Minnesota awarded federal grant to review legal cases for people believed to be innocent

Innocence Project of Minnesota will partner with Attorney General's office on the state's first-ever Conviction Review Unit

Minneapolis, Minn. – The Innocence Project of Minnesota announced today that it has received a two-year, \$300,000 grant from the U.S. Department of Justice that will fund the formation of Minnesota's first-ever Conviction Review Unit (CRU). The CRU, which will operate as a partnership between the Minnesota Attorney General's Office and the Innocence Project of Minnesota, will allow the state to review legal cases for people believed to be innocent. While there are dozens of CRUs across the country, Minnesota's will be just the fourth in the country that operates through an Attorney General's Office. To date, CRUs have helped initiate the exoneration of 444 people in the U.S.

"This is a momentous development in our ongoing mission to seek justice for all wrongfully convicted people in Minnesota," said Sara Jones, executive director of the Innocence Project of Minnesota. "Every criminal case carries with it the specter of a mistake, oversight, or even misconduct by law enforcement or lawyers. A CRU provides a powerful additional tool in the toolbox of justice for wrongfully convicted people."

"Prosecutors are ministers of justice. We have a duty to ensure those convicted of crimes are in fact guilty of those crimes," said Attorney General Ellison. "We strive for perfection but know our system is imperfect. This grant will allow us to create a unit to fearlessly review cases to make sure justice was served, and if not, to right those wrongs."

The purpose of a CRU is to prevent, identify and remedy wrongful convictions. Each case the CRU accepts for review will

have a strong indication that the person imprisoned could be innocent of the crime for which they were convicted. Minnesota's CRU also will develop policy proposals to address the most frequently identified causes of wrongful convictions and, when possible, identify the person or people who actually committed the crime. Ramsey County Attorney John Choi and Hennepin County Attorney Mike Freeman submitted letters of support and have vowed to work cooperatively with the CRU in cases that might arise

from their counties.

The structure and functioning of the CRU will be announced in early 2021.

"Justice is served when the person who committed a crime is held accountable and the innocent are free – and that is what a CRU will do for Minnesota," said Julie Jonas, legal director of the Innocence Project of Minnesota. "We look forward to engaging with jurisdictions across the state to correct wrongful convictions and continue our meaningful search for truth."

Essentia Health offering flu vaccine

Essentia Health is offering flu shots to the community in a variety of ways during the COVID-19 pandemic.

"This year might be the most important year for a flu shot ever," explains Dr. Aaron Philipps, an infectious disease specialist at Essentia Health. "Cold weather pushes us indoors and the close quarters allow for easier person-to-person transmission of respiratory viruses such as influenza and COVID-19. An outbreak of illness can over fill and overtax our hospitals. We have a vaccine against the flu that can help keep our cases down and keep our hospital beds available when they are needed."

Dr. Philipps also says, "the vaccine reduces your chances of getting the flu and if you don't have the flu, you have no risk of transmission to others that may not have the ability to fight off a serious infection."

The flu vaccine is recommended for people six months and older, including people with compromised immune systems and chronic medical

conditions. Flu vaccinations are covered by Medicare, Medicaid and most private insurances.

Due to COVID-19 precautions this year, getting your flu shot will look a little bit different. Here are some options for you:

Refocusing Perspective Amid COVID-19

Times are uncertain, and with that comes questions: How long will this last? Will I be able to be with my loved one when they take their last breath? Will I stay healthy? The list goes on, and sometimes, there are no answers. Many things are out of our control.

Rather than focus on what is not in our control, it may be helpful to instead refocus attention on what we can control.

Here are some suggestions:
COVID CHALLENGES
Living facility regulations

- While you can't change what's happening or change the regulations,
- You CAN check-in with the

facility often about changes to their regulations. Facilities know the importance of connection for both the patient and family. Many facilities try to coordinate some form of face-to-face visits, if they are able. You can also get creative on how to spend time with your loved one. Phone calls, video chat (FaceTime, Skype, etc.) are great resources during this time. Gather family outside of windows and share music, games, etc., while your loved one can watch and enjoy from inside. Position your loved one so they can watch drive-by celebrations, such as a birthday, anniversary or holiday gathering, from their room or outside their room.

No funerals or limited attendance at funerals

- While you can't change

what's happening or change the regulations,

- You CAN use creativity to plan a memorial service. An outdoor service or graveside memorial can be planned for a few more people or a smaller family service can be held now. A larger gathering/celebration of life can be planned for later, such as on a date that was special to the person who died (birthday or anniversary). Funerals and memorial services can also be live streamed online, so friends and family can join from anywhere.

Lack of physical touch

- While you can't change what's happening or the risks involved with physical touch,

- You CAN connect in other ways, such as sending photos electronically or by mail, making regularly scheduled calls and getting creative (example: specific sign language signs for "hugs" and "kisses" you can exchange with your loved one). Plan to check in with the facility frequently about any changes in their restrictions that might allow for more contact.

Dying alone

- While you can't change what's happening or the timing of when one dies,

- You CAN ask the facility if they can allow you to come in and say goodbye to your loved one as he or she nears the end

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of life. Many facilities are doing their best to work with families to be together near the end. Also, recognize that you would have been there in-person with your loved one as much as possible under different circumstances. It's common for a person to die when the family leaves for even a few minutes. Know that you didn't choose to stay away, and neither did the facility staff. Give yourself grace, as well as facility staff and other staff, knowing that everyone did their best.

Seeing a decline in your loved one's physical and/or cognitive health

- While you can't change what's happening or the isolation it causes,

- You CAN stay connected as much as possible through sending cards and packages and making frequent phone calls (daily or every other day). You can also arrange for facility staff to help your loved one video chat with you. Be positive and upbeat when you can talk with your person.

COVID EMOTIONS & FEELINGS

Anger

- While you can't control the situation,

- You CAN choose how you react to a situation. Often in this COVID environment, we don't get the outcome we desire. Anger is an easy "go-to" for the human psyche, but it isn't the most helpful. We can choose to not direct our anger toward family members, facility or other staff, or even the patients themselves. When anger threatens to boil over, take a walk, sit alone in a quiet place, read a book or meditate. Find a trusted friend or confidant you can talk to. Expressing your feelings out loud and attaching words to those feelings can be a helpful release of the emotion. Reach out to professionals for support. These are things you can control when everything seems out of control.

Guilt

- While you can't control the past or even the future,

- You CAN control the things we say to ourselves: "Should have," "could have" and "would have" statements used to shame yourself are not helpful. If facility restrictions kept us away, remember, that is out of your control. If there are things you feel you need to do or say, now's the time. Write a letter. Make a call. Give or ask for forgiveness. These are things you can do.

Despair

- While we can't expect to be self-sufficient all the time,
- You CAN seek assistance. If you are feeling hopeless or a deep

sense of sadness, it's OK to ask for help. Find a trusted friend or family member who will listen without judgement. Contact a member of your hospice team, a counselor or a therapist. Concentrate on changing your outlook on the situation because that is something you can control.

Remember, you are dealing with one of the most difficult times in your life—the end of life of someone you love. You are also faced with isolation, separation and uncertainty. There are things you cannot change. While you may not be able to change the situation, you can always change your mindset and reaction toward it.

A positive outlook can go a long way in what seems like a negative situation. Giving grace and kindness to others and to yourself can also change how we view a situation. Change what you can. Let go of what you cannot.

An Expectation is a Disappointment Waiting to Happen

When I first heard that line, I thought it was about the dumbest thing I'd ever heard. After all, who doesn't have expectations in their lives and isn't it a good thing? Let's find out.

When I first heard "An expectation is a disappointment waiting to happen," I wanted to explain my rationale behind it and why I thought it was a good thing to have them. If people care, they expect something because they believe you were capable of producing what they are expecting. If they thought you weren't capable of what they were asking, it would signal they didn't think you could do it.

Case-in-point. When our children were in sports, I always told them that it was a good thing when a coach yelled at them in the midst of a game. Paralyzed by expectation stopped me in my tracks as I froze. Then, a foreign concept wove its way into my thought process.

After a long day of all of these things I plopped on the couch and grabbed a "tractor" book and started reading. As you have probably heard me say before I call it doing some research!

I was reading a book and came across a chapter that talked about how sometimes a farmer spends so much time with his tractor it becomes like a member of the family. Sounds crazy but I would agree! Similarly I sold a tractor last year and when the new owner came to pick it up I had to go take a picture. I told him I've only sold a couple tractors in my life. When I buy a tractor it becomes part of the family.

I think that is because of all the stories I have heard in my life about tractors from my dad. Since I am a Minnesota "Boy" I do love stories about tractors that were manufactured in Minnesota. One of my favorites has always been Minneapolis Moline. There was also the Flour City and the Bull Tractor. When I was young I asked my grandfather, Ames Mickelson, what was the biggest tractor that you ever drove. He answered, "A Pioneer." He said they pulled 14 bottoms with it. Wow! We were probably pulling 4-14s behind our G John Deere at this time, so fourteen seemed huge. I didn't know what a Pioneer was at that time, I couldn't Google it! When I got older I was watching a tractor video put out by Dupont advertising tractors painted with their paint, and low and behold there was a huge antique Pioneer tractor. 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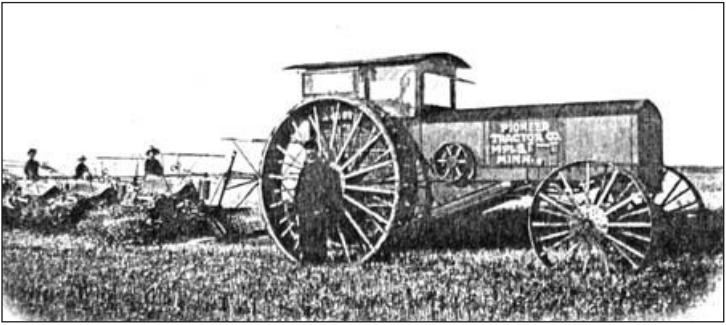

School is back in session,
and whether it's virtual or in-
person, routines have changed.
You may see kids and parents
in your neighborhood walking to
school, catching the school bus,
or just exercising after their
at-home school day is over. No
matter their motivation, it's
important for pedestrians big
and small to be careful, and for
drivers to watch out for them.

Each year in Minnesota, ap-
proximately 48 pedestrians are
killed as a result of collisions
with motor vehicles (2015-
2019). Fortunately, whether
you're a pedestrian or a driver,
there are steps you can take to
guard against crashes and
resulting injuries or fatalities.
A few safety tips are listed be-
low, but you can also read the
bike and pedestrian laws for
more detail. And for elementary
school-aged children, the Na-
tional Highway Traffic Safety
Administration offers a Child
Pedestrian Safety Curriculum.

Drivers

- Never drive distracted.
- Always drive the speed
limit.
- Look carefully for pedestri-
ans, including small children
and people in wheelchairs.
- Take particular care in in-
tersections, when turning, and
when opening your door after
parking on the roadside. Don't
forget your blind spots.

• Stop for a pedestrian cross-
ing at any corner, even if it isn't
marked with a crosswalk. This
is the law.

• When other vehicles are
stopped for a pedestrian, don't
pass them.

Pedestrians

• Obey all traffic signs and
signals.

• Cross only at corners, a
marked crosswalk, or where a
traffic light is present, never in
the middle of a block.

• Don't enter a crosswalk if
an oncoming vehicle won't have
enough room to stop.

• When crossing the street,
make eye contact with drivers to
be sure they'll stop.

• Use the sidewalk. If there
isn't one, walk on the side of
the road facing oncoming traffic.

• Pay attention and look for
additional cars while crossing
the street. Never assume driv-
ers see you.

• Wear bright-colored or re-
flective clothing when walking
at night.

In all cases, avoid drugs and
excessive alcohol. They can im-
pair your judgment as severely
on foot as they can behind the
wheel. Also, stay off your phone
while crossing the road. Distrac-
tions can lead to serious or fatal
consequences. If you and your
children familiarize yourselves
with traffic laws, obey the traf-
fic signs and signals, and follow
these safety tips, you have a
much greater chance of staying
safe, whether you're walking to
kindergarten or driving to work.
