(3/22/2021) Steve and Janelle Dahlin, Euclid are Polk West County's representatives and Jordan and Brooke Johnson, Warren are Marshall County's representatives in the 2021 Red River Valley Emerging Leadership Program. These dedicated couples stepped up to learn and develop leadership skills in a new way, as the program transitioned to an online and hybrid model of learning during the pandemic.

Steven farms with his brother, Kyle, on and off their 2,000 acre farm. They raise soybeans, wheat, sunflowers and corn. Janelle is a medical assistant at Truyu Dermatology in Grand Forks. She helps with procedures to remove skin cancer and general dermatology visits. She is also the clerk of Keystone Township and assists on the farm.

Jordan and Brooke Johnson

Jordan is a sixth-generation farmer and owns and operates JEJ Farms, Inc. He manages three full-time and many part-time employees during harvest. Jordan farms with his father, uncle and brother in Warren and surrounding areas, raising corn, sugar beets, soybeans and spring wheat. Brooke is a former hairstylist and currently a homemaker and stay-at-home mom to their three daughters.

The rural leaders from 14 counties in the region committed to learning via virtual spaces and embraced variations on a hybrid format. Together they gained insight on personal leadership styles, communication, rural issues, life balance, and facilitating effective meet-

ings. They took a virtual trip to the Minnesota State Capitol which included an online visit with their state legislators about issues affecting their communities.

The theme for the Class of 2021, "Discovering the Power of YET", has been just what everyone needed this year...a reminder to focus on what is possible, to view challenges as opportunities, to be creative and take risks, and for each person to own their attitude. Jody Horntvedt, Extension Educator with the program highlights, "The concept of YET has been evident in the many ways that participants embraced learning amidst the challenges in their lives and have been present and committed to taking part in program sessions."

University of Minnesota Extension coordinates the Emerging Leadership Program and provides educational content. Local partners include Northwest Minnesota Foundation, Red River Valley Development Association, and many donors from a variety of other sources across the region including ag producer groups, electric cooperatives, community businesses, financial institutions and individuals in counties throughout northwest and west central Minnesota who contribute each year.

DEA Seizures of Heroin and Fentanyl Increase Across North Dakota in 2020

OMAHA, Neb. —Seizures of fentanyl and heroin made by the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) in North Dakota increased in 2020 with investigators seeing a 223 percent increase from 2019 in the two drugs combined.

Fentanyl, estimated at approximately 100 times more potent than morphine and 50 times more potent than heroin, was seized by DEA for the first time in North Dakota since 2016. Found primarily in counterfeit pills, but on occasion in powder form, just two milligrams of fentanyl, or the equivalent of a few grains of salt, is considered a lethal dose.

"The people making these

counterfeit pills are by no means careful in their measurements," DEA Omaha Division Special Agent in Charge Justin C. King said. "While one pill from a single batch may contain 1 milligram of fentanyl, another may contain a lethal dose. We're seeing an increase in counterfeit pills in North Dakota and we want people to know the risk they take by using these illicit drugs."

The DEA's Fentanyl Signature Profiling Program found that 26 percent of illicit fentanyl pills examined in 2019 contained potentially lethal doses of fentanyl. Counterfeit pills can be difficult to distinguish from legitimate medications and

are often marketed as M30s, Perc30s, Blues or Mexican Oxy. The DEA stresses that the surest way to know that your medication is legitimate is to have it prescribed or given by a doctor or picked up at a pharmacy.

Marijuana was the number one drug seized in North Dakota in 2020 at 11.5 kilograms, with

methamphetamine seizures ranking second at 9 kilograms seized.

The DEA Omaha Division is a five state territory that includes Iowa, Minnesota, Nebraska, North Dakota and South Dakota as well as counties along the western border of Illinois and Wisconsin.

Pasque Flower Hike in Fertile Sand Hills

Enjoy a guided spring hike to view pasque flowers blooming in the Fertile Sand Hills on Saturday morning, April 3rd. The lavender pasque flowers, sometimes referred to as prairie crocus, are one of the first prairie flowers to bloom each spring. Hundreds of pasque flowers annually bloom throughout the Fertile Sand Hills with a high concentration in the Death Valley area—the primary destination of Saturday's hike.

Pasque refers to Easter Passover and is the Old French spelling for "Easter," which is often the time of its blooming. Pasque flower is the Manitoba provincial flower and the state flower of South Dakota which adopted it as the official floral emblem on May 5, 1903, along with the motto "I lead," complimenting pasque's first bloom of the spring. There are many reported medicinal uses of the

pasque plant by American Indians and European herbalists.

For those interested in joining the hike to check out the pasque flowers and the Fertile Sand Hills, take Summit Ave west off of MN Hwy 32 (just south of the Fertile downtown area). Go west past the Agassiz Environmental Learning Center Nature Center to the parking area and trailhead at the top of the hill. Wayne Goeken will lead the hike, with proper social distancing, to an area with abundant pasque flowers in bloom. The hike will leave from the parking area at 10:30 a.m. with return expected by noon. The hike is about 1.4 miles and will go along some uneven terrain and through a sand dune area. For more information, contact Wayne at 218-280-0516.

Water Protectors Blockade Line 3 Work With Prayer Lodge

(Lake George, MN) On Thursday, March 25 Indigenous water protectors sang and prayed inside of a waaginogaaning, the traditional structure of Anishinaabe peoples, as allies locked to each other around the lodge blocking Line 3 construction.

As the prayers of Indigenous

peoples and people of faith carried on the air, the spring melt and awakening life of the forest continued on. Three Ojibwe tribes have sued against the approval of Line 3 and its impacts on their treaty territory, their case is currently being heard in court.

Seven Arrested in St. Louis County

On March 25, 2021 deputies from the St. Louis County Sheriff's office responded to Floodwood Township, east of the City of Floodwood. Individuals protesting the Line 3 Oil Pipeline were reported to be locking themselves to a gate used by workers to access the pipeline construction site. When deputies arrived, they found 20 to 30 individuals were demonstrating against the pipeline at two separate and nearby locations. Four of the individuals had crossed into the construction area and locked themselves to heavy machinery. Two other individuals had locked themselves to a gate used to access the construction site.

All six of these individuals were extricated from the locks and devices and placed under arrest. One additional individual, who refused to leave when ordered, was also arrested.

Individuals were transported to the St. Louis County Jail. All were lodged for Gross Misdemeanor Trespass (on the site of critical infrastructure) and Obstructing Legal Process. One of the individuals, Anas-

tasia Sakorsky, was arrested last week by St. Louis County deputies in a similar incident.

1. Replace Fascia and soffits on all elevations of City Hall.
2. Replace Shingles and renew fascia and soffit on canopy from North Entrance doors to Cenex.
3. Fit window in Clerks Office (no window in presently) and replace existing windows (13# in total) on North, East Elevations and South Elevation.
4. Remove existing Siding on North and East Elevations of City Hall, Fire Dept. and Event Hall all the way up to Cenex.
5. Replace with 2x4 all supporting framework for siding and insulate, use a treated 2x10 at sidewalk level to allow for movement of sidewalks.
6. Replace existing siding as per plan and make good to existing Door Jambs at Fire Hall.
7. Level up Canopy over East Double doors and replace shingles and fascia and soffit.
8. Replace existing downspouts into drainage outlets in sidewalk.

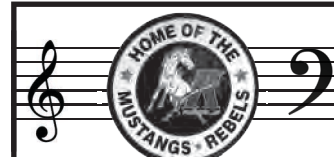

(owner/seller) are responsible for filing the "Notice of Sale" within ten days of the sale. This is located in the lower portion of the Certificate of Title. Doing this in a timely manner protects you and helps law enforcement to have access to the most current registered owner information. It is also helpful to create a receipt that contains the buyer's contact information and date of sale. This will serve as proof of when you sold the vehicle and to whom.

When purchasing a vehicle from a private party it is important that the vehicle title is transferred as soon as possible. Minnesota state law says that you have to transfer the vehicle's title within ten days of the date of sale, other than a sale by or to a licensed motor vehicle dealer.

New residents have a 60-day grace period in which to register their cars, passenger vans, 3/4 ton or less pickups, motorcycles, utility trailers, or house trailers

as long as the displayed license plates are current. If your registration expires before the 60-day grace period is up, you must obtain Minnesota registration at the time of expiration.

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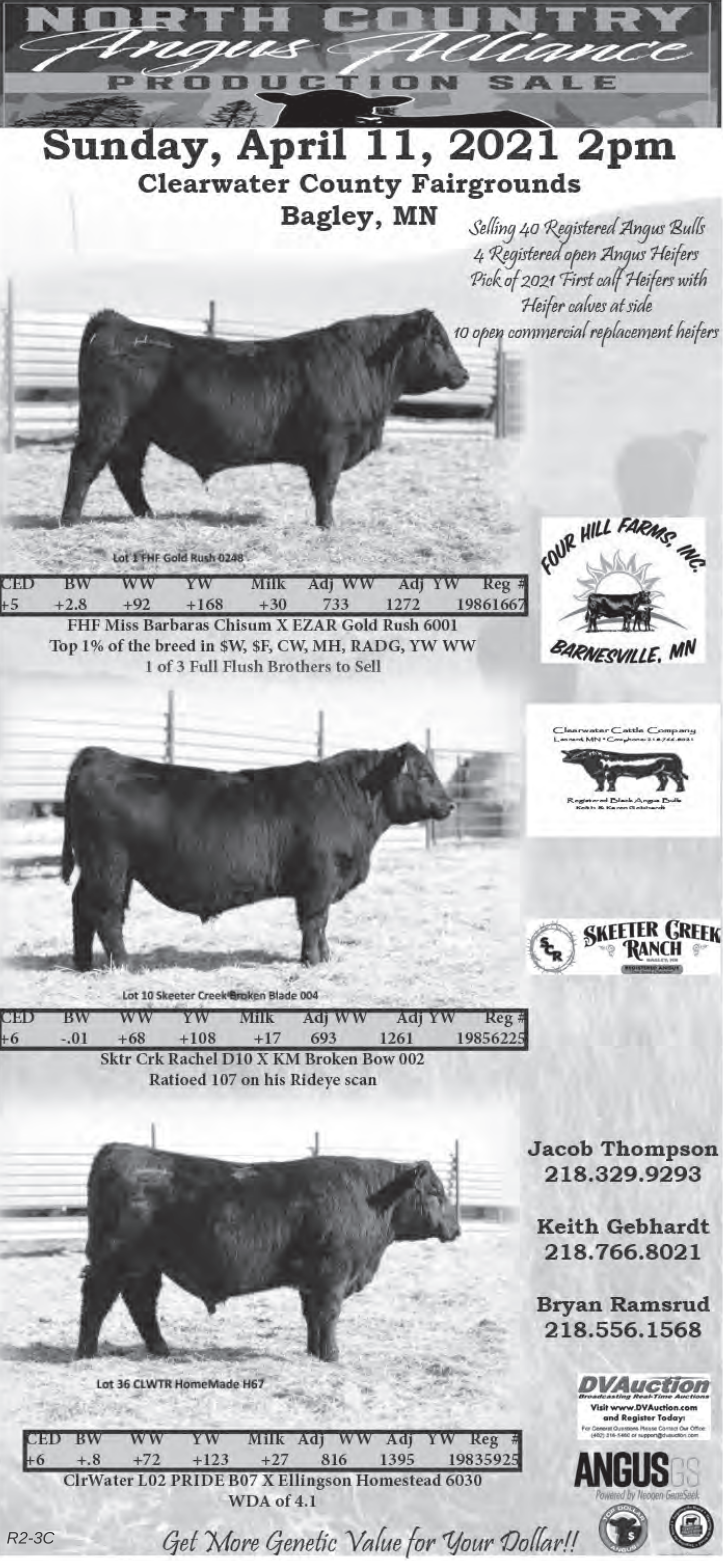

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26 Arrested in Lake Alice Township

On March 25th at 11:17am, the Hubbard County Sheriff's Office received a report of approximately 30 pipeline protesters standing on the side of US Hwy 71 at an Enbridge pipeline crossing in Lake Alice Township. When officers arrived, they found numerous vehicles parked along the highway, a crowd of protesters standing on the edge of the roadway, and approximately 20-protesters on private property within the pipeline easement. As other officers arrived on the scene, a dispersal order was given to those on the highway and also to those trespassing on private property. Some individuals complied with the order as they moved their vehicles and left the area. Those that remained on the private property were locked together in a circle and were surrounding other protesters who also refused to leave the area.
