenly collapsed and buried Kruse. Fortunately, the falling grain didn't hit the employee. The heel of Kruse's boot was exposed, and the employee pulled him from the ensiled grain.

"I sustained only minor injuries and spent 24 hours in the hospital for observation," Kruse says. "The 'buddy rule' saved my life that afternoon."

No silage pile is completely safe. Tulare, California, dairy nutritionist Doug DeGross pulled samples from a 12-foot face, then turned to walk to his pickup.

"The sun basically went out," DeGross says. "I couldn't see any light and the feed covered me completely. I knew what was happening before I hit the ground. The entire face fell on me, about 20 tons of silage. I remember thinking, 'I don't want to die here today!'"

Fortunately, DeGross was able to brush the silage away from his face and call for help.

"A nearby dairy employee pulled me from the pile," DeGross says. "I am blessed to be here, and everything works. I am physically, mentally and spiritually healthier today than I was on the day of the accident."

DeGross thought feed-out face looked safe from every angle, but he was wrong.

Richard Porter, owner and manager of Porter Cattle Company in Reading, Kansas, thought his pickup should be safe when he parked it about 12 feet back from the face of a bunker silo that was about 14 feet high.

"While I was standing about

30 yards away talking to an employee, the silage collapsed," Porter says. "It hit the hood of my truck hard enough that you could clearly see the outline of the air cleaner."

Porter's experience supports the recommendation to stay much further away from a silage feed-out face than the face's height.

Suffocation is generally the cause of death in a silage avalanche. Any time someone works alone around a bunker silo or silage pile, an avalanche can be especially deadly because, once buried in several feet of silage, chances of surviving the avalanche greatly decrease within just a few minutes.

Undercutting a feed-out face by digging into it with a loader bucket usually creates a dangerous overhang of silage that can break loose. This scenario is common when the height of the silage in a bunker or pile is greater than the loader can safely reach.

"If a loader must be driven close the feed-out face in an over-filled bunker or pile, the buddy rule should be strictly enforced, no exceptions," Bolsen says. "Silage samples should be obtained from a loader bucket at a safe distance from the feed-out face."

Vehicles should be parked at least three times further from the feed-out face than its height. Any time a new silage crop is packed against existing silage, clearly mark the point where the two silages join, and use caution when the feed-out face approaches the joined area.

Bolsen recommends posting warning signs around bunker silos and silage piles to remind workers and any bystanders of the unseen dangers posed by the silage feed-out face. The sign should read, "Danger! Silage Face Might Collapse."

If a bunker or pile is located in a remote area, the perimeter should be fenced and a sign posted saying, "Danger: Do Not Enter. Authorized Personnel Only."

To reduce the risk of an avalanche, avoid filling bunker silos and building drive-over piles to excessive heights. Never work or stand closer to a feed-out face than three times its height and take care not to become complacent.

Bottom line. Never think an avalanche cannot happen to you.

"Accidents are caused by unsafe behavior or conditions due to the actions of people," Bolsen says. "There has never been an unavoidable silage-related fatal accident. Learn all you can about silage safety practices and make them part of your daily routine."

Ask a Trooper

Question: This winter has provided snowbanks -

barriers in town, eliminating the turn lane, between our east and west bound lanes. If a school bus is stopped and the stop arm is extended, does the opposing traffic have to stop?

Answer: Motorists are not required to stop for a bus if the bus is on the opposite side of a separated roadway (median, etc.) — but they should remain alert for pedestrians.

With snowbanks or non-fixed barriers, motorists are required to stop when the stop-arm is extended and red flashing lights are activated on a school bus and when the roadways are

not separated. When in doubt, always side on the side of caution and stop for school buses.

Many school buses are equipped with video cameras and this footage can be used as evidence against a driver if a violation has occurred.

The fine for a school bus stop- arm/red lights violation is a minimum of \$500.

Last year, law enforcement across the state wrote nearly 1,200 stop-arm violation citations. Failing to stop for a school bus is not only illegal but it puts our children at risk.

Minnesota state law requires motorists to stop at least 20 feet from a school bus that is displaying red flashing lights and its stop-arm is extended when

approaching from the rear or from the opposite direction on undivided roads.

Drivers can face criminal charges for passing a school bus on the right, passing when a child is outside the bus, or injuring or killing a child.

“What are you doing?” He bluntly asked...looking puzzled.

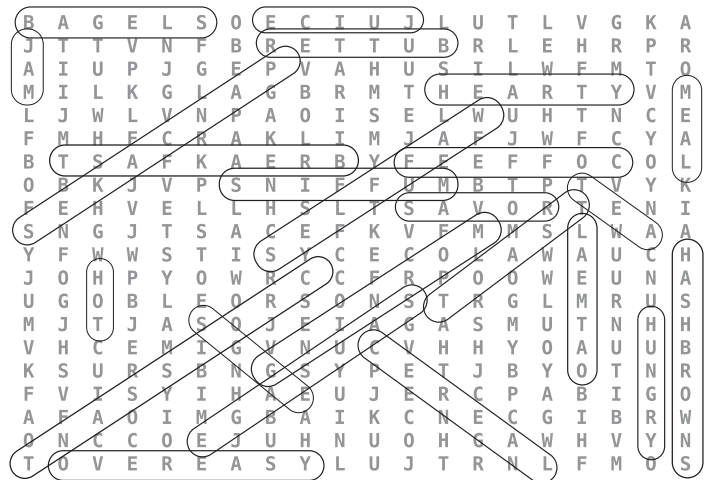
Upon reaching 300, I answered. “Well, we only have about 700 to go and that's almost a 500 piece puzzle...so let's start from here. We're almost there!”
