Criminal Activity Disguised as Protesting

Last week, as the Line 3 Project continues construction—bringing jobs, economic activity, and a new, safe pipeline in place of the aging one—protesters have crossed the line to engage in criminal activity including vandalism, destruction of property, and harassment of workers.

A group of Tribal business owners, workers and contractors sent a letter to Minnesota Tribal Leaders and Government. The letter, details how lives and work were affected by the protest events that took place at the Enbridge Two Inlets Pump Station site near Park Rapids, MN on Monday. In part: *Protests that disrupt work, damage property, and threaten our employees while claiming to be on behalf of our Native people is creating additional tension and consequences within our tribal communities. They also intentionally create a false narrative that there is no Native American support for this project and the economic impacts and opportunities it brings to our people.*

We respect the rights of everyone to express their opinions and to protest. As Native people,

making sure our voice is heard is even more important and essential, yet what happened on Monday went far beyond and resulted in Native workers being forced to stop working as their job sites were overrun by protestors.

On Monday, the damage to the Two Inlet Pump Station included extensive vandalism of contractor equipment, construction trailers broken into, and the destruction of environmental safeguards intended to control erosion and protect water quality. Criminals—once they broke the law, they are no longer protesters but criminals—attempted to trap workers while forcefully entering and then occupying the site, trespassing and criminally damaging property.

This destruction of the very environmental safeguards designed to protect water and harassments of workers plainly shows these criminals are not acting to “save the earth” but are criminals intent on causing damage.

The senseless destruction was not first amendment protected free speech but criminal behavior. The actors who did

this are criminals and should be treated as such. Below are some pictures taken at the Enbridge Two Inlets pump station site showing the aftermath of the destructive criminal activity.

The damaged equipment is owned by Gordon Construction—a 100% Native owned company based out of Mahnom, MN on the White Earth Reservation. The equipment will be taken out of work for weeks and cost hundreds of thousands to repair.

This behavior cannot be tolerated and those who broke the law must be held accountable as should those who enable and encourage these law breakers.

Criminal acts against pipeline are unacceptable

To the editor,
The Line 3 replacement project resumed after a spring-thaw hiatus. Work is 60 percent complete, and the new pipeline – one of the largest privately funded projects in state history – remains on schedule to be completed and in service later this year.

While that is good news, it was disgraceful to see activists recently cause significant property damage, threaten workers and prevent people from working on this job. While everyone's right to peacefully and lawfully protest should be respected, what recently took place at Two Inlets Pump Station was criminal and dangerous. Reports indicate protesters attempted to trap workers while forcefully entering and then occupying the site, trespassing and criminally damaging property. This is unacceptable and all involved should face full prosecution.

It is insulting to those of us who live here to see extremists, many from other places around the country, come to our region to try to stop work even after the project passed muster during an exhaustive permitting process. People here and throughout northern Minnesota are benefiting from thousands of jobs and millions of dollars in economic impact from this \$3 billion private investment. The old pipeline is more than a half-century old, obsolete and needs



to be replaced. Polling shows a majority of Minnesotans support the project and making sure construction continues.

The process to replace Line 3 started in 2014 during the Obama-Biden Administration. The Line 3 project is now the most reviewed pipeline project in Minnesota history and has been intensely scrutinized by state and federal agencies and regulators for almost six years. Instead of respecting the process and the community, these largely imported activists have trespassed and vandalized equipment that has impacted a Native American construction company.

Highly respected businesses such as Gordon Construction

not only serve as top White Earth job providers, but also have served other valuable roles in our tribal communities for decades. This includes their efforts to ensure the new Line 3 does not cross White Earth or Leech Lake reservations. It is a slap in the face to our local businesses – especially tribal-owned outfits – to now suffer criminal property damages and threats to their own safety.

It's time for the criminal acts to stop, for work to continue, and for us to make sure this project is completed so that we may continue to reap the environmental and economic benefits of replacing Line 3.

Heavily Cloaked

Wrapped round and hanging heavy appears to be an invisible cloak. You see weary on people's facial expressions about battles just below the surface. International concerns, national, state, and local battles are being waged.

Although some of these battles may be new to us and to the soil upon which we stand, the truth is, "there is nothing new under the sun" (Ecclesiastes 1:9).

A little riff-raff going on now and again is normal. However, when topsy-turvy is in full bloom, and the battles turn against brother, sister, mother, father, that is another level all together and evil is in its glory.

I don't do well with topsy-turvy but others appear to revel it. Broken begets broken and when things are not in the state of chaos, it is then recreated because that is the normal from which some operate.

I heard someone say, "People

will do anything to recreate what is familiar to them." In other-words, if we don't deal with things that have caused chaos within our lives, we pass it on by recreating it in not only our lives but the lives of those around us.

Adding to the heaviness of the cloak over us may come from accusations hurled when one does not agree with a given topic. It appears it is no longer acceptable to have a different opinion as it is bullied right out of the discussion...or worse yet, not even invited in. Assumptions, accusations, name calling all flare and presuppositions (which used to be called bearing false witness), are held up as fact.

No need to go into detail as I do not wish to make the cloak heavier. After all, He says, "My yoke is easy and My burden light" (Matt. 11:30).

How can we lift the cloak high enough to peek out from

under? Equipping ourselves with the armor of God as described in Ephesians 6:10-18 might be a good start. My personal favorite is the belt offered to all. It's the belt of Truth. Ask a Trooper

Question: I junked two vehicles about 30 days ago and have only received one "Junk Certificate" in the mail. I contacted the DVS with the VIN # in question and they have no record of the vehicle being junked and told me to contact the repair shop. I contacted the repair shop that I mailed the signed title to and they said they have taken care of it. I do not want to get into a sort of legal trouble with this and am wondering what other actions if any I should take to ensure the vehicle was actually scrapped or if once I signed and mailed the title to them I have no more legal responsibility for the vehicle.

Answer: If you sold your vehicle to licensed motor vehicle dealer, you don't have to do anything. There are many

different types of Minnesota licensed dealers. For example: New, Used, Scrap Metal, Wholesale, Broker, Lessor, Auction, Salvage Pool and Used Parts. If a vehicle is sold to a private individual or any non-licensed entity, you would be required to fill out a "notice of sale" within 10 days of the sale date. The bottom of the title contains the "notice of sale". It can either be filled out and mailed to Minnesota Driver and Vehicle Services (DVS), or be completed online. <https://dps.mn.gov/divisions/dvs/Pages/dvs-content-detail.aspx?pageID=642>

It is common that a dealer may hold two different licenses. For example: a used and scrap metal dealer license. In this case the dealer may buy vehicles that people are junking out. If the dealer junks the vehicle out, they have reporting requirements, which includes notifying the State of Minnesota the vehicle is "junked". If

the dealer decides the vehicle is worth fixing instead of junking, they would then report to the State of Minnesota that the vehicle is "held for resale" and later resold.

To answer your question about your other specific vehicle, it is currently "held for resale". This means a licensed, used dealership owns it and plans on reselling the vehicle. Being that a dealership held it for resale, you should not have to do anything.

720 John Deere/Tractor Adventures

Over the last week I made two trips to Crystal, ND. I have never been to Crystal but this week twice.....why you ask....I think you know.....a tractor! A 720 John Deere tractor that has been sitting in a backyard and was nearly hidden by a lilac bush. Trip number one was to measure for the trailer and trip two was to haul it home!

It turned out to be quite an adventure. My friend Jon Smith volunteered to come along and that is good because I needed a foreman! The old 720 had been in that spot for a while and had settled into the ground. We tried to tug it out but it would hardly budge?!? We discovered the brakes were locked up. Project one was to remove the brakes. After some fighting and maybe some swearing the brakes were removed. Now we could pull it out into the open. It was fun to see it in the daylight. Now came the labor intensive part, winching it up on the trailer. Click, click, click, and click, slowly the 720 came up on the trailer! Now just the 2 hour trip home!

I had to take some pictures of loading and unloading because that is the way I am.

I am sure you all have family albums with pictures of days gone by, but do you also have "tractor albums?" I sure do! I have pictures of old family tractors, new family tractors, and tractor show after tractor show. I have two huge tractor scrap books. One is full of pictures of tractors my family had or has now. The other is full of tractor pulls and shows I have been to over the years. I am sure when I am dead and gone my kids will say, "Why the ---- did dad take so many tractor pictures?!?"... well he loves tractors!

One of the picture I came across was during the summer of 1998. It features my 9 year old son, Nickolas, driving my friend Duane Whyte's 720 John Deere diesel. It was a row crop 720 with a wide front and pony motor start. The pony motor did not work so when you wanted to start it you had to give it a pull! After that it ran like a top. In fact, I wish I had it today!

You see back in 1956, the model 720 Diesel came to Nebraska to be tested. Low and behold the 720 continued the two cylinder tradition and broke yet another fuel economy record!! What was amazing about this accomplishment was that the 720's record would stand for 27 years!! John Deere engineers attributed the reason for the great fuel efficiency was the two cylinder design, a 16:1 compression

ratio, and the geometric design of the pistons and the cylinder head to create increased turbulence in the cylinders. They referred to this as "cyclonic fuel intake!" Whatever the reason, for a long period of time the John Deere two cylinder diesels were the kings of fuel economy.

I can remember watching my nine year old son, Nick, heading back and forth and back and forth with that 720 and a 10 foot tandem disc. It was dry and no danger of getting stuck and the disc had no hydraulics so he didn't have to worry about extra controls. I was proud of Nick! I have a 5 X 7 picture of Nick driving that 720 that day on my wall! Now Nick lives down the road with his wife Nicole and his son Archer and I know he will be just as proud of that little boy! Maybe someday one of my grandsons



Archer or Callan can drive the 720 I brought home. I sure hope so! Thanks for the help, Jon! Happy farmer here!

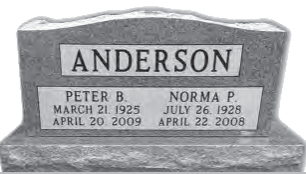

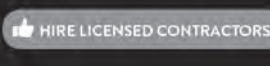

Beautiful weather once again brought out a great crowd to watch the races with 85 cars in the pits to go for glory on the 3/8 mile oval. Added to the day's special events, the 2020 track champion and top five winners were presented awards during intermission in front of the grandstand.

Next Sunday June 20th will be Pepsi Nei Bottling Kids Night at the track with all kids 12 and under receiving free admission and during intermission they will be allowed down on the track to meet their favorite driver and possibly win a bike or other prize. Many drivers will also be handing out hero cards or photos to be enjoyed by the kids. Next Friday fans can get to meet and see some of the racers with their cars at special events at both Luekens Foods locations in Bemidji. The cars and drivers will be available from 2-4:PM on Friday.

Bemidji Mini Stock Feature: 10 minis entered the track for the initial feature of the night with Waylon and Marie Current in the front row. The race got off to a fast start but came to an abrupt stop when a three wide melee on the front straight sent 14 year old Hayden Engen up and over Marie Current and upside down for the second week in a row but this time he landed on his top with Current's car mashed between his upside down car the front wall. Engen emerged shaken but ok. Current was removed from her car and taken by family members to the hospital to be checked over with a possible concussion.

When racing resumed it was Waylon Current in the lead with Ashton Schwinn, Kalin Honer, Corey Nelson and Brandon Hunter in the top five. Honer raced up on the inside in turns one and two and raced door to door with Current for the lead and taking it. Another caution slowed the race for a restart and moving Current back in front. Conrad Schwinn took advantage of the restart climbing up from 4th into third and then racing three wide with Honer and Current for the lead. It became a duel between Schwinn and Honer with Schwinn spinning and bringing out the caution flag and this time sending Honer tailback for the restart. Schwinn held his lead to pick up the win with Current, Gordon Hunter, Nelson and Honer in the top five.

Wissota Pure Stock Feature: 13 Wissota Pure Stocks were led on track by Bryan Karl on the pole and Bonnie Farrington outside. After the first lap it was Austin Carlson and Karl dueling for the lead side by side. A quick yellow flag was thrown when a car went over the top of turn one. The restart had Carlson in the lead with Karl, Kade Leeper, Farrington and Al Sadek in the top five. Josh Berg tried the high side and made it work moving up from his 4th row start into fourth with Dusty Caspers fifth. Racing outside Sadek moved up taking second as Deryk Weleski drove up to challenge Caspers for fifth. Following a couple additional cautions the race was started single file with Carlson holding on for the win followed by Sadek, Berg, Leeper and Caspers.

Wissota Midwest Modified Feature: 16 Wissota Midwest Modifieds roared on track with Connor Drewry and Darrin Lawler leading the way but it was 16 year old Joey LaValley racing on the high side taking the lead with Lawler, Jeff Reed, Brandon Bahr and Blake Higginbotham chasing. Reed once again used the high side to make up the ground from his fourth row start. A great race for the lead developed with LaValley, Lawler and Reed in a tight three wide race down the backstraight with Reed taking the lead spot. Following a caution and restart Alan Olafson was on the move racing up into fourth getting by Bahr. Olafson battled with Higginbotham for second but Higginbotham held his backup position as Reed took the checkered

flag from flagman Tim Jackson. Higginbotham was second with Olafson, Bahr, and LaValley in the top five. For Reed it was his third feature win of the season at Bemidji Speedway.

Wissota Mod Four Feature: The Wissota Mod Fours were the next feature attraction with Josh Sautbine and Brian Feda leading the way to the green flag. Sautbine took the lead with Jonathon Feda moving up into second followed by Blake Erickson, Brian Feda and Dean Larson. Erickson was racing high and grabbed the lead with Larson following into second. Conrad Schwinn raced inside in turn four and took over fourth with Skyler Smith inside into fifth. Erickson looked comfortable and in control when he slid up high in turn two giving the lead over to Larson with Schwinn, Sautbine and Smith all passing him. Larson won the feature, his 147th of his amazing career with Schwinn, Sautbine, Smith and Jonathon Feda in the top five.

Wissota Super Stock Feature: An even dozen Wissota Super Stocks entered the track with Kevin Salin and John Farrington leading the way. The two front leaders duelled side by side for the lead on the first lap with Salin holding the advantage. Following a caution Salin, Farrington, Nic Jacobson, Dalton Carlson and Dylan Nelson trailed the leader. But it was Jacobson showing once again how much he loved the highside of the track powering up around the leaders into the lead. Nelson moved up as well into third with Carlson fourth and Farrington fifth. Another caution created a restart with Nelson catching and passing Salin for second. Jacobson was "flying" on the track and Nelson tried to catch the leader but could not as Jacobson took the checkered flag for the second week in a row. Nelson, Farrington, Salin and Carlson trailed in the top five.

Wissota Modifieds Feature: Newcomer to the Wissota Modifieds Matt Fullerton was on the pole with veteran racer Doyle Erickson to his right. Erickson pulled out slightly into the lead with Josh Beaulieu, Fullerton, Lance Schilling and Scott Engholm chasing him. Beaulieu quickly showed the field he meant business in this one splitting the leaders down the front straight to take the lead but a caution flag put him back for the restart. The restart was a duel with Erickson and Beaulieu fighting for the lead with Beaulieu retaking the lead as he said later, "I was on a mission." The laps clicked off as Beaulieu continued to hold his lead but Fullerton was still in the picture with 2020 track champion Davey Mills now also in the top three. But Engholm was also determined racing up to challenge Mills for third as Beaulieu drove to Victory Lane with his second win of the season. Fullerton picked up his best finish of the year in second with Mills, Engholm and Erickson in the top five.

Wissota Hornet Feature: Andy Hansen and 14 year old

Brooke Vernlund led the field of 17 Wissota Hornets to the green flag with Vernlund taking the lead trailed by Hansen, Megan Vernlund and Chad Reller in the top five. Ross Magnuson moved up into fourth dropping Reller to fifth. Following a caution for a crash in the turns 1-2 it was Brooke Vernlund in control. Racing up from his

7th row starting position racing mostly on the highside Peyton Edelman was making up ground quickly racing all the way up to third before Vernlund took the feature win, her first ever. Magnuson, Edelman, Aiden Helwig and Travis Olafson trailing the winner ending an exciting night of racing at Bemidji Speedway.

A beautiful day turned into a beautiful night for racing at the Greenbush Race Park as 64 cars checked into the pits hoping to get the checkered flag at the end of the night.

The NLRA Wissota Late Models were making their first appearance of the summer with 17 cars headed to the track for their feature. First time visitor to the Park, Bryce Sward of Nelson, Mn., would lead the first lap from his inside second row starting position, but a caution after lap one prevented him from getting to far ahead of the rest of the field. When they come around to complete lap two, we had a new leader in Dustin Strand of East Grand Forks, Mn. Late Model rookie driver Mike Greseth of Harwood, N.D. would chase Strand for the next 18 laps, at times through lapped traffic, and Greseth would make the pass for the lead in corner four with six to go. Caution would fly one lap later and give the leaders a traffic free track to work with. Greseth was able to hold everyone off to get the win. Strand would finish second but would have to hold off a challenge from Cole Schill of Horace, N.D. Heat wins went to Strand, Sward and Cole Babcock of Rothsay, Mn.

The Wissota Midwest Modifieds would send 17 cars to the track for their feature, and just like one week ago, this race was filled with cautions. Aaron Blacklance of Thief River Falls, Mn., would pass Scott Kaml of Greenbush, Mn., out of corner two on a restart for the lead with 11 to go. After several more cautions, officials decided to go to a green, white, checkered finish. After two tries at that the raced was called giving the win and sweep to Blacklance. Justin Olson of Thief River Falls, Mn., would win his heat and finish second. Harley Kroening of Bemidji, Mn., would start outside of row six and finish third. The other heat win went to Shane Wahl of Greenbush, Mn.

The 14 car Wissota Street feature saw a good battle early as Aaron Blacklance and Tucker Pederson of East Grand Forks,

Mn., swapped the lead twice in the first five laps. Blacklance would get the lead back on a restart out of corner four. The last caution came with five to go and would set up a great race to the checkers. Blacklance and Ryan Johnson of Karlstad, Mn., put on a great show with Blacklance running the cushion and Johnson the middle of the track. It was a drag race out of corner four with Blacklance getting his second feature win and sweep of the night. Johnson would finish second while Greg Jose of Grand Forks, N.D. would win his heat and finish third. Pederson would pick up the other heat win.

The Wissota Pure Stocks would have one caution flag before getting one lap in and then would click off 15 caution free laps. Steve Nordhagen of Thief River Falls, Mn., would pick up his first win of the year and was never challenged for the lead. The real race was for the second and third spot between Deryk Weleski of Bemidji, Mn., and Dusty Caspers of Bagley, Mn. The two ran side by side for five laps before Caspers finally got by Weleski. Caspers would finish second and Weleski would get the lone heat win and finish third.

For the five years the Greenbush Race Park has hosted the Outlaw Mini Mods, Kelly Steele of International Falls, Mn., has been the guy to beat. In that time Steele has 13 wins and he added one more to the total as he won going away. International Falls, Mn., drivers Justin Besch and Tyler Jonson would finish second and third with Jonson winning the lone heat.

Up next for the Park, the Limited Late Models will make their first ever visit and they will be joined by the Modifieds, Midwest Modifieds, Pure Stocks, and 4 Cylinders. Pit gates open at 4:30, Grandstands at 5:30, draw cutoff is at 6pm with the green flag flying at 7pm sharp.
