Beito has one more book to her credit

Gretchen Urnes Beito of Thief River Falls has been involved in many book projects. She recently finished a book with Mildred Furuseth called "Furuseth in the 99th Infantry Battalion (SEP)".

The book is about Leonard Furuseth being drafted into the U.S. Army in 1942. The requirement was that the recruits be fluent in Norwegian. Leonard was a Gully native living in Thief River Falls when Gretchen first heard about his life and other information from his wife Millie Furuseth who co-authored the book. The booklet shares the experiences of the 99th Battalion from being drafted landing on Omaha Beach in June of 1944 to May 8 when the war ended. It was printed by Richards Publishing Company in Gonvick.

Other books by Gretchen Urnes Beito include, "Women of Thief River Falls at the Turn of the Century", "From Agassiz to Zeh", and "Tales of the Secret Earth River" with Diane Drake and "Coya Come Home: A Congressman's Journey."

"Women of Thief River Falls at the Turn of the Century", is a Study of Life in a Boom Town from 1895-1905, by Gretchen Beito. It was published by the Pennington County Historical Society, Thief River Falls, 1997. This booklet was prepared for the class "Introduction to Research" at the University of North Dakota. Instructor was Dr. Richard Beringer. It contains many photographs and stories about the women living in Thief River Falls at the turn of the century.

"From Agassiz to Zeh", "Norwegian Nisse at Christmas", and "Love to You, a Swed-

ish Christmas." Inez Mostue, a Scandinavian doll-maker, and Gretchen, author, teamed up to present Nordic life in pictures and words. Handmade dolls, eleven inches tall, depict women and girls in Norway, Sweden, Denmark, Iceland, and Finland. Mireille Genadry was the photographer. This was the third in a series of five Nordic books. For all ages. It was printed by Maurtua Publishing in Thief River Falls. All the proceeds from those five books were donated to Northwest Regional Library.

"Tales of the Secret Earth River" was written with Diane Drake. It has many stories of the Thief River Falls area from the very beginning. The first chapter captures a canoe trip from Thief River Falls up the Red Lake River to Hudson Bay in Canada. It was published by

EMg Publishing in Thief River Falls.

"Coya Come Home: A Congressman's Journey" written by Gretchen Urnes Beito. It is biography of Congresswoman Coya Knutson, the Minnesota farm wife who took Washington by storm.

After serving two terms in the state legislature (1950-1953), Knutson ran for representative in Congress. Self-determined and ready to make a difference for farmers at a national level, she ran against the DFL's endorsed candidate. Her personal campaign style and knowledge of farming persuaded Minnesota's Ninth District voters to elect her to Congress, where she served from 1955-1958.

Beito, of Thief River Falls, did a lot of research on the

Knutson book. She focused on Knutson's congressional service that included information from letters, campaign literature and newspaper clippings.

The book was published by Pomegranate Press owned by Kathryn Leigh Scott. She published books about the entertainment industry, including guide books, biographies, textbooks and coffee table art books. Not only was Scott a book publisher she was also a

daytime drama actress. She performed on London's West End, in television series and mini series and was in feature films. She has been cast in the movie, "The 11th Green" about President Dwight Eisenhower. Kathryn plays the role of Mamie Eisenhower.

Essentia Health offers on-demand video visits

However, some things like diagnosing strep throat, can be started via this on-demand video visit to shorten the time the patient spends at the walk-in clinic. Of course, there are instances where in-person care is necessary, such as lacerations or a

head stuck in a child's nose. These on-demand visits will allow patients to gain access to primary care around the clock, with the opportunity for more discussion that is generally available with an eVisit.

Amy Ratajczak, PA, a walk-in provider offering these visits says, "COVID-19 has really changed the landscape of healthcare and we are continually adjusting to ensure we are providing the highest level of care for our patients, when and how they need it." On-demand video visits allow Essentia Health to offer same day care without having to leave the comfort of your home. 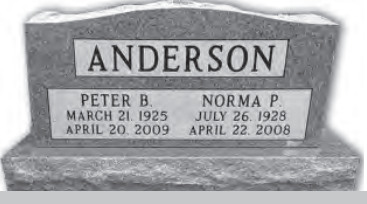

His doctoral dissertation was "Dying to the Law Through the Law (Galatians 2:19)." He also wrote for Augsburg Press "Following the Lectionary, Second Lessons for Pentecost, Year C." Gary had 2 books on Biblical Studies published by Wipf&Stock : "No Condemnation! A Study Manual (Homosexuality and the Bible)" in 2013 and "Dying and Deliverance – Searching for Paul's Law-Gospel Tension " in 2016.

Gary stated his life's mission as "to support the integrity of the Word and Sacrament ministry and to nourish appreciation for the Biblical message."

While he thrived on his work and mission, Gary's other interests included hunting, writing, music, reading and research on political issues and ideas, and Biblical studies. In later years Gary spent many hours, days, months, and years working on and reviving his late Gilthvedt grandparents' homestead on the Moose River north of Grygla.

Ask a Trooper

Question: Can you talk about staying safe on the 100 most traveled days?

Answer: Here is some information that was posted on the Department of Public Safety's blog: "After over two months of staying at home to slow the spread of COVID-19, heading out on the open road sounds like just the ticket. And a lot of Minnesotans will likely make similar plans, even as they're staying close to home due to the COVID-19 pandemic. But that sense of freedom can turn tragic if you're driving distracted, speeding, driving while impaired, or driving unbuckled. The 100 days from Memorial Day through Labor Day are most people's best opportunity for a short road trip – especially now that people are starting to venture out after the stay at home order. They're referred to as the 100 most traveled days on Minnesota's roads. Unfortunately, those 100 days are also the most dangerous. Because even though that period only accounts for about a quarter of the year, over a third of traffic deaths tend to occur during it. Preliminary numbers for 2019, for example, show that 136 of the year's 364 traffic fatalities happened during this 100-day stretch—that's 37 percent. While more people may be traveling to take in the joys

of the summer season, it's the drivers' behaviors that make these 100 days so deadly. Speed, distraction, lack of seat belt use and drunk driving continue to lead the way in fatal and serious motor vehicle crashes. In fact, unless driver behavior changes this year, things won't get any better.

Even though traffic volumes were down due to the COVID-19 stay at home order, there were more traffic fatalities this year than during the comparable time last year: 50 deaths during March 16-May 18, 2020, as compared to 47 deaths for the same period in 2019. And this year's 100 most traveled days are already off to a tragic start, with eight traffic fatalities over the Memorial Day weekend –making it the deadliest since 2010.

In an attempt to keep motorists safe, the Minnesota Office of Traffic Safety (OTS) is working with law enforcement agencies across the state to conduct

extra enforcement campaigns throughout the summer. Extra enforcement for speeding will take place June 22 through July 19, so keep an eye on that speedometer and always drive at speeds appropriate for the weather conditions. The one-year anniversary of the hands-free cell phone law is Aug. 1., so law enforcement across the state will be conducting extra hands-free cell phone enforcement Aug. 1-8. And the extra impaired enforcement campaign runs Aug. 14 through Sept. 7, but you should be finding sober rides all summer long.

The aim is for Minnesota law enforcement to stay extra vigilant so that you can arrive safely at your destination. It's never guaranteed, but by buckling your seat belt, putting the phone down, driving sober and obeying the speed limit, you can increase the chances that your open road will lead to summer fun instead of tragedy." https://dps.mn.gov/blog/Pages/061520-staying-safe-100-most-traveled-days.aspx

Recently my dad has been shopping around for a tractor. He always is fond of 8N Ford tractors. When living at Clearbrook, MN, in the late 1940's his neighbors, the Stanke's, had an 8N Ford. Lately dad has been shopping for a similar tractor to use around the farm. With the use of the internet my brother Cole has been on the hunt. Cole came across a tractor and asked me what is a Ford Dexta. I love tractors but am not a Ford expert, although I did know of the Ford Dexta.

According to my research the Dexta began production in 1958 (although I did see it listed at 1957 also?). The Dexta was rated at about 27hp on the drawbar and 31hp on the PTO. The prototype of the Dexta was a Ford 8N fitted with a Perkins Diesel engine. In a book called FORD TRACTORS by Robert N. Pripps it is believed the Fordson Super Dexta and Super Major made the Ford Tractor Operations management to introduce these models into the US market.

I got the book I mentioned above at a bookstore in St. Cloud when my dad was receiving a new heart valve in the hospital there. I have been paging through it and I realized... my favorite color is green (John Deere green), and when you see a Farmall all painted up in red it looks pretty nice. A prairie gold Minneapolis Moline with red wheels catches my eye and even a Flambeau Red Case looks pretty darn nice. But hey, there is something about that shiny Ford blue...it would look pretty good lined up in the yard too!!!
