Minnesota's townships to hold annual meetings on Township Day, Tuesday, March 10, 2020

Mark your calendar for democracy in action

(St. Michael, Minn.) – Minnesota's 1,781 townships will hold their annual town meeting on Tuesday, March 10. Known as Township Day, these annual meetings are held every year on the second Tuesday in March. Residents of the townships will meet to voice their opinions about local issues with other township residents and also vote directly on their annual tax levy; direct democracy in action. Citizens attending annual meetings also often discuss and vote on other local issues.

In addition, many of the state's townships will hold their township officer elections on Tuesday's Township Day.

"Township Day gives a direct voice to residents of townships. The annual meeting is an opportunity to participate in local government. Residents meet and discuss issues with their town board, and vote on the proposed tax levy," said Minnesota Association of Townships Executive Director David Hann.

"If you live in a township, please participate in your township's annual meeting on Tuesday, March 10. You can find the location and time by checking the published notice in the local newspaper or by contacting the township clerk," continued Hann.

"Township communities come together to shape their government from the grassroots up. Whether they are electing new local officers or voting on the annual tax levy, these annual meetings are important to the direct democracy of townships. On behalf of the Minnesota Association of Townships, I encourage every township resident to attend their annual meeting," concluded Hann.

Information Minnesota's townships: There are approximately 914,174 township residents in 1,781 townships in Minnesota. Townships exist in every area of the state, including the metropolitan area. Some, with populations of more than

1,000, function in much the same way as a small city. While many townships remain rural agricultural centers, other host a variety of residential, light commercial, and industrial development.

The tradition of Township Day: The tradition of a town meeting has roots in colonial America. New England town meetings gave citizens a way to exercise local authority. Those meetings were especially important in the development of democracy because it emphasized problem-solving through group efforts.

Background on townships: Townships were the original form of local government in Minnesota, established in the 1800s when Congress ordered a survey that divided the Minnesota territory into 36 square mile tracts of land. Today, the term "township" generally refers to public corporations governed by a local board of supervisors and created to provide services to residents.

In college he worked summers with a crew that harvested grain across South Dakota. His grandma Mabel would be delighted to know that Bob hauled her old tractor way across the country to give it a home on his California ranch.

Bob achieved his dream of

becoming a pilot in the Navy. He flew rescue helicopters off the USS aircraft carrier ORISKANY for two tours of duty during the Vietnam War, and a variety of aircraft during his military career until retirement. He continued flying as a corporate pilot, nationally and internationally, for several large companies, which took him to such unusual places as China and Siberia.

Fish house removal deadlines are approaching

Inland bass, northern pike and walleye seasons are now closed. That means the deadline to remove fish houses is on the horizon. Shelter removal deadlines

Dark houses, fish houses and portables must be off the ice no later than midnight for each of the dates given in the categories below. County sheriffs may prohibit or restrict the use of motorized vehicles if dangerous ice conditions are present. If shelters are not removed, owners will be prosecuted. A conservation officer also may confiscate, remove or destroy any ice structure and its contents if not removed by the deadline.

Inland waters: South of line - March 2, 2020; North of line - March 16, 2020

Border waters: Minnesota-Iowa - Feb. 20; Minnesota-Wisconsin - March 1; Minnesota-North and South Dakota - March 5; Minnesota-Canada - March 31



Dates of removal are determined by an east-west line formed by U.S. Hwy. 10, east along Hwy. 34 to Minnesota Hwy. 200, east along Hwy. 200 to U.S. Hwy. 2, and east along Hwy. 2 to the Minnesota-

Wisconsin border. After removal dates, shelters may remain on the ice between midnight and one hour before sunrise only when occupied or attended. Storing or leaving shelters on a public access is prohibited.

People in Minnesota Warned That Robocalls Are Likely To Rise During Election Year



People in Minnesota are being warned that robocalls are likely to increase as the country gears up for the 2020 elections.

The 2020 elections, which will be held in November, will see all 435 seats in the United States House of Representatives, 35 of the 100 seats in the United States Senate, and the office of the president of the United States contested. Thirteen state and territorial governorships, as well as numerous other state and local elections, will also be contested.

in nature, such as those from political parties or charities, can be extremely irritating but they are perfectly legal. Unfortunately, people in Minnesota can expect to see a significant rise in these types of calls in the coming months.

"While the information based robocalls are annoying, they are relatively harmless. However, there are other robocalls which are far from harmless and are trying to scam you. A robocall cannot legally attempt to sell you anything unless you gave them written consent so if you receive calls of this nature simply put the phone down. It's good to report robocalls that are trying to sell you something or scam you to the Federal Trade Commission."

Typical scam callers may claim to be from the IRS or other law enforcement agencies. Advice to prevent you becoming a victim of bogus calls:

- Hang up if you ever have any doubts about someone who has called you.
- Ensure the line has been terminated before making any further calls. You can tell if the dial tone is present or by using another phone.
- Never give out your PIN number, banks will never ask for it.

If you want to stop receiving scam and nuisance calls, follow CPR Call Blocker's quick three-step guide to stopping unwanted calls:

- Sign up to the National Do Not Call Registry – call 1-888-382-1222 or visit donotcall.gov
- Don't consent to being contacted – get your phone number taken off directories and look out for tick boxed on all marketing correspondence to see if ticking or unticking them will prevent your details being passed on to third parties.
- Consider getting a call blocker.

Ms Davies continued: "In the meantime, if you suspect you may have compromised your account, contact your bank or card provider as soon as possible. It also advisable to check your bank and card statements regularly for unauthorized charged as a matter of course."

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Governor Walz, Lt. Governor Flanagan Announce Proposal to Prevent Farming Accidents

Proposal will provide funding to farmers who wish to enhance safety equipment

[ST. PAUL, MN] - Today, Governor Tim Walz and Lt. Governor Peggy Flanagan announced a state funding proposal of \$250,000 to enhance farm safety measures across the state.

"Too many Minnesota families have lost loved ones to preventable farming accidents," said Governor Walz. "That's why I'm proposing new funding for safety measures like tractor rollover protection and grain bin safety equipment. We need to make sure all Minnesota farmers have access to these resources so they can work safely and prevent future tragedies."

"We need to do everything we can to ensure Minnesota farmers can work without fear of getting hurt or losing a loved one," said Lt. Governor Flana-

gan. "That's why we put forward a proposal to protect farmers from the real dangers they face every day."

The Governor and Lt. Governor's proposal includes three complementary approaches to address farm safety. Specifically, the funds will:

1. Relaunch the Tractor Rollover Protection Grant Program, originally created by Minnesota Statute 17.119. Once reinstated, the program reimburses farmers who retrofit eligible tractors with rollover protective structures.
2. Create a cost-share or reimbursement program for farmers who wish to invest in grain bin safety equipment.
3. Conduct a farm safety outreach campaign highlighting tractor safety and grain bin

safety and promoting the availability of this funding.

Thousands of farmers, family members, and farm workers are injured, and hundreds die in farming accidents every year in the United States. Although only about 2% of Minnesota's workforce is engaged in agriculture, it accounted for more than 30% of workplace fatalities in 2014 according to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. At least ten people have died in farming-related accidents in Minnesota since June 2019. Additionally, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and other sources consistently cite tractors (including rollovers, entanglements, collisions, etc.) as the most common cause of death on farms nationally.

Governor Walz Announces Path to Complete Final Stretch of Highway 14 Expansion

Proposal provides funding plan for the State to finish the expansion of Highway 14

[ST. PAUL, MN] - Today, Governor Tim Walz stood alongside Nicollet County first responders, bipartisan legislators, community leaders, and his neighbors from Mankato to announce a funding plan to complete the final expansion of Highway 14—the 12 miles of two-lane traffic between Nicollet and New Ulm.

The legislation would update state law to allow the Minnesota Department of Transportation (MnDOT) to apply for a federal Transportation Infrastructure Finance and Innovation Act (TIFIA) loan, administered through the Rural Project Initiative and Build America Bureau of the U.S. Department of Transportation. The loan application will ask the federal government for an estimated \$36 million for Highway 14.

Governor Walz's advocacy in this project spans back to his time in Congress and the death of his neighbor in Mankato.

"As a former member of Congress from Southern Min-

nesota, as someone who has driven countless miles on this road, as someone who has lost a dear friend and neighbor on this road, and now as this state's governor, this issue is personal to me, and it's personal to everyone in this area of the state," said Governor Walz. "We are pursuing every possible option to get this road built out to four lanes and keep Minnesotans safe."

"In this area of our state, everyone knows someone who has lost a loved one or been impacted by a tragedy on Highway 14. This is one of the most dangerous highways in Minnesota," said MnDOT Commissioner Margaret Anderson Kelliher.

"The Governor has long been an advocate of this project, and MnDOT is committed to getting it done."

The TIFIA loan is just one strategy MnDOT will employ to complete the last stretch of Highway 14 that has yet to secure a funding source. Earlier this week, MnDOT submitted an application for a federal Infrastructure for Rebuilding America (INFRA) grant, which provides infrastructure grants to road projects across the country.

The legislation is scheduled to be introduced by Senator Nick Frenzt and Representative Jeff Brand on Monday, March 2.

Norma Lee Kruckow was born on February 3, 1930 in Backus, MN the oldest of eight children born to Fred "Ted" and Lena (Sawyer) Kruckow. She was baptized and confirmed into the Lutheran faith. She attended school in Backus graduating with the class of 1948. Norma took numerous college courses, seminars, attended Minneapolis School of Business and taught classes at Northland Community College in Thief River Falls including "Women in Business". While in Minneapolis she found work with IDS and entered into service as a U.S. Navy Reservist. Norma was proud of the fact that she and all of her siblings served in the U.S. military.

On May 2, 1953, Norma was united in marriage to Lynn Hanson at First English Lutheran Church in Pine River, MN. The couple made their home in Minneapolis for two years before returning to purchase their farm in Moylan Township, Goodridge, MN. To this union a son, Michael was born. Together they began a dairy and grain farming career that lasted for over 60 years. Norma was pleased to see the farm operation and the Ayrshire dairy herd continued by her son and grandsons.

Along with working off farm at the Thief River Falls Times, Kiewel Bottling and as a lobbyist in St. Paul for the MN Farmers Union she was a key partner in the formation of a number of Goodridge area organizations. They included the Good-Hope 4-H Club, Bit & Bridle Saddle Club, Goodridge Square Dance Club,

Goodridge Historical Society, Goodridge Trailblazers Snowmobile Club, Deer Park Garden Club, local Chapter of the American Agri-Women, and the Women's Business and Professional Club in Thief River Falls. Norma's passion for politics also led her to serve on the Goodridge School Board, leadership in local and statewide MN Farmers Union and DLF activities, and a run for the MN House of Representatives in 1968. She was also a delegate to the National Democratic Convention in 1972.

She was affiliated with and/or served on the boards or as an officer of many organizations. These included the Midwest Dairy Association, Goodridge Area Historical Society, Minnesota Agri Women, American Agri Women, 13th District Horticulture Society, Northwest Women's Fund, Coya Knutson Memorial Scholarship Fund, Marshall County Land-Use Planning Committee, Marshall County Water Quality Task Force Committee, Senate District I DFL, Marshall County DFL, 7th Congressional District DFL, Northwest Dairy Association, Minnesota Ag in the Classroom, Goodridge School Board, Pennington County Fair Association and Marshall County Farmers Union.

Norma earned awards for work with Minnesota Horticulture Society-Award of Merit and Distinguished Service, American Agri-Women Leaven Award, Goodridge Community Builder Award, Minnesota Rural Futures, Inc.-Futures Award, 1999 Farm and Ranch Guide Country Woman of the Year, was inducted into Northwest Minnesota Women's Hall of Fame and is listed in Who's Who of American Women.

In her spare time, Norma enjoyed flower and vegetable gardening, working and riding horses, caring for her flock of chickens, bird watching and turning all the cows into babies. She made wonderful apple pies according to her grandchildren and always had another project in the works including writing plays, short stories and histories, many about the community.

She was a member of Faith Lutheran Church in Goodridge where she taught Sunday School and was active with the Ladies Aid.

Norma was an incredible woman ahead of her time that set the bar high for herself and others.

Survivors include her loving husband, Lynn; son, Michael (Linda) Hanson of Goodridge; grandchildren, David (Ashley), Matthew (Malena Rupprecht), Steven (Leah Schulz), Sara (Brad) Lunke; great-grandchildren, Wyatt, Izeck, Ty and Tucker Lunke; sister, Laura Norried; brother, Roland Kruckow; sister-in-law, Sheila Kruckow; and many nieces, nephews, relatives and friends.

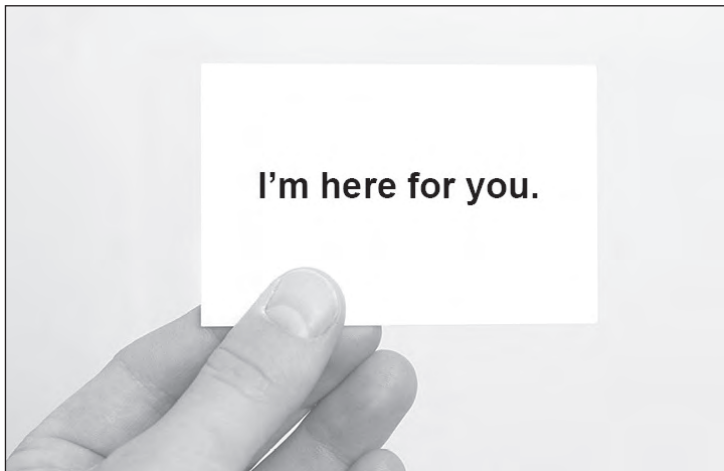

Tips from a Hospice Nurse: What to Say to a Dying Person

When someone is dying, it can be an emotional and trying time for everyone involved. Many people shy away from the person who is dying because they don't know how to deal with the emotions involved or they are afraid of what's to come.

The most important thing to remember is this is about the person dying and not ourselves. Many times, the person who is dying knows they are dying and wants to feel comfort and support. They want to be assured things will be OK and make amends for things that happened in the past.

You can use this to help guide you about what to say and how to say it.

Allow the person to be in control and follow their lead. For example, they may want to talk about their memories, big events of their life, etc. Keep their feelings and needs in mind during this time.

On the other hand, they may prefer to just be around their loved ones with little or nothing to say. In this instance you can show your presence by sitting next to them or their bed and providing a light touch of the hand or some other form of communication.

If they are unresponsive, don't allow this to deter you from saying what you want to say. Hearing is thought to be the last sense to go in the dying process, so don't be afraid to talk. Keep in mind that they person can likely still hear you, even if they appear to be in a deep sleep, so be mindful of what you say to others while in the dying person's presence.

It's also helpful to remember not saying anything at all may be right for some situations. Sometimes being still and in the moment is enough. Each situation is different because each person is different.

Tips for Interacting with a Dying Person

- Reminiscence with the person. Talk about memories and accomplishments. Share memories of joyous occasions. Start the conversation with, "Remember when..."
- Listen and be attentive while the dying person is sharing. They may feel the need to apologize or ask forgiveness for past transgressions. They may voice regrets from their life. Allow them time to speak and be heard.
- Say I love you. If the dying person is a loved one and it's appropriate, remind them they are loved. We all need to feel loved.
- Thank the person. Thank him or her for allowing you to be there, for past things, etc.
- Offer forgiveness. If there were situations when the dying person has hurt you in some way, offer them forgiveness if it feels right to you. Tell the person they are forgiven if you feel that way.
- Can you help in another way? Is there something more they want to discuss that hasn't been? Is there something more they want done? Ask them.

There are many ways to communicate and show compassion to a dying person. Find a meaningful way to connect with the person to provide comfort and support. Just being yourself and available is enough. Know that this can be a difficult time, and it can also be a peaceful time you may cherish.

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Theology in the Trenches

Hallmark Moments

Now packed away for the season are the Hallmark movies watched over the holidays. In the past, they have been noted for their purity of content. There, I said it, purity. It's a virtue. We don't hear much about virtues these days...lest someone be offended.

Case-in-point. Back in December I saw a post on social media. It was an article about a contemporary picture of the manger scene entitled Jose and Maria. They were hanging out on a main drag looking all hipster-like. In jeans and sweatshirts they were making their way...calling on a payphone to see if there was room at the Inn which was the hotel directly behind them. Upon a mechanical horse she sat.

Attached to this pic was a sermon text. Its subtleties tossed into the lap of the reader stood out. The picture called forth compassion and reminded us to remember how God works and through whom. It challenged us to remember how He entered this world in the first place...through a marginalized couple.

So what did this sermon message have to say that was written by Fr. James Martin, SJ? It said, "...it is primarily on the margins that we must seek Christ today: among the forgotten poor, among the vilified migrants and refugees, among the lonely sick and elderly, among the silent unborn, among the persecuted LGBT people. Here is where God lived, and could be found; here is where He still lives and can still be found." (I know there is a Q along with a few more missing letters in that acronym, but this article did not have it.)

I'd like to take this a step further than what Fr. Martin suggests because while there was plenty I agreed with, some I did not. I agree that He lives among the marginalized, but I disagree as to where we seek Him. I'd also like us to reconsider just who it is that is being marginalized in today's culture.

Where do we seek Him? We seek Him in His Word and in prayer. We seek Him in the sacraments and especially in the breaking of the Bread which He invites us to be partakers of. If we seek, I suppose our intent is to find Him which begs the next question.

Where do we find Him? We find Him among all people...all persecuted...all marginalized and all who are not marginalized. We see His face in all. All.

I beg to ask as I beg to differ as to who, exactly, are the marginalized? In order to not bear false witness against our neighbor, let's do a little breakdown by asking more questions.

Does He, Jesus, live among immigrants? Yes. Does He live among vilified immigrants? Yes. Does Jesus live among those who are vilifying immigrants? Yes. Is it okay to vilify? No, but He still lives among those who do...beckoning conversion. Does He live among those who have differing opinions about how immigrants should enter? Yes. How about those who desire to have full-fledged open borders? Does He live among those? Yes.

I have another question I am going to ask. This question has to do with persecution and just who is being persecuted lest we miss it. Does He live among the persecuted LGBTQI? Yes. Does He live among the LGBTQI who persecute others? Yes. Does He live among those who desire to teach their children that this lifestyle is not how God designed us? Yes. What about those who are being persecuted by others just because they believe to teach their children accordingly...does He live among them? Again, yes He does.

Just who is actually being marginalized within our current culture compared to those who are claiming to be marginalized may come as a bit of a surprise.

We cannot bear false witness against our neighbor by claiming we are the ones being vilified when we are actually doing the vilifying. We cannot claim to be persecuted when we may be the ones who are doing the persecuting.

Lest we forget, He came for all. Lest we see the face of Christ in all, we will continue to be part of those who persecute. May I give voice to Your Word in love as "love covers a multitude of sins" (1Peter 4:8)...of which we must confess and ask forgiveness of...not justification for.

"He came that all may have life" (John 10:10). All. We cannot and must not exclude any from the hope there is in Christ Jesus. And just as love covers a multitude of sins, our contrite hearts must be open to love which beckons us to ask forgiveness of whatever our struggles may be.

"There is no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus" (Rom. 8:1)...lest we forget...once and for all. Amen.

Ask a Trooper

Question: Is it legal for a person to have an open beer in the car if they hold it out the window while driving?

Answer: That's the first I've been asked that in my career. Minnesota state law says "possession" means either that the person had actual possession of the bottle or receptacle or that the person consciously exercised dominion and control over the bottle or receptacle. "Roadway" means that portion of a highway improved, designed, or ordinarily used for vehicular travel including the shoulder.

To be clear, the answer is no. Minnesota's enhanced DWI enforcement and education efforts have been factors in the continued reduction of alcohol-related deaths. Still, drunk driving remains a serious threat on our roads, contributing to 84 deaths in 2018. There were nearly 25,000 motorists arrested for DWI in 2017, and one in seven Minnesota licensed drivers has a DWI on record.

Commit to a Sober Ride

- Plan for a safe ride — designate a sober driver, use a cab/public transportation or stay at the location of the celebration.
- Speak Up — Offer to be a designated driver or be available to pick up a loved one anytime, anywhere.
- Buckle up — the best defense against a drunk driver.
- Report drunk driving — call 911 when witnessing impaired driving behavior. Be prepared to provide location, license plate number and observed dangerous behavior.

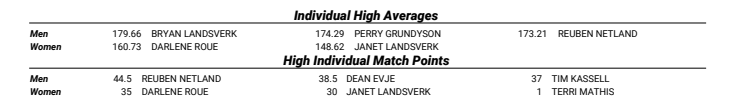
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
