Ada-Borup FFA Member Wins State Star Farmer

Twenty-two Honorary Degree Recipients Honored

MINNEAPOLIS – (April 22, 2021) Daniel Jossund, a senior FFA member from Ada-Borup High School, received the State Star Farmer award during the Minnesota FFA Convention today. The Minnesota FFA Foundation's sponsor for the Star Farmer recognition program is Compeer Financial Services. His award was announced during a surprise visit from the Minnesota FFA State Officers to his school, streamed live to convention participants across the state.

The organization's 92nd Convention with the theme Worth It is taking place through virtual sessions, live recognition, interactive state competition finals and workshops, as well as in-person convention-in-the-classroom activities.

Jossund earned the recognition through his FFA Supervised Agricultural Experience in Plant Systems with Jossund Bailing and Daniel Jossund Hay & Grain, and through Agribusiness Systems with J&L Jossund Farms.

Jossund describes that his SAE taught him how to make connections, manage finances and direct employees. He has served as the Ada-Borup FFA president and participated in Conduct of Chapter Meetings and the Agricultural Technology & Mechanical Systems Career and Leadership Development Events. His parents are John and Lorraine Jossund.

Other finalists for the award included Jenna Caughey – Brainerd FFA, Anna Ridenour – Triton FFA, and Aly Dieball – Sibley East FFA.

During Thursday's FFA Convention session, sponsored by NextEra, the Minnesota FFA Land of Service honor was presented to: 1.) Howard Lake-Waverly-Winsted with more than 3,021 hours served (value of \$80,486); 2.) Sleepy Eye with more than 1,407 hours served (value of \$35,780); and 3.) Princeton with more than 582 hours served (value of \$14,800).

Supervised Agricultural Experience state winners in the categories of Food Products and Processing Systems were recognized, along with Agriculture Fair participants in

those categories.

Food Products and Processing Systems Proficiency winners included:

- **Fruit Production** – Zachery Ruppert, Tracy FFA, sponsored by MinnTex;

- **Grain Production** – Mackenzie Henning, Jackson County Central FFA, sponsored by Corteva;

- **Nursery Operation** – Kristen Hubbard, United South Central FFA, sponsored by Ziegler Cat;

- **Specialty Crop Production** – Eric Melberg, Atwater-Cosmos-Grove City FFA, sponsored by Charles and Barb Melberg; and

- **Vegetable Production** – Josephine Homeier, Medford FFA, sponsored by AgCountry Farm Credit Services.

In her retiring address, Emilee Xayanourom, state vice-president from Mountain Lake FFA, shared with convention attendees of a practice she learned from her dad: collectivism. Xayanourom stated collectivism is putting the needs of the group ahead of your own.

"People are unique and different from each other, but we all live on the same world," Xayanourom said. "We need to be able to appreciate our differences but still work together for each of us as a whole."

Finalists were announced in the CDE and LDE areas of Conduct of Chapter Meetings, Creed Speaking, Parliamentary Procedure and Prepared Public Speaking.

Minnesota Reaches 100 Traffic Deaths; Earliest in the Last Six Years 102 Traffic Fatalities across the State

- Preliminary figures from the Minnesota Department of Public Safety Office of Traffic Safety show 102 people have died on Minnesota roads since Jan. 1, compared to 82 last year at this time.

- The state reported its 100th traffic death (preliminary) on April 21. This is the earliest date reaching the preliminary figure of 100 traffic fatalities in the last six years.

Recent Deaths on Minnesota Roads Include:

- A pickup driver traveling 80 mph in Wright County side-swiped an SUV at a curve in a construction zone. The pickup ran off the road and overturned a number of times. The unbelted 37 year-old male pickup driver was ejected and died. Alcohol and drug usage are suspected for the pickup driver. The buckled SUV driver was uninjured.

- A 52 year-old male motorcyclist was killed in Rice County after driving off the road at a curve and hitting an embankment. The driver was not wearing a helmet and alcohol use is suspected.

- A 28-year-old male driver drove onto the sidewalk at a Hopkins intersection, hitting a utility pole, traffic sign, two pedestrians and a tree. One pedestrian was reported to have minor injuries and the other pedestrian died. The driver reportedly was speeding and drug use is suspected.

- Two people were killed and one seriously injured in an I-94 Lowry Hill Tunnel crash in Minneapolis. The male driver of the car attempted to enter the

tunnel at a high rate of speed. The vehicle struck the freeway barrier wall, rupturing the fuel tank. It came to rest inside the tunnel. The driver was ejected and killed. One passenger died and another passenger was ejected and suffered serious injuries. Alcohol use is suspected.

The First 100 Traffic Fatalities Include:

- 82 motor vehicle occupants compared with 60 reported this time last year.

- 2 motorcyclists compared with 3 reported this time last year.

- 11 pedestrians compared with 13 reported this time last year.

- 2 bicyclists compared with 2 reported this time last year.

- 22 deaths involving crashes with heavy vehicle trucks.

- 51 single-vehicle crashes.

- 49 multi-vehicle crashes.

Bad Choices. Tragic Results.
For the first 100 traffic fatalities, preliminary information shows:

- 21 alcohol-related deaths (21 percent) compared with 31 this time last year (38 percent).

- 2 distracted-related deaths (2 percent) compared with 5 this time last year (6 percent).

- 40 speed-related deaths (40 percent) compared with 22 this time last year (27 percent).

- 31 unbelted motorist deaths (38 percent) compared with 21 this time last year (35 percent).

"Excessive speed continues to take a horrific and preventable toll on our roads," said Mike Hanson, Office of Traffic Safety director. "Alcohol, distraction, and no seat belts also continue to contribute to the loss of life in 2021. It doesn't have to be this way, and every Minnesotan has the power to stop the heartache and make choices that keep everyone alive. Drive smart by slowing down, paying attention, planning a sober ride and buckling up."

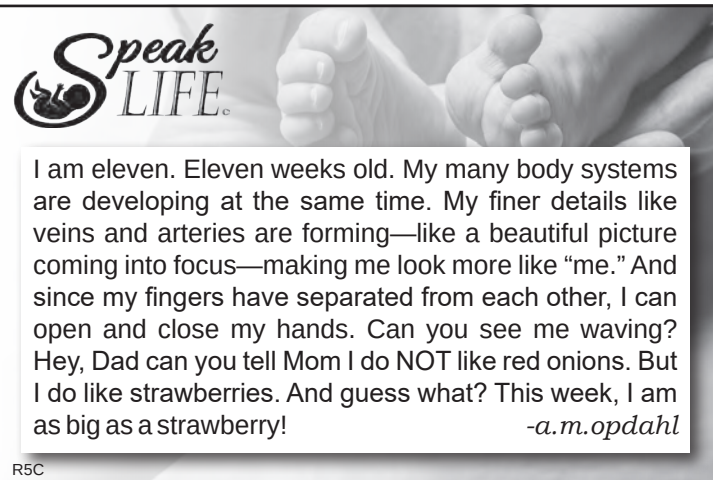

Sandra Kiddoo Named President of Northland Community & Technical College



ST. PAUL, Minn., April 21, 2021 – The Board of Trustees of the Minnesota State Colleges and Universities has named Sandra Kiddoo to serve as the next president of Northland Community & Technical College. The appointment will become effective July 1, 2021.

“Dr. Kiddoo’s leadership style is inclusive, transparent, and collaborative,” said Devinder Malhotra, chancellor of Minnesota State. “She has a strong track record of exploring new initiatives to provide the services and programs students and industry need for today and tomorrow. I am confident that Northland Community and Technical College will thrive under her leadership.”

Kiddoo is a senior level higher education professional with a record of success in college and state agency settings. She has advocated for the mission of community colleges, both as cost effective and high-quality options for students, and as integral to economic and workforce vitality.

Since 2018, she has served Hazard Community and Technical College (HCTC), a comprehensive community college offering both technical and transfer degree programs with an annual enrollment of over 3,000 students across three campuses and three additional locations. As the chief academic officer, her responsibilities include providing leadership for academic programming and developing and implementing a strategic academic master plan to ensure high quality programming and student success. Her accomplishments at HCTC include creating a long-term facility plan, obtaining \$9 million in grant funding for a Manufacturing and Construction Center of Excellence, implementing the K-Tech competency-based youth apprenticeship model, and adding programs in manufacturing that will help diversify the regional economy.

Before joining HCTC, Kiddoo served from 2015 to 2018 as vice president of academics at Mid-State Technical College (WI), a member of the Wisconsin Technical College System with an annual enrollment of over 2,600 students across three campuses and one center. In this capacity, she led the academic programming, adult basic education, workforce and continued education, institutional research, accreditation, and grants functions of the college. Her accomplishments included developing and implementing strategic and educational master plans, increasing access for students through online delivery technologies, engaging innovative instructional technologies, increasing workforce development initiatives, and developing and implementing new associate degree programs.

Previously, she served the Wisconsin Technical College System from 2007 to 2015 initially as education director for transportation and electronics, and later as associate vice president of instruction, providing academic leadership throughout the system of 16 technical colleges.

She holds a bachelor’s degree from the University of Wisconsin-Green Bay, a master’s from Capella University, and a doctorate from the University of Wisconsin-Madison.

Kiddoo succeeds Dennis Bona who served as president of Northland from 2015 to 2020 and retired December 2020.

Two Vehicle Accident

On 04/23/2021 at approximately 2:36 P.M. Polk County Sheriff’s Office was notified of a two- vehicle accident on Polk County Road 9 near 380th Ave SW in rural Fisher, MN. Deputies arrived on scene and found a Chevy Impala driven by Paul Chen, 54, of Racine, WI with heavy damage in the middle of the road and a Ford pickup driven by Erica Rose Brown, 43, of Hannah, ND in the ditch of County Rd. 9. The pickup driver and juvenile male passenger sustained non-life-threatening injuries and were subsequently transported by ambulance to Altru Hospital in Grand Forks, ND.

The accident is under investigation, no further information at this time.

Other assisting agencies include: Altru Ambulance, Fisher Fire and Rescue and East Grand Forks Fire Department.

Traffic Accident

On 4/19/2021, The Polk County Sheriff’s Office was dispatched to 202 N Mill St in the city of Fertile for a two vehicle accident. Deputies were advised that one car was T-boned, and that the other car drove into a building. Deputies arrived on scene and noticed a 2008 Blue Toyota RAV 4 driven by Cheryl Reitmeier 69 years old of Fertile in the middle of Lincoln Ave NE with heavy passenger side damage. A 2017 White Chevy Malibu driven by Eleanor Olson 86 years old of Fertile had driven into the building of Vern’s Carpet. It was determined that the Chevy Malibu was leaving the bank parking when the driver accidentally hit the gas pedal instead of the break. Ask a Trooper

Question: It seems like I am hearing about a lot of horrific crashes lately in the media. Are more people dying or being hurt in crashes this year?

Answer: Too many lives are being lost on Minnesota roads. Preliminary figures from the Minnesota Department of Public Safety Office of Traffic Safety show 102 people have died on Minnesota roads since Jan. 1, compared to 82 last year at this time.

The state reported its 100th traffic death (preliminary) on April 21. This is the earliest date reaching the preliminary figure of 100 traffic fatalities in the last six years. These fatalities include 11 pedestrians, 2 Motorcyclists, and 2 Bicyclists.

Drivers aren't just taking risks on highways and in the more populated regions. The 80 counties in greater Minnesota represent just yet Minnesota's population, half account for about 65 percent of traffic fatalities.

Speed continues to play a major role in Minnesota traffic fatalities contributing to at least 40 of these fatal crashes, making up 27 percent of all fatalities. Ever since the pandemic began in Minnesota, some drivers believe that they've been given a license to speed and are treating the open roads like a raceway. Speeding is a decision that makes the other driving mistakes worse.

Unbelted motorists are helping drive the significant rise in traffic fatalities this year, with 31 unbelted deaths or 35

I'm thankful for the up-cyclers, the paint makers, the wall décor designers, and kitchen stool creators. I look forward to meeting countertop people and area rug fabricators.

And what did God say after He finished with all that He'd created? Did He say it was good? No, He did not. What He did say was, "It is very good" (Gen. 1:31). So blessed we are to be surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses who care about the smallest of details which help offer hospitality to those who pass through. For this, I am grateful. Amen.

percent of lives lost who were not wearing their seat belt. Speak up if you are driving or the passenger and make sure everyone is properly buckled up. Seat belts are the number one tool you have in the car to keep you secured from being tossed around or ejected out of the car in a crash.

Distracted driving is killing hopes, dreams and lives and leaving people with serious injuries that tragically affect their day to day living. A combination of all of these like texting while driving distracts you for up to 4 to 6 seconds. That is like traveling the length of a football field and 55 mph blindfolded.

As the weather heats up, we plead with drivers to cool it when it comes to dangerous driving behaviors. Share the roadways with those walking, biking, riding motorcycles or moving farming equipment. Be aware and be patient, keeping all users safe.

My mom, Linda Mickelson, owns a couple of tractors that my grandfather, Clarence Ellickson, bought brand new in Oklee, MN, at Rolandson Implement. I have hopes and dreams of getting them both restored. Last summer I pulled out of the fence row, one of them, a 1952 A John Deere. It has been sitting for a while but I decided this will be the first project of the two! First of all if you know anything about tractors that sit for a while, two things happen. #1-the tires rot away! This is no cheap fix nowadays. Luckily I bought an M Farmall a few years back with nice tires..... these will be donor tires for mom's A. #2-the motor is now stuck! This is another somewhat difficult issue. I guess we will take it one step at a time!

The model A had many changes over the years. In 1947, a big styling change took place. These are my favorite model A tractors. The batteries were moved under the seat and the starter placed under the tractor instead of on top. A new pressed steel frame with curved design was added. This was a tractor!! These tractors also had an option that became a popular feature of John Deere tractors, the Roll-A-Matic front end. This was a narrow front end in which each wheel could independently go up or down on uneven terrain. A horse power upgrade was made. The new high compression head was used to give

the gasoline model A nearly 40 hp. In 1949, the shifting was changed to one shift lever instead of two, with a high low range. The last A rolled off the assembly line on May 12, 1952. This ended a 28 year production run of one of John Deere's most popular models.

When I see a picture of a newer styled A tractor I think of how farmers must have loved the new design, added power. If you look at old sales literature showing the newer A's, the pictures show farmers smiling as they sit upon these new sleek tractors. I was just born about 30 years too late!!! I wish I was one of those smiling farmers on a new model A!! But when I am done restoring mom's A, I think I will be smiling!! I will keep you posted!!

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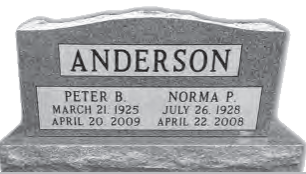

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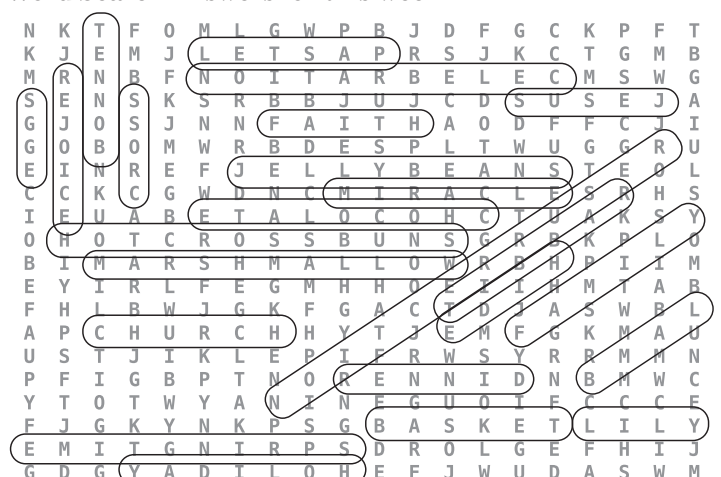

Aitkin, Anoka, Becker, Beltrami, Benton, Carlton, Cass, Chisago, Clay, Clearwater, Crow Wing, Douglas, Grant, Hennepin, Hubbard, Isanti, Itasca, Kanabec, Kittson, Koochiching, Lake of the Woods, Mahanomen, Marshall, Mille Lacs, Morrison, Norman, Otter Tail, Pennington, Pine, Polk, Pope, Ramsey, Red Lake, Roseau, Sherburne, Stearns, Stevens, Todd, Traverse, Wadena, Washington, Wilkin and Wright counties.

"People may not perceive how easily fires can accidentally get out of control when it's dry outside," said Casey McCoy, DNR fire prevention supervisor. "By restricting burning during our peak wildfire season, we've significantly reduced the number of wildfires Minnesota has experienced over the past decade."

Instead of burning yard waste, McCoy encourages landowners to compost, chip, or take brush to a collection site. For information on how compost yard waste, visit the DNR's guide to composting yard debris.

AccuWeather Global Weather update on storm potential

AccuWeather Global Weather Center — April 23, 2021 — Looking ahead to next week, AccuWeather meteorologists are monitoring for a potential severe weather outbreak across the southern United States on Tuesday and Wednesday that could pose a significant threat to life and property due to a strong storm system and jet stream setup.

The severe storm dangers next week will arrive right around a time that may already be triggering for millions that could be affected. Part of the outbreak could overlap with the 10-year anniversary of the Super Tornado Outbreak in 2011, an infamous event that spawned hundreds of tornadoes and claimed hundreds of lives across the South.

Once again, all of the necessary ingredients will come together for severe weather to develop. A strong storm system will shift into the region as a robust jet stream hovers overhead. Big dips in the jet stream often occur during April, an active month for severe weather, which, in turn, helps to provide extra energy for big thunderstorms and severe weather outbreaks to ignite.

Another reason that severe weather typically ramps up in April is the fact that major surges of warm and moist air from the Gulf of Mexico collide with lingering chilly air across the north.

Minnesota Starwatch

Minnesota Starwatch for May 2021

By Deane Morrison

As the winter constellations head into the sunset, Mars struggles to avoid the same fate.

May Day finds the red planet on course to glide between the bright stars Procyon, in Canis Minor, to the east and Capella, in Auriga, the charioteer, to the west. At the end of the month, Mars will be close to Pollux, the brighter Gemini twin. All the while, the planet is steadily dimming and, despite its relatively fast orbital motion eastward, sinking toward its inevitable exit from the evening sky this summer.

In the southeast to south, Spica, Virgo's only bright star, is outshone by brilliant Arc-turus, high above it in Bootes, the herdsman. To Spica's lower right is a misshapen rectangle of stars marking Corvus, the crow.

To the north, the Big Dipper—part of Ursa Major, the great bear—begins the month upside down, "spilling its water" on Polaris (the North Star) and Ursa Minor, the little bear. To identify Polaris, follow the "pointer stars" at the end of the Big Dipper's bowl. Bracketing Polaris are two brilliant stars: Capella, in the northwest, and comparably bright Vega, in Lyra, the lyre, in the northeast. During the course of a night, or from night to night, this arrangement changes as the

sky rotates counterclockwise around Polaris.

In the predawn sky, look for Jupiter and dimmer Saturn low in the southeast. Thanks to the resurgent sun, we have to get out earlier each morning to see them against a dark sky.

The night of the 25th-26th, May's full "supermoon" will be large and luminous as it slips through the Crown of Scorpius, a line of three stars near Antares, the scorpion's red heart. The moon undergoes a total lunar eclipse on the morning of the 26th, but sets before the moment of perfect fullness and also before the eclipse reaches totality.

This will be the year's closest full moon. It reaches perigee, the moon's closest approach to Earth in a lunar cycle, only about nine and a half hours before reaching fullness. It edges out the runner-up, April's supermoon, by a razor-thin margin. According to NASA, May's full moon will be closer than April's "by about 98 miles, or about 0.04 percent of the distance from the Earth to the Moon at perigee."

Anglers can prevent the spread of aquatic invasive species

Clean, drain, dispose every time

The approaching fishing season comes with a reminder from the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources to always follow state laws to prevent the spread of aquatic invasive species.

It's also important for anglers to take a few minutes for invasive species prevention every time a boat comes out of the water.

Maj. Shane Kirlin, DNR operations manager, said that's true whether or not an enforcement officer or watercraft inspector is present.

"All anglers and boaters in Minnesota are required to take three simple steps: clean, drain, dispose," Kirlin said. "It's not only the best way to prevent the spread of aquatic invasive

species, but it's also the law in Minnesota."

People must clean aquatic plants and debris from watercraft, drain lake or river water and keep drain plugs out during transport, and dispose of unwanted bait in the trash, not in the water.

In addition to these required steps, the DNR also recommends that anglers:

- Spray boat and trailer with high-pressure water;
- Rinse boat and trailer with very hot water (120° for two minutes; or 140° for 10 seconds); or
- Dry boat and equipment for at least five days.

Rep. Green expresses concern for House Dems' environmental bill

ST. PAUL – State Rep. Steve Green, R-Fosston, has roundly criticized a House Democrat package of environmental measures for its fee increases at a time of state surplus, expansion of government and burdensome regulations.

Green's criticism was aimed at H.F. 1076, an omnibus environment and natural resources bill which received approval from the body on party lines Thursday. Green spoke against the bill during a lengthy floor debate and said he has three major areas of concern.

First, Green said, he objects to the fact it raises fees on businesses and recreational activities by \$20 million over the next two years at a time the state has a massive budget surplus. Green also said he opposes language in the bill which brings California's auto regulations to Minnesota and cedes our state's power on this issue to that state.

Green also took issue with the bill placing more power in the hands of the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency to enforce new environmental permitting regulations.

"Putting that kind of power

in the hands of MPCA bureaucrats will crush businesses and could very well cause many to leave the state," Green said. "That provision is bad news. I have a great appreciation for our environment and for the natural resources we are blessed to share in our state. I also have the utmost respect for the constitutional liberties we enjoy and honor the taxpayer dollar. This bill tramples on both of the latter, especially as it pertains to the lack of accountability for the MPCA."

Green said the bill now will be the subject of a conference committee that will work to resolve differences between the two bodies' respective packages in the hopes of having a finished product in place before the Legislature is set to adjourn May 17.

"I'm really pulling hard for the Senate to stand strong on this and eliminate the bad provisions House Democrats passed in this bill," Green said. "I would like to see the version that comes back to the House for final approval be something worthy of bipartisan support."

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
