Steven Marsh, Gonvick Marshall, Minn. — Twenty-eight individuals have been selected to participate in Minnesota Agriculture and Rural Leadership (MARL), Class XI. MARL is a highly customized dynamic two-year educational experience featuring nine, two- and three-day in-state seminars, a six-day national study seminar and a two-week international study seminar.

Class XI is comprised of both agricultural producers and those involved in agribusiness or rural leadership positions.

"The quality of applicants to MARL continues to be high," said Executive Director Olga Reuvekamp. "The board had a very difficult task in selecting MARL Class XI participants," she said. "The program really develops the leadership qualities of the participants, and these are the individuals who are making a difference in agriculture today."

One vehicle rollover

On 7/2/2020 at approximately 1700 hours the Polk County Sheriff's Office responded to a one vehicle rollover on County road 12 southwest of Mentor, MN. Polk County Deputies and Mentor Fire and Rescue discovered a black Chevy Corvette on its roof in the east ditch. One adult male occupant was out of the vehicle and reported minor injuries. The driver was identified as 31 year old Max Wagner of Blain, MN. There were no other vehicles or persons involved in the crash. The motor vehicle crash is under investigation by Polk County Sheriff Office. Assisting agencies were Mentor Fire and Rescue, Fertile EMS responded and Advanced Towing and Recovery.

Missing Adult Located

On 7-4-20 at approx. 0223 hrs the Polk County Sheriff's Office responded to a report of a missing 78 year old male with dementia in the City of Winger. The subject had been missing for approx. 2 hours with family members searching for him.

With the assistance of the Winger Fire Department, Essentia Ambulance, Polk County K-9 and the Polk County Drone

the subject was located within 3 hours, approx. ¼ mile south of his residence in a tree line.

After being medically checked and cleared he returned to his family.

ATV Fatal Accident

On 07/02/2020 at approximately 5:53 pm, the Polk County Sheriff's Office responded to a report of an ATV rollover on 435th St SW Fertile, MN west of the Sand Hill River. County EMS and the Fertile Fire Department also responded. First responders attempted lifesaving efforts but the operator, a male juvenile, was pronounced deceased at the scene. It appears the operator lost control of the ATV and struck a tree. No further information will be released at this time.

The Polk County Sheriff's Office has received two complaints in reference to a Suspicious Person driving in Fosston and asking females if they want a ride. Thompson was transported to Sanford Medical Center with life threatening injuries. He was not wearing a helmet.

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The Importance of Listening Well

Yesterday I was in the middle of writing a paper when my son asked me if I would make him some popcorn. I told him no and that he could make himself some if he really wanted it.

He asked how, so I looked up from my paper and quickly listed off the directions:

"Take one of those cast-iron pots and put 3 Tablespoons of coconut oil in it. Add some kosher salt, pepper, and that red pepper Dad bought at the bottom of the pot. When the oil is all melted, add three popcorn kernels and put the lid on. When all three are popped, add a cup of kernels and shake the pot a few times then let the kernels pop till they're done."

He nodded his head and proceeded to make himself popcorn as he talked on the phone with his girlfriend. I returned to working away on my paper.

Pretty soon his dad came downstairs and went into the kitchen and asked what he was doing. Our son said I had told him how to make popcorn.

"How many kernels did you put in here?" Asked his dad as he looked inside the pot.

"Mom told me to put in three cups."

"You told him three cups?" A little confused at what I was hearing, I asked, "Three cups of what?"

"Peyton just told me you told him to put three cups of kernels into the pot."

"What? I never said that!"

As I re-told our son the recipe, he shook his head vigorously insisting I told him three cups of kernels. He still thinks I told him three cups of kernels. I'm pretty sure he'd bet his life that my instructions included three cups of kernels.

As I was thinking over this story, I realized how common this is in communication. We can't half-listen and understand what is being said. In order to fully engage in a conversation, we need to put down all the distractions and pay attention to the person speaking. Make eye contact. Be next to. Be with. Engage fully.

Yes, it would be easy for me to blame him and point out that he was not writing down the directions I gave him...or that he was still on the phone while I was giving him the directions...or that he was in the other room as I was giving him the recipe...but part of that is on me too. If I was able to take the time to look up from my paper and list off the directions to him, I had already disconnected myself from what I was doing enough to be able to go into the kitchen and be there with him to show him how to make the homemade popcorn for the first time.

In reality, I was not listening either. Listening takes two. It takes one to speak and one to be fully present. It takes eye contact. Presence. Engagement on both sides.

I can't change the interaction, but I can review what happened and decide what I could have done differently. I can choose to learn and grow from that experience. I can realize my part in the conflict and choose to find ways to better listen next time...for that is true repentance: a change in direction. May I continue to grow in this area and learn to listen well to others.

Ask a Trooper

Q u e s - t i o n : What is being done about distracted

driving? It seems like it is getting worse.

Answer: Here is some information that was shared on the Minnesota Department of Public Safety's blog. "When we think of distracted driving, most of us think of someone holding a phone up to their ear or scrolling through their social media feed. But distracted driving takes a lot of different forms. When you fiddle with your car stereo, you're taking your eyes and attention off the road. Same with cleaning up a spill from that barbecue sandwich you're trying to eat. Setting your navigation while driving also distracts from the road, and even passengers can distract you.

And if you think no one ever does that sort of thing anymore, the statistics from the most recent distracted driving enforcement campaign tell a different story. From June 1 through 14, law enforcement officers all over Minnesota were putting in extra hours, looking for distracted drivers. During that time, 1,034 drivers were cited for violating the hands-free cell phone law alone. They

could be facing fines of \$100 or more (including court fees) for a first offense and \$300 or more (also including court fees) for each subsequent offense.

You'll recall that the hands-free cell phone law has been in effect since Aug. 1, 2019. In the nine months after it took effect, Minnesota law enforcement officers cited 16,405 drivers for violating it. The fewer distracted drivers on Minnesota roads, the better. Distracted driving was a lead factor in crashes in 2019, contributing to 32 deaths and over 10 times as many injuries.

The tough truth is that no one can multi-task behind the wheel. If you're texting while driving at 55 mph, for example, you'll travel an entire football field before looking up – and any sports fan can tell you that a lot can happen in 100 yards. Texting while driving combines all three types of distractions: visual, physical and cognitive. A visual distraction might be a passenger or a particularly interesting billboard. A physical distraction happens when you take your hands off the wheel to, say, pick up a napkin from the floor. And a cognitive distraction is when you're lost in thought or engaging in a particularly deep discussion. The point is that when you're

driving a vehicle, you're there to do one thing and one thing only: Drive smart.

And how does one drive smart? We'll start with the obvious: Put the phone down, turn it off, put it out of reach, or use a hands-free device. Pre-program your radio stations, and adjust your mirrors and vents before you leave. Map out your destination and route in advance. Avoid messy foods (sorry, barbecue lovers) and secure your drink. Model proper driving behavior for your kids, and ask passengers' help with anything that might take your attention away from the road (and offer the same kind of help when you're a passenger, too).

With just a few adjustments, you can stay safe on the road. And more importantly, you can make sure everyone else on the road with you is safe, too."
